COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

Bill No. 379-33 (COR) was introduced on October 5, 2016 by Senator Dennis G. Rodriguez, Jr., and was subsequently referred on October 5, 2016 by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement.

The Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement convened a public hearing on December 13, 2016 at 1:00 pm in *I Litheslaturan*'s Public Hearing Room to receive public testimony on Bill No. 379-33 (COR).

Public Notice Requirements

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on December 5, 2016 (5-Day Notice) and again on December 7, 2016 (48-Hour Notice), fulfilling the 5-Day Notice and 48-Hour Notice of the Open Government Law requirement.

IL SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Chairperson Ada calls the Public Hearing to order and reads the title of Bill No. 379-33 (COR). He then calls upon Sen. Rodriguez to provide a brief synopsis of Bill 379-33 (COR).

Senator Dennis G. Rodriguez, Jr.: Thank you very much Mr. Chairman, Mr. Chairman Bill 379-33 consolidates 5.2 acres of property along Marine Corp. Drive in Tamuning across John F. Kennedy High School. This is the property between Shell Gas Station and the Guam Power Authority sub-station. Right now DISID has control of majority of that property. There is also a portion of that property that is under jurisdictions of the Chamorro Land Trust.

The Bill authorizes Guam Economic Development Authority to be the Broker in soliciting for leases or development of the property, to include the construction of a One Stop Business Center for DISID. Which DISID had planned for many years now which would include Guam's first Autism Center. So the proceeds these developments being used number one to build this center will also be used to pay GEDA fee based on MOU that they have executed or will be executing with CLTC and DISID. Also assure that a portion CLTC has jurisdiction on that they too will receive proceeds from the use of that property. That is what this bill is about and looking forward to working with the stakeholders and sees how we can move this forward. Thank you.

Senator Thomas C. Ada: Calls up those who signed up to provide testimony.

Michael Borja- Good Afternoon Mr. Chairman and Senators, my name is Mike Borja, I'm the Director of Department of Land Management and the Administrative Director of the Chamorro Land Trust Commission. On Bill 379-33 which has been proposed to consolidate several lots in the municipal of Tamuning under the administrative control of the Department of Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities (DISID) and the Chamorro Land Trust Commission. And it also intends to resolve the land to seek commercial. I attached my written testimony of copy of the Department of Land Management land zoning consideration report. This provides the department planning division's analysis and recommendations which I'm just pretty much summarizing today. In some basically we say really the correct zoning of the land is R-1 single residential dwelling agricultural so that just needs to be corrected. Then we might have included in the language of the bill is something that would protect the interest of the Chamorro Land Trust Commission and the property. Should propose lease agreements lapse or default and probably something we can work on if any kind of lease agreement comes about while the Chamorro Land Trust has a very small interest in all of this. We just want able to insure that the Trust is also protected. We also saw the need to resolve the "C" Commercial is unnecessary cause there were so many prior land use authorizations that allowed it to use the land saw fit for this purpose. And that information is more specifically discussed in analysis with the land zone in consideration report. With those modifications The Department of Land Management supports this Bill as we have out lined in our Land zoning consideration report.

Senator Thomas C. Ada: Okay, Thank you. Dr. Duenas.

Dr. Vincent Duenas: Hi. My name is Dr. Vincent Duenas and I'm here in support of Bill 379-33. I'm representing Hunter's Speaks Organization which is a 501-C3 Non Profit. Our mission is to establish Guam's first Comprehensive Autism Center. Autism and Autism Spectrum Disorders are general terms use to describe a group neuro developmental disorder that affect social interaction, verbal and non-verbal communication as well staring typical and repetitive behaviors. Most of these kids present with intellectual disability Bolder impermanent as well as physical health issues. Such as sleep disturbance, gastro-intestinal disturbance, seizures, coexisting such as psychiatric illness such as OCD, ADHD and severe anxiety are often present. Autism affects 1 in 68 American children that are 1 in 42 boys and 1 in 189 girls respectively. Autism is more common than pediatric AIDS, Diabetes and Cancer combined On Guam over 260 kids have been identified in Guam Public School System as well through Guam Early Intervention. That's ages 3-21 that do not include those younger or older. Or does it take in take account those being home schooled or in private school. Or in account of others waiting to be evaluated. How is autism treated American Academy of Pediatrics, The Centers of Disease Control as well as The New York State Health Department recommend a minimum of 25-40 hours of intensive behavioral intervention to treat this disorder. Our kids on Guam currently receive zero hours. With treatment it is estimated that around 10% of these children made so much progress with intensive intervention they no longer meet criteria for the diagnosis. Although result may vary, it is agreed by multiple studies that intensive behavioral intervention will help all children no matter what. And it's a service we think needs to be brought to the island. It is something that we've been working towards doing to our nonprofit. Autism has been described since the 1940's by Physician Leo Cannors John Hopkins University. It's been almost 8 decades of existence; still we have no autism treatment here on island. It is our mission at

Hunter Speaks to improve the standard care in Autism treatment here on Guam so that our kids can be in the same opportunities and same chance that a meaningful and productive life as everyone else in the mainland. Supporting the center and bringing the services to Guam. I think will be able to do that. So we support Senator Rodriguez and his effort in this Bill.

Senator Thomas C. Ada: thank you Dr. Duenas, Mr. Servino

Benito S. Servino: Read written testimony, attached.

Senator Thomas C. Ada: Thank you very much I also have here Ms. Lourdes Mesa I guess you were going to provide written testimonies in favor of the project I am going to open up for questions so senators did you have any questions?

Senator Dennis G. Rodriguez: Thank you very much Mr. Chairman I don't have any questions but I would like to thank you for being here. I know Mr. Servino that the project that you and the department have been working on for a very long time. And we are here now to take it to the finish line. Hopefully be able to use this public private partnership concept to get this moving because we knew one of the element to move forward was just the Government resources that were not there to move forward but now being able to work with GEDA work with the private sector we can make this happen and in doing this the opportunity of establishing Guam's first autism center is real with Dr. Duenas and the autism organization we would be working with we know that it is just a percent establishing the center is not going to address the problem without having the services here for our people for our kids and it is a percent so we know that the health insurance those factors need to be addressed and we are committed to doing that but hopefully we can get this on pursuit at this time thank you very much and thank you to Mr. Borja for the recommendations, Senator Ada.

Senator Thomas C. Ada: I just have a question in describing what kind of footprint does it have, does it take up 25,000 sq. ft. if you were to put a building there.

Dr. Duenas: Well we looked at roughly 6,000-10,000 sq. ft. Our group has been touring autism centers in Hawaii which we plan to mimic here on Guam. The last autism center we toured in Honolulu was around 10,000 sq. ft. They were servicing roughly 40 preschool aged children and I think that's going to be a good start for us. I know that this one center is not going to be able to meet the demands of our entire island but again it's a start.

Senator Thomas C. Ada: So I guess to Mr. Servino, my question would be were talking about consolidating 2 or 3 lots which totals 150,000 sq. ft. And you are going to put 10,000 sq. ft. piece facility on there or is the idea here. Because I noticed the language here is that it also authorizes that the Guam Economic Development Authority on behalf of DISID to lease to put the land out on a long term lease for 30 years. So what are we really getting at here the authorization to be able to lease out that property long term and then maybe use the proceeds from that and either build or rent someplace else for this autism center.

Mr. Ben Servino: The goal of the whole idea establishing a home of our own for DISID was actually to build our own structure as you can see. In the attachment, we have the A&E established and there are plans to use that facility again to comply with the mandates the public

law to establish DISID the developers that were providing proposal. Once they announce proposal and the request for interest and request proposals that GEDA will be working on. Will hopefully provide some leeway or information on how they want to develop the property. The main goal we want to insure is that our structure is included in that proposal. Again properties 5 acres area there is enough room there to lease part of the property to non-profit organization such as the autism center so if the developer decides to build structure. Maybe 5 7/10 stories they propose again allocation of those office space that we require from some of the non-profit organization. I know a number of organizations who would be interested in securing space over there.

Senator Thomas C. Ada: I have no problem with the effort to put up an autism center and all that I am certainly in full support of that. I just want to make sure that the focus of this bill is that we are basically authorizing a long term lease of this 150,000 Sq. ft. piece of property on marine drive that is going to be leased out by GEDA. For all we know we could see a hotel up there and then give you 10,000 sq. ft. some were so that's really what this bill does.

Mr. Ben Servino: Again we have the A & E's and we want to try to insure that our facilities incorporated in the proposals that are submitted. Addresses our needs and if there are options the developer would propose that would probably identify other properties we are open to exploring that.

Senator Thomas C. Ada: So you are not married to the idea that the autism center has to be in this location along Marine Drive. So basically then what It comes down to is that this bill give the authorization on a 30 year lease on a piece of properties for a developer to come in and build something on it and the proceeds of this will all go to DISID and a little bit to CLTC correct.

Mr. Ben Servino: Right.

Senator Thomas C. Ada: Is there any kind of estimate or revenue this thing might generate.

Mr. Ben Servino: I don't have that with me again. We rely on the proposals we have submitted once GEDA announces again the request for bid or request for interest because there may be various types of proposals that has been submitted. To include again building our own structure at the facility or providing the alternative property that they may have so we need to explore that with GEDA and again the highest and best use for that property.

Senator Thomas C. Ada: Ok I don't have any other questions.

Chairperson Ada adjourns the Public Hearing for Bill No. 379-33 (COR).

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent: I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds

that the Department of Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities

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7 I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that the Department of Integrated

Services for Individuals with Disabilities requires additional revenue to augment

its programs and provide improved services required to assist individuals with

disabilities. It is the intent of DISID, in collaboration and with the assistance from

the Guam Economic Development Authority, to construct a Business Center and

- One Stop Community Resource and Wellness Center which would house a one-
- 2 call, one-click transportation dispatch center, the Guam Regional Transit Authority
- 3 administrative office, employment, housing and health related programs and
- 4 services currently provided by the agency.
- 5 I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that Guam lacks a comprehensive
- 6 autism center that can address the needs of the over 200 children identified by the
- 7 Guam Public School system from ages 3-21 and the countless of other children in

- 9 comprehensive autism center managed by a non-profit organization will enable





2. CHRONOLOGICAL FACTS:

- a. Date of Receipt: December 1, 2016

3. ANALYSIS:

a. Compatibility with existing uses. Property as noted are currently zoned "R-1" (Single Family Residential Dwelling) as opposed to purported "A" (Rural-Agricultural). The subject lots are primarily bounded by Route 1 and are accessible from both Route 1 and Tun Joaquin Flores Street (West Harmon Industrial Park Road). The properties are public lands and prior to vacating operations, provided public assistive services under Goodwill Guam.

It is currently under the auspice of the Department of Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities (DISID) pursuant to land transfer authority to the agency from the Department of Land Management. Properties are described in DLM Map No. 314FY89.

If passed, DISID will have the opportunity to engage in commercial activities under a commercial zone designation and be allowed to construct a "Business Center and One Stop Community Resource and Wellness Center which would house a one-call, one-click transportation dispatch center, the Guam Regional Transit Authority administrative office, employment, housing and health related programs and services currently provided by the Department of Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities, which shall be in addition to the grant funding the Guam Regional Transit Authority received pursuant to the Veterans Transportation Community Living Initiative, United States Department of Transportation".

The Bill further identifies three (3) government stakeholders: Guam Economic Development Authority, DISID, and the Chamorro Land Trust Commission, all of which when roles have been fulfilled, will benefit from such an endeavor.

- b. Surrounding Development Trends: The community design plan designates these properties for "Institutional Use"¹ and reflects current or past use for school and rehabilitation facilities, with no changes to date. Likewise, surrounding land uses generally reflects both the designated community design plans as well as land uses per land zone designation.
- c. Property as Public Lands: Subject lots are public lands and their particular use to engage and support the mandates of the Department of Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities (DISID) was solidified by executive transfer of properties from the Department of Land Management to DISID on August 22, 2006, pursuant to Title 21GCA, Ch. 60, §60104.

CONCLUSION and RECOMMENDATION: As crafted, it appears Bill 379-33 offers an opportunity to "right fit" and affirm the use and/or flexible use of these properties to support the goals and objectives of DISID. We appreciate this intent with respect to supporting any endeavor engaged in public services for the elderly and persons with disabilities.

We provide the following recommendations:

- a. Modify the bill to reflect the appropriate zoning designation of "R-1" (Single-Family Residential Dwelling) Zone;
- b. The CLTC is unaware of any construction scheme for facilities as noted in the Bill. In this respect, it remains concerned of potential impacts physical structures may have on ability to commit Lot 5138-2-R3NEW-1-1 to leasing opportunities should CLTC-DISID lease agreement lapse or default occurs. In this respect, we suggest additional direction on development be expounded in the Bill to affirm protection of CLTC interest.

c. Remove the intent to re-zone to "C" (Commercial) Lots 5138-2-R3NEW-1-2 and 5138-2-R3NEW-R2. Pursuant to statutory authority at the time (Title 21GCA, Ch. 60, §60104), the administrative transfer of said lots essentially furthers and allows the use of these lands at DISID's mandated discretion. Thus, if the purpose of rezoning said lots is likewise intended, then a change of zone will not be necessary.





Hafa Adai Chairman Ada and members of the Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement. My name is Jay Rojas, Administrator of the Guam Economic Development Authority (GEDA), and I hereby submit this written testimony in support of Bill No.379-33 (COR).

We acknowledge Senator Dennis Rodriguez for introducing Bill No. 379-33 (COR) which by way of an Memorandum of Agreement (MOA), authorizes the Guam Economic Development Authority (GEDA), on behalf of the Department of Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities and the Chamorro Land Trust Commission, to solicit prospective tenants to lease and develop approximately 5.2 total acres on Lot No. 5138-2-R3 NEW-1-1, Lot No. 5138-R3 NEW-1-R2 and Lot No. 5138-2-R3 NEW-1-2, located in upper Tumon, Municipality of Dededo, at commercial fair market rental rates. GEDA supports Senator Rodriguez and the sponsors of Bill 379-33 which would allow the Authority to enter into a private-public partnership arrangement to provide for the commercial lease and development of these properties with the proceeds being utilized to construct and maintain the DISID Business Center and One Stop Community Resource and Wellness Center which has previously been designed using DISID program funds. The Center will house a one-call, one-click transportation dispatch center, the Guam Regional Transit Authority (GRTA) administrative office, employment services, housing and health related programs and services currently provided by the agency such as public outreach and coordination with key referral sources, counseling, streamline access to public long-term support and service programs for persons with disabilities, and state governance and administration.



GEDA also supports the intent of this bill which also requires the leasing of a portion of this facility for the establishment of a Guam Autism Center, whose mission is to provide a comprehensive autism facility where children and families affected by ASD may receive appropriate services in a more convenient and centralized location.

Should Bill 379 be signed into law, and as stipulated in the proposed bill, proceeds received from the lease shall also be utilized for payment to GEDA in its role in assisting DISD with property development and as the property manager, and the Chamorro Land Trust Commission for use of the property pursuant to a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between GEDA, DISID, and CLTC.

GEDA supports Legislative passage of Bill 379-33. Si Yu'os Ma'ase to you, the members of your Committee and Senator Rodriguez for the opportunity to provide written testimony.

My name is Lourdes AG Mesa and I am a parent and the legal guardian of a young man with a developmental disability. I also hold the office of president for the Autism Community Together (ACT), a support group for individuals with autism spectrum disorders and their families.

I am providing testimony today in support of Bill No. 379-33 (COR) introduced by Senator Dennis G. Rodriquez, Jr. to construct a new DISID business center and one-stop community resource and wellness center and the establishment of a Guam Autism Center.

Almost twelve (12) years ago, my son was diagnosed with having an Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD), a complex disorder of brain development that affected his ability to interact socially with others, with difficulties in his verbal and nonverbal communication and repetitive behaviors. It is never easy for any parent to hear the news that you have a child with special needs much less to have autism and that your lives as you know it will never be the same. The day we received the diagnosis was the day we began our journey of uncertainty, discovery, advocacy and self-empowerment.

For those of us living with autism, we understand the importance of early intervention and receiving the intensive services to meet each child's therapeutic needs. Unfortunately, services on Guam for those on the spectrum are very limited and almost non-existent. Parents like myself struggle daily with the challenges of taking the best possible care of our children. Families are faced with the decision either to remain on island or leave elsewhere to seek the services they desperately need for their children. Many of our families are just not able to pack up and leave because of limited resources or lack of family support off-island. Our families and children on Guam are hurting. The establishment of a Guam Autism Center can fill in the needs of our children and their families affected with autism spectrum disorders. We need to know those agencies that support individuals with disabilities such as the Department of Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities (DISID) and the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR) are able to continue to provide services for our children as they reach adulthood.

I am here today to ask that you support Bill No. 379-33 (COR) so that persons with disabilities will be able to get the quality services and help they need to better their lives and the lives of their families.

For the record, my name is Ben S. Servino, and I currently serve as the Director for the Department of Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities (DISID).

I am submitting this written testimony in support of Bill 379-33 (COR) which authorizes the Guam Economic Development Authority (GEDA) to maximize and seek the highest and best use of the property which is located across from JFK High School on behalf of DISID and the Chamorro Land Trust Commission (CLTC).

DISID has administrative jurisdiction of Lot No. 5138-2-R3 NEW-1-R2 (which is 11,168 +/- sq. m. located along Marine Drive) and Lot No. 5138-2-R3 NEW-1-2 (which is 7,075+/- sq. m. and located where the former Guam Rehabilitation and Workshop Center metal structure once stood). The CLTC has administrative jurisdiction over the adjacent half acre Lot No. 5138-2-R3 NEW-1-1 (which is 2,868 +/- sq. m. and located by the side road easement where the concrete car wash structure still stands).

With the assistance of the Governor's Office and the Department of Public Works, we were able to demolish and dispose of the old Guam Rehabilitation and Workshop Center Structure that was abandoned and neglected for over 15 years. This structure was not only an eye sore, but a health and safety concern for the community because the left over items from the Thrift Shop became a fire hazard and some homeless individuals were using the abandoned facility as their shelter.

Back in 2008, DISID developed a proposal for the construction of a two-story "Inclusion For All" facility at the old Guam Rehabilitation and Workshop Center location to help address the concerns raised under the DMHSA/DISID Permanent Injunction.

The goal was to house the various DISID program services and use the facility to collaborate with pertinent community organizations involved in providing programs and services to individuals with disabilities and their families.

This shovel-ready project has a completed Architectural and Engineering (A&E) Plan comprised of a total building area of 13, 583 s. f. was funded by the U.S. Department of Interior Compact Assistance Grant and was initially estimated to cost \$6 M to construct (please see attachment A).

The two-story facility would include office space for DISID's Division of Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR), the Division of Support Services (DSS), an Assistive Technology Computer Resource and Training Center, an Enrichment Center to promote Independent Living, and space for an Evaluation, Enforcement, and Compliance program unit to monitor and provide technical assistance regarding compliance with local and federal disability laws.

The A&E design included a multi breakout conference room which could be utilized for meetings by various advisory committees and councils, for clients seeking employment, training or micro-enterprise activities, and for awareness presentations of various programs and services offered by community and faith based service providers.

The facility also provided space for talented individuals with disabilities with entrepreneurial interest who wish to showcase and sell their goods to tourist that often visit K-Mart and for our island residents who wish to purchase hand crafted souvenirs to send back to the mainland.

Working with GEDA to lease and develop the lots across from JFK and to construct the DISID Business Center and One Stop Community Resource and Wellness Center would have many benefits and the return of investment for our government is significant.

DISID has been leasing private office space in Hagatna to house the operations of its program services for over 15 years and the annual savings of \$364,344 realized from the existing lease could be re-allocated towards the development of new program services, hiring additional Social Workers, and paying for utilities and maintenance costs at the new facility once it is constructed.

The DISID Business and One Stop Resource Center could serve as a transportation hub for Guam Regional Transit Authority (GRTA) whereby passengers could be dropped off to apply and receive Vocational Rehabilitation Services and employment related training from our Community Partners and to also apply and receive Support Services from our Agency.

DISID would also be able to access \$1M of Federal Transit Authority construction funding for the establishment of the One-Call-One-Click Transportation Dispatch Center through GRTA.

Clients from our DVR Program could benefit from training and employment opportunities such as custodial or lawn maintenance services, including clerical and other administrative and programmatic support services at the proposed facility.

Students from JFK High School could also benefit by providing Service Learning hours and serving as Mentors or Peer Trainers for our Clients at the new facility.

Practicum and internship opportunities could be established at the new facility for students from GCC and UOG.

Additional revenue could be generated for new DISID programs and services through the installation of an electronic advertisement signage board fronting Marine Drive.

Employment agencies such as the Guam Department of Labor (DOL) and their American Job Center could lease office space at the Business Center.

Non-Profit Organizations (NPOs) that serve PWDs could lease office space at the Business Center for the establishment of community based programs such as an Autism Center.

The cost to construct the DISID Resource Center could be absorbed by the Private Developer as part of their lease proposal.

At the end of the lease term, the Business Center facility will be transferred to DISID.

A provision could be included in the bill to allow DISID to charge a fee for the use of the Conference and Training Rooms for certain events. NPOs that serve PWDs would be allowed to utilize the Conference and Training Rooms for their organizational meetings and community outreach trainings at no charge.

In closing, I would like to share that during Cabinet meetings, the Governor would often remind everyone that the success of a government is measured by the way they addresses the needs of the most vulnerable (which includes the early childhood population, the youth, the elderly, individuals with disabilities, and the veterans) population in our community.



On behalf of the Guam Regional Transit Authority (GRTA), as the Executive Manager for GRTA, I am in support of Bill No. 379-33 to build a Department of Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities (DISID) Resource Center. GRTA grant application for the amount of \$1,305,000 of which One Million (\$1,000,000) was for the purpose of jointly working with DISID to have this facility build using Federal Transit Administration (FTA) grant monies for the construction of the building. No FTA funds will be utilized for A & E, the funding drawdown will begin once the actual construction commences.

Extended Budget Description

The proposed DISID Community Resource Center is a 2-story 220 ft. long x 107 ft. wide concrete building. This facility has a circular bus pick-up and drop-off/disabled parking stall area located at the middle front part of the building. In addition, an 8 ft. wide concrete covered walkway that extends end-to-end of the building frontage. DISID has agreed for GRTA to designate these two areas as GRTA's bus transfer facility, which will serve GRTA's Northern fixed-Route (Greyline), and the Northern paratransit services for Dededo, Yigo, and the surrounding areas. The asphalt-paved parking area has 85 parking stalls with storm drain system and catch basins. The exterior areas that are not asphalt-paved will be turfed and landscaped.

The entire first floor will be utilized as community habilitation; training/conference room; respite/PCA; workstation, interview, intake, and outreach areas. GRTA's Administration Office and the proposed One-Call/One-Click Center will be located at the area currently designated in the plan as CAAP. The entire second floor will be assigned to DISID executive, administrative, fiscal, planning, and supervisory personnel with conference rooms, restroom facilities, etc.

The estimated total cost of constructing the proposed DISID Community Resource Center will be approximately \$7 to \$8 million. Currently, more than \$900,000.00 is available from Guam Housing & Urban Renewal Authority (GHURA) grant as donation/contribution. Part of these funds will pay for the architectural and engineering plan modifications, and the rest of these funds will pay for the initial construction of the facility together with the \$1 million that GRTA will be contributing. The remaining \$5 million or more needed to complete the construction will be coming from DISID community development block grant and contribution/donation from Guam Economic Development Authority (GEDA).

GRTA and DISID have agreed to draw up a Memorandum of Agreement for GRTA to own the approximately 2,500 square feet of office space designated for GRTA's Administration Office and the proposed One-Call/One-Click Center, and to utilize the front portion of the building as GRTA's bus transfer

facility in exchange for contributing \$1 million to partially finance the construction of this facility.

Last August 2, 2006, the Government of Guam lots: Lot No. 5138-2-R3 NEW-1-2 containing an area of approximately 7,075 square meters and Lot No. 5138-2-R3 NEW-1-R2 containing an area of approximately 11,168 square meters were administratively transferred by the Governor of Guam to DISID for future development. These lots in the Municipality of Dededo were transferred to DISID pursuant to Title 21, Guam Code Annotated, Chapter 60, Section 60104, Real Property.

The subject lots and the surrounding areas are currently within M-1 zone or light industrial zone. Title 21, Guam Code Annotated, Chapter 61, Section 61309 allows conditional usage for utilities and public facilities such as this facility in an M-1 zone. This proposed building meets and exceeds the height limit requirement of 30 ft.; and the lot and area requirements of 0 ft. front yard depth, 20 ft. rear yard depth, 8 ft. side yard depth, 120 ft. lot width, and 5,000 square feet lot area.







DISID developing One-Stop Shop in Upper Tumon

Big changes could be coming to Upper Tumon, where new development could transform an abandoned government lot into a center to benefit residents with disabilities. Guam Department of Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities director Ben Servino said Guam is in need of a permanent facility to benefit the island's residents with disabilities.

"Bill 379 would authorize the Guam Economic Development Authority to lease and develop this land and construct what officials are calling the DISID One-Stop Shop," he explained. Located in Upper Tumon, the One-Stop Community Resource and Wellness Center will house DISID's health, housing and employment related services. The proposed facility would save the department roughly \$30,000 a month on rent alone.

In addition, the facility will also house a one-call, one-click transportation dispatch center, the Guam Regional Transit Authority administrative office, and Guam's first autism center.

Senator Dennis Rodriguez, Jr. introduced the bill earlier this month, and said, "The mission is to provide comprehensive autism for children and families affected by

ASD, may receive appropriate services in a centralize location 328 Guam has - the statistics - is over 200 kids who have been diagnosed with autism, and that's only from those who are in the public school system."

Servino added, "A lot of parents are very concerned about what would happen, if they should pass. A lot of the kids are now becoming adults, and who is going to be responsible for that? And I really feel that our government has an obligation to ensure that we provide those services."

The 5.7-acre property is governed by both DISID and the Chamorro Land Trust. GEDA will work with the agencies to foster a public-private partnership in order to construct the one stop shop. A portion of the remaining land - located on prime real estate in Upper Tumon - will then be leased to a developer, with lease payments providing a source of additional revenue to support the facility.

Officials said it could take more than a year before the facility is completed.

Land-use bill for autism center raises questions

Sen. Tom Ada raised concerns during a public hearing yesterday over a bill that would consolidate three lots of land in Tamuning for the use of a community center for individuals with disabilities, as well as establish an autism treatment facility.

Sen. Dennis Rodriguez, who authored the legislation, explained that Bill 379 would consolidate and rezone three separate lots, containing roughly 5.2 acres of land, along Marine Corps Drive across the John F. Kennedy campus in Tamuning for the purpose of engaging in a commercial lease that would fund the development of a business and community center for the Department of Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities (DISID) and the Guarn Autism Center.

According to language in the bill, two of the three lots in questions are already under the jurisdiction of DISID, while a third adjacent parcel lies under the purview of the Chamoro Land Trust Commission. As such, the

bill would authorize the inclusion of the CLTC lot in the project and stipulates that the land agency receive a portion of revenue generated by the commercial lease in proportion to the ratio of CLTC property so used.

The development of the land and the establishment of the commercial lease would be handled by the Guam Economic Development Authority which would, on the behalf of DISID, authorize a commercial lease that would incorporate the interests of DISID, and the construction of a comprehensive autism treatment facility, into the agreement.

While Ada openly stated that he had no objection to the construction of either an autism treatment facility or a DISID business and community center, he did raise questions as to how such facilities would be funded under provisions of the bill.

Specifically, Ada questioned the rationale behind establishing a long-term lease with a developer for a combined 150,000-square-foot property that would fund a facility, in the case of the Guam Autism Center, that would comprise only about 10,000 square feet.

"We are basically authorizing a long-term lease on this 150,000 square foot lot for 30 years (to GEDA)," Ada stated.

He further questioned whether language in the bill clearly stipulated that the autism treatment facility would necessarily be located on the Tamuning lots and questioned whether the bill would allow a developer to engage in commercial activity on the property and then fund construction of the autism facility elsewhere.

DISID Director Benito Servino, who offered testimony in support of the bill during yesterday's public hearing, stated that he did not understand why Ada would think that a developer would have such free reign over the ultimate use of the property. Servino said that the goals and plans he summarized in his testimony would be incorporated as provisions in any request for proposal (RFP) that GEDA puts out for potential developers.

Servino explained that the bill in question would answer the call for a much needed permanent residence for DISID, which has been until now paying for their office space via a lease at the DNA building in Hagåtña for more than \$300,000 a month over the past 15 years. He added that the potential rental savings could then be reallocated to other much-needed services and resources.

According to Servino, the proposed DISID Business and One Stop Resource Center would not only serve to house DISID's services to the island's most-vulnerable, but "could serve as a transportation hub for Guam Regional Transit Authority (GRTA), whereby passengers could be dropped off to apply and receive Vocational Rehabilitation Services and employment related training from our Community Partners and to also apply and receive Support Services from our Agency." In so doing, Servino added that DISID would also be able to access \$1 million in Federal Transit Authority construction funding for the establishment of the "One-Call-One-Click Transportation Dispatch Center through GRTA."

Servion's testimony went on to outline the many potential benefits such a development could have for the entire island community and reiterated that stipulations within any potential lease agreement would protect the interests of DISID and the proposed legislation.

Guam Autism Center

In addition to the DISID facility, mandates of the bill state that funds generated by any lease agreement on the proposed lots would also go toward the establishment of Guam's first comprehensive autism treatment facility.

Speaking in favor of the legislation and on behalf of the autism-advocate non-profit organization HunterSpeaks, Dr. Vincent Duenas explained the great need for an autism treatment facility for Guam.

According to Duenas, more than 260 children have been identified with autism and autism-spectrum disorders in Guam's public school system and early intervention programs so far, but notes that that number is probably higher and that many more children go undiagnosed.

"Autism affects one in 68 American children," Duenas said. "That's one in 42 boys and one in 189 girls, respectively. Autism is more common than pediatric AIDS, diabetes and cancer combined."

Duenas reported that studies of treatment options have shown that 25 to 40 hours of intensive behavioral intervention treatment can have lasting and noticeable results, such that 10 percent of children treated show "so much progress ... they no long meet criteria for the diagnosis (of autism)."

Despite the obvious need for such a facility and the existence of a reliable treatment option, Duenas stated that Guam has been without an autism treatment facility since the first reported diagnosis of autism in the 1940s.

If funding and a location for the facility is secured through Bill 379, Duenas said they would likely base the design of the Guam Autism Center off similar facilities in Hawaii that he had recently toured.

Duenas explained that the mission of HunterSpeaks would be fulfilled by the establishment of such a facility "so that our kids can be given the same opportunities and same chance at a meaningful and productive life as everyone else in the mainland."
