

#### **COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST**

#### I. OVERVIEW

Bill No. <u>229-33</u> (COR) was introduced on January 6, 2016, by Senator Frank B. Aguon, Jr. and was subsequently referred by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Guam US Military Relocation, Public Safety and Judiciary on January 11, 2016.

The Committee on Guam US Military Relocation, Public Safety and Judiciary convened a public hearing on Bill No. <u>229-33</u> (COR) on a Wednesday, January, 27 2016 at 4:00PM in I *Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room.

#### **Public Notice Requirements**

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via e-mail to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on Wednesday, January 20, 2015 (5-Day Notice), and again on Monday, January 25, 2016 (48-Hour Notice).

#### **Senators Present**

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 4:00 PM.

#### II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

#### Chairman Aguon:

This public hearing sponsored by the Committee on Guam, excuse me ladies and gentlemen in the audience we just started the public hearing. This public hearing sponsored by the Committee on Guam U.S. Military Relocation, Public Safety and Judiciary is hereby convened and if I can ask everyone in the audience should you have your cellphones on to please ensure that they are either placed in the silent mode or they are turned off for the duration of this hearing and if you do need to take a phone call or make a phone call, please exit the public hearing room. I would like to first of all start off by stating that this particular public hearing will be. We will be discussing two particular legislations.

#### Chairman Aguon:

Bill No. 229-33, which is relative to the temporary employment of retired conservation officers within the Division of Aquatic and Wildlife Resources of the Department of Agriculture should a critical need arise due to military activation or long-term disability. Also the second bill that will be discussed is Bill No.236-33 (LS) relative to the possession of firearms by aliens and introduced by the Honorable Senator V.A. Ada who is to my immediate left. For purposes of public notification, the initial notification was disseminated to all the stakeholders as well as to our media partners on the 20th of January and then the secondary notice was distributed on the 25th of January in compliance with the open government notification act. I would like to also recognize Senator Tony Ada who has joined us this afternoon. Thank you very much Senator for joining us for this particular public hearing.

We will proceed with discussion on the first piece of legislation Bill No. 229-33 and we have the following individuals who have signed up and if there is anyone else in the audience who would like to join us and provide testimony, you are more than welcome to join us upfront. Please ensure that you do sign in. Can I invite Mr. Mark Aguon from the Department of Agriculture, Mr. Matt Sablan, the Director of the Department of Agriculture, and Ms. Toni Santos. Please if you can all join us up front. For purposes of opening comment in regards to Bill No. 229-33, I believe the title is self-explanatory. There is a provision that applies directly to other law enforcement agencies, the Guam Police Department, the Department of Corrections as well as the Guam Fire Department that should there be any military activation or extended illness with any of our law enforcement public safety officers that flexibility is provide for these particular law enforcement agencies to be able to temporarily hire retired personnel, law enforcement personnel respective to their agencies and this flexibility right now, based on 229 could become applicable to the Department of Agriculture as it applies to the conservation officers. I would like to recognize first of all the Director, Mr. Sablan if you can go ahead and identify yourself for the record and be sure the mic is on and provide your testimony. Thank you.

#### **Director Matt Sablan:**

Good afternoon Mr. Chairman. Senator Ada. First of all, I want to thank you for giving the opportunity today to testify in support of Bill 229-33 (COR). I did pass out the handouts. I'm just going to make it brief, according to the written statement. With what's stated there in the act, the measure is in the event for deployment or emergency leave of shortage of man power that we are. This bill will authorize us the hiring of retirees. Currently we have ten conservation officers and recently we have one, Lieutenant Mike Reyes that retired. That brings us down to 9 and we have one under administrative duty to down to 8. Out of the 8, in about a couple of months, we are going to lose three to deployment and that of course leaves us with 5. The challenge there is 5 as far as island wide protection of our wildlife and marine natural resources. With that, I know there is a program and 1 guess Sergeant Mark Aguon will elaborate more on that with GCC the Balea program, but they are already certified POST and that's one avenue we can quickly identify to augment our shortage. To end that again I just want to thank you for giving the opportunity.

#### Chairman Aguon:

Thank you very much Mr. Director. Can I yield to Mr. Aguon? Please identify yourself for the record and please proceed.

#### Sergeant Mark Aguon:

Sergeant Mark Aguon, I'm the acting YC for the law enforcement section department for the Department of Agriculture. Yes, I support the Bill, although I think it needs to indicate and grant us permission to pick up LTEs or LTAs for the purpose of the pool that we are to choose from, if it just stays this way, we may just have one candidate. The other candidates who have retired may not be willing to or able to comeback and work with us because they have retired several years ago and for other reasons, but if you allow for the department to visit the LTE or LTA area, we have a pool of officers that have been certified through Balea with GCC and are POST certified and can take the POST certification entry level exams with DOA if need be. So that's why. I'm in support of the bill although I believe it needs to be added on. Thank you.

#### Chairman Aguon:

Thank you very much Sergeant Aguon. Ms. Santos, did you want to provide any comments?

#### Ms. Antonia Santos:

Thank you Senator. Well I'm only here simply because of the funding situation and right now with the lapse funds due to the retirement of conservation officer three, we do anticipate hiring at least three recruits. I mean I'm looking at recruits because it is a lower entry level and with the lapse funds that we have with the conservation officer three, that would be sufficient to cover through September. I'm looking at April through September because of the processing and all the things that have to happen.

#### Chairman Aguon:

Thank you very much Ms. Santos. Mr. Director, if I can at least pose a general question and either yourself or Ms. Santos can respond. First and foremost, thank you very much for providing the numbers because I think the numbers are going to justify either providing the agency flexibility or allowing the agency to be able to go out and recruit either trainees or LTAs for these particular positions because you said you presently are authorized 10 positions of which due to a retiree you are down, you are brought down to 9 and you have one individual who is reassigned else where only because of a personnel situation, a disability just so that our people don't get the wrong impression, and then very shortly in a few months will be losing three individuals as a result of military activation. So that would bring you down to an active force of 5. So you are literally going to be at 50% of your man strength or personnel strength with the conservation officers so that first and foremost I think it poses a somewhat a dire situation in terms of making sure that you have the man power and personnel at least at the level that you are authorized with this existing budget. So that's one aspect. Ms. Santos, I know you said that you are looking at hiring three recruits. Is that through the LTA process or is that a permanent recruit.

#### Ms. Antonia Santos:

LTA process.

#### Chairman Aguon:

Okay and that's recognizing that's on a temporary basis.

#### Ms. Antonia Santos:

Exactly.

#### Chairman Aguon:

During the course of the activation, the funds are going to be offset by virtue of these individuals being deployed elsewhere.

#### Ms. Antonia Santos:

That's correct Senator.

#### Chairman Aguon:

Okay. Any other comments. Senator Ada. Senator Torres. Thank you very much Senator for joining us this morning.

#### **Senator Mary Torres:**

The question that I had about that the bill is that. The bill, I notice that it contemplates them double dipping right. They come from a retirement status into an active status, but they maintain their retirement benefits and everything right. So it's a double dipping scenario. So I was a little confused about the leave. They can maintain. The bill requires that they are entitled to take the medical insurance plan as an active status as opposed to a retired, but they are not allowed to accrue sick and annual leave and I was unclear of maybe that is better directed to the author or do you have any thoughts on that part of the bill? The status, it was just a little peculiar.

#### Chairman Aguon:

The way this system is applied in other law enforcement agencies is that very similar to our LCII status personnel where individuals here in the legislature, where individuals are able to be pulled in and only paid specifically on a quasi contractual basis to be able to backfill any needed vacancies and keep in mind this is only based on two particular categories. One is military activation as well as extended long term illness of any law enforcement personnel. So that's more or less so there's no additional benefits whether it be accrue leave, annual leave, or sick leave and there's really no additional benefits with the exception of that individual being brought in with a slight possibility, and I need a clarification in terms of how Department of Administration is administering it, but a slight possibility of contributing to social security. That.. the clarification.

#### **Senator Mary Torres:**

Then going back to the other issue, its unclear why we would need to specifically provide in the law that if you're under a retirement status then you can subscribe to the medical government plan and that's one thing because its contemplated that they are going from into this position on a limited term on an as needed basis to fill a void as a result of illness or so. Why wouldn't you then just have them maintain their medical status as is, as retired. Why would you mandate that they switch over to an active status for medical plan? That part just didn't. I didn't understand the logic of that. Did you see that part?

#### Ms. Antonia Santos:

Well Senator, well this is like for example a military retiree. They come into the Government of Guam as a fulltime employee, but they don't opt for any insurance because they are still covered by military so we don't pay medical or dental insurance for them. So it would be the same things as the retirees coming back. They can still stay within their current retirement status with health insurance and they don't have to offer medical or dental. I'm going to look at the bill because I read it differently.

#### Chairman Aguon:

Ms. Santos. Line 19 and 20. What the good Senator is referring to is the provision that reads of any employees that are hired under this section shall only be eligible to enroll in the Government of Guam Health Insurance program as an active employee and that's a standard language where this individual will not be necessarily classified as an active employee based on a quasi contractual basis. So if that is a concern we'll seek legal counsel advice if in fact they would recommend that that would be extracted.

#### Senator Mary Torres:

Yeah because it's a little illogical. That's why I wanted to point that out. Thank you.

#### Chairman Aguon:

Thank you very much Senator. Senator Frank Blas thank you very much for joining us this afternoon. There will be a, Mr. Director, Ms. Santos, Sergeant Aguon, if there is any final comments you would like to provide with regards to this.

#### Director Matt Sablan:

I guess like Toni mentioned, I can probably consider the employee's choice.

#### Chairman Aguon:

Okay. We'll discuss it in terms of how DOA applies it across the board because this language is the same language and template utilized for other law enforcement agencies. So if by any chance these employees would like to enroll in the Gov Guam insurance and it allows them to enroll right now, then I don't know if we want to extract that benefit as a possibility when they are providing direct law enforcement services to our people. Okay, another thing, just for the information of the Director of the Department of Administration unfortunately they were not able to send a representative but they did submit written testimony to the committee. Yes, Sergeant Aguon.

#### Sergeant Mark Aguon:

Yes, with me closing, I just want to extend my sincere thank you from the bottom of our hearts from our section because we are in dire needs of man power right now. It's a very dangerous situation where we are heading into and we need to avoid that right away.

#### Chairman Aguon:

Thank you very much Sergeant Aguon. One final comment or question. I know that you're looking at 5 active full time employees within a few months. What is the time-line that you need to be able to have this direct authorization? Only because lets say if in fact this is not placed on the agenda in February, if its not placed in March, then you need the authorization by March. This doesn't make any sense to delay it any further. So what would the time-line that you need this adopted and this flexibility so that in fact the agency can be able to apply it.

#### **Director Matt Sablan:**

Yes, Senator, I believe starting February out of the three some of them will be going through primo stages. So that requires them to be on military leave.

#### Chairman Aguon:

Understood. Thank you for that clarification. Senator Ada or I'm sorry, Senator Frank Blas.

#### Senator Frank Blas, Jr.:

Thank you Mr. Chair and I apologize for my tardiness to the hearing and I don't know where this question had been asked and answered. I know this here says retired conservation officer. Has there been discussion about maybe expanding that to increase your pool of retirees to include maybe other areas of law enforcement that can possibly fit your requirement, your need?

#### Sergeant Mark Aguon:

We did not go outside the box as far as conservation officers although we did venture into recruiting POST graduates from GCC. POST certified graduates from GCC ... that have done internship with us already. So they are like a new pool of officers that may potentially come into the government.

#### Senator Frank Blas, Jr.:

So you're not averse to possibly expanding this pool.

#### Sergeant Mark Aguon:

Yes, I would like to.

#### Director Matt Sablan:

Yes, and early we did request addition to the language to avail GCC Balea program.

#### Senator Frank Blas, Jr.:

I'm also looking at maybe availing to maybe other officers retired from the other services.

#### Sergeant Mark Aguon:

That is an option right now. There is an option there.

#### Senator Frank Blas, Jr.:

Well because here it just says retired conservation officers.

#### Sergeant Mark Aguon:

I have not discussed that at all.

#### Senator Frank Blas, Jr.:

Thank you.

#### Chairman Aguon:

Thank you Senator Blas and thank you very much everyone for your testimony this afternoon.

This concludes our discussion and the public hearing on Bill No. 229-33 and Bill No. 236-33. The committee will continue to accept written testimony for the subsequent 10 days following this hearing and then the committee report will be provided and closed out for consideration by the entire legislature. Thank you very much folks and have a good day.

The public hearing adjourned at 4:29 PM.

Introduced by:

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AN ACT TO ADD A NEW SECTION 38 TO CHAPTER XII OF **PUBLIC** LAW 33-66: THE RELATIVE TO TEMPORARY EMPLOYMENT OF RETIRED CONSERVATION OFFICERS WITHIN THE DIVISION OF AQUATIC WILDLIFE RESOURCES OF DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE SHOULD A CRITICAL NEED ARISE DUE TO MILITARY ACTIVATION OR LONG-TERM DISABILITY.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds
- that Conservation Officers within the Division of Aquatic and Wildlife Resources
- 3 (DAWR) of the Department of Agriculture, like many other Peace Officers, are
- 4 service-minded individuals who often serve their country as reservists in our
- 5 nation's military reserve programs and/or the Guam National Guard. The
- 6 activation and deployment of these military forces have an impact on the
- 7 performance of the DAWR where adequate replacements are unavailable.
- 8 Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to allow the Chief
- 9 Conservation Officer to temporarily employ retired Conservation Officers in order
- to meet the needs of the DAWR.

**Section 2.** A new Section 38, as set forth below, is hereby *added* to Chapter XII of Public Law 33-66: 2

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"Section 38. Temporary Employment of Retired Guam Conservation Officers. The Division of Aquatic and Wildlife Resources (DAWR) of the Department of Agriculture may hire retired Conservation Officers if a critical need arises because of military activation of Conservation Officers or absence due to a long-term disability status, which has been certified by a medical doctor. The DAWR may exercise this hiring authority provided its authorized budget for personnel is not exceeded. The retiree hired shall fill such a temporarily vacant position and shall be terminated when the incumbent returns from military service or long-term disability. Retired officers may be hired only at the ranks of Conservation Officer I and below, only at Step I, and shall not receive sick and annual leave. Conservation Officers hired under this section shall first meet the requirements of the position in question, except for written examinations, and the Chief Conservation Officer shall certify that every retiree hired is fit for duty. Notwithstanding § 8121(a), Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, retirees hired temporarily pursuant to this Section may continue to receive retirement benefits. Any employee hired under this Section shall only be eligible to enroll in the Government of Guam Health Insurance Program as an active

Employee. The Director of the Department of Agriculture shall report to I

Liheslaturan Guåhan on July 1, 2016, and again thirty (30) days after the
end of the fiscal year, of the number of retired Conservation Officers hired
pursuant to this Section, the positions filled, the length of employment, the
cost of said hiring, and the nature of the critical need that was filled."

AN ACT TO ADD A NEW SECTION 38 TO CHAPTER XII OF PUBLIC LAW 33-66, RELATIVE TO THE TEMPORARY EMPLOYMENT OF RETIRED CONSERVATION OFFICERS CONSERVATION AND LIMITED-TERM **OFFICER** RECRUITS WITHIN THE DIVISION OF AQUATIC AND WILDLIFE RESOURCES OF THE DEPARTMENT AGRICULTURE SHOULD A CRITICAL NEED ARISE DUE **ACTIVATION** TO MILITARY OR LONG-TERM DISABILITY.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that Conservation Officers within the Division of Aquatic and Wildlife Resources (DAWR) of the Department of Agriculture, like many other Peace Officers, are service-minded individuals who often serve their country as reservists in our nation's military reserve programs and/or the Guam National Guard. The activation and deployment of these military forces have an impact on the performance of the DAWR where adequate replacements are unavailable.
- Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to allow the Chief Conservation Officer to temporarily employ retired Conservation Officers and Limited-Term Conservation Officer Recruits in order to meet the needs of the DAWR.

**Section 2.** A new Section 38, as set forth below, is hereby *added* to Chapter XII of Public Law 33-66:

"Section 38. Temporary Employment of Retired Guam Conservation 3 The Division of Aquatic and Wildlife Resources (DAWR) of the 4 5 Department of Agriculture may hire retired Conservation Officers and Limited-Term Conservation Officer Recruits if a critical need arises because of military 6 activation of Conservation Officers or absence due to a long-term disability status, 7 which has been certified by a medical doctor. The DAWR may exercise this hiring 8 authority provided its authorized budget for personnel is *not* exceeded. The retiree 9 or recruit hired shall fill such a temporarily vacant position and shall be terminated 10 when the incumbent returns from military service or long-term disability. Retired 11 12 officers or recruits may be hired only at the ranks of Conservation Officer I and below, only at Step I, and shall not receive sick and annual leave. Conservation 13 Officers hired under this section shall first meet the requirements of the position in 14 question, except for written examinations, and the Chief Conservation Officer shall 15 16 certify that every retiree or recruit hired is fit for duty. Notwithstanding § 8121(a), Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, retirees hired temporarily pursuant to this Section 17 may continue to receive retirement benefits. Any employee hired under this 18 Section shall only be eligible to enroll in the Government of Guam Health 19 Insurance Program as an active employee. The Director of the Department of 20 Agriculture shall report to I Liheslaturan Guåhan on July 1, 2016, and again thirty 21 (30) days after the end of the fiscal year, of the number of retired Conservation 22 Officers and Limited-Term Conservation Officer Recruits hired pursuant to this 23 Section, the positions filled, the length of employment, the cost of said hiring, and 24 the nature of the critical need that was filled." 25

Good afternoon, Mr. Chairman and Members of the Committee:

My name is Matthew L.G. Sablan, the Director of the Guam Department of Agriculture. I thank you for this opportunity to come before your Committee to testify in support of Bill No. 229-33 (COR), an act relative to the temporary appointment of retired Conservation Officers within the Division of Aquatic and Wildlife Resources of the Department of Agriculture should a critical need arise due to military activation or long term disability. To date, the department has only three (3) Conservation Officers that retired.

The department is requesting that language be added to the bill to allow for the "Hiring of Limited Term Employees" (LTE) presumably from the Guam Community College (GCC) Basic Law Enforcement Academy (BLEA) with Peace Officer Standardized Testing (POST) Certification. These officers would provide support to the Law Enforcement Section while receiving valuable on-the-job training experience.

In the current FY2016 budget, ten (10) Conservation Officers' positions were approved for the protection of five (5) Marine Preserve Areas (MPA) government-owned forests, wetlands, and grasslands as well as all natural resources of Guam and thirteen mile radius seaward.

Recently one (1) of our Conservation Officers retired leaving the department with eight (8) on duty patrol officers and one (1) officer on administrative duty.

Of the eight (8) on duty patrol officers, three (3) will be on military deployment leaving only five (5) on patrol officers. This shortage of manpower creates a great impact on the protection and vulnerability of our island's wildlife, marine, and natural resources.

Thank you for providing me with the opportunity to offer testimony on Bill No. 229-33 (COR). Si Yu'us Ma'ase!

#### **COMMENTS TO BILL No. 229-33(COR)**

The Bill proposes to temporarily employ retired Conservation Officers (CO) within the Division of Aquatic and Wildlife Resources (DAWR) of the Department of Agriculture should a critical need arise due to military activation or long-term disability of current COs.

The fiscal impact of this legislation involves the compensation to be paid to the retired COs while they are filling the temporarily vacant positions, provided that DAWR's authorized budget for personnel is not exceeded. The Bill addresses this issue by hiring retirees only at the ranks of CO I (ILO4-01, \$29,944.60 P/A) and below, only at Step I, and not receive sick and annual leave.

Based on the division's current staffing pattern and information from AS400, of the 7 COs within this division, there are only three (3) Reservists, with the lowest Grade/Step being IL04-8, \$41,922 P/A and the highest being IL04-16, \$55,213 P/A. Provided with this information, should any of the Reservists be activated, the compensation to be paid to the retired COs filling their vacancies would be significantly less than the regular compensation owed to the Reservists had they not been activated and remained on duty at their current salary and benefits.

Of the 7 COs within the division, the lowest Grade/Step is currently ILO4-5, \$37,430 P/A. With this Grade/Step compensation still being higher than the Bill authorizes, the compensation paid to retired COs filling vacancies left for COs claiming long-term disability should not exceed DAWR's authorized budget for personnel for the fiscal year.



### Conservation officers important, needed

It appears that, historically, some leaders and agency heads lacked a genuine appreciation of the value of Guam's natural resources, otherwise they would have done all in their power to support enforcement of the laws designed to protect those resources.

I refer to the egregious neglect of the conservation officer unit at the Department of Agriculture. For years the conservation officers have been denied adequate compensation, promotion, manpower, and sufficient funds to do their jobs safety and effectively. An oversight hearing (on Dec. 10) included testimony about why Guam needs more conservation officers, that conservation officers have not received pay raises for decades, no promotions and chronically lack funds for equipment and maintenance. When department vehicles break

down, they use their own money to pay for repairs.

These are management issue that should be scrutinized and addressed.

Currently, only 10 conservation officers serve Guam. In the coming months, due to retirement, deployment, and leave, the number of conservation officers will drop to just four. These few officers are charged with protecting all five Marine Preserve Areas and government-owned forests, wetlands and grasslands on Guam. Most alarming is they often face perpetrators without proper body armor and back-up personnel.

Matthew L.G. Sablan, the new director of the Department of Agriculture, stated that he is courting negligence when sending conservation officers to the field. The day will come when, outnumbered and lacking body armor, the conservation officers will confront well-armed poachers and suffer injury or loss of life.

Conservation officers go above and beyond. They provide educational outreach and special training to law enforcement officers in Guam and neighboring islands. For example, I invited Sgt. Mark Aguon and former conservation officer Shlan Aricheta to talk with my marine biology students about MPA laws, field experiences and training required to be a conservation officer.

Aguon stated that a female conservation officer was particularly valuable as not all poachers are male, and female perpetrators were increasing. Unfortunately, Aricheta, a limited-term employee, had to leave the conservation officers for a more stable position.

The practice of hiring conservation officers as limited-term employees is cheap, wasteful and dangerous. While saving money in the short-term, stability and continuity are compromised. Valuable training provided to limited-term employees is wasted when they are forced to seek employment elsewhere.

Conservation officers provide expertise to our community. According to Joachim Roberto, department chair of the criminal justice program at Guam Community College, Aguon, a member of the Criminal Justice Advisory Committee, was highly instrumental in developing the new marine and terrestrial conservation enforcement officer concentration of the Criminal Justice Certification Program at GCC. The program promises to produce well-trained conservation officers, but it remains to be seen if more conservation officer positions will be created in Guam, or in the region, to accommodate graduates.

As Guam's population grows, harvesting pressure is placed on both MPA and non-MPA areas. Enforcement must be prioritized or Guam will suffer the consequences of reef ecosystems destroyed by over-harvesting of fish, sea cucumbers, and other marine organisms. For example, the allowed daily catch limit for sea cucumbers, known locally as balate, is 100 per person per day. In less than a day, a few individuals can remove most of the sea cucumbers from a reef. Balate are vital to the health of reef ecosystems as they help control nutrient levels and seaweed growth. More conservation officers are needed for reef surveillance and to conduct investigations into illegal commercial activity of sea cucumbers.

If our leaders value our natural resources and want them for generations to come, they must do all in their power to ensure that:

- · Guam has more conservation officers;
- · conservation officers are recognized and compensated, through a timely promotion process;
- · conservation officers are safe and have the proper equipment and manpower;
- · limited-term employee positions are replaced with full-time positions; and
- management at the Department of Agriculture is held accountable for these improvements.

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
