



Committee Report Digest

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Higher Education, Culture, Public Library, and Women's Affairs convened a public hearing on Tuesday, February 2, 2016 at 10:00 a.m. in *I Liheslatura*'s Public Hearing Room. On the agenda was the consideration on Bill No. 235-33 (LS): An act to amend Section 1 (x)(2)(B) of Chapter 5 of Public Law 33-66, relative to the operational start up costs of the Guam Museum.

Public Notice Requirements

All legal requirements for public notices were met, with requests for publication sent to all media and all Senators; 5 days notice was sent on January 26, 2016 and the 48 hours notice was sent on January 29, 2016 via email. Copies of the hearing notices are appended to the report.

IL SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Speaker Won Pat Ed.D.

Began by thanking Vice Chair of the Committee on Higher Education, Culture, Public Libraries, and Women's Affairs, Senator Nerissa Underwood; and fellow colleagues, Senator Brant McCreadie; Senator Mary Torres for attending. Speaker Won Pat announced that the purpose of the hearing to hear two appointments – for Frank P. Arriola and Gina Y. Ramos to serve as members of the Guam Community College (GCC) Board of Regents Board of Trustees – and Bill 235-33 (LS), Relative to the operational start up costs for the Guam Museum; Bill 242-33 (COR), relative to interim admission, events, and membership fees for the Guam Museum; and Bill 245-33, relative to authorizing the Guam Public Library System to lease the portion of the building referred to as the "Internet Café" for the purpose of operating and managing a high quality and reasonably priced café.

After confirming that all notices of public hearing were sent out and after announcing that all testimonies may be sent via electronic mail or hand-delivered to her office, or hand delivered to Reproduction at the address of the Guam Legislature Building, Speaker began the hearing.

Speaker Won Pat Won Pat, Ed.D. transitioned to discuss 242-33, reminding the audience that this bills seeks to allow the Guam Museum to temporarily put fees in place without having to go through the "Triple A" process, but to sunset August 1, 2016. Speaker articulated that this bill will allow the Museum to obtain a revenue stream and begin negotiating with our island's tour agents.

Joseph Cameron

Expressed strong support for Bill No. 242-33 and for allowing DCA to establish interim admission, event and membership fees. Refer to Joseph Cameron's submitted written testimony for Bill No. 242-33.

Speaker Won Pat Won Pat, Ed.D.

Confirmed that the "Triple A" process will take place; 242-33 will allow for the Museum to have an immediate revenue stream, providing operation and sustainability upon opening. Won 2at confirmed there indeed may be adjustments to fees, emphasizing any change be minimal. We don't' want to outprice the admission to the Museum to the point that we don't get any visitors as a result. She expressed that she was very pleased to hear Cameron mention that the fees will be fair and reasonable and that the materials and artifacts of culture in the Museum be accessible to our island community

Senator N.B. Underwood

Expressed encouragement and inquired about whether the fees will be standard; Underwood asked if there was a review of what other Museums have set as far as fees.

Joseph Cameron

Agreed. However, pointed out Guam's uniqueness in population and demographic, and the need to balance the population of tourist who have "pushed for many years" for "sense of place" for culture and history; that place, Cameron noted, is the Museum. Cameron continued to articulate that in Guam "we" have also been very cognizant of what locals want. Cameron mentioned that he has considered grants, which would go toward paying the admission for locals, and most especially Guam's students. Cameron made reference to the concept of the "living museum," which incorporated the STEM project and an educational program. Cameron expressed that once the museum is open, the USDA can fund programs for the Museum, thus contributing to the sustainability of the museum. The Institute of Library Sciences has indicated the same fund source and support for Museum programs, noted Cameron. The admission rate/standard for the Guam Museum, Cameron expressed, will hopefully be even lower than the national rate. Cameron expressed that "we" want the museum to be accessible to all of our students, elementary to college level.

Senator N.B. Underwood

Reconfirmed that the interim fees proposed will be standard for everyone, but for students – and seniors, perhaps, as well – lower and hopefully subsidized. She reconfirmed of whether the interim fees will be the same for everyone.

Joseph Cameron

Responded that the Museum is looking at different fees for different participants.

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D.

Reiterated, regarding the interim fees, there was indicated that there are different fee rates for residents, man'amko, veterans, students and members of the military. She commented that this is more expansive that other museum and institutions, in which there are absolutely no fees for residents. For clarification, regarding the collection of the various fees, Speaker Won Pat inquired as to where the fees shall be deposited.

Joseph Cameron

Guam Museum Revolving Fund, which will turn around to pay the contractor on a task-driven order, for the impact of what the Museum will request of the tax payers.

Senator M.C. Torres

Asked Mr. Cameron about the sunset date, specifically if August 1, 2016 would be enough time. She expressed that this amount of time was actually short once the Museum is up and running.

Joseph Cameron

Expressed that August 1, 2016 was generous, but in responding to Senator Torres, expressed that perhaps December 2016 may indeed be better.

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D.

Informed Mr. Cameron, if a recommendation is to be made in regards to extending the sunset date, it must be made in this public hearing.

Joseph Cameron

Thanked Senator Torres for her statement and made a recommendation to amend the bill to read "December 31, 2016" instead of "August 31, 2016."

Senator M.C. Torres

Reiterated that this change shall allow for the Museum to have enough time to set up and get into an operational mode.

Joseph Cameron

Responded that the reason he proffered the 120 days is because he didn't want to give the impression to any lawmaker that he was trying to bypass the "Triple A" process entirely. December 31, 2016 would be more than feasible, he admitted, and agreed that this time will give a better ground as to how the museum is running.

Senator M.C. Torres

Added that the island has not done anything to this magnitude before (the Museum) and thus we should aspire to "hit it and give enough time to settle."

Senator N.B. Underwood

Added that while the sunset date is being discussed, the actual date of when the Museum is actually going to be open and operational is still uncertain, given any further impediments, for example. So, rather than give a specific date, she offered, it may be better to set a number of days, which would begin immediately once the museum is "fully operational."

Joseph Cameron

Thanked Senator Underwood and agreed. Cameron requested that he report back to the committee a proposal to this effect.

Senator T. A. Morrison

Commented that the bill, 242-33, calls for compliance without the "Triple A" process. Without compliance, given that the Museum would still be "in the process," what would be the process, Senator Morrision inquired, to notify the community of the interim fees.

Joseph Cameron

Once the contract is signed by all parties within the next month, Cameron informed, reaching out to the community will be carried out. He added that if the Museum is going to get the thousands of tourists in, and sustain this amount of tourist, we are going to need to start negotiating and exploring how rates.



Establishing a base rate for admissions early on will allow our team to begin negotiating with tour agents. It takes an average of four to six months for tour companies to fold in new attractions or optional tours into their sales programs at our source markets. This includes adding the new Guam Museum into their sales brochures and tour desk print collateral. It is important for us to quickly negotiate visitor industry rates so that once the Museum is fully operational we can begin welcoming our tourists immediately.



From these base rates we can also determine discounted admission rates for our residents, our *manåmko*, veterans, students and members of the military. Maximizing revenue streams will require a careful balance to ensure that the Museum can be self-sustaining to the extent possible yet affordable for all museum visitors, both tourists and residents alike.



Once our interim fees have been deliberated and are established, we will immediately begin processing them through the Administrative Adjudication Act. We anticipate that this will take at least 120 days before all fees are properly adjudicated and finalized. We realize that there may be some adjustments to any interim fees we may decide upon. However, we anticipate that they will be minimal in nature as we are confident that they will be fair and reasonable.



The proposed legislation intends to add a new Subsection (Y) to § 87104 of Chapter 87, Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated which would provide the Department of Chapters Affairs the authority to establish interim admission, event, and membership fees for the Guam Museum. The Department has yet to determine or finalize these base rates but has acknowledged that legislation will provide revenue to help sustain the new Guam Museum. The current estimated operating costs for the Museum is approximately \$1.2 Million per annum and is being supported by various fund sources (TAF, GF, etc.). Any fees that are collected should be applied to offset the costs of the operations of the facility.
