#### **COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST**

#### I. OVERVIEW

Bill No. 394-33 (COR) was introduced on October 28, 2016 by Senator Thomas C. Ada and was subsequently referred on October 28, 2016 by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement.

The Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement convened a public hearing on November 10, 2016 at 2:00 pm in *I Liheslaturan*'s Public Hearing Room to receive public testimony on Bill No. 394-33 (COR).

#### **Public Notice Requirements**

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on November 03, 2016 (5-Day Notice) and again on November 07, 2016 (48-Hour Notice), fulfilling the 5-Day Notice and 48-Hour Notice of the Open Government Law requirement.

#### Senators Present

Senator Thomas C. Ada Committee Chairperson

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 2:00pm.

#### II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Chairperson Ada called the Public Hearing to order and reads the title for Bill No. 394-33 (COR). He stated the bill was prompted by the fact that unlike the Chamorro Land Trust Commission and any other Board or Commission, which is required to undergo Legislative Confirmation, the work that is done by the Guam Ancestral Lands warrants the commissioners to undergo Legislative Confirmation. The provisions are mirrored to the Chamorro Land Trust Commission.

He then called those who have signed up to give testimony.

Anthony Ada, Commissioner, Guam Ancestral Lands Commission: Started by saying he understood why the bill came into play, as to make the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission uniform with other Boards and Commissions. He pointed section one of the bill, which states how many commissioners and the years in which they will serve. The staggered terms of the commissioners will allow for a learning curve and an understanding of what the commissions are responsible for. He foresees no problem with that section. Mr. Ada clarifies that there are seven members that currently sit on the commission.

He then asked for clarification on the same section but the part that give the current members 90-days and 3 legislative days, unless replaced sooner. He asked if that language stays in the bill, can the Governor reappoint current sitting commissioners?

**Chairperson Ada:** Responded that 3 legislative days would be equivalent to 3 months. He gave the example of the Speaker calling session to order and adjourning one week later, is one legislative day. Therefore, it is about 3 months for 90 days and 3 months for 3 legislative days, which would be 6 months. He hopes the Governor would get the appropriate packets to the Legislature either to appoint or reappoint, in that timeframe.

**Mr. Ada:** Asked two questions, would the bill put the current commission on hold until this bill is passed and would a courtesy resignation be required?

**Chairperson Ada:** Responded that there is language in other legislation that prohibits submitting courtesy resignations, as a result of change of administration.

**Mr. Ada:** Stated the reason could be so that a new Governor could work with his own people, unless he decides to keep those currently sitting. He went on to say he is just trying to understand the entire aspect of the bill.

**Chairperson Ada:** Stated that when a new administration comes in, it is up to them to decide but he will look at the language in regards to resignations.

**Mr.** Ada: He went into the section of the bill that states the quorum, four would be easier should someone not be able to make a meeting. As for land claims, the discussion can be had but not action can be taken unless 5 commissioners are present. But if the 4 present can take action right after a discussion then that would be okay.

**Chairperson Ada:** Answered that current law states 4 commissioners will be a quorum for administrative matters and 5 commissioners are a quorum to determine land claims. Stated that administrative items need 4 commissioners, while land claims need 5 commissioners. He went on to say that he was going on the majority needed to conduct business.

Roland Laguana, Commissioner, Guam Ancestral Lands Commission: Spoke in Chamorro.

**Mr.** Ada: Asked for clarification on the staggered term, the commissioner that serves one term will change to 4 years after the one year term?

**Chairperson Ada:** Responded yes but when serving the 4 years, if that commissioner decides for whatever reason to resign, say in the 2<sup>nd</sup> year, the appointed replacement will serve the remaining of the 4 years and not restart the 4 years.

**Ronald Eclavea,** Commissioner, Guam Ancestral Lands Commission: Stated concerns about the number of commissioners needs to determine a land claim.

**Chairperson Ada: Responded in Chamorro.** Stated based on the responses, the determination of a land claim should be kept at 5 commissioners.

Mr. Ada: Spoke in Chamorro.

**Anita Orlino,** Chairperson, Guam Ancestral Lands Commission: Stated the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission is a unique commission. Land issues are very sensitive, that is why there are 7 commissioners, 5 commissioners to determine a land claim and 4 commissioners for administrative matters. Stated that is the reason for the number of commissioners because of its uniqueness and the sensitive land issues.

**Chairperson Ada:** Asked if it is the commissioners that go through the application or is it a staff who goes through the application and gives their analysis? Stated there is a different set of responsibilities and tasks in comparison to the Chamorro Land Trust Commission. It is unique in that perspective but other than that there are still fiduciary responsibilities.

**Mr. Eclavea:** Stated the criteria for commissioners is that they must be an heir or descendent of ancestral properties?

**Chairperson Ada:** Responded that is not being changed, that will still be required. The only thing being changed is the commissioners will undergo legislative confirmation. Which means the appointed will go down the Legislature, the Legislature will look at the packet and puts the Legislature in the comfort zone that the right person is sitting on the commission.

**Mr. Ada:** Stated that a big portion of the position was the determination of land claims but now it is the management of the land. Things like renewal of leases, payments, request for leases, etc. He went on to say the staff at the Department of Land Management look at the application and make the commissioners work easier, if things are not in order the staff works with the applicant.

Chairperson Ada: Informed the commissioners present that the language for quorum could stay the same that way they can officially meet, have discussions and if it is an administrative business then a decision can be made. If there is a land claim, he stated that five commissioners are needed and that is 2/3 and that is what is done at the Legislature. He gave the example of the Legislature needing 8 to pass but to override a veto 10 is needed. The language will be looked at and necessary adjustment will be made. The bill doesn't look to kick out commissioners, the language has to be looked at.

Chairperson Ada adjourns the Public Hearing for Bill No. 394-33 (COR).

#### III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION

The Committee finds that:

- 1. one of the criterion to be eligible to serve on the GALC is that the individual must be "residents of Guam and descendants or heirs of ancestral land owners..." However, the law allows a "land claimant" to serve on the GALC. Technically, a claimant is one applying to be a bona fide "ancestral land owner", and until declared as such should not be allowed to serve on the GALC, amendments need to be made on the term length to account for 7 commissioners.
- 2. The status of the currently appointed (but not legislatively confirmed) Commissioners should be allowed to serve out their current term.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

**Section 1.** § 80103 of Chapter 80, Title 21, Guam Coded Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

#### "§ 80103. Guam Ancestral Lands Commission.

Lands Commission to carry out the purposes of this Chapter. The Commission shall be composed of seven members, with seven people appointed by *I Maga lahen Guåhan*, with the advice and consent of the Legislature. All Commissioners who shall be residents of Guam and descendants or heirs of ancestral land owners or claimants, and they shall serve terms of four years from the date of their appointment. Members shall serve terms of four (4) years, provided, however, that of the members first appointed under this statute, two shall be appointed for a term of one (1) year, two shall be appointed for a term of four (4) years.

The current appointed members of the GALC shall continue to serve for 90-days and 3 legislative days, unless sooner replaced by a duly confirmed appointee.

(b) Vacancies. Vacancies in the membership of the Council shall

- (b) Vacancies. Vacancies in the membership of the Council shall be filled by appointment by *I Maga lahen Guåhan* in the same manner as initial appointments, as provided in this section of this Chapter. Persons filling a vacancy must undergo the Legislative confirmation process, and shall serve for the unexpired portion of the term.
- (c) Quorum. Four Commissioners present shall constitute a quorum of the Commission for the conduct of administrative business and the disposition of a land claim. Five Commissioners present shall constitute a quorum of the Commission to determine a land claim. A vote of <u>four</u> a majority of the members of the Commission shall be required for any action of the Commission.
- (d) Administration. The Commission shall adopt rules and regulations governing the conduct of its affairs. It shall elect a Chairman and Vice-Chairman from among the Commissioners, and may employ an executive director and such staff as is necessary to carry out the duties set forth in this Chapter, pending the submission and approval of a budget by *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*.
- (e) Stipend. Each Commissioner shall receive the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for attendance of each meeting of the Commission; provided, that such compensation shall not exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per month, and provided that they are not members of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*."
- **Section 2. Severability.** If any provision of this law or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such

All Commissioners who shall be residents of Guam and descendants or heirs of ancestral land owners or claimants, and they shall serve terms of four years from the date of their appointment. Members shall serve terms of four (4) years, provided, however, that of the members first appointed under this statute, two (2) shall be appointed for a term of one (1) year, two (2) shall be appointed for a term of two (2) years, and three (3) shall be appointed for a term of four (4) years.

The current appointed members of the GALC shall continue to serve until the end of their current appointed term.

- (b) Vacancies. Vacancies in the membership of the Commission shall be filled by appointment by *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* in the same manner as initial appointments, as provided in this section of this Chapter. Persons filling a vacancy must undergo the Legislative confirmation process, and shall serve for the unexpired portion of the term.
- (c) Quorum. Four Commissioners present shall constitute a quorum of the Commission for the conduct of administrative business. Five Commissioners present shall constitute a quorum of the Commission to determine a land claim. A vote of a majority of the members present of the Commission shall be required for any action of the Commission.
- (d) Administration. The Commission shall adopt rules and regulations governing the conduct of its affairs. It shall elect a Chairman and Vice-Chairman from among the Commissioners, and may employ an executive director and such staff as is necessary to carry out the duties set forth in this Chapter, pending the submission and approval of a budget by *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*.
- (e) Stipend. Each Commissioner shall receive the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for attendance of each meeting of the Commission; provided, that such compensation shall not exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per month, and provided that they are not members of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*."






