

COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

Bill 195-33 (LS) was introduced on October 20, 2015 by Senator Thomas C. Ada and was subsequently referred on October 21, 2015 to the Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement.

The Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement convened a public hearing on October 29, 2015 at 1:30 pm in *I Liheslaturan Guahan* Public Hearing Room to receive public testimony on Bill No. 195-33 (LS).

Public Notice Requirements

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via email to all Senators and all main media outlets on October 22, 2015 (5-Day Notice) and again on October 26, 2015 (48-Hour Notice). Publication was conducted in the October 22, 2015 issue of the *Guam Daily Post* and in the October 26, 2015 issue of *Pacific Daily News*, *newspapers of general circulation*, fulfilling the 5-Day Notice and the 48-hour Notice of the Open Government Law requirements respectively.

The Public Hearing was Called-to-Order at 1:30pm.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Chairperson Ada: Chairperson Ada reads the synopsis of the bill and asks Mr. Joseph Borja to give a brief description of the property.

Joseph Borja, *Committee Analyst*: Mr. Borja referred to projected graphic exhibits of Lot 3470. A copy of that exhibit is attached for reference. Mr. Borja states that Lot 3470, Chalan Pago is approximately 117 acres in size. The property boundaries extend from the north around *Chilenko Road* where the Ordot-Chalan Pago sports facilities are located to the southern boundary of the property the *Asinan River*. The Asinan River is fed from the leachate of the former Ordot Dump, becomes the southern boundary of Lot 3470 and eventually empties into Pago Bay.

Chairperson Ada calls those who have signed up to give testimony.

Jessy C. Gogue, *Mayor of Ordot-Chalan Pago* (oral testimony): Good afternoon, Senators and thank you for allowing me to testify for this bill. I am opposed to turning over any part of this land to the *Chamorro Land Trust Commission* because there are still a lot of problems that have yet to be resolved within their inventory. I can attest here that Mr. Borja has been the most responsive director regarding land management issues that I've ever dealt with since my time as mayor. With respect to this particular lot, there may already be *Chamorro Land Trust Uses* of this property because there is actually a family living at the end of *Chalan Chilenko* road. In addition, there's actually an agricultural area that's currently being used by an individual who's farming there. Has the *Chamorro Land Trust Commission* already taken some kind of authority over Lot 3470 to issue out leases?

Lot 3470, designated in Public Law 22-18, involved several agencies, which divided up 117.94 acres and gave 35 acres to Department of Education for a middle school. He referenced another area near the bottom of Lot 3470, which was turned over to the Texas A&M Foundation. Over the last couple years, there has a been a group proposing a high density development called the Sigua Highlands Development which would encompass 5,000 residential units within that property belonging to Texas A&M. I believe that there are two proposed tower complexes for the elderly. Each tower would contain 925 units, which is a total of 1,850 units and the rest of them would be high-density town home type units all in close proximity to Lot 3470. If you take a look at the only middle school that serves Chalan-Pago, which is Agueda Johnson Middle School, we are already over capacity by almost a couple hundred students. The Department of Education should be here to talk about expansion or construction of another middle school. To turn over the entire 117 acres to the CLTC has me concerned because I'm looking into the future. What better place to develop than in the central part of the island? The Guam Memorial Hospital was also given 35 acres for an acute care hospital so that we can anticipate our medical needs in the future. On average, there are 2,000 births on this island every year not including the migration of people. Over the course of ten years, we're going to have 20,000 new bodies.

Chairperson Ada: So in essence, what was initially reserved decades ago should be kept intact for decades to come just in case.

Mayor Gogue: Yes, it should be. It's not necessarily decades to come but until we can correct the problems that exist within the *Chamorro Land Trust Commission* and they have proven performance that lands are going to be surveyed, infrastructure brought in, and leases given out to properties under their control...

Chairperson Ada: I'm trying to figure out where the source of your objection is. Is it because of a vote of no confidence in the commission or because we don't know where we're going yet and until we do, we should leave that land the way it was reserved to be used decades ago...

Mayor Gogue: It's both, Senator. He emphasized the strategic location of *Chalan Pago* with respect to the island. He noted from a 2010 census, that *Ordot-Chalan Pago* netted the highest growth of all nineteen districts. He went on to explain that a couple years ago, he was challenged by an application from the *Guam Land Use Commission* to take property directly

across from the Ordot Dump and rezone that to light industrial. Fortunately, we were able to argue and convince the commission to disapprove the application. The CLTC and GLUC very seldom give mayors a direct notice like the Legislature does of land issues in their respective districts.

Chairperson Ada: Have you had a chance to read Bill 175?

Mayor Gogue: I didn't read it in its entirety.

Chairperson Ada: I hope that you'll get a copy of that and the level of confidence in the *Chamorro Land Trust* and the disposition of properties might change.

Mayor Gogue: I will read it and you know that I do. He referenced Bill 287-32 and Bill 90-33 that authorized the land exchange between Public Health is done and just needs to be recorded. So the *Chamorro Land Trust* can go ahead and survey the seven (7) acres that was exchanged by law, but turning over the remaining 110 acres to the CLTC is not something I'm in favor of.

Annette Aguon, *Acting Administrator, Department of Public Health and Social Services* (written testimony): My acting director extends his apologies but he was called away for an emergency so I will be reading the testimony that he submitted in writing. The essence of his testimony was that the *Department of Public Health and Social Services* doesn't support Bill No. 195-33 because the DPHSS is in need of the land in order to develop initiatives for Assisted Living, Testing Laboratory for the military buildup, and a Public Health Facility in the future.

Chairperson Ada: Is the Public Health Laboratory in addition to what was constructed up north?

Ms. Aguon: Correct, the one built in *Dededo* was specific for a Mosquito Lab. This attachment is specific to a Public Health Lab for human and specimen testing. The current laboratory in the central facility is inadequate and doesn't have enough space for expansion. The location of Lot 3470 doesn't have the proper infrastructure so we are requesting to seek an alternate site because the cost to build infrastructure before we can build the facility would be too expensive.

Chairperson Ada: Is there any anticipation on how soon the next lab might be constructed?

Ms. Aguon: We are only on Phase 1 out of 4 phases. Phase 1 is the approval of the schematic and drawings. Phase 2 is identifying a piece of land that is approximately 4.5 acres in order for us to move on to Phase 3.

Chairperson Ada: What kind of time frame are we looking at for Phase 2?

Ms. Aguon: I'm not aware of the exact time frame, but I know that the *Department of Interior* has been assisting us and there's been an estimate of about \$13M for this project. The

issue is identifying a piece of property that already has existing infrastructure so that we can move on to the building phase.

Chairperson Ada: It's very likely that the next lab facility Public Health will be asking to build will be adjacent to the Mosquito Lab in *Dededo*. It's also a *Chamorro Land Trust* property there that has infrastructure. He'll probably be asking to build it there too, don't you think?

Ms. Aguon: Most likely, there was internal discussion about that property in *Dededo* near our Mosquito Lab.

Chairperson Ada: So the Department of Public Health might be looking at building it on *Chamorro Land Trust* property in *Dededo*, but keep the acreage in Lot 3470 for what?

Ms. Aguon: We're also leaning towards possibly swapping because the infrastructure at the *Ordot-Chalan Pago* lot is non-existent and so we do not want to delay the progress that has already been made in anticipation for the military buildup, the hub for other U.S. affiliated islands, proximity to Asia, and the need to bring our laboratory capacity up to par and to strengthen it.

Chairperson Ada: I could see where it'd be kind of problematic if the *Chamorro Land Trust* decided to lease out its property in *Dededo* for residential so then it wouldn't be available for the lab.

Mayor Gogue: The bills that authorized the exchange of land for the foster care and the mosquito facility up in *Dededo* already authorized the one for one exchange, not value for value, of land. So the *Chamorro Land Trust* has a segment of land through the public law to carve out their seven acres. If they want to survey the seven acres, we don't have a problem with that because that transfer has been done. But to turn over the 110 acres...

Chairperson Ada: In an earlier hearing, the issue was that the *Department of Public Health* came in and said that they don't want to build there. They wanted to build on nice flat ground in *Dededo, Tamuning*, or in *Barrigada Heights*. We can pull up those records because when Lot 3470 was selected, it was based on a tabletop survey, but when they actually did a terrain walk, and there were hills...

Mayor Gogue: It is challenging terrain and it lacks infrastructure, but take a look at a lot of things we've built. With today's technology and creativity, the land is viable.

Chairperson Ada: We're not saying that it's worthless...with construction technology; we're able to build things.

Chairperson Ada ends the public hearing for Bill No. 195-33 (LS).

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

The Committee finds that portions of Lot 3470, Chalan Pago reserved by Public Law 22-18 are not suitable to construct a middle school, not suitable to construct an acute care hospital, not suitable to construct an adult residential treatment facility, not suitable to construct a children's residential treatment facility, not suitable to construct a crisis center, not suitable to construct a homeless shelter, not suitable to construct a children's foster home, not suitable to construct a public health facility due to the following mitigating circumstances: the lack of infrastructure onsite and off-site, the inevitable increase of automobile and bus traffic on an inadequate 2 lane road through residential neighborhoods and the geological characteristics and topography of the property.

The Committee recognizes the agency and department reservations for these facilities in Public Law 22-18.

Department of Public Health and Social Services: According to their oral testimony DPH&SS would like additional CLTC land in Dededo next to their existing Mosquito Lab <u>and</u> also keep the Lot 3470 land for barter. While only the Department of Public Health physically showed up at the hearing and submitted oral and written testimony, the Committee made additional efforts to get testimonies on record from the other reserving agencies and departments.

Department of Education: A pre-hearing meeting was held on October 19, 2015 with the Department of Education where a description of the property and its elements was presented to the department. After the public hearing DoE eventually submitted written testimony dated November 12 and was delivered at 4:34pm on Friday November 13. DoE recognized the economic impracticality of developing and constructing on Lot 3470 Chalan Pago, however DoE requested special consideration from the Committee to identify other suitable lands in Dededo and Yigo in lieu of Lot 3470 to build schools and facilities. Further, DoE will soon develop a master plan for schools and facilities and would like the Committee's review and consideration of that plan's findings.

Other agencies and departments reserving land in Lot 3470: Post-hearing letters were also sent to non-attending non-testifying agencies and departments inviting written testimonies from the Guam Memorial Hospital and the Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center, only GBHWC responded, there was no response from GMH.

<u>Mayor of Ordot-Chalan Pago</u>: The Committee also recognizes the Mayor of Ordot-Chalan Pago's objections, lack of confidence in the Chamorro Land Trust Commission and his perception of the lack of updated direction on behalf of the Government of Guam. Committee Staff research though indicates that the Mayor's understanding of the acreage exchanged under the bills he cited (Bill 287-32 and Bill 90-33) is mistaken as the Chamorro Land Trust Commission previously had leasing authority and jurisdiction over the unreserved portion of Lot 3470 approximately 22 acres. The reserving agencies and departments in Public Law 22-18 did not fulfill their conditions of compliance.

The Committee finds that the agencies and departments objecting to this bill (and transfer of land) are utilizing the strategy of keeping this lot (acreage) in their department's asset in the hopes of trading this property for another lot more suitable to building their proposed facility. This strategy though denies beneficiaries of the Chamorro Land Trust Commission from receiving residential and agricultural leases, keeps the land out of the tax base and inhibits proper land use and proper land planning.

The Committee also finds that based on previous and recent legislative action *I* Liheslaturan Guahan and the Chamorro Land Trust Commission have always been favorably receptive to the land needs of the community as well as various government agencies, witness: Adacao Elementary School, Okkodo High School, the foster children's home, and various easements.

The Committee will certainly consider, favorably, DoE's upcoming master plan for schools and facilities in Dededo and Yigo as schools in those areas will primarily serve children of Chamorro Land Trust beneficiaries (lessees).

In actuality Lot 3470 and other such lands should have already been transferred to the Chamorro Land Trust Commission by operation of law (Public Law 22-18 Legislative Intent and Section 3 (b) Conditions of Compliance.)

The Committee recommends:

1. To amend Public Law 22-18 to transfer the entire Lot 3470, Municipality of Chalan Pago to the Chamorro Land Trust Commission.

2. To amend the following language to Bill 195-33:

"An act to amend Public Law 22-18 to transfer Lot 3470, Municipality of Chalan Pago reserved by the Department of Education (35 acres for middle school), Guam Memorial Hospital Authority (35 acres for acute care hospital), Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse (5 acres for adult residential treatment facility), Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse (10 acres for children's residential treatment facility), Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse (2 acres for crisis center), Department of Public Health and Social Services (2 acres for homeless shelter), Department of Public Health and Social Services (2 acres for children's foster home), Department of Public Health and Social Services (4 acres for public health facility) to the Chamorro Land Trust Commission for residential and agricultural leasing"

3. To add a new Section 3: Rescission of Land Reservation From The Reserved Lands List to delete Lot 3470 from Public Law 22-18.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhar*finds that in 1993 Public Law 22-18, section 2 paragraph (e) reserved Lot 3470,
Municipality of Chalan Pago formerly Municipality of Sinajana for "Guam's
health care needs".

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that the health agencies of the
Government of Guam have declined the use of Lot 3470, Municipality of Chalan
Pago as unsuitable for construction of health facilities due to location, topography,
lack of infrastructure and a lack of adequate access.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan intends to transfer the entire Lot 3470, Municipality of Chalan Pago consisting of 117 acres to the Chamorro Land Trust Commission for residential and/or agricultural leasing.

Section 2. Property Transfer. Lot 3470, Municipality of Chalan Pago as
 shown in Exhibit A, Department of Land Management Map No. 161FY93 shall be
 transferred to the Chamorro Land Trust Commission to be added into the
 Chamorro Land Trust Commission Lands Inventory for residential and/or

1 agricultural leasing.

Section 3. Exemption. § 2107 of Title 2, Guam Code Annotated and the

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds
that in 1993 Public Law 22-18, section 2 paragraph (e) reserved Lot 3470,
Municipality of *Chalan Pago*—formerly Municipality of *Sinajana*—for "Guam's
health care needs."

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that the health agencies of the
 government of Guam have declined to use Lot 3470, Municipality of *Chalan Pago*,

finding it unsuitable for the construction of health facilities due to location,
 topography, lack of infrastructure, and a lack of adequate access.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan intends to transfer the entire Lot 3470, Municipality
 of *Chalan Pago* consisting of 117 acres to the Chamorro Land Trust Commission
 for residential and/or agricultural leasing.

Section 2. Property Transfer. Lot 3470, Municipality of *Chalan Pago* as
shown in Exhibit A, Department of Land Management Map No. 161FY93 *shall* be
transferred to the Chamorro Land Trust Commission to be added into the
Chamorro Land Trust Commission Lands Inventory for residential and/or
agricultural leasing.

Section 3. Rescission of Land Reservation From The Reserved Lands
 List. The 117 acres of Lot 3470, Municipality of *Chalan Pago*, reserved for
 Guam's health care needs pursuant to Public Law 22-18, is hereby deleted from the
 Government of Guam Reserved Lands List.

Section 4. Exemption. § 2107 of Title 2, Guam Code Annotated and the
 Standing Rules of *I Mina' Trentai Tres Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* relative to the
 appraisals of land *shall not* apply to this Act.

18 Section 5. Severability. If any provision of this law or its application to 19 any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such 20 invalidity *shall not* affect other provisions or applications of this law that can be 21 given effect without the invalid provisions or applications and to this end the 22 provisions of this Act are severable.





We have reviewed Bill No. 195-33 which proposes to transfer Lot 3470, Municipality of Chalan Pago reserved for Guam's Health Care needs to the Chamorro Land Trust Commission for Residential and/or Agricultural leasing.

The proposed facilities listed under Public Law 22-18, Section 2(b) for the department shows 8 facilities of which 3 have been completed. Although we do not have immediate plans or funding to develop the sites listed for a Senior Nursing Home, TanoManamko, Elderly Facility and Trankilidat II, we would request that these lots remain dedicated to the intent of providing options for development that would evolve as we position to address the needs of our elders and public health through alternate options. For example, we are currently working and still developing initiatives on Assisted Living. We are also applying to expand for an Adult Day Care Facility for the elderly where the current Inarajan Senior Center is located on. We are also very close in obtaining a Level 2/3 Testing Laboratory in anticipation of the military buildup. Knowing there is land available for consideration for the use of assisted living facilities, expansion for an Adult Day Care Facility and building a Public Health Laboratory would place us in a better position than not having any properties to consider. These three facilities along will cost millions of dollars but also as important will be the need for land to build on.

Although the intent of Bill 195-33 is commendable, we cannot support the transferring of the properties for the Department of Public Health and Services to the Chamorro Land Trust commission at this time and respectfully request alternate sites for the projects to be provided for the projects we are currently working on for our elders and public health for our community.

to consider future developments that will be needed, for example expansion for a Public Health Facility and also for our Elders.

We have attached a schematic drawing of the proposed Public Health Lab for your information and would be happy to meet with you to provide additional justification for the Assisted Living and request to expand an Adult Day Care Center in Inarajan including any other developments which will require land to build on.







The Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center (GBHWC) would like to retain its continued interest in the reserved property, in reference to <u>Bill No. 195-33 (LS)</u>. The property is critical for the Center's future plans for its Residential Recovery Program (RRP). At present, the Center spends about \$110,400 dollars on leases for four (4) homes and two (2) studio apartments. This money could be otherwise utilized to improve services, personnel, etc.

Through collaboration with GHURA, there has been a discussion to assist GBHWC with the construction of a new home for residential use. At this stage, we are assessing our long term needs and the Center will need this land in order to maximize the grant funds toward construction.



BUREAU OF BUDGET AND MANAGEMENT RESEARCH COMMENTS ON BILL NO. <u>195-33 (LS)</u>

The proposed legislation amends P.L. 22-18, which reserved several tracts of government properties for future intended uses. P.L. 22-18 initially reserved sixty (60) acres of Lot No. 3470 to construct and provide health care facilities. The proposed legislation stipulates that the health care agencies of the Government of Guam have declined the use of Lot 3470 due to unsuitable location, topography, infrastructure, and adequate access to the property. Because Lot No. 3470 is not being utilized for its intended purpose, the proposed legislation aims provide an alternative use of this lot by transferring it into the Chamorro Land Trust Commission's land inventory designated for residential and agricultural leasing.

Although the proposed legislation will transfer to and authorize the CLTC to utilize the 60 acres for residential/agricultural leases, it does not specifically state which type of lease will be utilized. §75107(a) of Chapter 75, Title 21 Guam Code Annotated delineates the minimum and maximum amount of acres authorized for different types of agriculture/residential leases (substinence agricultural or aquaculture farming; commercial agricultural or aquaculture use; grazing use; and residential lots). Subsequently, because the proposed legislation doesn't specify which type of lease the property will be utilized as, the amount of leases that can be awarded on the property cannot be determined.

§75108(b) states that each lessee shall pay a rental of one dollar (\$1.00) per year for the term of ninety-nine (99) years. For example, if one commercial agricultural lease (maximum 20 acres per lessee) and one grazing lease (maximum 20 acres per lessee) is awarded on the subject property, anticipated revenue to be received by the end of the lease terms will amount to \$198. However, if one commercial agricultural lease and forty (40) residential leases (maximum once acre per lessee) are awarded, the anticipated revenue to be received by the end of the lease term will amount to \$4,059.

Subsequently, §75107(f) specifies that the lessee shall pay any taxes assessed upon the improvements made on the property during the duration of their lease period. Increased tax assessments are correlated with improved infrastructure on the property.

It should be noted that the proposed legislation does provide for revenue generating opportunities for the Government of Guam. However, due to not having sufficient information on the specific type of leases to be awarded on the subject property, the Bureau cannot determine the estimated revenues to be received.



SENATOR TOM ADA SEEKS TO ADD 225 ACRES OF LAND TO THE CHAMORRO LAND TRUST INVENTORY.

Hagåtña, Guam: On October 20, 2015, Senator Tom Ada introduced Bills 192,193,194 and 195, which will add 225 acres of land to the Chamorro Land Trust Commission's Available Lands Inventory. "The lands will be put into the Commission's available lands inventory for residential and agricultural leasing", said Sen. Tom Ada.

The 225 acres of lands were originally reserved in 1993 by Public Law 22-18 for use by various GovGuam agencies. In its review, the Legislative Committee on Lands found that the land reservations were for projects to build schools and health facilities. Two of the lot portions had been reserved to construct the As-Tumbo Middle School and the As-Tumbo Elementary School. Constructions of these schools were completed in 2007 and 2008, but at different locations. In another case, property was reserved to build a foster home; but a different site was instead chosen for the construction. "Land is a precious resource. If it is not going to be used for its original intended purpose, then it needs to be accounted for and added to the Chamorro Land Trust land inventory for residential or agricultural use" said Sen. Tom Ada.

The two other lots, Lot 3463 Agana Heights and Lot 3470 Chalan Pago, have significant development issues. Lot 3463 in the Municipality of Agana Heights is unsuitable for the construction of a central high school due to location, topography, lack of infrastructure, numerous easements for pipelines and high power electrical lines and a lack of adequate access. Lot 3470 in the Municipality of Chalan Pago is unsuitable for the construction of public facilities due to location, topography, lack of infrastructure and a lack of adequate access.

The 225 total acres are located in different areas: seventy (70) acres in Dededo, thirtyeight (38) acres in Agana Heights and one hundred seventeen (117) acres in Chalan Pago. "*The*

acreage to be added will offset acreage that may otherwise be used by the CLTC for commercial leasing," said Sen. Ada.
