COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

Bill No. 289-33 (LS) was introduced on April 2, 2016, by Speaker Judith Won Pat, Senators Dennis Rodriguez, Tina Muna Barnes, Nerissa Underwood, Mary Torres, Rory Respicio, Tom Ada, Tommy Morrison, Tony Ada, Vice Speaker Benjamin Cruz, Senators Frank Blas, Brant McCreadie, James Espaldon, Frank Aguon, and Michael San Nicolas. The bill was subsequently referred by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Finance & Taxation, General Government Operations, and Youth Development on April 4, 2016.

The Committee on Finance & Taxation, General Government Operations, and Youth Development held a legislative hearing on April 14, 2016, in *I Liheslatura*'s Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the agenda was Bill No. 289-33 (LS). The hearing convened at 5:30 p.m. and was adjourned at 6:33 p.m.

II. TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

Chairman Michael San Nicolas yielded the floor to Speaker Judith Won Pat to offer an opening statement on Bill No. 289-33.

Speaker Won Pat explained the intent of the bill. She stated that the Guam Economic Development Authority recommended that language in existing law be amended because the amount set aside to go to the labor/delivery ward of the Guam Memorial Hospital was insufficient. She explained the other changes being made to existing law including a continuous appropriation dedicated to paying the line of credit and the allowing of the government of Guam to refinance if lower interests rates are available. Speaker Won Pat stated that these changes will allow GEDA to move forward with securing funding for the renovation project.

Chairman San Nicolas called forward individuals signed up to testify.

Thomas Shieh expressed his support for the bill and stated that members of the medical community on Guam have been pushing for this bill for approximately two years. He stated that the labor/delivery ward needs to be upgraded for the safety, comfort, and support of mothers, fathers, babies, and medical staff and added that it would be one of the best investments the government could ever make. Dr. Shieh suggested an amendment to state that, if the hospital was to be privatized in the future, any cost associated with the renovation should be assumed by any new owner.

Jon Sidell expressed his support for the legislation.

Peter John Camacho mentioned the type of work he believed went into crafting the legislation and stated that the hospital administration is in full support.

Friedrich Bieling expressed his thanks for the bill and the work that went into the introduction of the bill. He stated that the ward was antiquated and was in desperate need of updating. Dr. Bieling mentioned several examples as reasoning for the bill's passage.

Bradley Patrick stated that he has worked in several medical facilities around the world and classified the hospital's labor/delivery ward as antiquated. He expressed his support for the bill.

Myroslav Harasym testified in support of the bill.

Chairman San Nicolas expressed his support for the bill. He mentioned that, when the law was originally passed, he wanted to first see plans developed so that a reasonable cost could be determined. He thanked Speaker Won Pat for her work on the project. He yielded the floor to Speaker Won Pat.

Speaker Won Pat read prepared testimony from the Guam Economic Development Authority. *(see attached)*

Senator Frank Aguon thanked the panelists for their work for the people of Guam.

Speaker Won Pat stated that federal funding for the hospital was recently announced by the Department of the Interior's Office of Insular Affairs that will help assist with securing the equipment necessary when the upgrades are complete. She mentioned that the labor/delivery ward has not changed much since she gave birth to her first child and pointed to that as reason

for the bill to be passed. Speaker Won Pat further added that, as with the renovation of the John F. Kennedy High School campus, while improvements are being made to government buildings on valuable land, she is opposed to any sale of the Guam Memorial Hospital.

Senator Dennis Rodriguez thanked Speaker Won Pat for her work on pushing this issue forward, GEDA for their diligent work in securing funding for the renovation, and the medical staff for the care and services they provide to the people of Guam. He further stated, in response to a comment by Speaker Won Pat, that there are no plans to sell the Guam Memorial Hospital and that recent government actions make way for any future public-private partnerships.

Dr. Shieh stated that the Guam Memorial Hospital is the only hospital that does not turn away patients and entering the island's only public hospital into a future public-private partnership may jeopardize that. He stated that Bill 289-33 needs to be passed and signed into law quickly because many families are in need of an improved labor/delivery ward.

Speaker Won Pat stated that session is scheduled for the following week.

Chairman San Nicolas stated that the committee will work to incorporate the suggestion made at the hearing by Dr. Shieh to require the assumption of any outstanding debt and compensation to GMHA for any incurred expenses financed if any privatization of the labor/delivery ward will affect the division. He stated that the bill is just following through on a project that already commenced and that the labor/delivery ward of the hospital is its primary profit center so the initial investment is expected to generate a higher profit of return for the organization and the people of Guam. Noting that there were no additional individuals present to provide oral testimony, Chairman San Nicolas concluded the hearing for Bill No. 289-33.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee has provided an amended version of Bill No. 289-33 (LS) which incorporates the recommendation made during the public hearing. A new subsection (v)(11) was added to include the assumption of outstanding debt and provision of compensation to the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority for expenses incurred under the subsection in the event that the labor and delivery ward, in whole or part, is privatized.

The Committee on Finance & Taxation, General Government Operations, and Youth Development hereby reports out Bill No. 289-33 (LS), as amended by the Committee, with the recommendation To Report out ONLY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- Subsection (v) is amended to §80109 of Chapter 80, Title 10, Guam Code
- 3 Annotated to read as follows:

- 4 "(v) Notwithstanding Subsection (s) of this Section, to arrange a line of credit, a
- 5 revolving loan fund, and/or a direct loan, the total cumulative amount not to exceed

1	Seven Million Dollars (\$7,000,000) Nine Million, Two Hundred Thousand Dollars
2	(\$9,200,000), to finance Guam Memorial Hospital Authority Labor and Delivery
3	Ward renovation Phases One through Four, and to include "Arts In Public

5	Code Annotated, with banks or other lending institutions licensed to do business on

(5) The line of credit, a revolving loan fund, municipal lease financing. and/or a direct loan may be secured by a pledge or other reservation of revenues collected by the government of Guam from the taxes collected under the "Business Privilege Tax Law" (namely, 11 GCA Chapter 25, excluding the alcoholic beverage taxes, liquid fuel taxes, automotive surcharges, tobacco taxes and real property taxes). The Business Privilege Tax pledged or reserved shall only apply to the unpledged portion of the business privilege tax (currently one percentage point of the current four percent Business Privilege Tax rate) so as not to violate the government of Guam's covenants to bondholders of the Series A, Series B and Series C Limited Obligation bonds authorized through Public Law 31-76, Public Law 31-196 and Public Law 31-276. The sum of Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$600,000) will be used as security continuously appropriated annually to pay for the principal, interest, and debt reserve for the line of credit, a revolving loan fund, and/or a direct I Maga'lahen Guåhan and the Guam Economic Development Authority are hereby authorized to execute the loan agreement, a revolving loan fund, and/or a direct loan agreement and other necessary documentation.

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- (6) Any money borrowed shall be repaid in accordance with the terms established in the negotiated agreement, but not to exceed an amortization period of more than twenty-five (250) years. In no case shall any amount borrowed be refinanced permitting repayment more than twenty (20) years after the loan is made.
- (7) Notwithstanding the provisions of Chapter 6 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated, the government of Guam hereby waives immunity from any suit or action in contract upon the loan and guaranty, but does not waive

sovereign immunity as to the personal liability of elected or appointed officials and employees of the government of Guam. For the purpose of this provision only, immunity is also waived as to the award of attorney fees and related costs in connection with any suit brought to enforce any right or obligation incurred under the loan authorized hereby or in connection with the enforcement of any agreement, note or pledge that arises directly from the indebtedness authorized hereby.

- (8) This Guarantee is a general obligation of the government of Guam, subject to the full faith and credit of the government of Guam. The Guarantor consents to any and all extension of time and waiver or modification of obligations guaranteed hereunder.
- (9) Alternative Financing. I Maga'lahen Guåhan and the Guam Economic Development Authority are authorized to utilize the following alternative financing if necessary:
 - (A) Federal Guaranteed Loan or Community Facilities Loan and Grants, instrumentalities of the United States Department of Agriculture, if such financing better serves the needs of the people of Guam; and/or
 - (B) Municipal Lease Financing. I Maga'lahen Guåhan, with the assistance of the Guam Economic Development Authority, is authorized to enter into a municipal lease financing as defined under Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, Division 5, Chapters 58, 58A, 58B, 58D and 58E.
 - (C) I Maga'lahen Guåhan is authorized to identify a fund source, except for funding sources that are already identified and earmarked for the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority, limited to the amounts in this Act, and utilize such source for the purposes of renovating the labor, delivery, recovery, postpartum ward where our babies are born. I Maga'lahi shall notify I Liheslatura (the Legislature) of the fund source(s) identified

pursuant to this provision no later than ten (10) working days after identification of funds.

(10) The GMHA Board of Trustees shall cause an update of its facilities master plan that will guide the capital improvement of the Guam Memorial Hospital. The Trustees shall allocate sufficient funds from the amount obtained from the line of credit, revolving fund, and/or direct loan authorized by this Subsection for the purpose of completing a master plan update. Review and approval of the completed master plan update shall be in accordance with the AAL. Said master plan update shall be completed within one hundred eighty (180) days from the date of enactment of this statute.

RELATIVE TO **AUTHORIZE** MAGA'LAHEN GUAHAN TO ENTER INTO A LINE OF CREDIT, A DIRECT LOAN, OR ALTERNATIVE FINANCING FOR THE RENOVATION OF THE GUAM MEMORIAL HOSPITAL LABOR AND DELIVER WARD (GMHA MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTHCARE (MCH) RENOVATION PROJECT).

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Guam Memorial Hospital Labor and Delivery Ward
- 3 Financing. Subsection (v) is amended to §80109 of Chapter 80, Title 10, Guam
- 4 Code Annotated, to read as follows:

"(v) Notwithstanding Subsection (s) of this Section, to arrange a line of credit, a revolving loan fund, and/or a direct loan, the total cumulative amount not to exceed Seven Million Dollars (\$7,000,000) Nine Million, Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$9,200,000), to finance Guam Memorial Hospital Authority Labor and Delivery Ward renovation Phases One through Four, and to include 'Arts In Public Buildings and Facilities' fee as required by §852 of Chapter 8, Title 1, Guam Code Annotated, with banks or other lending institutions licensed to do business on Guam. All terms of the line of credit, a revolving loan fund, and/or a direct loan agreement shall be negotiated by the Guam Economic Development Authority and *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* (the Governor) in the best interests of the people of Guam. The terms of the line of credit, a revolving loan fund, and/or a direct loan shall include the following:

(1) the line of credit, a revolving loan fund, and/or a direct loan shall be used by the Authority for the renovation of the Guam Memorial Hospital Labor and Delivery Ward (GMHA Maternal and Child Healthcare (MCH) Renovation Project);

- (A) such line of credit shall not be authorized, nor shall any borrowing be initiated that incurs interest expenses until the architectural and engineering specifications are completed and approved by the Board of Trustees of the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority (GMHA), and the Request for Proposal or Invitation for Bid to commence renovation is pending funding;
- (2) no charge shall be levied by a lender for making the loan;
- (3) the interest rate shall be subject to negotiation between the Board of Directors of GEDA, I Maga'lahen Guåhan, and the lender;

and such interest rate shall be computed on a monthly average and based on the actual amount extended for the Authority; and

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- (4) interest earned by the lender shall be exempt from taxation by the government of Guam.
- (5) The line of credit, a revolving loan fund, municipal lease financing, and/or a direct loan may be secured by a pledge or other reservation of revenues collected by the government of Guam from the taxes collected under the "Business Privilege Tax Law" (namely, 11 GCA Chapter 25, excluding the alcoholic beverage taxes, liquid fuel taxes, automotive surcharges, tobacco taxes and real property taxes). The Business Privilege Tax pledged or reserved shall only apply to the unpledged portion of the business privilege tax (currently one percentage point of the current four percent Business Privilege Tax rate) so as not to violate the government of Guam's covenants to bondholders of the Series A, Series B and Series C Limited Obligation bonds authorized through Public Law 31-76, Public Law 31-196 and Public Law 31-276. The sum of Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$600,000) will be used as security continuously appropriated annually to pay for the principal, interest, and debt reserve for the line of credit, a revolving loan fund, and/or a direct loan. I Maga'lahen Guåhan and the Guam Economic Development Authority are hereby authorized to execute the loan agreement, a revolving loan fund, and/or a direct loan agreement and other necessary documentation.
- (6) Any money borrowed shall be repaid in accordance with the terms established in the negotiated agreement, but not to exceed an amortization period of more than twenty-five (250) years. In no case

shall any amount borrowed be refinanced permitting repayment more than twenty (20) years after the loan is made.

- (7) Notwithstanding the provisions of Chapter 6 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated, the government of Guam hereby waives immunity from any suit or action in contract upon the loan and guaranty, but does not waive sovereign immunity as to the personal liability of elected or appointed officials and employees of the government of Guam. For the purpose of this provision only, immunity is also waived as to the award of attorney fees and related costs in connection with any suit brought to enforce any right or obligation incurred under the loan authorized hereby or in connection with the enforcement of any agreement, note or pledge that arises directly from the indebtedness authorized hereby.
- (8) This Guarantee is a general obligation of the government of Guam, subject to the full faith and credit of the government of Guam. The Guarantor consents to any and all extension of time and waiver or modification of obligations guaranteed hereunder.
- (9) Alternative Financing. *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* and the Guam Economic Development Authority are authorized to utilize the following alternative financing if necessary:
 - (A) Federal Guaranteed Loan or Community Facilities Loan and Grants, instrumentalities of the United States Department of Agriculture, if such financing better serves the needs of the people of Guam; and/or
 - (B) Municipal Lease Financing. I Maga'lahen Guåhan, with the assistance of the Guam Economic Development Authority, is authorized to enter into a municipal lease

financing as defined under Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, Division 5, Chapters 58, 58A, 58B, 58D and 58E.

(C) I Maga'lahen Guåhan is authorized to identify a fund source, except for funding sources that are already identified and earmarked for the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority, limited to the amounts in this Act, and utilize such source for the purposes of renovating the labor, delivery, recovery, postpartum ward where our babies are born. I Maga'lahi shall notify I Liheslatura (the Legislature) of the fund source(s) identified pursuant to this provision no later than ten (10) working days after identification of funds.

(10) The GMHA Board of Trustees shall cause an update of its facilities master plan that will guide the capital improvement of the Guam Memorial Hospital. The Trustees shall allocate sufficient funds from the amount obtained from the line of credit, revolving fund, and/or direct loan authorized by this Subsection for the purpose of completing a master plan update. Review and approval of the completed master plan update shall be in accordance with the AAL. Said master plan update shall be completed within one hundred eighty (180) days from the date of enactment of this statute.

(11) That, if the labor and delivery ward operations or facilities are privatized, to include any public-private partnership, then, as a condition of such privatization agreement, the party or parties which have assumed control or ownership of the operations or facilities shall assume any outstanding debt and provide compensation to the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority for any incurred expenses that were financed under this subsection."

Hafa Adai Chairman Rodriguez and members of the Committee on Health, Economic Development, Homeland Security, and Senior Citizens. The Guam Economic Development Authority (GEDA) would like to express that we are standing in full support of the intent of Bill 289-33 for the renovation of the Guam Memorial Hospital Labor and Delivery Ward.

Guam Memorial Hospital Authority (GMHA) and its facilities have served our island community for over 60 years rendering some of its amenities obsolete. As Guam's primary hospital, GEDA finds it necessary GMHA undergo renovations in order to accommodate the future needs of our island. The passing of Bill 289-33 will enable the Government of Guam, GEDA and GMHA to strategically finance one of its most crucial units as it affects the healthcare and wellness of our newborn children.

The borrowing authorized in Bill 298-33 in combination with the \$3,500,000 Governor Calvo requested from the Office of Insular Affairs will provide for the full amount required to make the appropriate renovations complete with the purchase of dire needed equipment.

Due to the manageable size of this financing, a subordinate lien of the three percent (3%) BPT will be sufficient in securing annual payments. Public Law 31-76 does not prohibit the Government of Guam from securing a financing with the three percent (3%) pledged BPT so long as the pledge is subordinate to the BPT Series 2011A, 2012B, 2013C and 2015D Bonds and upon legislative approval.

GEDA therefore recommends the \$600,000 annual appropriation for the principal and interest payments be appropriated as a subordinate lien of the pledged three percent (3%) Business Privilege Tax.
