COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

Bill No. 164-33 (LS) was introduced on August 20, 2015 by Senator Thomas C. Ada and was subsequently referred on August 21, 2015 by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement.

The Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement convened a public hearing on September 18, 2015 at 9:00 am in *I Liheslaturan's* Public Hearing Room to receive public testimony on Bill No. 164-33 (LS).

Public Notice Requirements

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on September 10, 2015 (5-Day Notice) and again on September 16, 2015 (48-Hour Notice). Notice was also posted on the Legislative channel.

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 9:00am.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Chairperson Ada called the Public Hearing to order and, as sponsor, gives an introduction of the bill.

Chairperson Ada: He starts by giving a brief synopsis of Bill No. 164-33. He explains that the bill proposes to create a Chamorro Land Trust Survey Fund from the sale of bull cart trails and land remnants that belong to the Government of Guam. The bull cart trails to be made available for sale are those which no longer serves its originally intended public transportation purpose or are now landlocked. Many bull cart trails negatively impact private properties because they unnecessarily dissect properties or leave a gap in between two contiguous lots. Included in the sale authorization are Government of Guam land remnants which were the result of the adoption of the standard block system. These are lots that are substandard in size, and would not be suitable for construction of any facility. The proceeds do not include trails or spaces of government lands that provide access to the beach. Proceeds from the sales will be deposited into the Survey Fund and its use will be restricted solely for enabling the surveying of (un-surveyed) CLTC lands and for operational use in support of the survey requirements.

Chairperson Ada continues by calling those who have signed up to give a testimony.

Michael Borja, *Director*, *Department of Land Management*: He reads his written testimony in favor of the bill (see written testimony attached).

He goes on to say that a number of individuals have come before the Department of Land Management because they do have pieces or portions of property that are considered bull cart trails or old roads that begin and end nowhere except that they transit through and divide their properties up or they can be an addition to some of their properties. He explains that sometimes the landowners are not permitted to purchase them because they still serve a purpose as a utility easement or access to someone else's property. He concludes his testimony by saying that there are still many of them throughout the island.

Debbie Quinata, *Nasion Chamoru:* She starts by saying that there was a bill introduced, several years ago, to allow Chamorro Land Trust lands to be sold to qualified recipients. She further states that, "*All Chamorro Land Trust lands are to be held in perpetuity and not be sold.*" The bull cart trails were put in place to keep people from being landlocked. There are other ways that the Commission can obtain funding for surveys and infrastructure. One way is to provide infrastructure that resorts back to the utility agencies of the island. The agencies and developer work together to put in infrastructure and the service is billed to the residents. The ratepayers will get their money back from the utilities for Chamorro residential and agricultural tracts. She objects to any kind of sale of bull cart trails, remnants, or slots of land that is supposed to remain in the inventory of the Chamorro Land Trust.

John Brown, *Vice-President and General Counsel, Jones & Guerrero Company, Inc.:* He reads his testimony in support of the bill, which offered some recommendations and amendments (see written testimony attached).

He goes on to say that the term, *landowner*, should not include tenants because it takes away the property from the adjoining landowner and makes them a hostage to his/her tenant. He thinks that there should be some clarification by definition of *landowner* pursuant to section 3102 of 21 GCA in regards to estate in fee simple. He offered to amend that section in the law through oral testimony.

Ted Nelson: He starts by saying that he is in support of the bill except for a few concerns. He wants to know how much money is being anticipated for the surveying of the properties and how long it will take to generate money for residential and agricultural subdivisions. He also wants to know why there is no appropriation from the Government to survey lands for the Chamorros. He exclaims that we should use Section 30 money to supplement and augment resources to start surveying immediately and distribute them to the many applicants. He proposes to use 2015 lapses from every line agency and give the funds to the Chamorro Land Trust so it can begin issuing the land. He concludes his testimony by saying that we can bring pride back to the younger generation so they can realize the Chamorro Dream.

Chairperson Ada: He says that there are requests from landowners to buy the bull cart trails that runs through their property. That money would go into the General Fund. He further

explains that this bill creates a survey fund where those proceeds will go into. There are other bills that will provide sources of funding for survey needs.

Mr. Nelson: He explains that bull cart trails were established to create an agreement between two or more landowners to sell. He doesn't want to sell the bull cart trail down in Gun Beach.

Ms. Quinata: She doesn't think there is regulation that stops people from leasing properties that encumber their ability to develop. There are long-term leases that pay the Chamorro Land Trust over and over again. Once it is sold, the money is gone forever. She is also very concerned with businesses taking advantage of this legislation to cut off access to the ocean and natural resources. She concludes by suggesting that the Chamorro Land Trust be audited for misappropriation of funds.

Chairperson Ada ends the public hearing for Bill No. 164-33 (LS).

III. Findings and Recommendations

The Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement has included parameters for when the sale of bull cart trails and land remnants may be considered, as well as the process for equitably disposing of the land."

The Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement, hereby reports out **Bill 164-33 (LS) as amended**, with the recommendation <u>5 to do pass</u>.

AN ACT TO CREATE A CHAMORRO LAND TRUST SURVEY FUND FROM THE SALES OF GOVERNMENT OF GUAM LANDS SUCH AS BULL CART TRAILS AND LAND REMNANTS AND TO ADD A NEW SUBSECTION (k) TO §75112 OF CHAPTER 75, TITLE 21, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *1 Liheslaturan* 3 *Guåhan* finds that the Chamorro Land Trust property inventory contains a 4 substantial amount of property that has yet to be surveyed and registered. *I* 5 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that the Chamorro Land Trust 6 Commission is prohibited by §75105(f) of Chapter 75 in 21 GCA from 7 *`leasing or licensing any available land until it is registered.*'

8 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* also finds that there are numerous instances of 9 land remnants, which have no utility for purposes of construction of 10 facilities or for transportation purposes, e.g. bull cart trails that begin and 11 end in the same lot. Notwithstanding, these remnants have value and utility 12 for landowners who own properties contiguous to the remnants. *I* 13 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* receives numerous requests for authorization to 14 purchase these remnants or old bull cart trails.

15 I Liheslaturan Guåhan intends to establish a special fund where 16 proceeds from the sale of the remnants shall be deposited into and used exclusively to provide supplemental funding to survey and register available
lands within the CLT property inventory and subsequently assign said
properties to eligible recipients for their intended purposes, i.e. as residential
or agricultural lots.

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Section 2. A new §75112 (k) of Chapter 75, Title 21, Guam Code Annotated is hereby added to read as follows:

"(k) The Chamorro Land Trust Survey Fund. The Chamorro Land 7 Trust Commission shall create a special Fund called the Chamorro Land 8 Trust Survey Fund, which shall be maintained separate and apart from any 0 other funds and is subject to I Liheslaturan Guåhan's appropriation. 10 Notwithstanding any other provision requiring the deposit of proceeds to 11 other funds, the Fund shall receive the proceeds of all sales of Government 12 13 of Guam lands such as bull cart trails, substandard lots, irregular lots, remnants, splinter lots, fractional lots, easement purchase remnants and 14 easement condemnation remnants. The Fund shall be used for the surveying 15 and mapping of Chamorro Land Trust Commission properties. 16

17 The Commission shall report on a quarterly basis to the Speaker of *I* 18 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* the revenues collected and expended from the Fund 19 and post the same on the website of the Chamorro Land Trust Commission. 20 The Fund shall be subject to audit by the Guam Public Auditor."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* 3 finds that the Chamorro Land Trust land inventory contains a substantial 4 amount of land that has yet to be surveyed and registered. *I Liheslaturan* 5 *Guåhan* further finds that the Chamorro Land Trust Commission is 6 prohibited by §75105(f) of Chapter 75 in 21 GCA from '*leasing or licensing* 7 *any available land until it is surveyed and registered.*'

8 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* also finds that the government of Guam has a 9 number of land remnants that are substandard in size, and as a consequence 10 would not be suitable to build on. Additionally, there exists numerous 11 stretches of bull cart trails which no longer serve the transportation function 12 they were originally intended for because they have been replaced by 13 alternate road corridors have been constructed subsequently. And in many

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cases these trails are now landlocked. Notwithstanding, these land remnants 1 2 have value and utility for landowners who own properties contiguous to the 3 remnants or the trails. I Liheslaturan Guåhan receives numerous requests for authorization to purchase these public land remnants and old bull cart trails. 4

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I Liheslaturan Guåhan intends to authorize the sale of these bullcart trails and land remnants. The proceeds from the sales will be deposited into 6 a newly created Fund and will be used solely for the surveying of un-7 surveyed CLTC land and for operational needs in support thereof.

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Section 2. §75105(c) in Chapter 75 of 21 GCA is amended to read:

"(c) The department, with the approval of the Commission, or the 10Commission may sell to any contiguous landowner any fractional lot 11 12 placed under its management which was created by the adoption of the standard block system, or bull cart trails that no longer serve the 13 transportation function originally intended. The Chamorro Land Trust 14 Commission shall offer any such land for sale to any contiguous 15 landowner of such property, on written application of such owner, 16 provided: 17

- 18 (i) The land is not contiguous to government property, serves as a 19 utility easement, or provides access to natural resources.
- (ii) The sale price be based on the appraised fair market value 20 21 having due regard to the fair market value of contiguous properties. and that the price be paid in full in cash equivalent. 22
- 23 (iii) If the property extends into property other than that belonging to the applicant, that the property to be sold shall be subdivided to 24 align with the borders of such adjacent owners. 25
- (iv) Notice of the application shall be given to all owners of land 26within 500 feet adjacent to the applicant's land. 27

1 (vi) Where the land to be sold adjoins land in addition to the 2 applicant's land, and such owner timely objects to the application, the 3 land shall be sold by highest cash price bid at an auction conducted to 4 include the applicant and any other such owner objecting, it being a 5 condition of sale that the highest price bid is not less than the 6 appraised fair market value.

(vii) Unless expressly provided otherwise, any use of the term
"owner," in relation to interests in real property, in this Title, as well
as any derivative thereof, including but not limited to "land owner" or
"property owner," is presumed to mean an owner in fee simple or
absolute fee, and to exclude any other estate or interest therein.

12 Section 3. A new §75112(k) in Chapter 75 of 21 GCA is added to 13 read:

"(k) The Chamorro Land Trust Survey Fund. The Chamorro Land 14 15 Trust Commission shall create a special Fund called the Chamorro Land Trust Survey Fund, which shall be maintained separate and apart from 16 any other funds. Notwithstanding any other provision requiring the 17 deposit of proceeds to other funds, the Fund shall receive the proceeds of 18 19 all sales of bull cart trails, substandard lots, irregular lots, remnants, 20splinter lots, fractional lots, easement purchase remnants and easement 21 condemnation remnants belonging to the Government of Guam. The Fund shall be used for the surveying and mapping of Chamorro Land 22 23 Trust Commission properties and for the operational support of the surveying and mapping efforts. 24

The Commission shall report on a quarterly basis to the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* the revenues collected and expended from the Fund and post the same on the website of the Chamorro Land Trust Commission. The Fund shall be subject to audit by the Guam Public
 Auditor."

Section 5. Severability. If any provision of this law or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity *shall not* affect other provisions or applications of this law, which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application and to this end the provisions of this act are severable.

RE: Bill No. 164-33 re Chamorro Land Trust Survey Fund

Dear Senators,

Jones & Guerrero Co., Inc. owns several blocks of land accumulated over fifty years, a few of which are burdened by adjacent or intersecting bull cart trails. Some of these bull cart trails are landlocked and extend beyond J&G's property lines, but not far and to no useable destination. The presence of these lands impede the highest and best available use and value of J&G's lands, and provide no benefit to the government.

J&G registers its support of the referenced bill if it is modified as mentioned below.

First, although only a finding, the language on lines 10 and 11, page 1, implies a limitation and should be clearly more broad. Please consider amending it, such as:

"... facilities or for transportation purposes. e.g. bull cart trails that <u>are landlocked</u>, <u>serve no useful purpose to the public</u>, begin and end in the same lot, <u>or otherwise</u> provide no benefit to the Commission or its purposes. Notwithstanding"

Second, as implied above, these useless lands are by their nature idled and cannot be put to beneficial use, thus are a dead weight on the community and coffers of the government. J&G therefore respectfully suggests that there be directive language in the bill, or amendment of other provisions of Chapter 75, to the effect that:

the Commission *shall* offer any such land for sale to any contiguous land owner of such property, on written application of such owner, provided:

(1) that the sale price be based on the appraised fair market value having due regard to the fair market value of contiguous properties, and that the price be paid in full in cash equivalent;

Page 2:

and, (2) if the property extends into property other than that belonging to the applicant, that the property to be sold shall be subdivided to align with the borders of such adjacent owners;

and, (3) that notice of the application be given to any owner of land within 500 feet adjacent to the applicant's land;

and, (4) that where the land to be sold adjoins land in addition to the applicant's land, and such other owner timely objects to the application, the land shall be sold by highest cash price bid at an auction conducted to include the applicant and any other such owner objecting, it being a condition of sale that the highest price bid is not less than the appraised fair market value.

This suggestion enhances the utility of the proposed Chamorro Land Trust Survey Fund, for the benefit of its beneficiaries. It enhances the utility of the lands of adjoining landowners. And it enhances the coffers of Guam by putting those idle lands into the hands of rate paying private parties.

J&G appreciates your consideration.

The creation of the Chamorro Land Trust Survey Fund stems from the Chamorro Land Trust Commission's (CLTC) property inventory containing a substantial amount of property that has yet to be surveyed and registered. In order for the CLTC to lease any of the properties in their inventory, the property must be surveyed and registered per §75105(f), Chapter 75, 21 GCA. Subsequently, there have been requests for legislative approval to sell land remnants owned by the Government of Guam, such as bull cart trails. The proposed legislation would deposit the proceeds from the sale of these land remnants into the newly created Chamorro Land Trust Survey Fund for the purpose of alding the CLTC in covering the costs for surveys and registration of the CLTC property inventory. Per the CLTC, the proposed legislation provides a good source of funding for land surveys and would allow them to issue out leases more expeditiously.

Funding to Survey Chamorro Land Trust Properties

Hagåtña, Guam: On August 20, 2015, Senator Tom Ada introduced Bill No. 164-33. The bill seeks to create a Special Survey Fund for the purpose of procuring surveying services for Chamorro Land Trust properties. Senator Ada stated, "*The Chamorro Land Trust Commission needs funding to sustain efforts to survey unregistered lots in their inventory*" He added that, "*The commission is prohibited from leasing or licensing any available land until it is registered*."

Bill 164-33 authorizes the Chamorro Land Trust Commission to establish this special revenue fund and account for all proceeds from the various land bills enacted into law affecting land transactions that involve the sale of government land such as bull cart trails, substandard, irregular, or fractional lots, which no longer have any functional utility. These kinds of properties are pervasive throughout the island. Senator Ada said "*as landowners look to maximize the use of their properties, we can anticipate more and more requests for such land transactions.*"
