COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

Bill No. 163-33 (LS) was introduced on August 18, 2015 by Senator Michael F.Q. San Nicolas and was subsequently referred on August 19, 2015 by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement.

The Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement convened a public hearing on September 18, 2015 at 9:00 am in *I Liheslaturan's* Public Hearing Room to receive public testimony on Bill No. 163-33 (LS).

Public Notice Requirements

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on September 10, 2015 (5-Day Notice) and again on September 16, 2015 (48-Hour Notice). Notice was also posted on Legislative TV Channel.

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 9:00am.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Chairperson Ada called the Public Hearing to order and yields to the sponsor of the bill.

Senator San Nicolas: He started by giving a brief summary of Bill No. 163-33. There are over eight thousand applicants that are waiting for their properties. He explained that the biggest bottleneck holding back these properties is surveying. The Land Trust does not have the monetary resources to be able to survey these properties and get them out to the beneficiaries. This bill would help the Land Trust become less cash poor by accelerating the lease payments. He added that we could use the ninety-nine dollars, due over the course of one year, for the purpose of surveying properties. Another provision in the bill would remove property tax exemptions since the government is paying for the surveying. He added that the revenue from the taxes could then be used to survey more properties. He concluded by saying that this bill is just a piece of the puzzle to make this twenty-year old idea become reality for many of our people.

Michael Borja, *Director*, *Department of Land Management*: He fully supports Bill No. 163-33 for two parts. The first, being the ninety-nine dollar lease payments to be made in one year would allow the Commission to be financially efficient. The second part, being the waiving of property tax exceptions would provide fairness to the system. He explained that we have to be fair to the people who have already paid for their own surveys and leases and not allow this seven-year exemption that they currently get. He concluded by saying that the Chamorro Land Trust will become more responsible and transparent.

Chairperson Ada: He asked Mr. Borja if the proceeds would get deposited into the General Fund.

Mr. Borja: He replied saying that the funds would be assigned to a certain ledger account designated from the Chamorro Land Trust. It would then be for general use.

Chairperson Ada: He explained that the previous bill was more prescriptive of how the money is to be used and where it's to be deposited. He wanted to report Bill No. 164-33 first so that it establishes the account and then report out Bill No. 163-33 so that the accelerated lease payments will go into the Special Survey Fund for its particular purpose.

Ted Nelson: He explained that the sale of the lots in the Land for the Landless subdivisions could be used by Land Management to begin surveying.

Chairperson Ada ends the public hearing for Bill No. 163-33 (LS).

III. Findings and Recommendations

The Committee finds that all revenues from the accelerated lease payments to the Chamorro Land Trust Commission should be deposited into the *Chamorro Land Trust Survey Fund*. Upon enactment of the creation of said fund by Bill No. 164-33 into Public Law, all revenues from Bill No. 163-33 shall be deposited into the new fund (The Chamorro Land Trust Survey Fund).

The Committee recommends that expenditures from the *Chamorro Land Trust Survey Fund* shall be used for surveying and mapping of CLTC land tracts for agricultural and residential leases. Testimony from the public hearing for Bill 163-33 summarized the need for the Commission to become financially efficient and is in need of funding sources to survey, map, and register agricultural and residential tracts in order to issue leases to the more than 8,000 applicants.

After considering the findings and testimonies given at the public hearing, the Committee hereby reports out Bill 163-33 (LS) As Amended, with the recommendation to the report out only.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section I. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that the time and cost associated with monitoring and processing payments for Chamorro Land Trust Commission (CLTC) agricultural and residential ninety-nine (99) year leases would be more efficient with an established time period for full payment of the lease. The one dollar (\$1.00) per year CLTC lease should be paid by lessees in an accelerated manner for effective processing of such leases.

8 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that § 75108 (g) of Chapter 75, Title 21, 9 Guam Code Annotated provides original CLTC lessees an exemption from all 10 taxes for the first seven (7) years from date of lease. Additionally, a survey of 11 assigned land is a mandatory prerequisite for all leases. Many applicants often have 12 difficulty paying for a survey of their assigned land, and therefore, are unable to obtain a lease to use the land. This single issue has been the cause for delaying the
 issuances of leases for CLTC lessees.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that the current listing of CLTC applicants awaiting leased property numbers over eight thousand (8,000) individuals, with approximately four thousand nine hundred of these applicants having applied since December 1995. This twenty (20) year wait for those who have applied for leases since the beginning of the CLTC and all other individuals that constitute the rest of the list requires that the government take effective action to adequately comply with the primary objective of the CLTC.

Section 2. Establishment of Payment for Ninety-Nine (99) Year Lease. §
75108(b) of Chapter 75, Title 21, Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to
read:

13 "(b) The lessee shall pay a rental of One Dollar (\$1.00) a year for the tract 14 and the lease shall be for a term of ninety-nine (99) years. <u>Payment for the full</u> 15 term of the lease *shall* be paid, in full, within one (1) year from the effective date 16 of the lease and *shall* be effective for all existing leases. The payments of such 17 leases *may* be used for the payment of surveying Chamorro homelands pursuant to 18 § 75108(g)(1) of this chapter.

(1) The remaining balance on any residential or agricultural lease terminated prior to its expiration *shall* be refunded."

Section 3. Waiving of Tax Exemptions for Surveyed Property. § 75108
 (g) of Chapter 75, Title 21, Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read:

"(g) The lessee shall perform such other conditions, not in conflict with any
provision of this Chapter, as the Commission may stipulate in the lease, provided,
however, that an original lessee shall be exempt from all taxes for the first seven
(7) years from date of lease.

The Chamorro Land Trust Commission (CLTC) supports the two elements of Bill No. 163-33 regarding the payment of the residential and agriculture leases, and the property tax exemption waiver.

The annual cost of a CLTC residential and agriculture lease is one dollar. The steps necessary to account for this nominal payment vastly outweighs the fee itself. These steps include invoicing, printing and mailing, receiving and posting the payment, depositing and reconciling bank accounts; and, if necessary, pursuing collection of the one dollar if payment is delinquent. Multiply this times the number of CLTC leases and the manpower alone would demand we have a large office of accounting clerks and accountants.

This bill would create an efficiency in the system by requiring all residential and agriculture lease be paid in full, ninety-nine dollars (\$99), within the first year of the lease.

With CLTC's plan to survey its properties in order to expedite the issuance of residential and agriculture leases, the second part of this bill will eliminate the lessee's exemption to pay property taxes in the first seven years of the lease. Since this lessee did not expend any resources for the survey of the property, the property tax payments would begin once the lease is effective. Since many applicants have financial difficulty completing their surveys, CLTC would complete the surveys. The money collected from the property tax would then assist with the payment of other land surveys.
