COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

Bill No. 294-33 (COR), As Introduced – B. J.F. Cruz – "An act to add a new Section 1(ee)(5) to Chapter V of Public Law 33-66 relative to providing supplemental funding and authorization to the Guam Election Commission for its FY 2016 Operations and for payments on obligations incurred in prior years."

I. OVERVIEW

Bill No. 294-33 (COR) was introduced by Vice Speaker Benjamin J.F. Cruz on April 12, 2016, and subsequently referred to the **Committee on Appropriations and Adjudication** on the same day.

The Committee on Appropriations and Adjudication convened a public hearing on Wednesday, April 20, 2016, beginning at 2:00PM in the Guam Legislature Public Hearing Room. The hearing for **Bill No. 294-33 (COR)** began at 2:15 PM and ended at 2:36 PM.

Public Notice Requirements

All legal requirements for public notices were met, with requests for publication sent to all media and all Senators on April 13, 2016, and April 18, 2016, via email. Copies of the hearing notices are appended to the report.

II. TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

Chairman Benjamin J.F. Cruz announced Bill No. 294-33 (COR), and acknowledged Ms. Maria Pangelinan, Executive Director of the Guam Election Commission, as the

individual present to testify.

Ms. Maria Pangelinan thanked Chairman Cruz, greeted the members of the Committee on Appropriations and Adjudication (Committee), and proceeded to read the first page of her written testimony, a letter drafted by Ms. Pangelinan to Chairman Cruz (appended to this report). The letter requested an increase to the Guam Election Commission's (GEC) FY2016 supplemental budget, from three hundred eight thousand nine hundred sixty dollars (\$308,960) [as stated in Bill No. 294-33 (COR)] to three hundred thirty four thousand two hundred and thirty eight dollars (\$334,238). According to Ms. Pangelinan's letter, the additional twenty five thousand two hundred seventy eight dollars (\$25,278) was needed to cover the costs of the Guam Central Voter Registry System and the GEC Office Systems. The letter further requested an authorization of two hundred seventy thousand five hundred thirty one dollars (\$270,531) for GEC prior year obligations, stating that the GEC Board had already authorized the payment of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for the total three hundred seventy thousand five hundred thirty one dollars (\$370,531) incurred in prior year invoices. Ms. Pangelinan noted that under Section 2 of Bill No. 294-33 (COR), GEC would be able to make such payment through the Fiscal Year (FY) 2015 carryover funding.

Chairman Cruz inquired:

"What prior year obligations consist of [nearly] three hundred seventy one thousand dollars (\$371,000)?"

Ms. Pangelinan:

"It's on the last page [of Ms. Pangelinan's written testimony, entitled "Bureau of Budget Management Research: Prior Year Obligations for FY 2015]. This form that you see is something that is submitted in every budget request but it is not included in the budget digest."

Chairman Cruz inquired:

"Did you get the lump sum budget?"

Ms. Pangelinan responded:

"Lump sum, sir."

Chairman Cruz continued:

"And in your allocation that you gave to the [Bureau of Budget and Management Research (BBMR)], why did you not take care of your prior year obligations?"

Ms. Pangelinan responded:

"Sir, in the [budget] process, the budget digest does not include this amount anywhere. This amount only shows in my cover letter for every fiscal year budget returns..."

Chairman Cruz interjected:

"To whom?"

Ms. Pangelinan responded:

"To the legislature, with a courtesy copy to BBMR."

Chairman Cruz inquired:

"And your submittal, your request to BBMR—do you submit your request directly to us?"

Ms. Pangelinan responded:

"What we do, Mr. Chairman, is we submit it you, but we work with [BBMR] so that their budget request shows what we say we need. If we don't work with them, their budget request for us may be a different amount than what we..."

Chairman Cruz clarified:

"So they make a budget request for you, through the Executive Budget, so you're not one of the autonomous agencies separated?"

Ms. Pangelinan responded:

"No."

Chairman Cruz continued:

"Okay so I'm wondering why you didn't work with them to get this amount in your allocation."

Ms. Pangelinan responded:

"I've been working with them for the last five (5) years. There was a point in time, Mr. Chairman, maybe FY2013, where they were going to be able to transfer a little bit but because another—I believe it might have been FY2012—but what happened was our election vendor took priority over that."

Chairman Cruz inquired:

"And even if we were to make this authorization, have they assured you of any cash that's going to be forthcoming to make these payments?"

Ms. Pangelinan responded:

"No sir. I keep asking."

Chairman Cruz continued:

"And you've had their authorization and the ongoing obligation that neither of you have covered."

Ms. Pangelinan responded:

"Yes. So at the end of FY2015, we accumulated a carryover of about one hundred four thousand dollars (\$104,000), so I had asked the GEC Board to allow us to pay one hundred thousand [dollars] (\$100,000) of the [approximately] three hundred seventy one thousand [dollars] (\$371,000) [in prior year obligations].

Chairman Cruz inquired:

"To whom?"

Ms. Pangelinan responded:

"We were going to pay part of it to our former legal counsel. And to the University of Guam (UOG) Computer Center."

Chairman Cruz inquired:

"And how much is going to the [UOG] Computer Center?"

Ms. Pangelinan responded:

"Thirty nine thousand dollars (\$39,000)."

Chairman Cruz inquired:

"And were those payments made?"

Ms. Pangelinan responded:

"Not yet, because the authorization for paying prior year obligations in the FY2016 budget only authorizes to use FY2016 funding. So what we were going to do was start to charge current year expenditures to FY2015 carryover, but with Section 2 of Bill No. 294-33 (COR), we can just take the one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) out of the carryover of FY2015."

Chairman Cruz opened the floor for questions.

Senator Frank B. Aguon inquired:

"Out of the authorization year, the appropriation is a [total] three hundred thirty four [thousand dollars] (\$334,000) that you're requesting [for GEC's FY2016

Supplemental Budget]. Now the two hundred and seventy thousand [dollars] (\$270,000) [for GEC prior year obligations]—is that above and beyond? Or are you requesting authorization to be able to expend these on prior year obligations?"

Ms. Pangelinan responded:

"Above and beyond."

Senator Aguon continued, referring to the last page of Ms. Pangelinan's written testimony:

"And you did provide a breakdown of some of these obligations. I'm just looking at some of these obligations. Ideally, we want to be able to make sure that government [entities] will meet our obligations but looking at entities such as [the Guam Department of Public Works] back in FY2013 for the busing, looking at the Guam Police Department back in 2012 as outstanding obligations, there are certainly areas in which we can have a discussion with some of these entities and see if, in fact, they've already closed the books on these obligations. But thank very much, Ms. Pangelinan, and thank you for the clarification."

Senator Rory J. Respicio inquired:

"Thank you for the introduction of [Bill No. 294-33 (COR)]. I want to point out that the three hundred thirty four thousand dollars (\$334,000) that the GEC is requesting...this bill basically would put the onus on the [Governor of Guam] to identify and transfer the sums necessary so that the expenses that would be incurred for the Primary Election would be covered. I also want to go on the record to thank [Chairman Cruz] for including Section 2. Just so senators know, this language was exactly the language that was adopted by a floor amendment that I had made and there were no objections, but somehow in the process, it didn't reflect this, and that's why Maria Pangelinan is saying that they did submit the request to BBMR to process these prior years obligation and all BBMR was reading was that it was prior year. Is that correct [Ms. Pangelinan]?"

Ms. Pangelinan responded:

"Yes."

Senator Respicio continued:

"So what we're doing here in Section 2 is really consistent with what the Legislature addressed in session but it didn't reflect that in the final passage of the Budget Act. So thank you so much, Mr. Chairman, for wanting to help clarify that and also I'm hoping that since the bill originated as a challenge for [Governor Calvo] to identify and transfer the funds, I'm hoping that we can

agree to challenge him more and just also recognize the additional two hundred seventy thousand dollars (\$270,000) so that we're very clear that these are obligations that have to be paid and that the GEC—whether through its own cost savings initiatives and the lapses they've identified, or whether the Governor can identify some resources elsewhere. I think, at the very least, giving [Governor Calvo] the authorization is more than half the battle. Would you say that's a correct assessment of what we're trying to do here?"

Ms. Pangelinan nodded her head in agreement.

Senator Aguon inquired:

"Just so we understand the implications of not moving forward with this legislation, you're looking at focusing on the Primary Election which is toward the conclusion of this fiscal year?"

Ms. Pangelinan responded:

"Correct."

Senator Aguon continued:

"And you also need the funding as quickly as possible so that you can continue the preparation [for the Primary Election]?"

Ms. Pangelinan responded:

"Yes. One of the things that happens, Senator, is that, in preparation for the Primary Election, to save money, we also buy the ballots for the General Election. And we prep with their vendor for both the Primary and the General, including the site support. We also prep the precincts and the precinct officials. [So] when we're prepping for the Primary, we're gearing up for the election as well. It's worked out, but it is a little complicated because, come September 30, 2016, it's the close of the fiscal year. Come October, it's hard for us to process payments at the beginning of the fiscal year."

Chairman Cruz inquired:

"And in your [budget request] submittal to us last year, was this three hundred and eight thousand dollars (\$308,000) included?"

Ms. Pangelinan responded:

"For FY 2016, yes most of it, [but] not all of it. I apologize, Mr. Chairman. I don't know what the difference from..."

Chairman Cruz clarified:

"Not including the prior year obligations. Just for the operations of this year."

Ms. Pangelinan responded:

"Probably the one hundred and twenty two thousand dollars (\$122,000) was not included there, sir. I'm sorry I don't know the difference between what we had requested and what we were appropriated."

Chairman Cruz continued:

"You've really placed us in a really difficult position because you're not the only one that's asking for a supplemental. But the fact that this is a democracy and we're trying to make sure we can move forward with this is the only reason why I was looking at [this legislation]. But now you've complicated it by having an additional amount different from last month. It was only March and now it's increased by [approximately twenty five thousand dollars] and you're asking for [approximately] an additional two hundred and seventy one thousand dollars (\$271,000). Plus you're asking to pay it for the [approximately] three hundred and seventy three thousand (\$373,000) [in prior year invoices]. I just don't know how we're going to be able to fit that in."

Ms. Pangelinan responded:

"Mr. Chairman, I don't remember the difference, but in the schedule BBMR report, what we had requested shows partially on the column, and I apologize for the difference in what I requested on March 17, 2015 [page 4 of Ms. Pangelinan's written testimony] and what I requested now. We've been working with the University of Guam Computer Center for over twenty (20), maybe even thirty (30) years. They've been doing it without any charge to the GEC up until FY2011. So since I've been there, Mr. Chairman, we've gone back and forth with taking it out of the UOG Computer Center. But at this time, all the central voter registration centers that are available for purchase can only be housed off-island, and that's something we don't want to deal with right now. And the UOG Computer Center is capable and offering to help us get it up and running the way it should be."

Senator Torres inquired:

"I'm trying to understand, from one budget year to the next, one fiscal year to the next, you have 'on' elections and 'off' elections right?"

Ms. Pangelinan responded:

"Every year has funded an election."

Senator Torres continued:

"So, as I'm looking at your itemization [page 7 of Ms. Pangelinan's written testimony], a lot of the costs [are] the hard costs. It's the cost of printing, supplies, setting out the precincts, and the like. So if your budget is consistent, more or less, from one fiscal year to the next."

Ms. Pangelinan responded:

"It's not. A lot of the costs are born in the Primary Election, so [in] our even year budgets, we spend a little more than [in] our odd year budgets."

Senator Torres replied:

"But your budget submission reflects that practice. I understand that's probably the way it is, but what I'm getting at is that you would expect that there's a catchup that scheduling of the elections and the submission of the budgets provides, [so] although elections don't occur every single year, it more or less covers, so I find it interesting that your prior year obligations would amount to so much. Is that because of the litigation? I see the majority of the cost is due to legal fees for litigation and election contests."

Ms. Pangelinan responded:

"That's correct, which is not budgeted at all. It's not submitted as a budget amount. The only legal counsel that we submit is our retainer fee, so [an] additional amount is required for litigation. Typically, we try to pay it at the end of fiscal year. But because it's not been budgeted, and there's no money, it does not get paid. Hence, we have prior year obligations dating back to 2005."

Senator Torres inquired:

"And the majority of the cost of the supplemental budget is to cover the upgrades to the system, is that correct?"

Ms. Pangelinan responded:

"No. I'm also looking at other election supplies to cover our election vendor site support and the ballot production. Madame Senator, if you look at this schedule (page 7 of Ms. Pangelinan's testimony), you'll see those expenses that come up to the three hundred twenty thousand dollars (\$320,0000) you see that FY 2016 is aligned right there and that's what we had requested and so what we've covered with FY 2016 appropriations shows in the next column. So it's just a matter of where we allot the amounts that we're requesting for."

Senator Torres replied:

"It just seems like the ordinary types of things should have been accounted for. I can see the extraordinary things like software upgrades but..."

Ms. Pangelinan responded:

"There is an additional cost because we increased our number of precincts to sixty seven (67) versus fifty eight (58). That's something that's real simple to visualize. That [we have an] additional seven precincts with five precinct officials each, so there's an additional cost already of three hundred and fifty (350) per precinct official times five (5) of them for the nine (9) precincts."

Senator Torres replied:

"I just don't see how we can anticipate that."

Ms. Pangelinan responded:

"The precinct realignment took place after FY 2016. That happened in December [2015]. So we don't re-budget for what we have in the budget process, so we're not able to foresee that the number of precincts are going to increase and by how much."

Senator Torres thanked Ms. Pangelinan for her response and noted that she had no further questions.

Chairman Cruz thanked the Committee and Ms. Pangelinan. On account that there were neither additional questions from the Committee nor other individuals present to testify, the Chairman considered Bill No. 294-33 (COR) as heard.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Appropriations and Adjudication to which was referred **Bill No. 294-33 (COR) - B.J.F. I humbly come before you to respectfully request your positive consideration of the Guam Election Commission's FY 2016 supplemental budget request for a total of \$334,238. The supplemental request will cover GEC's expenditures for the August 27, 2016 Primary Election: increase in precincts (58 to 67) and polling sites, (21 to 22), and necessary hardware and software upgrades for the GEC's voter registry system. This amount increased from the original request of \$308,960 by \$25,278 to cover additional cost of the Guam Central Voter Registry System and the GEC Office Systems. With the collaboration of the University of Guam Computer Center, the GEC is set to upgrade a system that was created over twenty years ago.

With the passage of Bill No. 294-33, the GEC will be able to use FY2015 carry over funds to pay \$100,000 of the total \$370,531 prior year obligations.
