



Committee Report Digest

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Higher Education, Culture, Public Library, and Women's Affairs convened a public hearing on Tuesday, February 2, 2016 at 10:00 a.m. in *I Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room. On the agenda was the consideration on Bill No. 235-33 (LS): An act to amend Section 1 (x)(2)(B) of Chapter 5 of Public Law 33-66, relative to the operational start up costs of the Guam Museum.

Public Notice Requirements

All legal requirements for public notices were met, with requests for publication sent to all media and all Senators; 5 day notice was sent on January 26, 2016 and the 48 hour notice was sent on January 29, 2016 via email. Copies of the hearing notices are appended to the report.

11. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Speaker Won Pat Ed.D.

Began by thanking Vice Chair of the Committee on Higher Education, Culture, Public Libraries, and Women's Affairs, Senator Nerissa Underwood; and fellow colleagues, Senator Brant McCreadie; Senator Mary Torres for attending. Speaker Won Pat announced that the purpose of the hearing to hear two appointments — for Frank P. Arriola and Gina Y. Ramos to serve as members of the Guam Community College (GCC) Board of Regents Board of Trustees — and Bill

235-33 (LS), Relative to the operational start up costs for the Guam Museum; Bill 242-33 (COR), relative to interim admission, events, and membership fees for the Guam Museum; and Bill 245-33, relative to authorizing the Guam Public Library System to lease the portion of the building referred to as the "Internet Café" for the purpose of operating and managing a high quality and reasonably priced café.

After confirming that all notices of public hearing were sent out and after announcing that all testimonies may be sent via electronic mail or hand-delivered to her office, or hand delivered to Reproduction at the address of the Guam Legislature Building, Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. began the hearing

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. began hearing of Bill No. 235-33, relative to the operational start up costs of the Guam Museum, and recognized Mr. Joseph Cameron of the Department of Chamorro Affairs (DCA) in attendance to testify. Speaker reminded the audience of the intent of the bill, to expand the language of the existing statute beyond personnel to include operational start up costs, which may be reiterated by DCA today, and used to fund education and marketing expenses, maintain the collection of the Museum or any further expenses outlined in the RFP for the operation and management of the Guam Museum.

Joseph A. Cameron

President, DCA; in favor of Bill No. 235-33, greeted the senators and introduced himself. *Refer to submitted written testimony of Joseph Cameron for Bill No. 235-33*. Cameron described operational start of expenses of the Guam Museum in his written testimony, which included the procurement of long lead items such as Point of Sale systems, collateral print materials, copy machines, fixtures, and display cases, in addition to other items required for the start up and daily operations of the museum.

Speaker Won Pat Won Pat, Ed.D.

Speaker thanked Cameron and recognized that following the introduction of the bill some have requested further clarity of "operational start of costs." Won Pat asked Cameron, based on the RFP to do a Public Private Partnership, would the operational costs indeed reflect those outlined in the scope of services? She referenced the scope of services (Section 4 of RFP-15-008). Won Pat asked if there are any other operational start up expenses needed — such as those listed in Cameron's written testimony — or in addition to what is described in the said scope of services.

Joseph Cameron

Made reference to the IDIQ feature of the contract (indefinite deliverables indefinite quantity) and being driven on a task-order basis. He mentioned that getting the "front of the house," for in place, such as the necessary personal in place, most important; where as the "back side of the house," which is the curatorial projects, can come later. He commented that as the museum open, DCA wants to make sure the museum is indeed ready to open and it has the lead items in place with its opening. Cameron made reference to the American Alliance of Accreditation, saying one thing that is very paramount to the applicant that was given the notice of award, is accreditation. He also alluded to the awardee being made up of a host of professionals who have expressed this sentiment.

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D.

Reiterated the importance of having the details and clarification of "museum operational start up costs" and asked Cameron if any of the expenses mentioned in Cameron's written testimony were incorporated into the RFP.

Joseph Cameron

Replied yes, and apologized for not providing the "laundry list" of expenses included in the entire RFP in his testimony.

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D.

Requested that Cameron submit to the Committee the list of the Museum operation expense list for the purpose of inclusion into the committee report.

Joseph Cameron

Agreed.

Senator N.B. Underwood

Greeted Director Cameron and inquired of the opening date of the Guam Museum.

Joseph Cameron

Recognized the many challenges and delays the Museum has had in its construction, but assured that the Museum's construction (interior and exterior) shall be complete mid-March 2016. Mid-March construction is critical as, Cameron expressed, Delphi (Fabrication Company) will need to step in to begin fabrication of hardware, furniture and media that needs to be in place for the opening.

Senator N.B. Underwood

Reconfirmed the statement that the Museum will be opened mid-March and asked, once more, if the museum will be open in time for FestPac.

Joseph Cameron

Responded, "Yes," that they are currently awaiting the operation and management contract to be approved by the AG and Governor in order to get the awarded company on board and working immediately.

Senator M.C. Torres

Greeted Mr. Cameron and commented on the oddity of the amount of the appropriation, \$529,730, which Bill 235-33 seeks to expand the language to include "operational costs" in addition to personal.

Joseph Cameron

Explained that this amount was based off of a fiscal note and reflects only the specific list of positions and incurred benefits. This was prior to the decision to procure services for Museum operation, managements and maintenance. Cameron reiterated that what the bill in discussion allows for is the expanding of the purpose of the \$529,730 to include operational costs in addition to personnel.

Speaker Wor. Pat, Ed.D.

Added that the amount, \$529,730, is only for funding for half of the year, not the full year.

Joseph Cameron

Agreed.

Senator M.C. Torres

Inquired of the procurement of a private company and asked Cameron if the staff and personnel of the museum a separate body from the awarded management team or is the management also going to be responsible for providing the personnel.

Joseph Cameron

Informing that there are a few Museum Assistants who will be assisting on behalf of DCA; Cameron informed that these assistants are currently assisting with Museum curration, which will save the contractor from having to hire additional people. Cameron informed that the contractor will be under the direct supervision of DCA and in collaboration with what the needs are of the facility's programs.

Senator M.C. Torres

Explains the reason for her inquiring, and that a sense of ownership and pride has resonated with our island since the building of the museum. Torres expressed that she hopes this sense of pride will not deteriorate but rather be enhanced by the management team awarded.

Joseph Cameron

Strongly assured that the organization awarded the bid is composed of people recognized in the field of education and culture, and that the Museum will be thus driven by the people of Guam.

Senator T. A. Morrison

Thanked Cameron and began to inquire about the Museum's current work to establish their interim fee schedule. Senator Morrison asked if the base rate fees were factored into of eration costs, and inquired about the transition period that will take place regarding this.

Joseph Cameron

Assured that any type of admissions fees for programs or into the facility will go directly to DCA, and then it turns right around and revolves to sustain the management contract.

Senator T. A. Morrison

Asked Cameron, with FestPac occurring at the end of May, if there was any anticipation knowing that 120 days will take him beyond May. Morrison asked Cameron if he would look to the Legislature to expedite the fee schedule.

Joseph Cameron

Cameron expressed that once the contractor is on board, the sustainability plan makes reference to a base range comparable to the Bishop Museum. However because Guam is a smaller community the ratio of base range must be balanced with our size and population.

Speaker Won Pat Ed.D is in full support of Bill No. 235-33 (LS) and concluded the public hearing at 11:43 a.m. and also mentioned if there are additional letters of support to email it to fbtorres@judiwonpat.com. Or hand deliver at 155 Hesler Place Hagatna Guam 96910. Or via fax at 472-3589.




