COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

Bill 194-33 (LS) was introduced on October 20, 2015 by Senator Thomas C. Ada and was subsequently referred on October 21, 2015 to the Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement.

The Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement convened a public hearing on October 29, 2015 at 1:30 pm in *Liheslaturan Guahan* Public Hearing Room to receive public testimony on Bill No. 194-33 (LS).

Public Notice Requirements

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on October 22, 2015 (5-Day Notice) and again on October 26, 2015 (48-Hour Notice).

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 1:30pm.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Chairperson Ada: Chairperson Ada reads the synopsis of the bill and asks Mr. Joe Borja to give a brief description of the property.

Joe Borja, Staff Member: Mr. Borja explains that Lot No. 3463 consists of approximately 38 acres in the municipality of Agana Heights. The property is actually located outside of the village and has the military petroleum oil line as well as GPA's high voltage power lines that run through the property. The property is also in the flight path of airplanes landing and is in the vicinity of where the Korean Airline crash site is located. He describes the Lot as being hilly with ravines and lower areas where water collects.

Senator Underwood: Asks Mr. Borja, what is the total acreage of the area?

Joe Borja: Replies it is about 38 acres.

Senator Underwood: Asks Mr. Borja, would it be possible to build a school with the pipelines running through it.

Joe Borja: He responds with no.

Senator Underwood: She explains Lot 3463 based on the description of the property is not feasible to build a school on it and poses a problem for DOE.

Senator Anthony Ada: Asks Mr. Borja, what would we be able to build there if the land reverts back to the land trust?

Joe Borja: You might be able to put some housing there or use it as a aqua culture farm because of the ravines that are on the property. He explains that not all the property may be used for agriculture or residential purposes, but certainly there are some parts that can be used for it. The portions not suitable for residential or agricultural use could be preserved for green space.

Senator Anthony Ada: Asks Mr. Borja, would we be finding ourselves giving leases out for these properties and there is not infrastructure for it.

Chairperson Ada: Responds by saying that it is CLTC to handle that situation. He explains that all the bill does is transfer property into the CLTC inventory, because the reserved property is not suitable to build a school. He then concludes the discussion and declares Bill 194-33 as being duly heard.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

The committee finds that Lot No. 3463 reserved by Public Law 22-18 for the Guam Department of Education is not suitable to construct a Central High School because of the existence of a military fuel line and GPA's high voltage lines that run through the property as well as the topography of the land.

The committee further finds that GPA has reserved utility easement rights on Lot No. 3463 in order to operate and maintain existing electrical and fuel lines. GPA operates and maintains those lines in agreement with the Department of the Navy. The committee recommends adding language to Bill 194-33 preserving the existing easement for GPA.

The Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement hereby reports out **Bill 194-33 (LS) as amended**, with the recommendation ~~PASSED~~.

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guāhan* finds that
3 in 1993 Public Law 22-18 reserved Lot 3463, Municipality of Agana Heights for a central high
4 school.

5 *I Liheslaturan Guāhan* further finds that a central high school has already been built now
6 known as Tiyan High located in Tiyan. *Additionally, I Liheslaturan Guāhan* finds that Lot 3463,
7 Municipality of Agana Heights is unsuitable for the construction of central high school due to
8 location, topography, lack of infrastructure, numerous easements for pipelines and high power
9 electrical lines and a lack of adequate access.

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10 *I Liheslaturan Guāhan* intends to transfer the entire Lot 3463, Municipality of Agana
11 Heights consisting of 38.83 acres to the Chamorro Land Trust Commission for residential and
12 agricultural leasing.

13 **Section 2. Property Transfer.** Lot 3463, Municipality of Agana Heights as shown in
14 Exhibit A, Department of Land Management Map No. 387-FY91 shall be transferred to the
15 Chamorro Land Trust Commission to be added into the Chamorro Land Trust Commission
16 Lands Inventory for residential and agricultural leasing.

17 **Section 3. Rescission of Land Reservation From The Reserved Lands List.** The
18 38.83 acres of Lot 3463 reserved for the construction of the Central High School pursuant to P.L.
19 22-18 is hereby deleted from the reserved lands list.

20 **Section 3. Exemption.** § 2107 of Title 2, Guam Code Annotated and the Standing Rules
21 of *I Mina' Trentai Tres Na Liheslaturan Guāhan* relative to the appraisals of land *shall not apply*
22 to this Act.

3 that Public Law 22-18 (enacted in 1993) reserved 38.83-acres within Lot No. 3463
4 in the Municipality of Agana Heights, for the Guam Department of Education
5 (GDOE) to construct a Central High School within said Lot.

6 FY91, *shall* be transferred to the Chamorro Land Trust Commission to be added
7 into the Chamorro Land Trust Commission Lands Inventory for residential and
8 agricultural leasing.

9 **Section 3. Reduction of Acreage From The Reserved Lands List.** The
10 38.83 acres of Lot No. 3463, Municipality of Agana Heights, reserved for the
11 construction of a Central High School pursuant to Public Law 22-18 is hereby
12 deleted from the Government of Guam Reserved Lands List.


13 **Section 4. Preservation of Easements.** All existing easements on Lot No.
14 3463, Municipality of *Agana Heights*, shall remain reserved for GPA and GWA to
15 allow for continued operation and maintenance of electrical facilities and fuel
16 lines.

18 Standing Rules of *I Mina' Trentai Tres Na Lihesluran Guåhan* relative to the
19 appraisals of land *shall not* apply to this Act.

20 **Section 6. Severability.** If any provision of this law or its application to

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

The Guam Power Authority provides the following testimony for Bill No. 194-33 relative to the conveyance of property to the Chamorro Land Trust Commission (CLTC).

GPA operates and maintains electrical facilities, a fuel oil line and maintenance access roads on the subject property through a Lease Agreement with the Department of the Navy.

Consequently, GPA reserves its rights to the following easements for the continued operation and maintenance of the existing electrical facilities, access road and fuel line:

- 50' Transmission Line Easement (Civil Case#32-50) filed under document number 23717 in the Department of Land Management, Government of Guam (DLM);
- Access Road to 34kV Transmission Easement (Civil Case#19-58) filed under document number 34292 in the Department of Land Management, Government of Guam (DLM);
- Petroleum, Oil and Lubricants (POL) Easement (Civil Case#59-58) filed under document number 34957 in the Department of Land Management, Government of Guam (DLM).

BUREAU OF BUDGET AND MANAGEMENT RESEARCH
COMMENTS ON BILL NO. 194-33 (L.S.)

The proposed legislation intends to transfer Lot No. 3463 in the municipality of Agana Heights to the Chamorro Land Trust Commission. The subject property was initially reserved to construct a Central High School through P.L. 22-18, but a Central High School (Tiyan High School) has already been built (in the municipality of Tiyan) and is already operational. Because Lot No. 3463 is not being utilized for its intended purpose, the proposed legislation aims provide an alternative use of this lot by transferring it into the Chamorro Land Trust Commission's land inventory designated for residential and agricultural leasing.

Although the proposed legislation will transfer to and authorize the CLTC to utilize the subject property's 38.83 acres for residential/agricultural leases, it does not specifically state which type of lease will be utilized. §75107(a) of Chapter 75, Title 21 Guam Code Annotated delineates the minimum and maximum amount of acres authorized for different types of agriculture/residential leases (subsistence agricultural or aquaculture farming; commercial agricultural or aquaculture use; grazing use; and residential lots). Subsequently, because the proposed legislation doesn't specify which type of lease the property will be utilized as, the amount of leases that can be awarded on the property cannot be determined.

§75108(b) states that each lessee shall pay a rental of one dollar (\$1.00) per year for the term of ninety-nine (99) years. For example, if one commercial agricultural lease (maximum 20 acres per lessee) and one grazing lease (maximum 20 acres per lessee) is awarded on the subject property, anticipated revenue to be received by the end of the lease terms will amount to \$198. However, if one commercial agricultural lease and nineteen (19) residential leases (maximum once acre per lessee) are awarded, the anticipated revenue to be received by the end of the lease term will amount to \$1,980.

Subsequently, §75107(f) specifies that the lessee shall pay any taxes assessed upon the improvements made on the property during the duration of their lease period. Increased tax assessments are correlated with improved infrastructure on the property.

It should be noted that the proposed legislation does provide for revenue generating opportunities for the Government of Guam. However, due to not having sufficient information on the specific type of leases to be awarded on the subject property, the Bureau cannot determine the estimated revenues to be received.

SENATOR TOM ADA SEEKS TO ADD 225 ACRES OF LAND TO THE CHAMORRO LAND TRUST INVENTORY.

Hagåtña, Guam: On October 20, 2015, Senator Tom Ada introduced Bills 192, 193, 194 and 195, which will add 225 acres of land to the Chamorro Land Trust Commission's Available Lands Inventory. "*The lands will be put into the Commission's available lands inventory for residential and agricultural leasing*", said Sen. Tom Ada.

The 225 acres of lands were originally reserved in 1993 by Public Law 22-18 for use by various GovGuam agencies. In its review, the Legislative Committee on Lands found that the land reservations were for projects to build schools and health facilities. Two of the lot portions had been reserved to construct the As-Tumbo Middle School and the As-Tumbo Elementary School. Constructions of these schools were completed in 2007 and 2008, but at different locations. In another case, property was reserved to build a foster home; but a different site was instead chosen for the construction. "*Land is a precious resource. If it is not going to be used for its original intended purpose, then it needs to be accounted for and added to the Chamorro Land Trust land inventory for residential or agricultural use*" said Sen. Tom Ada.

The two other lots, Lot 3463 Agana Heights and Lot 3470 Chalan Pago, have significant development issues. Lot 3463 in the Municipality of Agana Heights is unsuitable for the construction of a central high school due to location, topography, lack of infrastructure, numerous easements for pipelines and high power electrical lines and a lack of adequate access. Lot 3470 in the Municipality of Chalan Pago is unsuitable for the construction of public facilities due to location, topography, lack of infrastructure and a lack of adequate access.

The 225 total acres are located in different areas: seventy (70) acres in Dededo, thirty-eight (38) acres in Agana Heights and one hundred seventeen (117) acres in Chalan Pago. "*The*

acreage to be added will offset acreage that may otherwise be used by the CLTC for commercial leasing,” said Sen. Ada.

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Las Vegas casinos not rushing to join daily fantasy game

LAS VEGAS (AP) — It has been more than a week since Nevada regulators told the daily fantasy sports industry to get a gambling license or get out, and before they made their exits, the top two companies inferred regulators were playing favorites to protect Nevada's golden ticket: casinos and sports books.

There was no playing favorites, say state regulators and casino operators.

The state's sports books, for one, haven't suffered with the recent existence of daily fantasy sports. They kept \$427 million of what was bet on football, basketball, baseball and other sports last year, up 61 percent since 2011, according to Nevada Gaming Control Board statistics.

While last week's legal op-

erion opened the door for already-licensed gambling establishments to enter the daily fantasy sports game in Nevada, none appear to be rushing to join.

Those lucrative gambling licenses, a result of intense background investigations by Nevada agents who aim to root out unsavory characters from an industry that's only a few decades removed from its mob past and wants it to stay that way, keep their multi-billion dollar operations humming.

They may have clarity in Nevada, but they don't have it outside the state's boundaries. The intense scrutiny and investigations by federal authorities, plus a warning from Nevada's regulators, also hasn't engendered any sort of confidence about stepping into the fray.
