



#### Committee Report Digest

#### I. <u>OVERVIEW</u>

The Committee on Higher Education, Culture, Public Library, and Women's Affairs convened a public hearing on Tuesday, February 2, 2016 at 10:00 a.m. in *I Liheslatura*'s Public Hearing Room. On the agenda was the consideration on Bill No. 245-33 (COR) An act to add a new Subsection (a)(1) to section 80128 of Chapter 80, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, relative to authorizing the Guam Public Library System to lease the portion of the building referred to as the "Internet Café" for the purpose of operating and managing a high quality and reasonably priced Café.

#### **Public Notice Requirements**

All legal requirements for public notices were met, with requests for publication sent to all media and all Senators; 5 days notice was sent on January 26, 2016 and the 48 hours notice was sent on January 29, 2016 via email. Copies of the hearing notices are appended to the report.

#### II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

#### Speaker Won Pat Ed.D. 10:08 a.m.

Began by thanking Vice Chair of the Committee on Higher Education, Culture, Public Libraries, and Women's Affairs, Senator Nerissa Underwood; and fellow colleagues, Senator Brant McCreadie; Senator Mary Torres for attending. Speaker Won Pat announced that the purpose of the hearing to hear two appointments — for Frank P. Arriola and Gina Y. Ramos to serve as members of the Guam Community College (GCC) Board of Regents Board of Trustees — and Bill 235-33 (LS), Relative to the operational start up costs for the Guam Museum; Bill 242-33 (COR), relative to interim admission, events, and membership fees for the Guam Museum; and Bill 245-33, relative to authorizing the Guam Public Library

System to lease the portion of the building referred to as the "Internet Café" for the purpose of operating and managing a high quality and reasonably priced café.

After confirming that all notices of public hearing were sent out and after announcing that all testimonies may be sent via electronic mail or hand-delivered to her office, or hand delivered to Reproduction at the address of the Guam Legislature Building.

**Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D.** began the hearing on Bill No. 245-33, which she announced was relative to authorization of the Guam Public Library, Hagatna branch, to lease the portion of the newly renovated building referred to as the internet café. She informed that given the current statute regarding the lease of a space for a food establishment, only the front of the library is authorized. 245-33 allows for the internet café within the library to be leased and operate.

#### Joseph Cameron

President, Department of Chamorro Affairs (DCA) introduced himself. He informed that the Guam Public Library falls under the purview of DCA, and he expressed his support for the Bill, 245-33. The current legislation, he informed, authored by Senator Sam Mabini was to allow vendorizing on the external grounds. In moving forward with the RFP for the new internet café, the Guam Services Agency (GSA) had advised that current law only speaks to authorizing vendors on the external grounds versus leasing space. Cameron proctored the amendment to repeal the current law. There is no longer space on the outside of the building anyway. He added, there will be a fair opportunity for the "Museum" [sic] — Cameron most likely meant the library — "to have some additional income." In industry standards, he noted, the library must capture its expenditures and profit margins. Any profit margin more than 5% is the standard for Guam, Cameron continues to express, which could make its way for additional profit for the library. Refer to Joseph Cameron's submitted written testimony on Bill No. 245-33.

#### Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D.

First things first, Won Pat confirmed, is to allow for leasing/vendors inside the library building. The next step is to do an RFP, through which, she reminded, the increase in utilities would be borne by whoever it is awarded. She added, in your RFP, and the consideration for of terms, the amount of profit, the use of space, and liability must be defined.

Thus, a possible amendment to this bill may be necessary, she considered, and instructed Cameron to work with the committee. She added, "it will be subject to an audit."

#### Joseph Cameron

Responded, "correct," that it shall be subject to an audit. If you are an individual without access of a computer, Cameron added, we have stations – computers – purchased by the Library in the cyber tech café.

#### Senator T. A. Morrison

Spoke of the community WiFi measure and working with telecom providers to provide this service. He commented that this bill is very specific to Hagatna and inquired of the status of the Agat library.

#### Joseph Cameron

Informed that the Agat library is functional, and that Guam Public Libraries all have WiFi, donated by a company.

#### Senator T.A. Morrison

Expressed wanting to work with author to expand Bill No. 245-33 to include an internet café at the Agat library.

#### Joseph Cameron

Mentioned that he would go back to Office of the Interior to make that request. Cameron expressed that beginning with the Hagatna branch, however, is a good start. He also expressed that the cyber tech café shall create a "sense of space" for parents and their children, as will creating additional programming for the library, and that the way that the library was renovated allows for the immersion of learning and "spaces" to support that.

#### Senator T. A. Morrison

Inquired about the result of WiFi in the library, particularly if there was a noticeable increase in visitor traffic once WiFi was put in place.

#### Joseph Cameron

Replied, "yes" and that the library has a running log of users, which shows this. He added that the library also has rules in place for computer use.

#### Senator V. A. Ada

Commented that in looking at Cameron's testimony and learning that the Library provided the computers and WiFi service, specifying in the RFP – to whoever leases out the internet café – he asked Cameron why it wasn't decided to have the leasee provide both the WiFi and the computer in the cyber tech café.

#### Joseph Cameron

It was part of a Department of Interior Grant, Cameron responded. The new computers in the cyber tech café was the basis of the grant approval, he informed, and a part of the intent of the interior money. He added, in the scope of services of the RFP, there will be an opportunity to specify computer maintenance and usage. He reminded, however that these computers in the cyber tech café are additional to the computers that are provided in the main library space.

Cameron agreed with Senator Ada that the maintenance and any needed computer replacement could be specified in the RFP.

#### Senator V.A. Ada

The café patrons may think that computers are for them not library use also we need clear distinction, for public use.

#### Joseph Cameron

Strongly agreed, reiterating the fact that it is still government property; the company that is awarded the RFP will be leasing to provide services strictly for a café.

#### Senator V.A. Ada

Mentioned that we don't want the company that will be providing services to make additional revenge from the government-owned computers in their leased space.

#### Joseph Cameron

Assured that he would revisit Senator Ada's issue of concern and that the Hagtna Library and DCA shall be proactive in controlling these details.

#### Senator M. C. Torres

inquired of the benefits of the cafe and if any feasibility studies were done to determine if it, indeed, is a viable option. She reminded that libraries have limited space and hours; thus, she inquired of the realistic sustainability for a cyber tech cafe within the library? She asked if proximity to other cafes in Hagatna was considered, and if research was done to prove if a café would be viable.

#### Joseph Cameron

Replied that he had spoke to neighbors in the Hagatna area (where the library is located) and that there was some home for a café in that location. Cameron also informed that there is an advantage in that the café will have an additional separate entrance from the main entrance of the library, giving the opportunity for an earlier opening time. Cameron expressed not wanting to deter opportunities from the business of the café.

#### Senator M.C. Torres

Asked if Cameron believed that the current would be enough to support the café.

#### Joseph Cameron

Responded that while he didn't have a base, there are so many cafes within Hagatna and they are packed and looking for an opportunity like this. Cameron mentioned that he spoke with café owners in

the area, many of which are interested in putting in for this bid. Cameron confirmed that the business to support a café is there.

#### Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D.

Expanded on the issue equipment maintenance in café. She suggested that the company awarded the bid could be responsible for upkeep of the computers, as it would be an additional cost the government would have to provide for.

#### Joseph Cameron

Responded that computer maintenance will be included in negotiations with potential café companies to lease the cyber tech café.

#### Joseph Cameron

Added, the funds collected for this venue need to be able to go back to the library to support the needs of the library; for resources and education programming, in the form of books, additional computers, or marketing for specific programs, and at the benefit of the entire Guam Public Library System. He emphasized that the revenue made from the inclusion of a cyber tech café can't be cut out from assisting and improving the library system.

#### Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D

Expressed that she wanted to continue this dialogue surrounding the library, and the improvements to the Guam Public Library System.

**Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D** thanked everyone who provided testimony, reminded the audience of the opportunity to still provide testimonies via email or through her office, and adjourned the public hearing at 11:43 a.m.

**Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D** is in full support of Bill No. 245-33 (COR) and concluded the public hearing at 11:43 a.m and also mentioned if there are additional letters of support to email it to fbtorres@judiwonpat.com. Or hand deliver at 155 Hesler Place Hagatna Guam 96910. Or via fax at 472-3589.

The proposed legislation intends to add a new Subsection (a)(1) to Section 80128 of Chapter 80, Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated which would authorize the Guam Public Library System (GPLS) to lease the portion of the building referred to as the "Internet Cafe" for the purpose of operating and managing a high quality and reasonably priced cafe. This would allow GPLS a source of additional revenue which will go towards the support of library infrastructure maintenance and improvement costs. Should GPLS charge between \$1.50 and \$1.75 per sq. ft. for the use of the floor space of 1,000 sq. ft., rental income would be between \$1,500 and \$1,750 per month (\$18,000-\$21,000 per annum).
