COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

Bill No. 360-33 (COR) was introduced on July 29, 2016 by Senator Thomas C. Ada and was subsequently referred on August 1, 2016 by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement.

The Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement convened a public hearing on October 26, 2016 at 9:30am in *I Liheslaturan*'s Public Hearing Room to receive public testimony on Bill No. 360-33 (COR).

Public Notice Requirements

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on October 19, 2016 (5-Day Notice) and again on October 24, 2016 (48-Hour Notice).

The public hearing/information briefing was Called-to-Order at 9:34am.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Chairperson Ada: Chairperson Ada explains that both Bills 360-33 and 361-33 will be heard simultaneously because they both have to deal with GPA. He explains that Director Michael Borja from Land Management has submitted written testimony in support of both bills, but with some minor modifications. Chairperson Ada asked if GPA has had a chance to look at DLM's testimony. If the bill is to be amended, GPA will be notified of it. He then calls on GPA to provide their testimony.

John Benavente, *General Manager GPA*: In support of both bills 360-33 and 361-33(see written testimonies).

Chairperson Ada: He presumed there were some preliminary discussions between GPA and DLM for compensation that would be given to CLTC for the property.

John Benavente: He is not sure there is any compensation for the Lot in Bill 360-33. GPA has been there since 1973. There will be compensation for the second parcel that GPA is acquiring in Bill 361-33.

Chairperson Ada: He makes it clear that the lot GPA is currently sitting on will not be compensated and just be an administrative transfer.

Joey Duenas, *Chairman of CCU*: He explains the property was supposed to be transferred in 1993 and somehow it never made it. The property has been maintained and used by GPA. They are willing to pay for the additional property right behind it which is what Bill 361-33 intends to do.

Chairperson Ada: He explains that Bill 360-33 is just correcting a transfer that should have been made along time ago. Chairperson Ada asked if they could explain why GPA needs the additional property directly behind the current substation.

John Benavente: Reads his written testimony in support of Bill 361-33(see attached).

Chairperson Ada: He would like to note two things pointed out in DLM testimony. First is a a resolution passed by the CLTC on August 18, 2016 meeting which stated that the transfer of property by CLTC to GPA shall be compensated to the CLTC for said lot in bill 360-33. This is quite different then what GPA was expecting and asked if it had changed since their last discussion with CLTC.

Graham Botha, *GPA legal counsel*: They did speak with Director Borja and at the time it was clear that there would be no compensation for the property. It was agreed upon for compensation for the new property which is on bill 361-33.

Chairperson Ada: He explains they will need to sit down with the CLTC in regards to their conditions that were stipulated in DLM testimonies for both bills. In bill 361, DLM suggested a reversionary clause be put in the bill. The property transferred shall be used for the intended purpose within 5 years or the land goes back to the CLTC. Chairperson Ada asked GPA, if they see them completing their project within the 5-year window.

John Benavente: He replies yes and in fact the bid is out on the market already.

Chairperson Ada: He then asks senator Espaldon if he has any questions.

Sen. Espaldon: He asked GPA's legal counsel if he had received DLM's testimonies prior to today's hearing.

Graham Botha: He replies no they have not until this morning.

Sen. Espaldon: He explains on item #3 on DLM's testimony it indicates that CLTC shall grant GPA a "Grant of Right of Way" and asked if this was necessary because GPA has had control of the lot. 421 since 1973.

Graham Botha: He explains they needed the right of way access to the property in order to have the surveyor and appraiser to enter in advance for bill 361-33. In bill 360-33 there is already an existing license that covers it.

Chairperson Ada: He says it looks like the 5 conditions from DLM is copied and paste for both bills. So, only 2 conditions would apply for the property on bill 360-33 according to the chairperson. He then explains they would also review the resolution to be consistent.

Joey Duenas: He explains the lot regarding bill 360-33 has been used by GPA since 1973. GPA had already been occupying the property and had pre dated the CLTC. GPA never got the paperwork done for the property and ended up in the CLTC lands inventory. He believes the lot has been given to GPA and therefore CLTC should not be compensated for it. GPA fully understands that CLTC must be compensated for the lot in bill 361-33.

Chairperson Ada: He thanks GPA and Mr. Duenas and moves on to the next item on the agenda.

Written Testimony Received:

Michael Borja, Director of Land Management John Benavente, GM for GPA

Findings and Recommendations:

The committee finds that Lot. 427 containing an area of \pm 3,243 in the municipality of Talofofo is currently under the CLTC lands inventory list. The committee furthermore finds that, On August 18, 2016 a resolution was passed by the CLTC requiring compensation from GPA for Lot. 427.

The committee finds that it is not necessary to add a reversionary clause section into Bill 360-33 as recommended by DLM, because GPA will be compensating DLM for the property.

The Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement, hereby reports out Bill 360-33 (COR) as introduced, with the recommendation to VUOVI OWY.

AN ACT TO TRANSFER LOT 427, MUNICIPALITY OF TALOFOFO WITH AN AREA OF 3,243± SQUARE METERS FROM THE ADMINISTRATIVE JURISDICTION OF THE CHAMORRO LAND TRUST COMMISSION TO THE GUAM POWER AUTHORITY FOR THE PURPOSE OF EXPANDING THE TALOFOFO SUBSTATION.



BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative findings and intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds §8203 of Title 12 of the Guam Code Annotated provides that the Guam Power Authority (GPA) is authorized to acquire lands for the purposes of constructing, improving, equipping, maintaining, repairing, renewing, replacing and reconstructing the electrical system of GPA.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the Guam Power Authority (GPA) has identified property, under the administrative jurisdiction of the Chamorro Land Trust Commission (CLTC), for the purpose of expanding the Talofofo Electrical Substation, preparing the site for the future construction of an Energy Storage System. These improvements are essential in meeting current and future growth demands for electrical generation and distribution to the Island Wide Power System (IWPS).

1 I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the Guam Power Authority has commissioned
 2 a 25.65 MW solar farm through NRG Energy (independent power producer) and a 275
 3 KW wind turbine renewable energy as part of its integrated resource plan; and

I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the construction and installation of an Energy Storage System facility at the selected site will provide significant power output stabilization from the Dandan Solar facility and wind turbine, thus firming the net power output.


I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that considering the present and future ability of GPA to operate the Island Wide Power System, GPA desires to include Lot 427, Municipality of Talofofo for the Talofofo Electrical Substation Expansion and it desires that the CLTC convey to GPA, and such action is deemed in the best interest of both parties and necessary for the Land Registration.

Section 2. Authorization to Transfer Land to the Guam Power Authority (GPA). Notwithstanding any other provision of law, rule or regulation, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* authorizes the Chamorro Land Trust Commission (CLTC) to transfer the existing *Talofofo* Electrical Substation property containing an area of three thousand two hundred forty three (3,243) square meters, more or less, Lot 427, Municipality of *Talofofo*, as shown on the Land Registration survey Map of Lot 427, Municipality of *Talofofo* prepared by TG Engineers, filed under instrument No. 806752 (See exhibit A) for the construction of a new Energy Storage System (ESS Parcel). GPA shall, upon acquiring the Conditional Grant Deed, submit to the court the Land Registration of the property and all Land Registration expenses shall be borne by GPA.

(a). GPA shall pay for the appraisal of the property by two different appraisers certified to do business on Guam, which shall be selected by the Administrative Director of the Chamorro Land Trust Commission.

1 (b). GPA shall have the property surveyed and registered at its own expense.

- (c). GPA shall work with the Chamorro Land Trust Commission (CLTC) to determine an appropriate compensation for the property to include preferably but not limited to purchase at fair market value, in-kind service exchange of equal value or a combination of options to be approved by GPA, the Consolidated Commission (CCU) and the (CLTC). GPA and CLTC will have one hundred and eighty (180) days to finalize the compensation agreement.
- **Section 3. Proceeds.** All proceeds made from the sale of Lot 427 shall be deposited into the *Chamorro Land Trust Infrastructure and Survey Fund*, identified as Department of Administration Revenue Account Number 3669-57001.
- **Section 4. Rezoning.** Lot 427, Municipality of *Talofofo*, is hereby rezoned from Agricultural (A) to Public Facility (PF) for the purpose of expanding the *Talofofo* Substation and constructing the Energy Storage System.
- **Section 5. Effective Date.** This act shall take effect upon enactment.
 - **Section 6. Severability.** If any of provision of this law or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity *shall not* affect other provisions or applications of this law, which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or applications and to this end the provisions of this act are severable.

Dear Senator Ada.

The Guam Power Authority provides the following testimony in favor of Bill 360-33 relative to conveyance of Government Property to GPA for the existing Talofofo Substation.

GPA has been utilizing the site for the Talofofo Substation for many years. On April 26, 1973, a land use permit application was submitted to the Department of Land Management for a specific public use by GPA. This application designated 3,243 square meters within Government Lot Parcel "A" for GPA's Talofofo Diesel Power Plant and Power Substation. The goal of the acquisition of portions of the Government property was essential in order to provide relief to load demands from Southern Guam.

On July 15, 1992, under P.L. 21-117, GPA was granted emergency procurement authority for generating equipment as a response to the increased demands of the IWPS. This included a 9.6 Mega Watt unit to be located on the Talofofo Substation site with an in-service date of May 31, 1993 with a commitment to generate, transmit and distribute the electricity produced from the Talofofo unit to southern villages. P.L. 21-117 also included the conveyance of property to GPA. Unfortunately, the Talofofo Substation site was omitted in the transfer of properties.

Over the years, GPA completed significant improvement activities to maintain the Talofofo Substation and Diesel Plant. These items included substation improvements, diesel plant refurbishment, and generation protection and fire protection projects. Most recently, GPA invested in a \$700,000.00 RICE/MAC emission control which now places the plant in compliance with EPA.

The Talofofo Substation and Diesel Plant site continues to be an important asset to the Island Wide Power System. The conveyance of the property to GPA is essential to ensuring that GPA has a defendable right to the property and satisfying our bond covenants.

GPA is committed to completing the conditions set forth in Bill 360-33 relative to the acquisition of this property that will serve the mission of the Authority well into the future. Thus, GPA is in full support of Bill 360-33.

I would like to also take this opportunity to thank Land Management and Chamorro Land Trust Commission for their utmost assistance and support of this Bill.

Thank you for the opportunity to submit this testimony for this important endeavor. We look forward to working with you to find ways to improve service to our rate payers.

Buenas Yan Hafa Adai!

This bill proposes the transfer of Chamorro Land Trust Commission (CLTC) land from its inventory for the purpose of expanding the Guam Power Authority's Talofofo Electrical Substation.

Based on the bill and its exhibits, the following was determined:

- 1. Lot 427, Municipality of Talofofo, was never transferred to GPA.
- 2. Lot 427 is unregistered land and is approximately 3,243 square meters.
- 3. This bill lacks a reversionary clause for non-use of the land or failure to complete compensation.

Because Lot 427, Talofofo, is not a registered parcel of land, it is essential this parcel must be registered prior to completing the transfer of the property.

At their August 18, 2016 regularly scheduled meeting, the CLTC board of commissioners approved CLTC Resolution 2016-14 which stated the following:

DLM Testimony on Bill No. 360-33 October 24, 2016 Page 2 of 2

- CLTC, recognizing GPA's need for the land to serve the public's good, approves and declares Lot 427, Talofofo, be available and designated for the Guam Power Authority.
- 2. Guam Power Authority shall be fully responsible for all land surveys and land registration.
- 3. CLTC shall grant GPA a "Grant of Right of Way" (later corrected to "Right of Entry") for Lot 427, Talofofo.
- 4. Bill No. 360-33 shall include a section entitled "Reversionary Clause" that the properties transferred shall be used for the intended purpose within five years or the land shall be returned to the Chamorro Land Trust Commission.
- 5. The transfer of the property to GPA shall be with compensation to CLTC.

Based on CLTC Resolution No. 2016-14, the Chamorro Land Trust Commission supports Bill No. 360-33 with modifications added.

CHAMORRO LAND TRUST COMMISSION RESOLUTION NO. 2016-14

Declaration and Designation of Land for Guam Power Authority Infrastructure Development

WHEREAS, the Chamorro Land Trust Commission (hereafter CLTC), in accordance with Title 21, Section 75105, declares the need to make land available for Guam Power Authority (GPA) infrastructure development;

WHEREAS, the CLTC board of commissioners recognizes GPA's need for land, currently used as the Talofofo Electrical Substation, to be assigned under its authority;

WHEREAS, the CLTC board of commissioners recognizes and acknowledges GPA's immediate need to prepare, survey and register the desired land and authorizes the execution of a "Grant of Right-Of-Way" until law is enacted to assign the property to GPA;

WHEREAS, the CLTC board of commissioners requires the land assignment be compensated at a rate and/or process to be determined at a later date to be set in the law assigning the property to GPA;

WHEREAS, on August 18, 2016, the CLTC board of commissioners at their regularly scheduled meeting, Tamuning, Guam, reviewed and approved by a motion to designate, as available, the proposed land as necessary for the public good to be assigned to the Guam Power Authority by legislative action, as described in Bill No. 360-33:

The existing Talofofo Electrical Substation property containing an area of £3,243 square meters, Lot 427, Municipality of Talofofo, as shown on the Land Registration survey map filed under instrument No. 806758, for the expansion of the Talofofo Electrical Substation.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,

- The Chamorro Land Trust Commission Board of Commissioners approves the listed land and declares this land
 to be available and designated property for the Guam Power Authority infrastructure development who shall be
 fully responsible for any and all land surveys and land registration, as necessary;
- The Chamorro Land Trust Commission authorizes the execution of a "Grant of Right-of-Way" for the designated property identified above to the Guam Power Authority;
- The Chamorro Land Trust Commission Board of Commissioners requires Bill No. 360-33 include a "Reversionary Clause" that the properties transferred shall be used for the intended purpose within five years or the land shall be returned to the CLTC land inventory; and
- 4. The Chamorro Land Trust Commission Board of Commissioners transmits this Resolution to 1 Liheslaturan Guahan with its recommendation to include the designated property in legislation to assign it to the Guam Power Authority with compensation to be determined within a specified period listed in the enacted law.

BUREAU OF BUDGET AND MANAGEMENT RESEARCH COMMENTS ON BILL NO. 360-33 (COR)

The proposed legislation intends to transfer a portion of Lot 427 in the municipality of Talofofo from the administrative jurisdiction of the Chamorro Land Trust Commission (CLTC) to the Guam Power Authority (GPA) for the purpose of expanding the Talofofo substation to construct an Energy Storage System.

Sections 2(a) and 2(b) stipulate that the GPA will be responsible for covering the cost of the appraisal of the property by two different appraisers as well as the cost of the property survey and registration.

Although compensation for the transfer of CLTC property to the GPA is not specifically outlined, Section 2(c) stipulates that the two parties will determine the appropriate method of compensation to include, but not limited to, purchase at fair market value, in-kind service exchange of equal value, or a combination of the two options. All compensation options shall be approved by the GPA, CLTC, and the Consolidated Commission on Utilities (CCU). The compensation agreement between the GPA and CLTC must be finalized within 180 days after the enactment of the proposed legislation.

Because the GPA does not receive appropriations from the Government of Guam, having GPA cover the cost of the appraisals, survey, and registration of the subject property will not have an impact on any of the Government of Guam's finances.

As previously mentioned, the CLTC will receive an appropriate compensation for the transfer of the subject property. However, because the specific terms of compensation have not been outlined or agreed upon at the time of preparing comments, the Bureau is unable to determine if the compensation is equal, more, or less than the value of the subject property.
