#### I. OVERVIEW

**Bill No. 358-33 (COR)** was introduced by Vice Speaker Benjamin J.F. Cruz on December 16, 2015, and subsequently referred to the **Committee on Appropriations and Adjudication** on the same day.

The Committee on Appropriations and Adjudication convened a public hearing on Tuesday, December 6, 2016, beginning at 2:00PM in the Guam Legislature Public Hearing Room. The hearing for Bill No. 358-33 (COR) began at 2:00PM and ended at 2:10PM.

#### II. TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

**Chairman Benjamin J.F. Cruz** announced Bill No. 358-33 (COR), and called on Senator Dennis G. Rodriguez Jr. to provide his statement as the main sponsor of the measure:

#### Senator Rodriguez:

"Thank you very much, Mr. Chairman. Bill No. 358 is an act to amend §1909, §1909(i), and §1907(c), and to add new § 1907(e), (f) and (g), all of chapter 19 of title 1, Guam Code Annotated. This is relative to granting increased autonomy to the Office of Public Accountability on personnel matters. And since the inception of the Office of Public Accountability ("the Office," OPA) in 2000, we've seen the different struggles and obstacles that the Office has faced and to ensure that we live up to what the intent of that office was to have it be independent and have them function able to operate their autonomy. This legislation grants them similar authority granted to the Office of the Attorney General. And so we'd like to see how we can move this forward and here's all the testimony from those that are present."

Chairman Cruz thanked Senator Rodriguez and noted for the record that Senator Adolpho Palacios and Mr. Peter S. Calvo of the Civil Service Commission had submitted testimony *in support of* Bill No. 358-33 (COR) (*appended to this report*). The Chairman then called on Deputy Public Auditor Yuka Hechenova to read testimony on behalf of the Public Auditor Doris F. Brooks, who was off island.

**Ms. Hechanova** greeted the Committee and proceeded to read Public Auditor Brook's written testimony *in support of* Bill No. 358-33 (COR) (*appended to this report*).

On account that there were neither additional questions from the Committee nor other individuals present to testify, the Chairman considered Bill No. 358-33 (COR) as heard.

#### III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

As indicated in testimony submitted to the Committee on Appropriations and Adjudication (Committee), provisions in Bill No. 358-33 (COR) were taken directly from the autonomy provisions relative to the Office of the Attorney General's financial and personnel matters in Public Law 31-153. Upon review, the Committee made the following amendments:

• Section 2, which designates the powers of the Public Auditor to a deputy or an assistant, was <u>removed</u> as the Office of the Public Auditor already grants such powers and responsibilities administratively when he or she is off-island.

- In Section 4, which authorizes the Public Auditor to procure a private contractor or enter into a Memorandum of Understanding/Agreement with another GovGuam agency to manage its personnel operations, the phrase "subject to the availability of funds" was <u>added</u>.
- The phrase "except those regulations which conflict any of the statutory provisions herein" was <u>removed</u> from subsection (f) of Section 4 to ensure that transition from current rules and regulations under the DOA to the newly adopted rules and regulations by the OPA are properly carried out.
- The effective date was changed from "October 1, 2016" to "upon enactment of this Act" to reflect the date of the filing of this report.

Dear Vice Speaker Cruz and Committee Members:

Thank you for holding a hearing on Bill 358-33. I am off island and have asked my Deputy Yuka Hechanova and Audit Supervisor Llewelyn Terlaje to be here.

Thank you, also to Senator Dennis Rodriguez for introducing this measure.

Bill 358 is patterned after Bill 286-31, now Public Law 31-153, introduced by Senator Adolpho Palacios in 2011. This law gave the Office of the Attorney General autonomy over financial and personnel matters. Bill 358 proposes to grant the Office of Public Accountability similar autonomy over OPA's personnel matters. As elected offices, the OPA is seeking parity with the Office of the Attorney General in this regard.

P.L. 31-153 is far more reaching than Bill 358. It includes codification removing the Bureau of Budget and Management Research's allotment control over the Office of the Attorney General's annual budget. OPA must continue to ask each budget cycle for this exemption.

The impetus for Bill 358 came about earlier this year when OPA attempted to hire an auditor without going through the Department of Administration. With the passage of the FY 2015 Budget, an amendment was made to Section 1907 of OPA's enabling legislation that we presumed granted OPA hiring autonomy from DOA.

To prepare ourselves for this change, we met with the Civil Service Commission for guidance and drafted an MOU with DOA to begin the transition. However, DOA did not respond and provide comments on the MOU.

We advertised the auditor positions from mid-January to early February 2016. The applications were then evaluated and scored by our HR Consultant, Ms. Karri Perez.



After interviews, we selected a candidate and requested a drug test for this candidate in March. DOA did not administer the drug test and instead requested an Attorney General opinion in April about OPA's hiring authority.

In June 2016, Attorney General Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson verbally indicated to me that OPA did not have the authority to hire without going through DOA. The DOA Director, Christine Baleto, also attended this meeting.

It was from this June meeting that Senator Rodriguez subsequently introduced Bill 358.

Let me add that under Mrs. Baleto's leadership, DOA HR has become more responsive to OPA's recruitment issues. While we appreciate and welcome this change, it is still in OPA's best interest to have personnel autonomy in order to be a robust independent audit office.

In October 2014, OPA assessed its independence as part of the Pacific Association of Supreme Audit Institutions Performance Management Framework. Guam OPA rated low with deficiencies in organizational independence and autonomy while 75% of other audit organizations scored fairly well. To fulfill our mandate effectively, OPA must be able to independently manage our office, including personnel matters.

Bill 358 also provides OPA the option to outsource the Human Resources operations or manage it through a Memorandum of Agreement with another government agency. This is a reasonable provision as the OPA is a small office that only recruits occasionally. It would not be cost effective at this time to hire a full time employee for managing OPA's Human Resource function.

OPA's bi-weekly payroll would still be processed by DOA, similar to the OAG.

A separate personnel issue has been the OPA Compensation Study which will not be affected by this bill. We have been working with DOA since March 2016 on the OPA Compensation Study to create new OPA positions. Currently, DOA is reviewing the positions.

In summary, OPA is seeking personnel autonomy similar to the personnel autonomy that the Office of the Attorney General presently has.

I hope you and the committee members will favorably report out the bill and vote for its passage.

Vice Speaker Cruz and members of the Committee my name is Peter S. Calvo, Executive Director of the Guam Civil Service Commission. I am writing today on behalf of the Commission to testify on Bill 358-33(COR) introduced by Senator Dennis G. Rodriguez, Jr.

I want to thank you for the opportunity for us to provide input on Bill 358-33(COR) which is entitled "AN ACT TO AMEND § 1907(e), (f) AND (g), ALL OF CHAPTER 19 OF TITLE 1, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO GRANTING INCREASED AUTONOMY TO THE OFFICE OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTABILITY ON PERSONNEL MATTERS."

I would like to recognize and commend the author for the intent to resolve the current recruitment problems of the Public Auditor. In some ways the Office of Public Accountability and Civil Service Commission are kindred organizations in that we both conduct oversight of other agencies. For the Public Auditor it is matters such as expenditures. For the Civil Service Commission it is ensuring that the hiring, promotion, and discipline of classified employees comports with the Merit System principles mandated by the Organic Act.

To that end, the Commission is particularly supportive of Section 4's removal of the current Title 1 G.C.A., Chapter 19, § 1907(c) which could be read to allow the appointment of classified employees. Unclassified employees generally do not fall under the purview of the Civil Service Commission; however, as custodians of the Merit System we are obligated to ensure that its principles are followed in the recruitment of classified employees. It is our position that classified employees cannot be hired or promoted outside of the competitive process. Thus, we oppose the current form of § 1907(c) and encourage its repeal through Bill 358-33(COR).

If the Public Auditor is required to follow the competitive hiring process, but is able to do so independent of the Department of Administration ("DOA"), then we have no objection. The Merit System does not require that DOA be the one to implement its principles, only that those principles

are followed. If the Office of Public Accountability will recruit and promote individuals in accordance with the Merit System, subject to Post-Audit Review by the Commission, then we are supportive of it receiving that level of autonomy. Yet, that autonomy should always be subject to the review of the Commission to ensure that Merit System principles are followed when a classified employee is recruited, promoted, or disciplined. We would be opposed to any subsequent amendments that run counter to adherence to the Merit System. Also, it would be beneficial to clarify in the proposed § 1907(h) (Page 5, Lines 9 to 11) that the "discretionary" review is not at the discretion of the Public Auditor, but the discretion of the Commission.

The Legislature has always been supportive of the Commission in the past and we hope that you will look kindly at our concerns with Bill 358-33(COR) and for your continued support in the future.

In support of Bill 358-33, I am submitting this testimony. Based on my reading of the Bill, it is my understanding that it proposes to amend the current provision of a law or process that requires the authorization of the Department of Administration before a funded position may be filled by the Office of Public Accountability (OPA). I understand that Bill 358-33 proposes to transfer the process to OPA to allow for a more timely filling of a vacancy. Currently, the wait time to fill a funded vacant position is from 3 months to six months, from submission of request to D.O.A. to receipt of authorization to fill the vacancy.

Bill 358-33 brings to mind a Bill which I introduced in the 31<sup>st</sup> GL, which became PL 31-153. This PL 31-153 is the product of collaborations between the Office of the Attorney General (OAG) and my office, at the time. At that time, the OAG was faced with the same challenge and lengthy process when they were filling a vacancy position for an attorney, as currently existing in the OPA.

The passage of Bill 358-33 would be consistent with the autonomy nature of the OPA, and would share the same autonomy level as the OAG, both elected offices.
