



COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

OVERVIEW

I.

Bill No. <u>354-33</u> (COR) was introduced on July 26, 2016, by Senators James Espaldon, and Mary Torres and was subsequently referred by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Guam US Military Relocation, Public Safety and Judiciary on July 26, 2016.

The Committee on Guam US Military Relocation, Public Safety and Judiciary convened a public hearing on Bill No. <u>354-33</u> (COR) on a Monday, September 19, 2016 at 2:00PM in I *Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room.

Public Notice Requirements

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via e-mail to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on Monday, September 12, 2016 (5-Day Notice), and again on Thursday, September 15, 2016 (48-Hour Notice).

Senators Present

Senator Frank B. Aguon, Jr., Chairman Speaker Judith T. Won Pat Ed. D, Ex-Officio Senator James Espaldon, Committee Member Senator Brant T. McCreadie, Committee Member Senator V. Anthony Ada, Committee Member Senator Nerissa B. Underwood, Ph.D., Committee Member Senator Tommy Morrison Senator Mary Torres.

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 2:00 PM.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

Chairman Aguon:

Good afternoon ladies and gentlemen, if I can ask initially for administrative purposes if anyone who has a cellphone, if you can place it in silent mode or turn them off during the course of the public hearing. Good afternoon again. This committee public hearing sponsored by the Committee on Guam U.S. Military Relocation, Public Safety and Judiciary is here by convened. There are three items on the agenda. Bill No. 336-33 (LS) relative to the training requirements for members of the Civilian Volunteer Police Reserves. Bill No. 354-33 (COR) relative to estates of small value.

Chairman Aguon:

Bill No. 369-33 (COR) relative to providing discretion in the expenditure prioritization of the police patrol vehicle and equipment revolving fund to the Chief of Police for the purposes of acquiring, repairing and maintaining vehicles and requisite associated equipment for the Guam Police Department. For the information of the public in conformance of the open government law, notification was initially disseminated on the 12th of September with the subsequent notification also sent out on the 15th of September to the stakeholders and I want to as Chair thank the military. Media partners, I apologize, for their assistance in disseminating information with regards to today's public hearing. We will proceed with recognizing the members. I would like to Speaker Won Pat. Thank you very much Madam Speaker for joining us this afternoon. To my immediate left is Senator James Espaldon, Senator Brant McCreadie, Senator Tony Ada, and then to Speaker Won Pat's immediate right is Senator Underwood. Thank you senators for joining us this afternoon and we also have Senator Tommy Morrison joining us this afternoon.

We are going to proceed with the next item on the agenda. Bill No. 354. We do have one individual that has signed up and also provided written testimony. Mr. Attorney Terry Brookes and just for the information of the public and also the sponsor, we did receive written testimony from the law firm of Yanza, Flynn and Timblin. So, Mr. Brooks if you are still in the audience you are welcome to join us and as we await his arrival, I would like to ask the sponsor to go ahead and provide his opening remarks with regards to the legislation. Senator Espaldon.

Senator Espaldon:

Thank you Mr. Chairman. Mr. Chairman, this bill is more of a house keeping bill in terms of bringing up to date what is already in the books. Current law provides that estates of more than \$20,000 must go through probate and the law setting these values in essence was put in in 1981 I believe when the probate code of Guam was included in the Guam Law revision commission as part of the creation of the Guam Code Annotated. So basically, it's been 35 years since that \$20,000 threshold was set. I can speak to the figures, but I believe I perused our Attorney Brook's testimony so I'm going to let him speak to numbers and perhaps at the end Mr. Chair if there is anything that needs to be addressed or spoken to, then if you'll give me a chance to it then, but I would like to hear from Attorney Brooks.

Chairman Aguon:

Thank you very much Senator Espaldon. Attorney Brooks.

Attorney Terrance Brooks:

[Written Testimony Attached]

Chairman Aguon:

Thank you very much Attorney Brooks. Senator Espaldon. Any questions or comments?

Senator Espaldon:

I have no questions at this time Mr. Chairman thank you.

Chairman Aguon:

Senators, any questions or comments for Attorney Brooks? If not, Madam Speaker.

Speaker Won Pat:

Thank you very much. I have a better understanding of it now after I read your testimony. I know it goes on further, but I was just trying to make a list of all the things you are saying. Basically what costs an individual or family to go through the court system. Are you saying then that with this legislation now there may not be any for an attorney so you don't pay that 20-25% that maybe a family member could be appointed by other members in the family?

Attorney Terrance Brooks:

Well, it would still be a good idea to get an attorney to prepare the affidavit. However, the cost of doing that would be 500 at the most, compared to 5000 for doing a probate. So the savings are substantial. You know, I've had several cases just in the last year where somebody has come into the office and said well I've got 23,000 in my mom's account and I would like to transfer this over to myself or to the heirs and then you explain the process to get this \$20,000 out of the bank and it's just cumbersome. So that's the purpose for this.

Speaker Won Pat:

So with this increase in the amount, would it some how shorten then the process? Make it quicker?

Attorney Terrance Brooks:

Well, it would certainly shorten the process for estates of small value. So this would raise the bar to \$75,000 and for any estate where the separate assets are 75 or less, a simple affidavit filed at land management and served to whoever is holding the funds should be sufficient to allow the person to collect the funds.

Speaker Won Pat:

So there wont be the 6-month period that you indicated and there wont be the filing fees, publishing notices, mailing notices, and paying for process server?

Attorney Terrance Brooks:

Yup. All of that

Speaker Won Pat:

All that. Thank you very much for that explanation. I appreciate it because you're right. I also had gotten some request like you said it was actually under \$25,000 and I didn't even know that there was this amount. Thank you for clarifying.

Attorney Terrance Brooks:

Thank you very much for your time.

Chairman Aguon:

Thank you Madam Speaker. Attorney Brooks, just one additional question. I noticed that in your testimony that you highlighted that in the state of California the threshold is 150,000.

Attorney Terrance Brooks:

150,000. Yes.

Chairman Aguon:

Right now based on your testimony, 75,000 is sufficient for the cost of living here on Guam?

Attorney Terrance Brooks:

We are smaller. Estates are smaller. So I don't have a problem with 75,000. It's not a figure that's in cement. It could be changed but it seems like a fair amount.

Chairman Aguon:

Okay. Thank you. Senator Espaldon.

Senator Espaldon: I have no questions thank you Mr. Chair.

Chairman Aguon: Okay. Thank you, Attorney Brooks.

Attorney Terrance Brooks: Thank you all.

Chairman Aguon:

If there are no other questions on this particular piece of legislation and everything else that the committee has heard this afternoon. Bill No. 336, 354, and 369 have been publically heard and for information of the public, if anyone would like to submit written testimony to the committee, we will continue to receive written testimony for the subsequent ten days exclusive of Sunday and then we will conclude with the closing out of the committee report. So thank you very much everyone, have a good day.

The public hearing was adjourned at 3:37 PM.

Section 1. § 3101 of Chapter 31, 15 GCA is amended to read:

"§ 3101. Estates Under [S20,000.00] \$75,000.00; Summary Administration or Probate;

4 Affidavit. When a decedent leaves no real property, nor interest therein nor lien thereon, in the territory of Guam, and the total value of the decedent's property in the territory of Guam, excluding 5 6 any motor vehicle of which the decedent was the owner or the legal owner, over and above any 7 amounts due to the decedent for services in the armed forces of the United States, and over and above 8 the amount of salary not exceeding [three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00)] six thousand dollars 9 (\$6,000.00), including compensation for unused vacation, owing to the decedent for services from any employment, does not exceed [twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00)] seventy-five thousand-dollars 10 (\$75,000.00), the surviving spouse, the children, lawful issue of deceased children, a parent, brothers 11 12 or sisters of the decedent, the lawful issue of a deceased brother or sister, the guardian of the estate of 13 any minor or incompetent person bearing such relationship to the decedent, or the trustee named under 14 a trust agreement executed by the decedent during his lifetime, the primary beneficiaries of which bear 15 such relationship to the decedent, if such person or persons has or have a right to succeed to the 16 property of the decedent, or is the sole beneficiary or are all of the beneficiaries under the last will and testament of the decedent, may without procuring letters testamentary, letters of administration with 17 18 the will annexed or letters of administration, and without awaiting administration upon the estate of 19 an intestate decedent or the probate of the will of a testate decedent, collect any money due to the

decedent, receive the property of the decedent, and have any evidences of interest, indebtedness or right transferred to such person or persons upon furnishing the person, representative, corporation, officer or body owing the money, having custody of such property or acting as registrar or transfer agent of such evidences of interest, indebtedness or right, with an affidavit showing the right or the person or persons to receive the money or property, or to have such evidences transferred."

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Section 2. § 3103 of Chapter 31, 15 GCA is amended to read:

7 "§ 3103. Estates Under [\$10,000.00] \$35,000.00; Surviving Spouse's Right to [\$1,000.00] \$2,500.00 From Deposits in Savings Institutions. Whether a person dies testate or intestate, and 8 9 irrespective of the character of his property, if the value of the estate does not exceed [ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00)] thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000.00), the decedent's surviving spouse, if 10 11 entitled by succession or by the last will and testament of the decedent to any money of the decedent on deposit in any bank, savings and loan association, credit union or other savings institution licensed 12 13 to do business in the territory of Guam, may collect such money, not to exceed the total sum of [one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00)] two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00), without procuring letters 14 15 testamentary, letters of administration with the will annexed or letters of administration, and without awaiting administration upon the estate of an intestate decedent or the probate of the will of a testate 16 17 decedent, upon furnishing the bank, savings and loan association, credit union or other savings 18 institution with an affidavit showing the right of the affiant to receive such money."

Section 3. § 3109 of Chapter 31, 15 GCA is amended to read:

If 21 the decedent leaves a surviving spouse or minor child or minor children, and the net value of the whole 22 estate, over and above all liens and encumbrances at the date of death and over and above the value of 23 any homestead interest set apart out of the decedent's estate under the provisions of Section 2401 or 24 Section 2409 of this Title, does not exceed the sum of [twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00)] seventy-25 five thousand dollars (\$75,000.00), the same may be set aside to the surviving spouse, if there be one, 26 and if there be none, then to the minor child or minor children of the decedent."

Hafa Adai Chairman Aguon and Senators:

Thank you for the opportunity to present testimony on this Bill.

I have practiced law on Guam for more than 30 years now. My practice has involved many different types of cases including probates. As you know, probate is the judicial process of transferring the assets of a deceased person to his or her heirs.

Guam law currently requires that a person go through a probate if the separate assets left by the deceased exceed \$20,000. This bill raises the amount to \$75,000.

Currently, for an estate with assets of less than \$20,000, a simple affidavit with a copy of the death certificate can be recorded to transfer the estate's assets to the deceased person's heirs. When Guam's probate code was enacted in 1970, the amount subject to this section was \$300. At some point that amount was increased to the current \$20,000, however, given inflation and the rising cost of filing a probate case, publishing and mailing notices, I believe that the time has come to increase the amount again. For comparison, in California the amount which can be distributed via affidavit is \$150,000.

A probate case an easily take six months to complete when there are no complications. That is a significant amount of time to wait for what is no longer a huge amount of money. While the expenses of a last illness, funeral and burial come due immediately, a decedent's family with an estate of more than \$20,000 is forced to wait six months to obtain funds that would greatly assist in the payment of the bills.

Probate cases are much more expensive to undertake now. Filing fees at the court have jumped by more than 300%. It used to cost \$80 to file a civil or probate case. Now it costs \$300. The cost of publishing notices in a newspaper have increased tremendously. The cost of mailing notices to heirs has also increased significantly. Paying a process server to post notices in public places has also grown. My firm requires \$1,500 just to cover the costs of a probate, not including attorney's fees. Add in attorney's fees, which are a percentage of the value of the estate, and court closing costs, and an heir could wind up paying \$4,000 - \$5,000, 20% - 25% to close a small estate of that exceeds \$20,000 in value.

Raising the limit for small value estates to \$75,000 would be a substantial benefit to heirs of small estates. Usually these estates consist of bank accounts, retirement accounts or unpaid wages or benefits that belonged to a person who has died. Getting the funds of a small estate to the heirs in an expeditious and inexpensive way at a time when they need it the most makes good sense and good law.

I hope you will favorably consider this bill and give a break to the heirs of small estates, who can certainly use it. Thank you.

Dear Senator Aguon:

I hereby offer my written testimony on Bill No. 354-33 (COR), concerning certain proposed revisions to Chapter 31, Title 15, Guarn Code Annotated.

I can only speak to the proposed revisions to 15 GCA § 3101 in Bill No. 354-33 (COR), however, as I have never had occasion to study or use any of the other sections of Chapter 31 of the probate code.

As far as I can recall, I have used 15 GCA § 3101 on behalf of at least three clients in my probate practice work, so far. On each occasion that I have used 15 GCA § 3101, fortunately, the sum value of the decedent's estate was below \$20,000.00, and, as such, the provisions of 15 GCA § 3101, as those provisions currently stand, were adequate to accomplish my clients' goals. However, I can envision a scenario in the future where a client might come to me for assistance with an estate which meets all of the terms of 15 GCA § 3101, except that the amount of salary in the decedent's estate is between \$3,000 and \$6,000, or the value of the entire estate is between \$20,000 and \$75,000. In such a scenario, I would be forced to take the estate through an expensive, time-consuming full probate administration.
