#### I. OVERVIEW

**Bill No. 50-33 (COR)** - "An act to *amend* § 8121 of Chapter 8 of Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated; relative to the annuity payments of certified, registered or licensed healthcare professional, or ancillary service personnel employed by the Judiciary of Guam" was introduced by Senator Rory J. Respicio on March 3, 2015, and subsequently referred to the **Committee on Appropriations and Adjudication** on March 4, 2015.

The Committee on Appropriations and Adjudication convened a public hearing on Monday, March 23, 2015, beginning at 4:00PM and reconvening at 5:30PM in the Guam Legislature Public Hearing Room. The hearing for Bill No. 50-33 (COR) began at 5:42PM and ended at 5:55PM.

#### II. TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

Chairman Benjamin J.F. Cruz announced Bill No. 50-33 (COR), and allowed the sponsor of the bill to make an opening statement.

**Senator Rory J. Respicio** thanked Chairman Cruz for hearing Bill No. 50-33 (COR) and continued with his opening remarks:

"[Bill No. 50-33 (COR)] is an act to amend certain sections of the Guam Code Annotated relative to annuity payment to certified registered licensed healthcare professionals for ancillary service personnel employed by the Judiciary of Guam. I want to say that this bill is being introduced at the request of the Judiciary [of Guam (Judiciary) and I want to recognize their oversight chair Senator Frank B. Aguon, Jr. for allowing me to introduce this bill on [the Judiciary's] behalf. What the Judiciary is seeking here, Mr. Chairman and colleagues, is exemptions that are already provided in statute for similar healthcare professionals and ancillary service position at the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority (GMHA), the Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center (GBHWC), and the Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS) that lifts the prohibition on employing retirees for these positions. And if we [pass] this [bill] — hopefully we will — and it becomes law—this would continue on the support the Legislature continues to provide for the Judiciary in its ability to provide for therapeutic jurisprudences and I am grateful that you have this bill publicly heard and I also provided the sponsor statement (appended to this report) to that effect. So thank you, Mr. Chairman."

**Chairman Cruz** thanked Senator Aguon and motioned for Mr. Joshua F. Tenorio, Administrator of the Courts, Judiciary of Guam, to proceed with his testimony.

Mr. Joshua F. Tenorio thanked Chairman Cruz, and thanked Senator Respicio for his sponsorship of the bill. Mr. Tenorio read his written testimony. He added that three (3) senior individual- and marriage-counseling therapists out of his staff of eight (8) will be completing their service later this year with one scheduled to complete her thirty-six (36) year service in June. He said that the concern is several of the senior therapists are leading the effort to implement system changes at the Judiciary, but he claimed that he has not heard of any desire for any of the therapists to have indefinite employment at the Judiciary. He continued:

"In fact, if I'm able to use this to convince one of [the senior therapists] to at least stay six (6) months to a year while we finish training staff and our execution of acquiring and implementing the risk and needs assessment, then I'm going to feel much better about our success. There's a chance, of course, that they may not [stay]; you know, a lot of people that have lots of government years of service are able to go into private practice and do other things but this at least gives us a tool to try to convince them to at least have a managed transition and at least let us

finish certain kinds of work. [This bill is] not meant to establish a good secondary workforce."

**Senator Respicio** thanked Mr. Tenorio and Chairman Cruz, and asked the Administrator of the Court to relay to the Committee for the record the conversation Chief Justice Robert J. Torres, Jr. had with the Chairman of the Government of Guam Retirement Fund (GGRF) Board of Trustees, Mr. Joe T. San Agustin.

**Mr. Tenorio** said that Chief Justice Torres spoke to Mr. San Agustin to explain the situation and to seek support or, at least, neutrality for the legislation. He said that according to the Chief Justice, Mr. San Agustin indicated his support as he felt that it was equitable given that the same exemption exists elsewhere for the same pool of people.

**Senator Respicio** thanked Mr. Tenorio once again, and noted the importance of recording that information as part of the public hearing process.

**Chairman Cruz** noted that Mr. Tenorio had mentioned that this legislation is meant for the interim, and asked the administrator if he would object to adding a sunset provision—which **Mr. Tenorio** denied—and if were amenable to one, what the reasonable terms would be.

Mr. Tenorio responded that a reasonable term would be three (3) years due to the evidence-based practices that the Judiciary is currently implementing for juvenile and adult offenders and others that it has yet to acquire and implement in the areas of domestic violence and sex offender treatment. He noted that the Judiciary, in collaboration with the Robert F. Kennedy National Resource Center for Juvenile Justice, has just selected the juvenile risk and needs assessment tool; the same assessment tool will be implemented as early as the fall, or ideally next year. He mentioned that Senator V. Anthony Ada has been extending his support for revamping domestic violence therapy. He concluded that given the major changes in store for the Judiciary, three years could be "a good compromise" in case practices need to be reconsidered.

**Senator Frank B. Aguon, Jr.** thanked Chairman Cruz and said he wanted to pose some questions regarding the proposed sunset provision:

"I understand the nature of what the Judiciary of Guam is effected with right now in terms of being provided with this flexibility. Why would you consider it an interim when in fact it applies to a number of other government of Guam agencies? And with the Judiciary, you moved tremendously towards treatment courts. And as treatment courts, you always want that flexibility to be able to retain or to pull from individuals who have retired from the government of Guam and have that flexibility moving forward. Now, in the treatment courts, we're not a strong emphasis on the part of the Judiciary of Guam that I would not understand about sunset provisions, but why would you want to advocate for that?"

#### Mr. Tenorio responded:

"I think that my own observation is that in this field, the number of licensed professionals is expanding [...] in part due to some of the expansion of the scholarship programs that are available [...] and to the fact that the starting pay for the provisions in the Competitive Wage Act (CWA) for new employees is attractive. Of course, people would argue that [the salary] should be more but at least for entry-level positions, [per] the CWA implementation, entry-level positions or first time employed after CWA implementation, there is a significant pay increase. So to answer your question, I would agree to it because I'm really concerned that we're not going to be able to really pull off a quality program implementation if I'm faced with a departure of some of these senior therapists [who] are already knowledgeable of the court, that understand where we want to go, [and] are familiar with the data that we're looking at. I mentioned that we have a talent management program; we've been doing tremendous work trying to really pave the way for our employees to expand their knowledge base and continue [their employment] at the court. So I don't see it much of a threat, but people would definitely argue, with as much flexibility as you could make it indefinite, but this is not our primary mandate. Our primary mandate for behavioral health is with GBHWC, but the client services was born out of [GBHWC's inability] to keep up with the demand—and the demand that's generated by the court is based on case times and it really needs to be reliable services [...] I have a more narrow focus on this, just because the changes we're making in the next few years are going to be far lasting and [require] constant evaluation. I don't see us making radical changes; as time goes on, we'll constantly make incremental changes [...]

# **Senator Aguon** interjected and said that wished to close with this comment:

"I think, Joshua (Mr. Tenorio), I understand your perspective. I'm glad you highlighted it from a narrow perspective, at least at this point in time. It's just with the impending opening of the veteran's court, which is another treatment court, you always want some form of flexibility, and the intent, the way I look at it, is the allowance to be able to recruit or to retain government of Guam retirees should always be considered as a program that would augment existing work force, not supplant. And that's how the program has been administered in many of the other government of Guam agencies. And I anticipate that [in regards to] the [Judiciary], the primary focus would also be very similar to that where any time you utilize this particular tool, it's to augment or provide that additional support should the full-time staff not be able to meet that requirement at any point in time. I just want to share that because of the impending opening of the veteran's court. So that again is another treatment responsibility. Thank you, Mr. Tenorio; I appreciate your comments."

On account that there were neither further questions from the Committee nor other individuals present to testify, **Chairman Cruz** considered Bill No. 50-33 (COR) as heard.

#### III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Based on written testimony provided subsequent to the measure's public hearing, the Committee on Appropriations and Adjudication finds that the bill contains a minor drafting error that would inadvertently cause the deletion of items (b) through (e) of § 8121, Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated. As such, the Committee recommends that Section 2 of the measure be amended to read as follows:

"Subsection (a) of § 8121 of Chapter 8 of Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby amended to read as follows:"

Section 1. Legislative Intent. The Judiciary of Guam Client Services & 1 Family Counseling Division provides a variety of direct therapeutic, psychological, 2 evaluative, consultative, and educational services to the court, its clientele, and the 3 community. These services include forensic and psychological evaluations; 4 individual, couples/conciliation, and family counseling; group counseling; and in-5 house consultation and counseling. To address the continued availability of these 6 7 services, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to provide the Judiciary of Guam with the same exemption to the provisions of 4 GCA §8121 that allow certified, 8 registered, or licensed health care professionals, or ancillary service personnel, 9 employed by the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority, the Guam Behavioral Health 10

and Wellness Center, and the Department of Public Health and Social Services, to receive annuity payments if they are employed by the courts for any period of time.

This provision will allow the Judiciary of Guam to introduce evidenced based practices to improve probation services, update and improve the effectiveness of the Alternative Sentencing Office and its programs, adopt and implement risk and needs assessment tools to develop case management plans, and improve the responsiveness of referral services for behavioral health, substance abuse and developmental disabilities.

**Section 2.** §8121 of Chapter 8 of Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby amended as follows:

"§ 8121. Same. Suspension of Annuity Payment. (a) A retired member who subsequently becomes an employee eligible for membership under § 8106 of this Title prior to January 1, 1999, shall, upon becoming so employed, have that member's right to receive payment of that member's annuity suspended for the duration of that member's employment, but all other rights pertaining to that member's annuity provided by this Article, including automatic increases therein, shall be retained by that member. The provisions of this Section shall not be applicable to any retired Judge or Justice designated and assigned by the Chief Justice to perform judicial duties in the courts of Guam as provided for in § 6115 of Title 7 GCA, or

any person employed by the Department of Education in Guam schools, as a substitute teacher or as a Certified Augmentation Teaching Service (CATS) employee as that term is defined by Title 17 GCA § 3127(b). Such employment shall be subject to the provisions of Subsection (d) of this Section.

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The provisions of this Section shall not be applicable to any certified, registered or licensed health care professional, or ancillary service personnel, employed by the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority, the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, the Department of Public Health and Social Services, and the Judiciary of Guam; academic faculty positions at the University of Guam and the Guam Community College; a limited term police officer employed by the Guam Police Department, to include Police Officers I, II, III and Sergeant I & II, performing duties such as patrol officers, narcotic officers, criminal investigators and school resource officers; or limited term school bus drivers or automotive mechanics employed by the Department of Public Works; provided, that such person(s) occupies such positions for which no other qualified/certified applicants was available, and that such employment shall be on a fiscal year basis; subject to the provisions of Subsection (d) of this Section.

The provisions of this Section shall not be applicable to employee(s) of the Office of the Governor, employee(s) of the Office of the Lieutenant Governor, unclassified employee(s) appointed by the Governor of Guam, and heads of autonomous agencies appointed by a governing board. 
The fulfillment of the critical mission this Division requires the employment of professionals who are certified, registered, or licensed in their fields. To address the shortage of available personnel that meet this criteria, the Judiciary is seeking the exemptions already provided in statute for similar health care professional and ancillary service positions at the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority, the Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center, and the Department of Public Health and Social Services that lifts that prohibitions on employing retirees for these positions.

By extending the current exemptions to include the Judiciary, we will make it possible for the Judicial branch to introduce evidenced based practices to improve probation services, update and improve the effectiveness of the Alternative Sentencing Office and its programs, adopt and implement risk and needs assessment tools to develop case management plans, and improve the responsiveness of referral services for behavioral health, substance abuse and developmental disabilities.

I look forward to the Committee's discussion and approval of this legislation, and request that this statement be included in the Committee Report of Bill No. 50-33 (COR). Si Yu'os Ma'ase!

Dear Vice Speaker Cruz & Members of the Committee,

The Judiciary of Guam submits its testimony in support of Bill 50-33(COR), "An Act to Amend §8121 of Chapter 8 of Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated Relative to the Annuity Payments of Certified, Registered or Licensed Healthcare Professional, or Ancillary Personnel Service Personnel Employed by the Judiciary of Guam."

This legislation will add the Judiciary to the list of government agencies currently authorized to employ retired certified, registered, or licensed health care professionals and ancillary service personnel. In the Judiciary, these licensed professionals would exclusively be assigned to the Client Services and Family Counseling Division ("CSFC").

The CSFC Division provides a variety of direct therapeutic, psychological, evaluative, consultative, and educational services to the court, its clientele, and the community. These services include Forensic and Psychological Evaluations; Individual, Couples/Conciliation and Family Counseling; Group Counseling; and In-House Consultation and Counseling including to law enforcement personnel when necessary. The division is currently staffed by 8 full-time licensed Individual, Marriage, and Family Therapists ("IMFT"). In the past, the division also employed 1 full-time psychologist.

The Judiciary is undergoing a system-wide revamp of its strategies for juvenile justice, adult probation services, therapeutic court programs, and case management. We are in the process of acquiring validated risk and needs assessment tools to improve the assignment of risk levels to criminal defendants, earlier identification of mental health and substance abuse issues, and evaluate socialization factors that will reduce recidivism. We are in a transition to quality individualized case management in an effort to reduce and address recidivist behavior. This involves the evaluation and screening of juvenile and adult

defendants, providing effective services and focused referrals, and reducing the over supervision of low risk defendants.

We are also revising our strategies in treating crime victims, domestic violence offenders, as well as the management of sex offenders. This work involves acquiring new programs, investments in training probation officers and therapists for motivational interviewing and validating assessments, regular and structured evaluation of program outcomes, and quality assurance and review of case management plans and supervision strategies. These evidence-based practices will improve probation services, the responsiveness of referral services for behavioral health, substance abuse and developmental disabilities, and will significantly reduce recidivism.

The CSFC Division is an integral component in the development and implementation of these changes. The pool of qualified, licensed health care professionals, such as therapists, available to the Judiciary is, quite often, shared across the government of Guam. Indeed, the last recruitment process undertaken by the CSFC Division resulted in the hiring of the Psychiatric Social Worker Supervisor from the Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center ("GBHWC").

Our goal is to utilize the flexibility contemplated by Bill 50-33(COR) to bridge gaps between the retirement of highly skilled members of our professional health care workforce and the completion of a comprehensive recruitment process that results in the hiring of competent and similarly skilled and experienced successors to these positions. This flexibility is something the Judiciary only intends to utilize on an interim basis when it will improve effectiveness. Planning for succession is a priority for the Judiciary and we have developed a Talent Management Program to assist us in this regard.

Thank you, again, for the opportunity to testify in favor of Bill 50-33(COR). The Judiciary is hopeful that this proposed legislation will receive favorable treatment by this body and become law. I writing to submit supplemental testimony regarding Bill 50-33(COR), "An Act to Amend §8121 of Chapter 8 of Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated Relative to the Annuity Payments of Certified, Registered or Licensed Healthcare Professional, or Ancillary Personnel Service Personnel Employed by the Judiciary of Guam."

The Judiciary was responsible for drafting this legislation. However, upon closer review, we have identified a drafting error resulting in the inadvertent removal of subsections (b), (c), (d), and (e), which should remain in an amended 4 G.C.A. §8121. The Judiciary's only intent in requesting amendment to §8121 is to make changes to subsection (a). There is no intention to remove the subsections following (a), as is evidenced by the fact that proposed language in Bill 50-33 contains a reference to subsection (d).

We apologize for the error and are hopeful the Committee will amend the language so that Section 2 is read as follows: "Subsection (a) of §8121 of Chapter 8 of Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby amended as follows:". This will limit the scope of the changes proposed in Bill 50-33(COR). We look forward your favorable consideration.

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


