#### **COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST**

#### I. OVERVIEW

Bill No. 290-33 (COR) was introduced on April 4, 2016 by Senator Thomas C. Ada and was subsequently referred on April 5, 2016 by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement.

The Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement convened a public hearing on April 14, 2016 at 9:00 am in *I Liheslaturan's* Public Hearing Room to receive public testimony on Bill No. 290-33 (COR).

#### **Public Notice Requirements**

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on April 7, 2016 (5-Day Notice) and again on April 11, 2016 (48-Hour Notice). Publication was conducted in the April 7, 2016 issue and April 11, 2016 issue of the **Guam Daily Post**, *a newspaper of general circulation*, fulfilling the 5-Day Notice and 48-Hour Notice of the Open Government Law requirement.

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 9:00am.

#### II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Chairperson Ada calls the Public Hearing to order and as sponsor, introduces Bill No. 290-33.

**Chairperson Ada:** He first reads the title of Bill 290-33. Then referring to a projected graphic he says that the area that we are talking about is within the red lines of the map shown. The area that's in yellow is also government land which we're also looking to place under the administrative control of the mayor. The area that we are looking to transfer to the mayor and the council is in a tract that includes a senior citizens center, a fire station and post office mailboxes.

Chairperson Ada then calls those who have signed up to provide testimony.

**Michael Borja**, *Director*, Department of Land Management (reading from written testimony): He reads his testimony in favor of Bill 290-33. His testimony recommended an amendment to Section 1 of the bill to exclude the transfer of lots not occupied by the existing structures. In addition, the testimony also suggested a source of funding for the cost to consolidate and parcel the lots in Tract 3620 to be transferred to the Mayor of Inarajan and the Inarajan Municipal Planning Council.

**Chairperson Ada:** First of all, Land Management has no objections to the administrative transfer and control?

**Director Borja:** Nor does the Chamorro Land Trust. We had already discussed that in the previous bill and it's to be used by the mayors and the Chamorro Land Trust Act approves that kind of activities for the lands to be used for the communities and for the mayors specifically.

**Chairperson Ada:** Just to clarify for the record, this bill was introduced because the previous bill actually made reference to an incorrect tract number.

#### Director Borja: Ok.

**Mayor Doris Lujan,** *Mayor of Inarajan* (oral testimony): We respectfully request that section 1, lines 5 and 6, which states "*multi-purpose sports facility*" be amended to read "*community public facilities.*" Additionally, we request that section 2 be removed in its entirety. Additionally, we request the bill be amended to include Tract 381-1 and all adjacent lots that are located in Tract 3620 be included in this bill.

**Chairperson Ada:** I guess we're having a change of tract numbers versus lot numbers, but those are details that will get straightened out. As long as we have your written testimony, we'll take a close look at that and work out those details.

**Don Weakley, Inarajan Municipal Planning Council** (oral testimony): About three years ago, the council, under the direction of the Mayor submitted a request to GHURA for funding for a gymnasium under CDBG funds and not knowing at that time that it was under the control of the Chamorro Land Trust. The agreement with the Chamorro Land Trust expires in about six or seven years so GHURA didn't want to touch it unless we could get permanent control of the property. They've given us indication to assist with the funding of the gymnasium and other sports facilities. In addition, the Mayor's concept is to make this area the government center of Inarajan because it's up above any dangerous tidal waves or anything like that. We're one of two villages on the island that does not have our own mayor's office. Someday we hope that the government will provide a mayor's office to the mayor. Right now, we are paying about \$2,600 a month to the church for leasing the mayor's office where we're at now in Malojloj. But we like that area there because public health, fire department, and the senior citizens center is all there so it's an ideal location. We respectfully request your approval of it.

**David Chargualaf,** *Resident of Inarajan* (oral testimony): I'm here in support of Bill 290-33 which ultimately gives jurisdiction to our mayor's office and the municipal planning council. I just have two questions. The first one is the bill identifies the use of the land specifically for a multi-purpose center. If in fact we do get jurisdiction, is it restricted to just that? Secondly, the bill states that in the event we don't use the land, it goes back to the Chamorro Land Trust. Is there a timeline or deadline of when we have to use that land? Those are my questions.

**Chairperson Ada:** The mayor brought up earlier that the properties being transferred for the purpose of the multi-purpose sports facility, but the recommendation is to make it a broader term so that we're not limited to that. If it's used for something else other than what is being envisioned, does it go back to the Chamorro Land Trust. We'll have to go back and take a look at that.

**Mr. Chargualaf:** The intent is to use it for the multi-purpose center, but are we restricted to use it for just that specifically or can we add on to it?

**Mayor Lujan:** Senator, earlier I stated that section 2 of this bill be removed in its entirety, which means we don't have any limitations owning the property once it's transferred under the jurisdiction of the mayor's office.

Chairperson Ada: We'll look at that.

**Speaker Judi Won Pat:** What do you envision now and in the future so we get an idea as to what it is that you're planning to use the land for?

**Mayor Lujan:** Community public facilities includes educational, recreational, and cultural purposes. Adult learning center, vocational technical training, and anything that is possible for our community to engage in building so it's a general purpose facility for whatever comes up. Inarajan is going to grow and we're going to be needing this type of facility.

**Speaker Won Pat:** Don (Weakley) mentioned that you would like to have the mayor's office there so that would also include the mayor's office. Ok, thank you.

**Chairperson Ada:** You're looking at a larger version of what you have in the village now. You have the basketball court back there, the old house that's been renovated which becomes the community meeting center, small computer room back there. It's a very small multipurpose facility. You really need to start thinking about the growth in the village.

If there are no other questions, then we'll consider Bill 290-33 as having been duly heard. Thank you.

Chairperson Ada adjourns the Public Hearing for Bill No. 290-33 (COR).

#### III. Findings and Recommendation

The Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement finds and recommends the following relative to Bill 290-33:

- That Tract 3620 in the Municipality of Inarajan is not Chamorro Land Trust Lands but rather is actually from the Public Law 22-18 Government of Guam Reserved Lands List Exhibit to Section 2(b), which referenced an incorrect tract number (Tract 3621).
- Amendment: Section 1, Lines 5 and 6: change *multi-purpose sports facility* to *community public facilities.*
- Amendment: Section 1, Line 7: Add "The portion of Tract 3620 to be administratively transferred shall be the areas not occupied by the Senior Citizens Center, the Inarajan Fire Station and the U.S. Postal Service Mailboxes."
- Amendment: Section 2: **Remove** in its entirety.
- Amendment to provide and allow a varierty of funding options for the consolidation and parceling survey: Determine, provide and allow for funding options. Funding for the survey may be sourced from the Host Community Benefits Fund for the Municipality of Inarajan authorized by Title 10, Chapter 51, Article 4, GCA, or; Alternatively, the survey cost can be incorporated into the construction contract for the facilities. Or the Department of Land Management can be directed to conduct the survey funded by FY2017 appropriated funds.
- That all contiguous Government of Guam lots to Tract 3620 including Lot 381-1 be transferred to the Mayor of Inarajan and Inarajan Municipal Planning Council.


**Property Transfer.** Should the remainder portion of Tract 3620 be 9 Section 2. no longer required for the construction of a multi-purpose sports facility, it shall 10 automatically transfer to the inventory of the Chamorro Land Trust Commission. 11

12 Section 3. Responsibilities of the Department of Land Management. The Department of Land Management shall cause a re-survey of Tract 3620 as described in 13 14 Department of Land Management map drawing reference number 150-FY85/14-85T246 to sever out the portions of Tract 3620 upon which the Senior Citizens Center and the 15 16 Inarajan Fire Station are situated on. 

#### Hafa Adai!

The Department of Land Management has reviewed Bill No. 290-33 and recommends the following technical change to the bill:

a. Add to Section 1 of Bill No. 290-33: "Tract 3620 is described in Department of Land Management map drawing reference number 150-FY85/14-85T246 as shown on Exhibit A. <u>The portion of Tract 3620 to be administratively transferred</u> <u>shall be the lots not occupied by the Senior Citizens Center, Inarajan Fire</u> <u>Department, and the U.S. Postal Service.</u> Said administrative jurisdiction <del>and</del> shall become effective upon the enactment of this Act."

The intent of Bill No. 290-33 is similar to Bill No. 227-33 which this department commented on in its January 21, 2016 testimony letter. The significant difference with Bill No. 290-33 is the inclusion of an unfunded mandate in Section 3 of the bill onto the Department of Land Management. Instead, the department recommends the following:

a. The Office of the Mayor of Inarajan and the Inarajan Municipal Planning Council fund the necessary consolidation and parceling of the lots in Tract 3620 being administratively transferred to it from the Chamorro Land Trust Commission. Funding may be sourced from the Host Community Benefits Fund for the Municipality of Inarajan as authorized by Title 10 Guam Code Annotated, Chapter 51, Article 4; or,

b. The consolidation and parceling of the lots in Tract 3620 would be required of and performed by the contractor who will construct the multi-purpose sports facility for the Office of the Mayor of Inarajan and the Inarajan Municipal Planning Council.

#### BUREAU OF BUDGET AND MANAGEMENT RESEARCH COMMENTS ON BILL NO. <u>290-33 (COR)</u>

The proposed legislation intends to transfer a portion of Tract 3620 in the municipality of Inarajan to the administrative jurisdiction of the Inarajan Mayor's Office (IMO) and the Inarajan Municipal Planning Council (IMPC) for the purpose of constructing a multi-purpose sports facility.

It should be noted that there have been similar versions of the subject legislation proposed during FY 2016. Bill No. 227-33 (COR) transferred unspecified portions of the subject property to only the IMO for the purpose of constructing the multi-purpose sports facility. Subsequently, Bill Nos. 254-33 (LS) ~ 262-33 (LS) transferred specific portions of Tract 3620 (Lot Nos. 9 thru 17 with an aggregate area of  $8,391.2\pm$  square meters) to the IMO for the same purpose of constructing a multi-purpose sports facility.

The subject proposed legislation has the same intent to transfer portions of Tract 3620 for the construction of the sports facility, but now to include the IMPC as receiving administrative jurisdiction of the property. In addition, the proposed legislation adds the responsibility of re-surveying Tract 3620 to the Department of Land Management (DLM) to designate which portions of Tract 3620 shall be transferred to the administrative jurisdiction of the IMO and IMPC. Because the added responsibility of re-surveying Tract 3620 imposes an unfunded mandate on DLM, the DLM recommends that the responsibility of covering the cost of the re-survey should be held by the IMPC funded by the Host Community Fund or by the contractor selected to construct the multi-purpose sports facility.

Transferring the subject property to the administrative jurisdiction of the IMO and the IMPC will have several fiscal impacts involving multiple parties. By transferring the subject property to the IMO and the IMPC, the CLTC will not be able to collect lease payments resulting in a loss of revenue. However, by enabling the construction project to commence, revenues in the form of building permits for the sports facility can be anticipated to be received by the Department of Public Works (DPW). Subsequently, when the sports facility is operational, the IMO and IMPC can assess fees for use of the facility (i.e. basketball leagues, team practices, etc.).

Due to lack of sufficient information regarding the current lease agreement of the subject property and the specifics on the design of the new sports facility, the Bureau is unable to determine an approximate dollar amount of potential revenues lost for the CLTC in lease payments and gained by the DPW through the issuance of building permits.

In addition, the construction of the sports facility would increase the total aggregate assessed value of real property on Guam. Per the Certified 2013 Real Property Tax Assessment roll mandated by §24518, Chapter 24, Title 11 GCA, the total land and building aggregate assessed values are \$5.959 Billion and \$5.629 Billion, respectively. The combination of both the land and building assessed values creates the base for the Government of Guam's debt service ceiling, which is ten percent (10%) of the total assessed value. The construction of new facilities on the cited lot will increase the total building assessed value, thus increasing the base for the Government of Guam's debt service ceiling.

It should be noted that the proposed legislation includes a reversionary clause upon inaction of portions of the property. If any portion of Tract 3620 should no longer be needed for construction of the sports facility, that/those portion(s) of Tract 3620 will be reverted back to the Chamorro Land Trust land inventory.
