COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

L OVERVIEW

Bill No. 332-33 (COR) was introduced on June 8, 2016 by Senator Michael F.Q. San Nicolas and Senator James V. Espaldon. The bill was subsequently referred by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Finance & Taxation, General Government Operations, and Youth Development on June 9, 2016.

The Committee on Finance & Taxation, General Government Operations, and Youth Development held a public hearing on December 22, 2016, in *I Liheslatura*'s Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the hearing agenda was Bill No. 332-33 (COR). The hearing convened at 1:33 p.m. and was adjourned at 3:12 p.m.

IL TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

Chairman Michael San Nicolas read the title of the bill. He stated that the bill is meant to be a companion to any legislation that aims to raise the minimum wage and would provide for a nominal offset to small businesses which would experience a greater impact from a wage increase. The bill would phase out after the initial \$150,000 of business privilege tax exemptions realized by a small business as a result of a minimum wage increase. The provisions of the bill would only be effective if legislation to raise the minimum wage is passed into law. Without other individuals present to testify, Chairman San Nicolas concluded the hearing for Bill 332-33.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Finance & Taxation, General Government Operations, and Youth Development hereby reports out Bill No. 332-33 (COR) with the recommendation To REPORT DUT ONLY.

RELATIVE TO RAISING BUSINESS PRIVILEGE TAX THRESHOLD EXEMPTION BY PRORATED AMOUNTS AT A RATE OF FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$50,000) FOR EACH DOLLAR (\$1.00) GROSS MINIMUM WAGE INCREASE ABOVE EIGHT DOLLARS AND TWENTY-FIVE CENTS (\$8.25) PER HOUR.



BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Short Title. This Act shall be cited as the "Responsible
- 3 Minimum Wage Affordability Improvement Act."
- 4 Section 2. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds
- 5 that the Business Privilege Tax is the largest single source of revenue to the
- 6 General Fund of the Government of Guam, responsible for roughly one-third (1/3)
- 7 of its revenue.

- 8 I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that increasing the minimum wage can result in
- 9 higher take-home pay for low income workers.
- 10 I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that a minimum wage increase can
- 11 impact the profitability of businesses which pay below or slightly above the
- 12 proposed minimum wage.
- 13 I Liheslatura further finds that it cannot be known for certain the number of
- small businesses which may not open due to an increase in the minimum wage, the

1 number of employees not hired as a result of an increase in the minimum wage, or

the number of businesses which do not expand due to an increase in the minimum

wage. If the minimum wage is to increase, it ought to be done in such a manner

4 that protects some of businesses most likely to be adversely affected.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the Business Privilege Tax has threshold exemptions for businesses with under fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) in income, exempting the first forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) of income.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the annual direct wage cost of one dollar (\$1.00) per hour for a forty hours per week employee with two weeks of unpaid leave, would be two thousand dollars (\$2,000). If the Government of Guam were to increase the Business Privilege Tax threshold exemption sufficiently to offset a minimum wage increase of one dollar (\$1.00) per hour for one such employee, the threshold would be raised fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000).

It is therefore the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to provide assistance to small businesses for any future minimum wage increase by raising the threshold exemptions of the Business Privilege Tax by prorated amounts at a rate of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for each dollar (\$1.00), rounded to the nearest tenth cent, gross increase in the minimum wage, by adding a new §26203.2 to Article 2 of Chapter 26, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated.

Section 3. Minimum Wage Affordability Improvement. A *new* §26203.2 is hereby *added* to Article 2 of Chapter 26, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

"§26203.2. Minimum Wage Affordability Improvement.

(a) Definitions. For the purpose of this section, the following words and phrases, together with all of the common derivatives thereof shall have the meaning ascribed to them in this subsection:

(1) 'exemption amounts' mean the maximums of the forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) Business Privilege Tax exemptions provided in items (9), (28), (29), and (30), (31), and (32) of \$26203(k), Article 2, Chapter 26, Title 11 of the Guam Code Annotated and the maximum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) Business Privilege Tax exemption provided in \$26203.1 of Article 2, Chapter 26, Title 11 of the Guam Code Annotated.

(2) 'gross minimum wage increase' means the greater of either

- (2) 'gross minimum wage increase' means the greater of either the federal minimum hourly wage under the U.S. Fair Labor Standards Act minus eight dollars and twenty-five cents (\$8.25) per hour or the minimum hourly wage established under §3105 of 22 GCA minus eight dollars and twenty-five cents (\$8.25) per hour.
- (3) 'minimum wage increase' means a change in the greater of the federal minimum hourly wage under the U.S. Fair Labor Standards Act and the minimum hourly wage established under §3105 of 22 GCA which results in a minimum hourly wage greater than eight dollars and twenty-five cents (\$8.25) per hour.
- (4) 'threshold amounts' mean the maximums of fifty-thousand dollars (\$50,000) of applicable income required for a business to claim the Business Privilege Tax exemptions provided under items (9), (28), (29), (30), (31), and (32) of \$26203(k), Article 2, Chapter 26, Title 11.
- (b) Changes to Threshold and Exemptions Amounts. Upon the effective date of any minimum wage increase following the enactment of this section, the threshold amounts and exemption amounts shall each increase beyond their amounts as of the date of enactment of this section by

prorated amounts at a rate of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for each dollar (\$1.00), rounded to the nearest tenth cent, gross minimum wage increase.

(c) Notice. In the event of any change in the threshold exemptions pursuant to this section, the Department of Revenue and Taxation shall post notice on its website and shall transmit a letter to each business required to file for Business Privilege Tax with the Department, each of which shall provide information about the new threshold and exemption amounts."

Section 4. Severability. If a provision of this act or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or applications of the act that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this act are severable.
