

#### **COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST**

#### I. OVERVIEW

Bill No. <u>28-33</u> (COR) was introduced on January 22, 2015, by Senator Frank B. Aguon, Jr., and was subsequently referred by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Guam US Military Relocation, Public Safety and Judiciary on January 22, 2015.

The Committee on Guam US Military Relocation, Public Safety and Judiciary convened a public hearing on Bill No. <u>28-33</u> (COR) on Friday, February 06, 2015 at 2:00PM in Liheslatura's Public Hearing Room.

#### **Public Notice Requirements**

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via e-mail to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on Thursday, January 29, 2015 (5-Day Notice), and again on Wednesday, February 04, 2015 (48-Hour Notice). Notices were also published in the Marianas Variety Newspaper on Friday, January 30, 2015 and Wednesday, February 04, 2015.

#### II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

#### Senator Aguon:

"The items that will be discussed this afternoon on the agenda include: Bill No. 10-33 which is - An act to exempt certain Public Sector Allied Health Professions from Jury Duty, by amending sections in the Guam Code Annotated.

The second bill that will be discussed this afternoon will be Bill No. 14-33 which is - An act known as the Justice Safe Valve Act of 2013 relative to empowering the Courts of Guam to depart from applicable mandatory minimum sentences under specific conditions, and for other purposes.

Then, we will close the discussion for this particular public hearing on Bill No. 28-33 which is - An act relative to removing the time restriction for the Guam Police Department Headquarters, Administrative and other Agency Sections from occupying Government-owned facilities at Tiyan, Guam.

#### Senator Aguon:

"The initial public hearing ad was placed in the Variety(Marianas) on Friday, January 30th. Second public hearing notice sent out on February 4th and also the second ad was printed on February 4th, Wednesday. So that is incompliance with the public notification act.

We will proceed to Bill No. 28-33 (COR) which is, an act relative to removing the time restriction for the Guam Police Department Headquarters, Administrative and other Agency Sections from occupying Government-owned facilities at *Tiyan*. This is legislation that was sponsored by yours truly because the existing law provides a time limit for GPD to occupy facilities up in *Tiyan* and that time limitation was dated 2013 and obviously it being 2015 we do not want the Guam Police Department to not be incompliance with legislation and existing law. The Committee has received testimony on this particular measure by the Antonio B. Won Pat Airport Authority and that will be incorporated into the committee report. At this time we do not have any individuals who will be providing testimony on Bill No. 28(-33(COR)) and so the committee recognizes that and will proceed.

Just for the information for the public because this is legislation that will adjust a particular time line in existing law; the committee may reserve the right to report this out by Wednesday or Thursday of next week so that we may entertain it in the upcoming session. Aside from that, Bill 28-33 is publicly heard and unless there is anyone else in the audience who will like to provide testimony, we will conclude this public hearing. Thank you folks."

The public hearing was adjourned at 2:17PM.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guahan finds that Public Law No. 31-22 amended Public Law No. 26-100 which established time restrictions for the Guam Police Department (the "Department) to vacate government property located in Tiyan, Guam, which is under the ownership of the Antonio B. Won Pat Guam International Airport Authority (hereinafter referred to as the "Airport Authority"). As the Guam Police Department continues to explore options on identifying a more permanent facility for its headquarters, administrative and other operational requirements that are presently located in Tiyan, it is essential that existing public law be amended to grant the Department additional time to finalize its long-term facility requirements and location.

It is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guahan* that the removal of the timeline which exists in law should not directly impact any pre-existing or future arrangements between the Airport Authority and the Guam Police Department. Therefore, this provision would amend the existing law and remove the time period

in which the Department must vacate the Airport Authority government facilities

2 in Tiyan, and which would enable the Department (with no pre-established time

3 restriction) to continue to pursue its options of identifying or constructing a

permanent headquarters and administrative facility.

#### Section 2. Use of Tiyan property by the Guam Police Department.

Section 2 of Public Law No. 26-100, pertaining to the discontinuance of use of Tiyan property (owned by the Antonio B. Won Pat Guam International Airport Authority) by specified government of Guam entities, which was previously amended by Public Law No. 31-22, is hereby amended further to read as follows:

"Section 2. Discontinuance of *Tiyan* Use. Beginning on October 1, 2002, *no* government agency other than GIAA shall utilize space for office or other purposes on *Tiyan* properties under the jurisdiction of GIAA, *except* to the extent that such office space may be required by the Customs and Quarantine Agency and the Department of Agriculture, both for activities associated with operations at GIAA, and *except* for the Guam Police Department headquarters and administrative operations until a permanent facility is constructed for GPD, but in *no* event shall GPD be allowed to utilize property in *Tiyan* for its headquarters and administrative operations beyond September 30, 2013.

Provisions *shall* be made in the Annual Budget Acts to appropriate funds needed to accommodate rentals that may be required pursuant to this Act. Government agencies *shall* be relocated to facilities owned and operated by the government of Guam where such is feasible. The provisions of this Section also apply in the case of *Tiyan* properties under the jurisdiction of GEDA, the Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR) or its successor, and the Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority (GHURA)."

**Section 3. Effective Date.** The provisions contained within this Act shall be effective upon enactment.

Section 4. Severability Clause. If any provision of this Law or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid, or contrary to law, such invalidity *shall not* affect other provisions or applications of this Law which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.

Hafa Adai Senator Aguon:

I am writing to express the Antonio B. Won Pat International Airport Authority, Guam's ("GIAA") position with regard to Bill 28-33. Bill 28-33 amends earlier law authorizing the use of GIAA-owned Tiyan properties by the Guam Police Department ("GPD") by eliminating the date by which GPD can no longer use the Tiyan property for its headquarters and administrative offices. While GIAA supports the intent of Bill 28-33, GIAA suggests certain modifications to the Bill.

GIAA recommends the following changes to the Bill:

Revise Section 2 as follows:

"Section 2. Discontinuance of *Tiyan* Use. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, Bbeginning on October 1, 2002, no government agency other than GIAA may shall lease utilize space for office or other purposes on *Tiyan* properties under the jurisdiction of GIAA, except to the extent that such office space may be required by the Customs and Quarantine Agency and the Department of Agriculture, both for activities associated with operations at GIAA, and except for the Guam Police Department headquarters and administrative operations until a permanent facility is constructed for GPD, but in no event shall GPD be allowed to utilize property in *Tiyan* for its headquarters and administrative operations beyond September 30, 2013.









Provisions shall be made in the Annual Budget Acts to appropriate funds needed to accommodate past, current and future rentals that may be required pursuant to this Act. Government agencies shall be relocated to facilities owned and operated by the government of Guam where such is feasible. The provisions of this Section also apply in the case of Tiyan properties under the jurisdiction of GEDA, the Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR) or its successor, and the Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority (GHURA).

GIAA requests your Committee's favorable consideration of the suggested revisions to Bill 28-33. Thank you for giving me the opportunity to provide GIAA's views on Bill 28-33.
