

I. OVERVIEW

Bill No. 155-33 (LS) was introduced by Senators Frank B. Aguon, Jr., Dennis G. Rodriguez, Jr., and Tina R. Muña Barnes on August 12, 2015, and subsequently referred to the **Committee on Appropriations and Adjudication** on August 13, 2015.

The **Committee on Appropriations and Adjudication** convened a public hearing on **Thursday, September 17, 2015**, beginning at **2:00PM** in the Guam Legislature Public Hearing Room. The hearing for **Bill No. 155-33 (LS)** began at **2:30PM** and ended at **2:39PM**.

II. TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

Chairman Benjamin J.F. Cruz announced **Bill No. 155-33 (LS)** and called on **Talofo’fo’**

mayor Mr. Vicente S. Taitague and Talofó'fo' resident Mr. Franklin Artero to provide testimony.

Mayor Vicente S. Taitague, Municipality of Talofó'fo', expressed his appreciation to the sponsors of the bills and read for the record his written testimony (*appended to this report*) in support of the legislation

Mr. Franklin Artero, a resident of Talofó'fo', provided his testimony in support of the legislation:

"I'm here to support my mayor, the best mayor in the whole island. [Talofó'fo' is] God's country—I know, but we're the best. (Laughter). I know that but I'm from God's country and I'm here to support the kids up there.

"I remember when I was growing up—and I'm an old man as you can tell by looking at me—in the late '50s, we have light in the basketball court. I'm from Agana Heights; I grew up there, and the ball field, the kids are active. We're always doing physical exercise for the little league, the Babe Ruth, the other softball team. Besides baseball, there's practice and they take turns in the field. The basketball court is always busy with all kinds of activities. And you hardly see [obese] children in the village because they're always racing, running, playing, dancing, doing all kinds of activity. Now most of them just stay home and play the video [games], or because the fact that they cannot go out at night because they can't use the field.

"[The field provides a venue for many activities:] whether it's baseball or soccer, or even the cheerleaders of the drum and bugle team, or drill team going out there and practicing because certain part of the ball field is nice and solid and they can do some marching.

"And Thirty Nine Thousand Dollars (\$39,000) is nothing compared to the physical fitness of our children. And hold on the crime and all kinds of activities will eliminate a lot of that. We support the coaches, continue to talk to the children—whether it's the female team or male team—about the importance of integrity, you know, [to discourage them from] breaking into people's houses and doing illegal stuff. And [the youth will] get involved in organized activity to keep themselves busy. Okay? Thank you."

Senator Frank B. Aguon, Jr. gave a few remarks about the project cost:

"One thing I need to recognize, Mr. Mayor, is the total cost for your projected project is Sixty-Eight Thousand Dollars (\$68,000), of which funds are available to the community of Talofó'fo'. You're going to take Twenty-Nine Thousand (\$29,000) out of the Limited Gaming Funds—which you could otherwise use for other community projects—and you're going to invest it into this project itself. And I'm coming to a point where you're willing to do that, half of your community, now that you're reaching out and asking for the balance of Thirty-

Nine Thousand Dollars (\$39,000).

“And I say this because there’s also another mayor and vice mayor [who] will be joining us shortly who are doing the very same thing. They’re asking if by any chance—they are being resourceful—they went out and found the same money for particular project, or projects, in their village, and then they’re reaching out and coming full circle, and they get additional funding so that they can complete the project.

“It just reflects on your innovation and your willingness to take resources that you could otherwise use elsewhere for the community and apply to this project. It shows how important the upgrade of this particular ball field is to you and your village and so I thank you for your willingness to invest and take some of your proceeds from the Limited Gaming Funds to assist specifically for this project. I certainly hope we can work together not only with the Chairman but also with the front offices so that these funds can be identified and allocated accordingly.”

Mayor Taitague stated that his preference is to appropriate the total amount, and take the \$30,000 to fix the new center. He asked the Chairman in jest if he could be given the total cost.

Senator James V. Espaldon asked about potential land ownership issues with the field:

“Mr. Mayor, if I may, I need to ask the question, only because I’ve gone up with you, I’ve met with you up there. And there’s a letter in front of us from one of the residents in your village basically highlighting the fact that the property of the little league baseball field sits on actually belongs to the church. And so if we use the government funds for that, I’m just wondering, is there some kind of agreement or a [memorandum of understanding] (MOU) that’s been worked out between the municipality and the church in terms of being able to do this? The liability issues?”

Mayor Taitague replied that he has on file an MOU signed by Father Felix.

Senator Espaldon continued with the questioning regarding fixing other sporting surfaces:

“Okay, the other point that this resident of Talofó’fo’ mentions is that if she had her preference, is that you also now, gosh, if you had a lot of money, you’d do other things as well. And I can understand; I’m sure the other villages feel the same way. She basically speaks to the point that the basketball court and the tennis court could probably use, you know—if she had her rathers, she’d rather see the basketball court and the tennis fields fixed as opposed to the little league field. And I would imagine that’s because you have two (2) baseball fields and one we know has just been completed and it’s a beautiful field for all the residents to use. I’m just wondering; any thoughts on that, Mr. Mayor?”

Mayor Taitague responded:

“Once I get to rounding the Limited Gaming Funds, that would be addressed, sir. All we have to do is put new lights up and resurface it and that would do the job. So it’s [in] the plans.”

Senator Thomas A. Morrison began by stating that his first homerun was in Talofó’fo’, and continued with commending the Mayor Taitague for using the Limited Gaming Fund, and his creativity in trying to augment the project. He continued:

“And I thank my colleagues, the Chairman and my colleagues here, that we were able to address the [Limited Gaming Fund] and allow that to release to occur because as you stated earlier to Senator Espaldon, that release will be coming continually. Money is available in that fund to help these community projects. My understanding, too, is that the field now, which is only just for baseball, is also being used for soccer? “

Mayor Taitague denied this.

Chairman Cruz considered Bill No. 155-33 (LS) heard.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

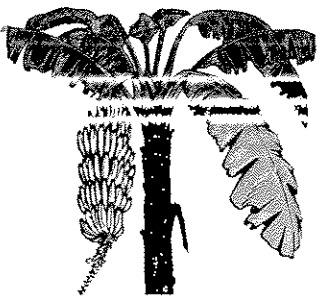





Testimony on Legislative Bill's 153-33, 154-33, 155-33, 156-33, 157-33 and 158-33.

Hafa Adai. I would like to thank you for providing me this opportunity to provide written testimony on a number of proposed measures with similar source of funding, specifically the savings associated with the recent refunding of the Government of Guam's 2007 and 2009 General Obligation Bonds.

These Bills are all laudable in their own right and promote capital improvements to recreational areas and the Umatac Bridge Towers, a monument to Fallen Heroes of the Pacific, and overtime funding for Typhoon Halong.

These Bills collectively would require approximately \$773,454.85 of the \$1,575,972 realized from the successful General Obligation bond refunding authorized under Public Law 33-60. The remaining funds, should all these proposals become law, would be approximately \$802,571.15.

The Bureau would be remiss if it did not call to the attention of this Committee that Section 1 of Public Law 33-60 states, "It is, further, the intent of I Liheslaturan Guahan that there will be no borrowing for new capital improvements with the refunding of the 2007 Bonds and the 2009 Bonds, but rather that the projected net cash flow savings that would be achieved from the refunding of the 2007 Bonds and the 2009 Bonds be appropriated from the General Fund and applied toward capital improvements relating to the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority (GMHA) and other health related matters."

Our only public hospital continues to face challenges while at the same time saving lives and providing quality health care for our Island and our neighbors who seek care at the GMHA. The Bureau therefore urges this Committee and the members of the 33rd Guam Legislature to remember that the savings from the refunding was to provide an infusion of cash to GMHA in order for them to continue their valiant efforts to serve the healthcare needs of Micronesia. It is further the Bureau's desire to state for the record that it is in full support of all remaining savings to be immediately appropriated directly to GMHA for the good of our healthcare system and consistent with legislative policy as embodied in Public Law 33-60.

Thank you again for the opportunity to provide written testimony on this series of proposed measures.

My name is Anita Atalig-Manibusan and I reside in the village of Talofoto, aka God's Country.

I am writing my testimony on Bill 155-33 (LS), which will appropriate \$39,000 to the Talofoto Mayors Office for the repairs and upgrades of the Talofoto Baseball Field.

First of all, Talofoto has TWO (2) Baseball Fields.

The first one is the newly renovated, **SPC. Richard Junior Degracia Naputi Baseball Field**, across Talofoto Elementary School. The second, is located across the San Miguel Catholic Church, which is owned by the church. As you pass by this (second) baseball field, you will see a banner across the fence which reads, the **"San Miguel Parrish Baseball Field"**.

To make a long story short, The San Miguel Parrish Baseball Field was the Mayor's first choice for the Community Development Grant, until GHURA did a title research on the property.

The Community Development Grant apparently could not be used for renovating/ upgrading of the San Miguel Parrish Baseball field only because it was deemed private property.

I am not against appropriations to any mayor's office, assisting them in upgrading public sports facilities in their villages. Being a former manager/coach of youth baseball teams in the village of Talofoto, I understand the need to maintain the facilities to keep our youths busy. For many years, parent volunteers in the community took the lead to maintain these facilities using their personal funds and equipment to ensure the field is safe for our children to practice on. This volunteer work has been happening since we (the residents) only hear "No Funding" every year.

If this body is generous enough to appropriate thirty (\$39,000) nine thousand dollars to the Talofoto Mayor's Office for the repairs and upgrades of an outdoor sports facilities, then let it be for the outdoor basketball and tennis court adjacent to Talofoto Elementary School.

These two outdoor sports facilities (once upon a time) were being used by (Talofoto Elem.) teachers for their Physical Education class time. The teachers stopped using the outdoor sports facilities due to the overgrown weeds/shrubs and the rusty fences, three years ago. The tennis court was adopted by a family, but their adoption involved only cutting the grass and bushes around the court area.

In closing, Bill155-33, falls short in identifying which **Baseball Field** in **Talofoto** is receiving the appropriations.

Bill No. 155-33 (LS) under Section 1 proposes to appropriate \$39,000 from the initial savings realized in from refunding of the Government of Guam General Obligation Bonds, 2007 Series A and the Government of Guam General Obligation Bonds, 2009 Series A per P.L. 33-060, to the *Talofu'fo'* Mayor's Office for the purposes of repair and upgrades to the *Talofu'fo'* baseball field.

The Guam Economic Development Authority (GEDA) has completed the refinancing of the noted Bonds. As such, the actual net amount of the estimated net savings is \$1,575,972 to become available around September 30, 2015. However, there are several legislative bills identified below, for various proposed appropriations from the identified savings:

As calculated, \$1,023,455 has been identified for appropriations, leaving the available balance of \$552,517 for the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority (GMHA) pursuant to P.L. 33-060.

It should be noted that P.L. 33-060 provides that any potential savings be used "toward capital improvements relating to the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority and other health related matters." As such, any alternate proposed use of those savings would redirect funds from the intended purpose of this law.
