

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

#### **COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST**

#### 1. OVERVIEW

Bill No. <u>197-33</u> (LS) was introduced on October 21, 2015, by Speaker Judith T. Won Pat, Ed. D., Senator T.C. Ada, and Senator T.R. Muña Barnes and was subsequently referred by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Guam US Military Relocation, Public Safety and Judiciary on October 21, 2015.

The Committee on Guam US Military Relocation, Public Safety and Judiciary convened a public hearing on Bill No. <u>197-33</u> (LS) on a Wednesday, December, 30 2015 at 2:00PM in I *Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room.

#### **Public Notice Requirements**

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via e-mail to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on Tuesday, December 22, 2015 (5-Day Notice), and again on Monday, December 28, 2015 (48-Hour Notice).

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 2:00 PM.

#### II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

#### Chairman Aguon:

This public hearing sponsored by the Committee on the Guam U.S. Military Relocation, Public Safety, and Judiciary is hereby convened. We do have three pieces of legislation that we will be entertaining this afternoon. In the following order, Bill No. 197, which is relative to extending the duties of the Guam Police Department community assisted policing efforts CAPE volunteers to include event supervision of the 12th FESTPAC of the Pacific Arts sponsored by Speaker Won Pat, T.C. Ada and T.R. Muna Barnes.

#### Chairman Aguon:

Bill No. 198-33(LS) which is relative to creating the uniform interstate enforcement of domestic violence protection orders sponsored by Senator B.T. McCreadie, and then we will conclude with Bill No. 215-33 (COR) which is relative to recognizing the successful rehabilitation and treatment of individuals convicted of first offender drug cases between 1998 and 2005 sponsored by Vice-Speaker B.J.F. Cruz and Majority Leader R.J. Respicio. As we proceed with this public hearing I would like to recognize the members of the committee and the members of the legislature that are here. Vice Speaker B.J Cruz, thank you very much Mr. Vice-Speaker for joining us. Senator Rory Respicio, Senator Mary Torres and Senator Tony Ada. Thank you Senators again for joining us this afternoon. As was highlighted, we will commence with Bill 197-33. One other piece of item first of all for notification in compliance with the open government law, the initial notification on this particular public hearing was disseminated on December 22nd and the second notices were disseminated on December 28th. If anyone would like copies of the messages that were disseminated to the stakeholders and the community as well as the print ads by all means, contact my office. Aside from that we will proceed with the pieces of legislation Bill 197. We do have two individuals and if there are any other individuals in the audience who would like to provide testimony please approach the desk outside the public hearing room and sign in and we will proceed and recognize you. I would like to invite Chief Joseph Cruz of the Guam Police Department. Please Chief if you can join us and Major Fred Chargualaf. As was mentioned as little earlier, this is Bill 197-33 sponsored by Speaker Won Pat. I would like to recognize the Vice-Chair of the Committee Senator Tom Ada. Thank you very much senator for joining us this afternoon. Speaker Won Pat did provide a written statement and it reads as follows.

So that's the statement, public statement by the sponsor of the legislation that we are entertaining right now. Bill No. 197 and Chief, if you can identify yourself for the record and proceed with your testimony.

#### **Chief Joseph Cruz:**

My name is Joseph Cruz. I am the Chief of Police for the Guam Police Department.

#### [Written Testimony Attached]

#### Chairman Aguon:

Thank you very much Chief Cruz for your testimony this afternoon. Major Chargualaf.

#### **Major Fred Chargualaf:**

Yes. Good afternoon Senators. My name is Major Fred Manibusan Chargualaf. I'm the Operations Bureau Chief of the Guam Police Department. Just to kind of reiterate what the Chief was mentioning that we are in fact in support of this bill and the key aspect there by not just putting out specific events. What this recommendation by putting all sanctioned events is for other future events that come that's not necessarily either being done on island or if it does come forward, then by putting all GPD sanctioned events, it will allow our department as the Chief mentioned to meet our needs and what that does like he says, it will allow the officers that are the full-time officers to focus on their duties.

#### Major Fred Chargualaf:

Where as the CAPE volunteers and I'm going to give an example like if they're mechanics or lets say they are a heavy equipment operator and if they're needed for FESTPAC or any other event, doesn't necessarily mean that they're just going to be tied down to securing FESTPAC, but any event that we deem necessary whether it be the Liberation Parade or others. So this bill you know, Chief has used this term before, it becomes a force multiplier for us and what that does is like what the Chief mentioned it meets our end state and allow us to actually not just provide security, but other things that might not necessarily be law enforcement or police related. Like I said, it could could supporting our administration division or support division folks, but more importantly, it will allow them to what you all wanting to push for the bill, but also extending to any and all of our GPD sanctioned events. Thank You.

#### Chairman Aguon:

Thank you very much Major Chargualaf. Senators any questions, inquiries or comments? Yes. Senator Tom Ada.

#### Senator Tom Ada:

I was following along Major Chargualaf and you kind of lost me that if these volunteers are lets say their fulltime jobs are mechanics they are basically, then you would utilize them by your comments, you would utilize them in a mechanics shop. So I'm just trying to follow what you're saying.

#### Major Fred Chargualaf:

Yes, and again you know. Like I said it will allow these guys to assist our organization again for all our sanctioned events. So if a vehicle goes down and they are providing assistance to the department then we can utilize them because they'll have those skills.

#### Senator Tom Ada:

Would you do the same for another officer if he had mechanic skills. Would you take him out of that uniform and put him in the mechanic shop?

#### Major Fred Chargualaf:

You know, that's going to be at the discretion of the chief.

#### **Senator Tom Ada:**

Well that's basically what you're suggesting.

#### Major Fred Chargualaf:

Well I'm suggesting for the CAPE volunteers because they are just volunteers. So what the volunteers currently do, they just have their enforcement duties, which is dealing with the accessible parking, violations, as well as littering. So the bill that this legislature is trying to propose is extending it to security, but if we allow them to do other you know other tasks when we have a GPD sanctioned event and then if also there's another event like I said not currently being done now and it happens in the future then it will allow us to no just use them for security aspects but things they might be able to provide.

#### Senator Tom Ada:

Chief Cruz, maybe you would care to elaborate.

#### Chief Joseph Cruz:

Thank you Senator. I would tell you that the intent of the law as indicated in subsection 770302 is for our CAPE volunteers is to provide a security centric or a security oriented functions to support the Guam Police Department. In particular, the Chief of Police is authorized to recruit for the enforcement of accessible parking and littering laws, number one. Number two, the Chief of Police is allowed to recruit volunteers to patrol the campuses of GDOE. That's number two and then number three is the Chief of Police can recruit volunteers for traffic directions, security and crowd control for such events as listed by the Chairman of the Committee and to that end state I would tell you Senator is that it is my intent as the Chief of Police while although our volunteers would have additional skill sets because its what they do on a full-time basis, it is my intent to stay within the spirit of the law. And the spirit of the law is to use them for security centric missions. What the major was eluding to was for functions particularly, say for example our CAPE volunteers are all EBOC certified and emergency vehicle operators course. So we could use them, hypothetically for traffic direction, which still meets the intent and the spirit of the law. We could hypothetically use them for desk watch duty, and we've done that in the past where some of our civilians just to augment our full-time officers because the shortage of man power. In this case it's security centric. Again, it could assist the full-time force in that manner. Would I per say as the Chief of Police take them and put them in a mechanic shop? Not necessarily. I would take it on a case by case basis, In the event that if it came down to that. To consider that, but I would say upfront and in of itself my intention is to use the CAPE volunteers in accordance to what the law specifically affords me to be able to recruit for CAPE volunteers. So to that end Senator I would tell you that it is my intent to use them to augment other tasks aside from what specifically indicated in subsection 77302 keeping within the spirit of the law so that they stay security centric if you will.

#### Senator Tom Ada:

And I appreciate you clarifying that and that's a new term for me, security centric and I think that clarifies it. There is just one other question that I have and that is you would like to broaden it to augment GPD during all GPD sanctioned events. So what other events occur on a relatively recurring basis other than Ko'ko Road Race, the Liberation Day Parade etcetera that you can think of. Maybe just a couple.

#### **Chief Joseph Cruz:**

Well a good example is augmenting the neighborhood watch program. Our CAPE volunteers go out there and they would augment the neighbor hood watch program to go out there and to assist the village mayors as they go through out the village in accessible parking, and littering, but also to provide traffic directions. Say for example you see many funerals on our island. Right now the mayor's office is providing that escort service. Having our CAPE volunteers who are EBOC certified and traffic direction certified can go out there and do their volunteer service in the community by helping the neighborhood watch program, helping the village mayors so things of that nature. There are other major events. There are other marathons, there are other races that happen on our island spate and apart from the Ko'ko Race, the Micronesian Island Fair, there's the Eikeden, there's the perimeter relay, there's a myriad of races that are mandated by Guam Law that we have to provide security for.

Those are the type of events Senator that I would like to use our CAPE volunteers for.

#### **Senator Tom Ada:**

And that's fine. And if your recommendation is to make it broader, maybe we should qualify that though by adding in that qualifier. That the additional duties will be as you put it security centric and I would feel more comfortable with that than knowing that there's a possibility these guys end up in a mechanic shop and that just caught my attention. Okay. Thank you.

#### Chief Joseph Cruz:

Senator, I just wanted to be clear also because one of the things that my staff have brought to my attention was the fact that using them augment at something like a desk watch or up at our tactical communications section where they would dispatch. All those positions at our tactical communications section are all law enforcement and dispatch our civilians. So using a CAPE volunteer in that fashion would also kind of fit the bill because of the fact it is security centric, it's providing a police type of service to the community versus that of a mechanic or what have you. So I will take a look at that a try and include that in my written testimony that I can follow up as a supplement to qualify as you say my testimony to include those specific big ticket items that we would need help from our CAPE volunteers to include things like funeral escorts, dispatching and desk watch duties as well.

#### Chairman Aguon:

Thank you very much Senator Tom Ada and Chief Cruz. Speaker Won Pat. Did you want to inquire or ask any questions according to your legislation, and then I will recognize Senator Torres.

#### **Speaker Won Pat:**

Not knowing what those specifics are. I agree with the previous speaker that maybe something a little broader and can be all encompassing because of just that fear. When we were doing this, I want you to know though the 12th Festival of the Pacific Arts, FESTPAC is really only going to happen next year. So this is just a one-time event. So it's maybe not even to be this specific but maybe to amend as you had indicated earlier to be all encompassing just so long as we know that when FESTPAC comes around that we will be looking to the assistance of course of the CAPE officials to do this. So its going to be only a one-time thing here because its once every four years.

#### **Chief Joseph Cruz:**

Absolutely Madam Speaker and we will definitely get that included in our supplemental testimony that we will be providing.

#### **Speaker Won Pat:**

Can I just ask you just briefly knowing of course, its unfortunate or fortunate as opposed that at least we've heard they have been very successful, in the time that you've been in have you found that this particular program has been beneficial also to the department?

Absolutely madam speaker. I would tell you that any help that we get into the Guam Police Department is help that is received with open arms and I would tell you much of the CAPE volunteers have reached out to us wanting to assist the Guam Police Department. So we see success in the program. We see success in their volunteer efforts to stay within the spirit of the law by enforcing accessible parking as well as littering, but we see also that they want to do more. So this falls in line with wanting to provide security for FESTPAC, but we see it as it being more beneficial by taking it a step further and making it encompass other GPD function or sanctioned events. So we do see success Madam Speaker and we want to continue with that and I think this would be a good conduit to want to recruit more volunteers into the Guam Police Department. Specifically more CAPE volunteers.

#### Speaker Won Pat:

And based of course... now that you're able to generate primarily from the littering fines and I know that there was a bifurcation to assist with persons with disabilities as well. Do you find that the funds that you have would be sufficient to continue now to provide the additional training for more individuals who want to volunteer?

#### Chief Joseph Cruz:

I would tell you that based on the analysis that we've done in the department and what we've been briefed, on the onset we think that the fraction of accessible parking and the littering violation that were coming to the Guam Police Department were so to speak, were assisting the program, and they were helping to provide training. To provide a uniform ... if you will with a polo shirt and what have you. However, what we've noticed because of their success that the amount of accessible parking and littering has gone down and that's to the success of the CAPE volunteers as well as to our CVPR officers. So to that point, because we see a drop, the funding source coming in to feed that program also has diminished. So to answer your question upfront, I would tell you that that funding source to be able to support the CAPE volunteer program is not quite meeting the mark. So we are having to be innovative in the management of our monies to be able to continue to train them on traffic direction, train them on emergency vehicles operators course and what have you so that they can meet the intent of what the law indicates. So upfront, I will say that at this point in time it's not sufficient and we are having to find funding from within. On the onset it was because a lot of people through no fault of their own were taking advantage of the accessible parking. Now that we have enforced that, we've seen that people are more in compliance of those laws and we see the decline in those numbers so that's the perspective we have in the police department.

#### Speaker Won Pat:

And I appreciate knowing that of course because that's something we may need to look in as well and some of these other events where they are requesting the assistance of the CAPE officers that maybe there should be some type of fee so to speak you know to be able to assist not of course the per hourly rate but definitely something that can continue to sustain the program so that they will be able to help the community.

What I will tell you madam speaker is for things like police escorts and security, we do assess a fee. It part of, it goes into the police services fund. So there's a fee schedule that is listed right now and its been through the triple a process, so that schedule is there. We let all the citizens know should they need traffic direction assistance, should they need security assistance from the Guam Police Department, we assess those fees. Those fees go automatically go into the police services fund, which feed the police department. So specifically we just need to find the monies from within that come from the police services fund to be able to provide training and uniform for our CAPE volunteers. However, as you indicated if funding would be made available or appropriated specifically for our CAPE volunteers and specifically for our CVPRs that would definitely assist the Guam Police Department in being able to provide services to our community.

#### **Speaker Won Pat:**

Thank you very much Mr. Chairman

#### Chairman Aguon:

Thank you very much Speaker Won Pat. Thank you Chief Cruz. Senator Torres.

#### **Senator Mary Torres:**

Chief Cruz very briefly. The speaker captured a lot of the thoughts that I had that I was going to address but do you have an anticipation of what your volunteer needs would be assuming FESTPAC is your next target. Do you have any idea how many volunteers did you like to recruit and if you do, did you have a corresponding fiscal impact that it would have, you mentioned the poles and I imagine there's other credentials and other minor equipment that they would to be outfitted with? Do you have a gauge of what that might be right now?

#### Chief Joseph Cruz:

Right now in working with the Governor's Office, the FESTPAC Executive Director, in speaking to her just so that the committee is aware, I've been designated as the head of security for FESTPAC. So as a sub committee, so as a safety and security sub committee chairperson, it is my responsibility to ensure that the safety and security aspect for the FESTPAC when FESTPAC comes to Guam is appropriate and we do meet the safety and security needs. Specifically, for the Guam Police Department, what I've committed to FESTPAC from the personnel of the Guam Police Department is 60 officers whether it be uniform officers, fulltime officers, police reserves, or CAPE volunteers. I've committed 60 personnel. In taking a look at our operations and realizing that we do need to continue to keep the entire island safe but realizing the magnitude of FESTPAC, what I'm saying is for the Guam Police Department specifically 60 bodies is what I'm committing. In taking a look at that, we are looking at appropriations or monies from within as well as funding from the FESTPAC committee to assist us in that. Now we are working collaboratively with the other local law enforcement agencies to be able to meet that end state. What I would tell you is that we are looking at that right now. I do not have have for you at this point a dollar figure I could attach to that 60 but it is my intent to recruit more volunteers, get them trained up and get them the minimum equipment they would need to be able to augment that 60. So at this point in time, I am looking at 60 either full-time officers or CVPRs to be augmented on top of that with the CAPE volunteers.

So to answer your question, of do I know a dollar figure at this point? I do not have a dollar figure readily available for you at this time Senator.

#### **Senator Mary Torres:**

The first part was do you even have a figure of how many people you would like to get, how many additional bodies. Like what is your CAPE force right now approximately?

#### Chief Joseph Cruz:

Right now I believe 8. 8 CAPE volunteers.

#### **Senator Mary Torres:**

So you're looing to double that?

#### **Chief Joseph Cruz:**

That's what we are looing, we are looing to at least double the CAPE volunteer force, but again, I just want to be clear. 60 police officers, is what I'm looking at committing to the FESTPAC. That's only one piece. There are other federal law enforcement agencies that will be involved in the security piece for FESTPAC.

#### Chairman Aguon:

Thank you very much senator Torres. Senator Respicio and then Senator Tony Ada.

#### Senator Rory Respicio:

Thank you very much Mr. Chair, Chief, Major, good afternoon and also to your men and women in blue. Thank you for being here this afternoon. Thank you for your Merry Christmas message. So Merry Christmas and Happy New Year as well. You know I appreciate your testimony and I've seen this piece of legislation evolved over the years and this piece of, this particular law amended over time to include the Guam Koko Race and I believe it was amended again to include the Micronesian Island Fair. So your suggestion is certainly warranted that maybe if legislation were more broad that an event comes up, that we wouldn't have to come back and amend the law but I also recognize the sponsors of this legislation's intent to want to specifically make sure that the CAPE volunteers under the, your leadership is are going to be focused on the 12th Festival of the Pacific of, for FESTPAC. I'm asking if you follow me for a moment on page 2 line 7, after the "take out and" so "it's the security crowd control, and to augment the Guam Police Departments police force during all GPD sanctioned events to include, but not limited to, events such as" and then we keep everything in such as the Guam Koko Road Race, Guam Micronesian Island Fair, Liberation Day Parade, and the 12th Festival of the Pacific Arts or FESTPAC. If this legislation went from wanting to make sure that FESTPAC is going to be covered too, then, the other extreme to amend it, where you take all these events out and the support will be provided unless it's GPD sanctioned. What are the guarantees that come FESTPAC, CAPE volunteers will be there. I know the guarantees' real and present because of your involvement in FESTPAC.

#### **Chief Joseph Cruz:**

Yes.

#### Senator Rory Respicio:

But I just want to ask if it's possible, as a possible compromise, and this also takes into consideration now, what you would need, and how you would need to augment your force from time to time. So I want to offer this as a recommendation to the chair as this bill still continues to go through his committee and this legislative process.

#### **Chief Joseph Cruz:**

Senator, I am very much on board with, with the proposal that you have just mentioned. Now, I think in mentioning it, I see your point, and I think that wanting to have a commitment specifically to FESTPAC. I can see that. But I can also see how you're including the all GPD sanctioned events. So I think that would be the, that meets the intent of what the amendment is as well as the intent of the Guam Police Department in wanting to use CAPE volunteers above what's listed currently in this amendment.

#### Senator Rory Respicio:

And it's a good, deliverable to the FESTPAC committee. The legislature through, throughout the several months providing for preparations and should Speaker Won Pat's bill pass and become law this is another deliverable due to FESTPAC committee saying that there's legislations specifically provided so that CAPE volunteers will be there. So I think it's a win win. I'm glad that you're open to it.

#### **Chief Joseph Cruz:**

Absolutely Senator, and thank you for that recommendation.

#### Senator Rory Respicio:

I'll just submit this to the chair. Thank you for your support.

#### Chief Joseph Cruz:

Absolutely. You're welcome.

#### Chairman Aguon:

Thank you very much Senator Respicio. Senator Tony Ada.

#### **Senator Tony Ada:**

Thank you Mr. Chair. Good afternoon Chief.

#### Chief Joseph Cruz:

Good afternoon Senator.

#### Senator Tony Ada:

I just wanted to know whether, you know, because expanding the CAPE volunteers currently, they'll be interacting with the people at FESTPAC and things like that. What is the liability to the government I mean would, if a CAPE volunteer gets injured or they inadvertently injure an individual, would the government be held liable? And how do we keep.



As it is right now, the Workman's Compensation Act will be covered by our volunteers. That question has been brought up many times by our CVPR's. And the answer to that question is they are covered under workman's compensation. In this case where a CAPE volunteer is working as a CAPE volunteer under executing their duties trained by the Guam Police Department under the auspices of the Guam Police Department they would be covered by the Workman's Compensation Act. So for liability in that, to that regard, they would be covered. The reverse of that is if a CAPE volunteer were to do something, so long as they are functioning just like police officers or CVPR's under the auspices and within the guidelines of how they were trained. Traffic direction, operating that motor vehicle, so on and so forth, again, they would be covered as well.

#### Senator Tony Ada:

So then would an amendment have to be made to specify that within the, or not, do you know?

#### Chief Joseph Cruz:

I don't think. Upfront Senator, I would say I don't think it does, but I could go back to my legal council and confirm with my legal council just to be sure.

#### Senator Tony Ada:

Okay. And then on the expansion on CAPE currently, CAPE cite vehicles that are parked.

#### **Chief Joseph Cruz:**

They can only cite for accessible parking and littering. That's all they can cite for.

#### **Senator Tony Ada:**

Individuals or vehicles?

#### Chief Joseph Cruz:

If there is an individual there with that vehicle, the citation is given to the individual. However, 9 times out of 10, the vehicle is parked without the proper documentation there, whether there be a placard or a license plate, the citation is written and left with the vehicle.

#### Senator Tony Ada:

Okay, thank you Chief. Thank you Mr. Chairman.

#### Chairman Aguon:

Thank you very much Senator Tony Ada. Speaker Won Pat has one follow up question.

#### Speaker Won Pat:

Thank you Chief. I know recently there was a notice of alert that was put out by homeland security primarily I guess as an advisory that whenever there is going to be a gathering of a large number of people you know that they are asking the community to be on alert you know be watchful because we are expecting about 2,700 performers, artists, and artisans and of course there is the traditional followers of about 500-800 of them.

#### Speaker Won Pat:

So GVB has been actively promoting this in Korea and Japan so we really can anticipate a large number of people who will be here so I'm just hoping that with that advisory that maybe there is special attention or training will be provided to the CAPE officers as well in preparation and I'm not just then of course your officers as well.

#### Chief Joseph Cruz:

Absolutely Madam Speaker. We are taking that into consideration to make sure that they are trained and that they are ready to deal the volume of residence and visitors that will be taking part of the FESTPAC festivities. So we are taking a look at that Madam Speaker. We are aware of the threat assessments that are being provided by Homeland Security and the Fusion Center, the Marianas Fusion Center. So we are taking all that into consideration and we are making sure that our full time force, our CVPR, as well as our CAPE volunteers are trained to adequately deal with the threat and deal with the volume of residents and visitors that will be coming to our island.

#### Speaker Won Pat:

Thank you very much.

#### Chairman Aguon:

Thank you very much Speaker Won Pat, and Chief Cruz and Major Chargualaf, thank you very much, and to all you men and women in blue. Thank you for your presence this afternoon and likewise Merry Christmas and a Happy Holidays to all of you. Happy New Year.

The Committee will continue to accept written testimony on any pieces of legislation that have been entertained this afternoon until close of business Monday the 5th of January. Thank you again. Thank you Senators for joining us.



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
