COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

Bill No. 233-33 (LS) was introduced on January 19, 2016, by Senator Brant McCreadie. The bill was subsequently referred by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Finance & Taxation, General Government Operations, and Youth Development on January 19, 2016.

The Committee on Finance & Taxation, General Government Operations, and Youth Development held a public hearing on February 10, 2016, in *I Liheslatura*'s Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the hearing agenda was Bill No. 233-33 (LS). The hearing convened at 10:00 a.m. and was adjourned at 11:23 a.m.

II. TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

Chairman Michael San Nicolas yielded the floor to Senator Brant McCreadie to offer an opening statement on Bill No. 232-33. At the request of Senator McCreadie, the Chairman allowed for an opening statement to be made that covered Bill No. 232-33 and Bill No. 233-33.

Senator Brant McCreadie explained the intent of both bills and presented statistics on copper wire thefts within the last three years. He explained the importance of reducing the incidences of theft of copper wire and other metals by imposing harsher fines and penalties. He encouraged other members of the Legislature to support both pieces of legislation.

Chairman San Nicolas thanked the author of the legislation for his statement. Noting that there were no individuals present to provide oral testimony, Chairman San Nicolas concluded the hearing for Bill No. 232-33 and Bill No. 233-33.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

At the request of the author of Bill No. 233-33 (LS), the Committee has provided an amended version of the legislation.

The Committee on Finance & Taxation, General Government Operations, and Youth Development hereby reports out Bill No. 233-33 (LS), as amended by the Committee, with the recommendation To REPORT OT ONY.

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that 3 Public Law 29-70 greatly increased the reporting requirements for scrap metal 4 businesses in an effort to curb the rash of copper wire and other nonferrous metal 5 thefts occurring in our community. However, I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that scrap metal dealers have failed to properly maintain records of nonferrous metal 6 7 transactions. Clearly, the "honor system" currently in place, which requires scrap 8 metal dealers to obtain information from individuals looking to sell copper and other 9 metals, is not working. As such, I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that responsible 10regulation is needed to provide an additional layer of inspection to curb copper wire 11 theft.

12 Therefore, it is the intent of I Liheslaturan Guåhan to amend \$74103 and §74104, and to add a new §74110 of Chapter 74, Title 11 Guam Code Annotated 13 14 relative to establishing mandatory inspection of all nonferrous metal property before 15 being sold to scrap metal businesses.

- Section 2. Subsections (b) and (c) of §74103 of Chapter 74, Title 11 Guam
 Code Annotated are hereby *amended* to read:
- 2

3 (b) For every transaction that involves nonferrous metal property, every 4 scrap metal business doing business in Guam shall require from the person with 5 whom a transaction is being made to sign a declaration. The declaration may be 6 included as part of the transactional record required under Subsection (1) of this 7 Section, or on a receipt for the transaction. The declaration must state 8 substantially the following:

9 "I, the undersigned, affirm under penalty of law that the 10 property that is subject to this transaction is not, to the best of 11 my knowledge, stolen property."

12 The declaration must be signed and dated by the person with whom the 13 transaction is being made. An employee of the scrap metal business must 14 witness the signing and dating of the declaration and sign the declaration 15 accordingly before any transaction may be consummated.

16Additionally, every scrap metal business shall require each person with17whom a transaction is being made to provide a copy of a satisfactory certificate18of inspection from the Department of Public Works pursuant to §74110 of this19Chapter.

(c) The record and declaration required under this Section, including the
 satisfactory certificate of inspection from the Department of Public Works
 provided to the scrap metal business pursuant to §74110 of this Chapter, must
 be open to the inspection of any commissioned local or federal law enforcement
 officer of Guam or any government department or agency at all times during the
 ordinary hours of business or at reasonable times if ordinary hours of business
 are not kept, and must be maintained wherever that business is conducted for

1	one (1) year following the date of the transaction."
2	Section 3. Subsection (a) of §74104, Chapter 74, Title 11 Guam Code
3	Annotated is hereby amended to read:
4	"(a) No scrap metal business may enter into a transaction to purchase or
5	receive non-ferrous metal property from any person who cannot produce the
6	following:
7	(1) at least one (1) piece of current government-issued picture
8	identification, including a valid driver's license or identification card
9	issued by any jurisdiction; and
10	(2) a copy of a satisfactory certificate of inspection from the
11	Department of Public Works, as mandated by §74110 of this Chapter.
12	Only nonferrous metal property properly inspected and identified in the
13	certificate of inspection shall be eligible for sale or delivery to a scrap
14	metal business.
15	Section 4. §74110 of Chapter 74, Title 11 Guam Code Annotated is hereby
16	added to read:
17	"§74110. Inspection Mandatory.
18	(a) No nonferrous metal property may be purchased or received by a
19	scrap metal business without first being inspected and certified by the
20	Department of Public Works. Only nonferrous metal property accounted for in
21	this inspection shall be eligible for sale or delivery to a scrap metal business.
22	(b) The Department of Public Works shall draft rules and procedures to
23	conduct inspections of nonferrous metal property, and shall obtain and keep
24	records of the following information:
25	(1) the name and signature of the person who possesses the
26	nonferrous metal property being brought in for inspection;

1	(2) the street address and telephone number of the person who
2	possesses the nonferrous metal brought in for inspection;
3	(3) the time, date, and location, of the inspection;
4	(4) the estimated monetary value of all nonferrous metal property
5	being inspected;
6	(5) the name of the individual performing the inspection;
7	(6) a description of the motor vehicle and license plate number of
8	the motor vehicle used to bring the nonferrous metal property for
9	inspection;
10	(7) the current driver's license number or other government issued
11	picture identification card number of the person or a photocopy of the
12	person's drivers license or other government-issued picture identification
13	card;
14	(8) a compiled list of each item brought in for inspection; and
15	(9) a photographic record of the items brought in for inspection.
16	(c) At the time of inspection, the Department of Public Works shall
17	require each person to complete a declaration affirming their rightful ownership
18	and possession of all nonferrous metal property brought in for inspection. No
19	certificate shall be issued without a properly filled out declaration.
20	(d) Upon satisfactory completion of inspection, the Department shall
21	issue a certificate of inspection, which each person shall provide to the scrap
22	metal business before any transaction may occur. Any person who does not
23	receive a valid certificate from the Department of Public Works shall not be
24	eligible to sell any nonferrous metal property.

1	(e) Copies of all records and certificates of inspection for non-ferrous
2	metal property shall be remitted each month to the Guam Police Department
3	and the Attorney General's Office.
4	(f) The Department of Public Works shall establish appropriate fees for
5	inspection of nonferrous metal property.
6	(g) Nothing in this Section prohibits the Department of Public Works
7	from obtaining additional information it deems appropriate with regards to the
8	proper certification of nonferrous metal property.
9	(h) Nothing in this Section shall prohibit the Department of Public Works
10	from entering into a contract with a qualified entity to conduct the inspections
11	on their behalf, granted that proper procedures and safeguards are put in place
12	to ensure the validity of the inspections."
13	Section 5. Effective Date. This Act shall be effective immediately upon
14	enactment.
15	Section 6. Severability. If any provision of this Law or its application to any
16	person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall
17	not affect other provisions or applications of this Law which can be given effect
18	without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this
19	Law are severable.

Section 3. Subsection (a) of § 74104, Chapter 74, Title 11, Guam Code 4 5 Annotated, is hereby *amended* to read: 6 "(a) No scrap metal business may enter into a transaction to purchase or 7 receive non-ferrous metal property from any person who cannot produce the 8 following: 9 (1) at least one (1) piece of current government-issued picture identification, including a valid driver's license or identification card 10 11 issued by any jurisdiction; and (2) a copy of a satisfactory certificate of inspection from the 12 13 Department of Public Works, as mandated by § 74110 of this Chapter. 


