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## COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

## I. OVERVIEW

Bill No. 39-33 (LS) **as amended by the Committee**, was introduced on February 20, 2015 by Senators T.A. Morrison and T.R.M. Barnes, and was subsequently referred by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Municipal Affairs, Tourism, Housing and Historic Preservation on February 23, 2015.

The Committee on Municipal Affairs, Tourism, Housing and Historic Preservation convened a public hearing on Bill No. 39-33 (LS) on Wednesday, March 11, 2015 at 1:30 p.m. in I Liheslatura's Public Hearing Room.

Public Notice Requirements

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via e-mail to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on Wednesday, March 4, 2015 (5-Day Notice), and again on Monday, March 9, 2015 (48-Hour Notice).

## II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 1:32 p.m.

Chairwoman Muña-Barnes recognized members of the audience who were in attendance for Bill No. 39-33 (LS), including Mr. Mark Baldyga, Mr. Nathan Denight, former Senator Telo Taitague, and Mrs. Therese Arriola, all from the Guam Visitors Bureau (GVB); Mr. Bob Steffy from the Guam National Olympic Committee; Mr. George Benoit of the Guam Golf Association; and, Mr. Joe Young of the Cal Ripkin Association.

Senator Tommy Morrison followed by providing brief remarks as the main sponsor of the measure. Senator Morrison offered that Bill No. 39-33 (LS) would complement GVB's existing grants-in-aid program by enabling cultural organizations and sports teams to participate in off-island competitions, fairs, and similar events where their

involvement would assist in the promotion of Guam as a safe, clean, and unique destination of choice.

Senator Morrison provided several examples of the types of rules and regulations GVB would have to develop in order to effectively administer the use of limited public funds. He then acknowledged the value fundraising efforts offer Guam's youth, young adults, and many others involved in sports and cultural activities. Senator Morrison concluded his opening remarks by sharing that the legislation aims to provide a meaningful level of support to cultural practitioners and athletes who continue to contribute to the development and growth of Guam's tourism industry.

Before allowing the panel of guests to begin providing their individual testimony, Chairwoman Muña-Barnes informed attendees that she had just received a text message from Mr. Steven Muña in support of Bill No. 39-33 (LS). According to Chairwoman Muña-Barnes, Mr. Muña is an umpire who has many years of experience working with members of Guam's baseball community.

Chairwoman Muña-Barnes then recognized Mr. Nathan Denight, General Manager of the Guam Visitors Bureau, to provide testimony on behalf of the agency's management and staff. Mr. Denight thanked Chairwoman Muña-Barnes and Senator Morrison for the opportunity to present his agency's testimony in support of the measure. Mr. Denight informed the Committee that GVB currently has two grant programs to assist local tourism-related activities involving cultural and sports activities. However, both grant programs are limited to events that are held on island. Mr. Denight commented that GVB's Board of Directors, management, and staff support the use of proceeds from the Tourist Attraction Fund for certain activities that would strengthen Guam's image abroad. According to Mr. Denight, GVB is fully aware of the fundraising challenges faced by cultural practitioners and athletes who wish to participate in off-island activities. Mr. Denight concluded by requesting the Committee to consider authorizing GVB to expend up to twenty five thousand dollars (\$25,000) of the initial appropriation provided for in Section 2 of the bill to procure an online grant application system. The investment would help the agency to effectively administer the grant application process.

Mr. Mark Baldyga, Chairman of the Guam Visitors Bureau Board of Directors, followed with brief comments in support of the legislation. Mr. Baldyga shared that GVB supports Bill No. 39-33 (LS) because the intent of the measure is embraced by the



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agency's Vision 2020, which endorses programs that promote Guam not only as a great place to visit – but a great place to live as well. He reiterated the need for GVB to invest in an online grant application system to ensure that applications are handled in an efficient manner. In addition to the creation of the new cultural and sports ambassadors fund, Mr. Balyda requested the Committee's support for other important needs of GVB, including various capital improvement projects.

Mrs. Therese Arriola, Chairwoman of GVB's Culture and Heritage Committee, testified in support of Bill No. 39-33 (LS) as the measure would help to strengthen the capacity of cultural practitioners to promote the Chamorro culture to other communities. According to Mrs. Arriola, the legislation is a great addition to GVB's existing grants-inaid program with the potential of attracting increased media attention for Guam, especially in countries that are not part of GVB's core markets.

Torgun Smith, President of the Guam National Tennis Federation, offered testimony in favor of the legislation based on his many years of experience coordinating the participation of local athletes in off-island competitions and events. Mr. Smith shared that he was very familiar with the challenges Guam athletes face in raising enough funds in order to compete abroad. He concluded by recognizing the assistance GVB previously extended to his organization in helping to organize local tennis clinics with off-island teams.

Chairwoman Muña-Barnes thanked Mr. Smith for his testimony and then proceeded with the public hearing by reading the written testimony provided by Mr. Victor Torres of the Guam Sailing Federation. In summary, Mr. Torres suggested for the Committee to amend certain language in the legislation to ensure that public funds are used to support sports organizations that are duly acknowledged by a recognized national or international sports body. Mr. Torres offered the proposed amendment to ensure that sports federations on Guam that are in good standing with national or international sports organizations, but are not members of the Guam National Olympic Committee, have opportunities to apply for grant funding.

Senator Tommy Morrison followed by thanking those in attendance for providing input on the merits of Bill No. 39-33 (LS), as well those areas in the bill that may need to be amended. He shared that his office worked closely with the GVB's management before introducing the measure, to ensure that such a program would be a win-win situation for Guam's tourism industry – and for Guam's cultural practitioners and athletes.

Senator Morrison spoke of his many experiences participating in off-island sports competitions where he witnessed other communities that were able to showcase a blend of culture and sports.

Chairwoman Muña-Barnes then recognized Mrs. Arriola to share additional comments on the measure. According to Mrs. Arriola, FY 2015 grants-in-aid funds designated for cultural and heritage groups have already been awarded to thirteen (13) recipients in anticipation of activities related to the upcoming Festival of the Pacific Arts. Mrs. Arriola requested the Committee's assistance in ensuring that funds from the new ambassador program be distributed equally between both cultural and sports grant award categories.

Mr. Vince Reyes of Inetnon Gef Pa'go followed by thanking Senator Morrison and Chairwoman Muña-Barnes for introducing Bill No. 39-33 (LS). Mr. Reyes believes that funds from the new program would help to increase the levels of artistry, showmanship, and experience among cultural practitioners, especially our youth. He concluded by suggesting that GVB require fund recipients to provide some type of community service upon returning from their events off island, including free shows for official functions and sports clinics for youth and families.

Mrs. Arriola provided additional comments relative to the rules and regulations that will have been promulgated for the new program. She informed the Committee that several members of GVB's Board of Directors have already started discussions with GVB's management and staff concerning the different requirements for receiving program funds. Mrs. Arriola commented that the rules and regulations for GVB's grants-in-aid program will be considered as the new rules are developed.

Chairwoman Muña-Barnes thanked Mrs. Arriola and other panel members for providing testimony in support of Bill No. 39-33 (LS). Chairwoman Muña-Barnes committed to reporting out the measure in time for either the March or April legislative session, subsequently adjourning this public hearing at 2:18 p.m.

The public hearing was adjourned at 2:18 p.m.

It is, therefore, a policy of the government of Guam to identify and sustain a 6 viable funding source to support opportunities for cultural organizations and sports 7 teams to assist in the enhancement of the Guam product abroad through their 8 participation in activities that are duly approved by the Guam Visitors Bureau.

9 Cultural and Sports Ambassadorship Program Fund, § 9402. 10 established. There is hereby created, separate and apart from all other funds, the Guam Visitors Bureau "Cultural and Sports Ambassadorship Program Fund" 11 12 (hereinafter referred to as Fund). The deposits into the Fund shall not be 13 commingled with deposits received from the Tourist Attraction Fund for the 14 operations, special projects, and any other appropriations made to the Guam 15 Visitors Bureau, and *shall* be kept in a separate bank account. The bank account 16 shall be established and maintained by the Guam Visitors Bureau, and its funds 17 shall only be available for use as stipulated herein.

18 § 9403. Annual Deposit. No less than Two Hundred Thousand Dollars 19 (\$200,000) of the adopted revenue projection of the Tourist Attraction Fund for 20each fiscal year shall be set aside and allocated by the Department of Administration to the Guam Visitors Bureau for deposit into the Fund established 21by this Section. Each annual deposit shall be made over the course of the fiscal 2223 year as collections are received. Financial contributions may also be made to the 24 Fund by participating businesses and organizations, as sponsors of cultural groups 25 and sports teams.

1 Any unexpended balance of the Cultural and Sports Ambassadorship 2 Program Fund *shall not* revert to the Tourist Attraction Fund or any other fund, and 3 *shall* be available until fully expended for the purposes described herein.

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4 § 9404. Adoption of Rules. The Guam Visitors Bureau shall adopt, through a resolution approved by the Board of Directors of the Guam Visitors 5 6 Bureau, the rules necessary to effectuate the provisions herein which shall include, 7 but not be limited to, the definition of a Sports Ambassador, the types of fairs, 8 competitions, and activities to be authorized, the amounts to be awarded to cultural groups and sports teams, the eligibility criteria for selection, and the requirements 9 10 for organizations to complete community service hours as a condition for receiving 11 public funds. The rules and regulations shall ensure that Fund proceeds are used 12 exclusively to support cultural groups sanctioned by the Guam Visitors Bureau, 13 youth sport teams participating in nationally and internationally recognized competitions, and other sports teams that are members of sports federations duly 14 15 endorsed by the Guam National Olympic Committee."

Section 2. Initial Deposit. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the 16 17 Director of Administration is hereby authorized to deposit up to Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) from the unappropriated balance of the Tourist 18 19 Attraction Fund for Fiscal Year 2014 into the Cultural and Sports Ambassadorship 20Program Fund for use during Fiscal Year 2015. Of this amount, One Hundred 21 Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) shall be allocated to support youth sports teams 22participating in nationally and internationally recognized competitions during Fiscal Year 2015, and One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) shall be 23 24 allocated to support Sports Ambassadors competing in the 2015 Pacific Games.

1 § 9401. Legislative Statement. Cultural performers and athletes on 2 Guam serve as integral components of Guam's tourism industry. 3 Opportunities for cultural groups and sports teams to promote Guam's rich 4 and unique culture abroad help to educate other communities about, and 5 raise awareness of, our island as a safe, clean, and pleasant destination of choice. Cultural groups and sports teams continue to strengthen Guam's 6 7 image abroad through their participation inat regional and international fairs, 8 competitions, and activities.

9 It is, therefore, a policy of the government of Guam to identify and 10 sustain a viable funding source to support opportunities for cultural 11 organizations and sports teams to <u>strengthen existing</u>, and to attract new, 12 <u>visitor markets assist in the enhancement of the Guam product abroad</u> 13 through their participation in activities that are duly approved by the Guam 14 Visitors Bureau.

15 § 9402. Cultural and Sports Ambassadorship Program Fund, 16 established. There is hereby created, separate and apart from all other 17 funds, the Guam Visitors Bureau "Cultural and Sports Ambassadorship Program Fund"' (hereinafter referred to as Fund). The Guam Visitors 18 19 Bureau is hereby authorized to use Fund proceeds to provide grants for 20transportation expenses for off-island travel by cultural and sports 21ambassadors. The Ddeposits into the Fund shall not be commingled with 22 deposits received from the Tourist Attraction Fund for the operations, special projects, and any other appropriations made to the Guam Visitors 23 24 Bureau, and *shall* be kept in a separate bank account. The bank account 25 shall be established and maintained by the Guam Visitors Bureau, and its 26 funds *shall only* be available for use as stipulated herein.

§ 9403. Annual AppropriationDeposit. Beginning on October 1, 1 2015, and for each year thereafter, No less than Two Hundred Thousand 2 Dollars (\$200,000) is hereby appropriated from of the adopted revenue 3 projection of the Tourist Attraction Fund for each fiscal year shall be set 4 5 aside and allocated by the Department of Administration to the Guam Visitors Bureau for deposit into the Fund established by this Article Section. 6 7 Each annual deposit shall be made over the course of the fiscal year as collections are received. Financial contributions may also be made to the 8 Fund by participating businesses and organizations, as sponsors of cultural 9 10 groups and sports teams ambassadors.

Any unexpended balance of the Cultural and Sports Ambassadorship Program Fund *shall not* revert to the Tourist Attraction Fund or any other fund, and *shall* be available until fully expended for the purposes described herein.

§ 9404. Adoption of Rules and Regulations. Within ninety (90) 15 days following the enactment of this Act, tThe Guam Visitors Bureau shall 16 17 adopt, pursuant to the requirements of the Administrative Adjudication Law 18through a resolution approved by the Board of Directors of the Guam Visitors Bureau, the rules and regulations necessary to effectuate the 19 20provisions herein which *shall* include, but *not* be limited to, the definition of a Cultural Ambassador and a Sports Ambassador, the types of fairs, 21 22 competitions, and activities to be authorized, a requirement that grants 23 awarded to each ambassador not exceed fifty percent (50%) of transportation 24 expenses the amounts to be awarded to cultural and sports organizations, the 25 eligibility and selection criteria for selection, and the requirements for cultural and sports ambassadors organizations to complete community 26 27 service hours as a condition for receiving public funds.

In developing the required rules and regulations, the Guam Visitors 1 2 Bureau *may* consider incorporating existing rules and regulations established 3 for the 'Off-Island Educational Training and Cultural Enhancement Fund', and the 'Sports Fund for Off-Island Travel', as applicable and necessary. 4 The rules and regulations shall ensure that Fund proceeds are used 5 exclusively to support cultural groups sanctioned by the Guam Visitors 6 7 Bureau, youth sport teams participating in nationally and internationally 8 recognized competitions, and other sports teams that are acknowledged by a 9 nationally or internationally recognized sports organization members of 10 sports federations duly endorsed by the Guam National Olympic 11 Committee."

12 Section 2. FY 2015 Appropriation Initial Deposit. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Director of Administration is hereby authorized to 13 14 deposit up to Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) is hereby appropriated 15 from the unappropriated Fiscal Year 2014 balance of the Tourist Attraction Fund for Fiscal Year 2014 into to the Cultural and Sports Ambassadorship Program 16 17 Fund for use during Fiscal Year 2015. The Guam Visitors Bureau is hereby authorized to expend Fund proceeds Of this amount, One Hundred Thousand 18 19 Dollars (\$100,000) shall be allocated to support grants for transportation expenses 20for off-island travel by cultural and sports ambassadors authorized to participate in 21 the 2015 Pacific Games and other youth sports teams participating in nationally 22 and internationally recognized competitions during Fiscal Year 2015, and One 23 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) shall be allocated to support Sports Ambassadors competing in the 2015 Pacific Games. Up to Twenty Five Thousand 24 25 Dollars (\$25,000) of this appropriation may be expended by the Guam Visitors 26 Bureau to develop an online grant application system.

*Håfa Adai* Chairperson Barnes and Members of the Committee on Municipal Affairs, Tourism, Housing and Historic Preservation,

On behalf of GVB's Board of Directors, thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony on Bill 39-33: An Act to Add a New Article 4, §§ 9401-9404, to Chapter 9, Division 1, Title 12, Guam Code Annotated, Relative to Promoting the Guam Product Abroad Through the Establishment Of a Cultural and Sports Ambassadorship Program Fund.

The Guam Visitors Bureau supports Bill 39-33, which will provide support for those that represent our island overseas in sports and cultural events.

GVB has two divisions that are impacted by this bill. The Bureau's Cultural & Heritage division focuses on the promotion and preservation of our Chamorro culture, while our Sports & Events Division is dedicated to the development of local events that attract visitors to our island and improve the quality of life for Guamanians. Both divisions have grant programs, but currently these programs are dedicated to local development in these areas since GVB's primary mission is to attract visitors to the island. So at this time, GVB does not have the funding to provide grant assistance for ambassadors for travel off-island.

That being said, GVB certainly recognizes the numerous benefits that off-island travel provides to athletes and cultural practitioners. Moreover, Guam's participation in off-island sports and cultural events can bring media attention and ultimately awareness about our destination. We also recognize the tremendous burden that fundraising places on our local community, and agrees that the Government should provide some assistance. So GVB is pleased to use its resources to administer this fund, as it is a way to give back to the community.

GVB respectfully asks Senators to consider adding an additional section to the bill authorizing GVB to use up to \$25,000 from Section 2 of the bill to develop an online grant application system. This will allow sports teams and cultural organizations to have full access to the program and to submit applications at their convenience. It will also allow GVB to receive applications in a timely manner and for the organization requesting assistance to track their application progress in real-time.

While GVB supports this bill, we must state for the record that the Tourist Attraction Fund's primary mission is to attract visitors to the island. For FY 2015, GVB did not receive our full request for Capital Improvement and Safety projects. For this reason, we humbly request that

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#### **Comments**

The intent of Bill No. 39-33 is to create a new "Cultural and Sports Ambassadorship Program Fund" as a separate fund within the Guam Visitors Bureau (GVB). This Fund is to be utilized to support cultural and sports teams who travel abroad to promote Guam's brand. The bill provides for annual deposits of \$200,000 to the Fund. Rules on the use of such funds will be determined by GVB's Board of Directors. The bill authorizes an initial deposit of \$200,000 from FY2014 unappropriated balances of the TAF. Per the Department of Administration, the unaudited TAF unreserved fund balance as of September 30, 2014 is adequate to fund the \$200,000 per this bill.
