COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

Bill 62-33 (LS) was introduced on March 30, 2015 by Senator Thomas C. Ada and was subsequently referred on March 30, 2015 by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement.

The Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement convened a public hearing on April 6, 2015 at 9:00 am in *I Liheslatura*'s Public Hearing Room to receive public testimony on Bill 62-33 (LS).

Public Notice Requirements

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on March 30, 2015 (5-Day Notice) and again on April 2, 2015 (48-Hour Notice).

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 9:00am.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Chairperson Ada: states that Bill 62-33 is an act to amend §32113(b) of Chapter 32, Title 22, Guam Code Annotates, relative to required experience for professional engineers, professional architects and professional land surveyors, and clarifying processes for applicants. He goes on to say that the bill will clarify when the clock starts for when the required experience can begin accruing.

Chairperson Ada then calls up those who have signed up to give testimony.

Paul Santos, *Chief of Cadastre/Guam Chief Surveyor*, *Department of Land Management* (written and oral testimony): Mr. Santos reads his testimony explaining his support of the intent of the Bill 62-33 but offers recommendations. He explains that often there are inexperience surveyors who may have gained experience not necessary under a licensed surveyor. He goes on to say that his experience as the Chief of Cadastre at Department of Land Management is that many surveyors who don't have that professional judgment that is

required in land surveying are not able to solve boundary and property issues. Mr. Santos says, that too often these issues go unresolved and a few years down the line they start to creep up and that is when we start to see the results of these surveys. He explains that if that surveyor had a little more experience and mentorship of a licensed surveyor, then maybe the initial errors would not have occurred. He goes on to say that the Board should have the final authority in confirming and verifying the experience of the applicant. Mr. Santos finishes by saying there are other typographical recommendations and those can be found in his written testimony submitted.

Mark Ruth, *Chairman, PEALS Board* (oral testimony): Mr. Ruth explains that he and the PEALS Board have worked Chairperson Ada's office and are in full support of Bill 62-33 as introduced. Mr. Ruth goes on to say that Mr. Santos is also on the PEALS Board and that he has expressed his concerns in their working session of the bill. He says that the PEALS Board was not sure how to word the recommendations being made by Mr. Santos but the PEALS Board understands and accepts the recommendation being made at todays hearing by Mr. Santos.

Tom Camacho, *Dueñas Camacho & Associates*: Mr. Camacho says that in addition to the suggestions made by Mr. Santos, the professional surveyors who signed the applicants credentials could also be brought in for an interview. He says that an applicant may paint a pretty picture and say what is wanted but going beyond that and bring in the professional may be feasible. Mr. Camacho says he is in support of the bill.

John Dueñas, *President*, *Dueñas Camacho & Associates* (written and oral testimony): Mr. Dueñas starts by saying he is in support of the Bill 62-33. He goes on to say that he has sat with Chairperson Ada's office in the initial draft of the bill and he supports the additions made by Mr. Santos. He goes on to say that he thought is was in the authority of the PEALS Board to interview applicants but if it not then he is in support of that addition. He then says his written testimony goes into further detail on the background and doesn't fell the need to read what was iterated in the preamble. He ends by saying he is in support of bill 62-33.

William Gilman (oral testimony): He starts by saying he is a license professional engineer on Guam and several other states, and is also registered with the National Council for Engineering Examinations. He goes on to say that he concurs with the intent of the bill to meet NCEE standards. He then says that there is language in the bill that unintentionally violates the basic premise of proving a candidate is qualified to practice engineering on Guam, making reference to page 2 lines 11 to 23. He continues by saying what is missing is that a graduate candidate must first pass fundamentals of engineering exam. As read he says, the bill allows a graduate engineer to practice for four years, one of which is under a professional engineer, then take the second of only two exams and upon passing this exam shall be allowed to practice engineering, making reference to line 21.

He then says the engineer profession is highly dependent on understanding the basic fundamentals of engineering. Mr. Gilman says without passing the fundamentals of engineering exam, how will the community know the candidate is qualified to understand the reasoning behind the second exam. He then makes reference to page 3 lines 6 and 7, saying it

mentions the examination for another qualification but in earlier discussion this requirement has inadvertently been left out. He ends by asking the bill include the proper references to the fundamentals exam.

Mark Ruth: He starts by saying the fundamentals exam is not left out. He says if you read line 11 carefully, it says an engineering intern. He goes on to say that if you go into the definitions, an "engineering intern means a person who complies with the requirements of education, experience and character, and has passed an examination in the fundamental engineering subjects." Mr. Ruth says the question has come up before and it all hinges on the word intern, saying it is not the intent to mislead. He then says if the committee decided to insert the definition of an engineer intern into the section of the bill that would be fine and make it nice and clear.

William Gilham: He says he is in support of the definition added onto the bill, because it gives good clarification.

Chairperson Ada: He says when this was brought to his attention, the changes was being when does the clock begin for the creditable engineering experience. He then says the way it is being interpreted now is that the creditable experience that is required begins only after the fundamentals exam has been passed.

Mark Ruth: He clarifies saying the law says "in addition." He says there are two ways to look at the language, meaning this and that or this then that. It doesn't say exactly when the clock start. He says the PEALS Board legal council has interpreted to mean this then that, leaving the Boards hands tied. That is the determination made to other candidates says Mr. Ruth.

Chairperson Ada: He states in the recommendation about the surveyors, it is his understanding with the engineering exam, which is an objective exam, it is a pass or fail. He goes on to say that in the case of the surveyors, the fact that you are suggesting that the certification of the surveyor maybe determined by the outcome of the interview, it gives it some degree of subjectiveness.

Paul Santos: He starts by saying that the recommendation protects the public because now they will know that the applicant is truly qualified to take that examination. He then says as stated earlier, he has seen to many younglings coming into the profession lacking requisite professional judgment and maturity. He continues with saying that professional surveyors is a different field, it requires a lot of experience, reading on legally issues, and not everyone gets it the first time. He says the more experience the applicant gets the better exposure to different issues and that makes for a better surveyor.

Chairperson Ada: He says his concern is if the surveyor applicant passes the examination, meets his experience requirements but all that may be for not, if the applicant doesn't do well in an interview. Where would the applicant go to appeal or is there a recourse to appeal?

John Dueñas: He states that his interpretation of Mr. Santos' recommendation, he wants to make sure that surveyor indeed has the experience, they want to verify that experience maybe

through interviewing the applicant. Mr. Dueñas says he thinks its fine, he sees it as a clarification of the application and not subjectiveness.

Mark Ruth: He says that in the case of architects, to verify experience the supervisor has to be a licensed architect. Then that requirement goes in ENCARB and they verify all the experience and need to meet requirements, so there is a documented process, so at the end of that time there certifies an IDP. He then says in the case of the surveyors, it is unique on Guam and the type experience needs to be relevant.

John Dueñas: He says there are two parts to the professional land-surveying exam, one is Guam land matters, under that part of the exam they should be able to bring someone in for an interview. That part of the exam makes it unique to Guam says Mr. Dueñas. To have someone articulate what the applicant did, in that part of the exam, if the Board decides.

Mark Ruth: He says that maybe we don't want to use the word interview, but rather the Board has the authorization to request for additional information. That leaves it up to the discretion of the Board, says Mr. Ruth.

Chairperson Ada: He states that for his question, the recommendation made by Mr. Camacho to bring in other professionals to possibly endorse the applicant would be helpful. The language will need to be looked at but Chairperson Ada says he wants to report the bill out for the April session.

Chairperson Ada ends the public hearing for Bill No. 62-33 (LS).

III. Findings and Recommendations

The Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Land, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement, as recommended by the PEALS Board, amends the bill by inserting language which allows for an interview from the PEALS Board to be a component of the application process. The Committee hereby reports out Bill 62-33 (LS), as amended, with the recommendation to control with the recommendation to control to the process.

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds

3 that § 32113 of Chapter 32, Title 22, Guam Code Annotated (aka the PEALS law)

4 requires four years of professional experience before an individual may sit for the

5 Professional Engineer examination. However, the Board of Professional Engineers,

6 Architects and Land Surveyors (PEALS) Board, finds that Subsection (b)(1)(A)

7 also requires that these four years be completed after an individual successfully

8 passes the Fundamentals of Engineering examination. The potential for a similar

interpretation also exists within Subsection (b)(5)(A), relative to the experience

required for the Professional Land Surveyors examination.

I Liheslatura further finds that this interpretation is inconsistent with the

model law and rules established by the National Council of Examiners for

Engineering and Sciences (NCEES), of which the Guam PEALS Board is a

(Upon passing such examination(s), the applicant shall be granted a certificate of registration to practice engineering on Guam, provided the applicant is otherwise qualified.) Creditable experience towards the required four (4) years stipulated by this Subsection shall begin at a point after graduation from an engineering program accredited by EAC/ABET, or the equivalent.

(B) Graduation, Experience and Examination — A graduate of an engineering or related science curriculum of four (4) years or more, other

than the ones approved by the Board as being of satisfactory standing, and with a specific record of eight (8) years or more of progressive experience, at least two (2) years of which shall have been under the supervision of a registered engineer on projects of a grade and character which indicates to the Board that the applicant may be competent to practice engineering, and having passed a current form of examination in the fundamentals of engineering shall may be admitted to a current form of examination in the fundamentals of engineering and a current form of examination in the principles and practice of engineering as prescribed in the by-laws. Upon passing such examination, the applicant shall be granted a certificate of registration to practice engineering on Guam, provided the applicant is otherwise qualified.

- (A) Education, Experience and Examination A graduate of an NAAB accredited program from a school of architecture approved by the Board as being of satisfactory standing and with at least three (3) years of progressive experience satisfactory to the Board in architectural work covering the major categories of architectural practice, at least two (2) years of which *shall* have been under the supervision of a registered architect, and having completed the Intern Development Program (IDP), *shall* be eligible for a current form of examination as prescribed in the rules and regulations. Upon passing such examination, the applicant *shall* be granted a certificate of registration to practice architecture in Guam, if the applicant is otherwise qualified.

"(A) Licensure or Registration by Examination — An Engineer Intern and a graduate of an engineering curriculum of four (4) years or more, accredited by EAC/ABET or the equivalent, with a specific record of an additional four (4) years or more of progressive experience on engineering projects of a grade and character which indicates to the Board that the applicant may be competent to practice engineering, at least one (1) year of which *shall* have been under the supervision of a registered professional engineer, *shall* be admitted to a current form of examination in the principles and practices of engineering, and in the case of specific engineering disciplines, other examinations as prescribed in the by-laws. (Upon passing such examination(s), the applicant *shall* be granted a certificate of registration to practice engineering on Guam, provided the applicant is otherwise qualified.) Creditable experience towards the required four (4) years stipulated by this Subsection *shall* begin at a point after graduation from an engineering program accredited by EAC/ABET, or the equivalent.

(B) Graduation, Experience and Examination — A graduate of an engineering or related science curriculum of four (4) years or more, other

than the ones approved by the Board as being of satisfactory standing, and with a specific record of eight (8) years or more of progressive experience, at least two (2) years of which *shall* have been under the supervision of a registered engineer on projects of a grade and character which indicates to the Board that the applicant may be competent to practice engineering, and having passed a current form of examination in the fundamentals of engineering *shall* may be admitted to a current form of examination in the fundamentals of engineering and a current form of examination in the principles and practice of engineering as prescribed in the by-laws. Upon passing such examination, the applicant *shall* be granted a certificate of registration to practice engineering on Guam, provided the applicant is otherwise qualified.

(C) A Non-graduate from a Technical Curriculum — A non-graduate of an engineering or related science curriculum of four (4) years or more, with a specific record of three (3) years or more in such a curriculum plus twelve (12) years or more of progressive experience on engineering projects, four (4) years of which must have been under the supervision of a registered engineer, and of which at least six (6) years have been in responsible control of engineering projects of a grade and character which indicates to the Board that the applicant may be competent to practice engineering, and having passed a current form of examination in the fundamentals of engineering shall may be admitted to a current form of examination in the fundamentals of engineering and the principles and practice of engineering as prescribed in the by-laws. Upon passing such examination, the applicant shall be granted a certificate of registration to practice engineering on Guam, provided the applicant is otherwise qualified."

Section 3. § 32113(b)(3) of Chapter 32, Title 22, Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read:

"(3) As an Architect:

- (A) Education, Experience and Examination A graduate of an NAAB accredited program from a school of architecture approved by the Board as being of satisfactory standing and with at least three (3) years of progressive experience satisfactory to the Board in architectural work covering the major categories of architectural practice, at least two (2) years of which *shall* have been under the supervision of a registered architect, <u>and having completed the Intern Development Program (IDP)</u>, *shall* be eligible for a current form of examination as prescribed in the rules and regulations. Upon passing such examination, the applicant *shall* be granted a certificate of registration to practice architecture in Guam, if the applicant is otherwise qualified.
 - (i) Effective June 1, 2009, a new or inactive candidate applying to the Board for eligibility evaluation for an applicant to the Architect Registration Examination (ARE) *shall*, prior to registration or licensure exam eligibility, complete the Intern Development Program (IDP) of the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards (NCARB), as defined herein and in the rules and regulations set forth, and the most recent or current form of IDP guidelines prepared and prescribed by the NCARB. The IDP requirement does not apply to a candidate who:
 - (aa) was determined by the Board to be eligible on or before May 31, 2009 and who is active in the examination process; or

(bb) has completed all the necessary education equivalents prior to June 1, 2009, who has submitted a completed application for eligibility evaluation to the Board that is postmarked on or before May 31, 2009, and who has been determined by the Board to be eligible.

- (ii) An applicant shall obtain IDP certification upon completion of the Intern Development Program and shall submit such certificate with application form new or inactive candidate *shall* submit an application form, as prescribed and furnished by the Board, and accompanied by such supporting documents required herein. Such supporting documents *shall* include the candidate's current and valid IDP file transmitted by NCARB.
- (iii) As an applicant eandidate acquires additional work experience as required by the Board, it is the applicant's eandidate's responsibility to ensure that his/her employer(s) complete Employment Verification Forms covering the additional work experience gained with that employer and that the forms are submitted to the Board. Reporting *shall* be as per most current NCARB policies and procedures.
- (iv) Completion of the IDP *shall* fulfill the lawful experience requirement provided in this Chapter, and in the rules and regulations.
- (B) Experience and Examination An applicant having eight (8) years of architectural training or educational experience satisfactory to the Board, of which a minimum of three (3) years *shall* be experience covering the major categories of architectural practice under the supervision of a registered architect, and having completed the Intern Development Program. *shall* be eligible for a current form of examination as prescribed in the rules

2	granted a certificate of registration to practice architecture on Guam, if the

b. Page 7, line 3: Creditable experience towards the required four (4) years stipulated by this Subsection may be completed at any point, prior to or after, the applicant passing....change passing to passes the Fundamentals of Land Surveying Examination.

To Address Creditable Professional Experience

Re: Bill No. 62-33(LS)

Hafa Adai Senator Respicio and Ada:

I wish to testify in support of Bill No. 62-33. The PEALS Board (Professional Engineer Architects and Land Surveyors Board) has for the past several years consistently denied eligibility of applicants wanting to sit for the Professional Engineer Examination based on their interpretation of the PEALS Law. Section 32113 of 22 GCA, Chapter 32 was referenced to support the PEALS decision. Without any change to the current law, the PEALS Board also intends to apply this interpretation to applications from Survey Interns wanting to sit for the Professional Land Surveyor Examination.

PEALS Board decisions for not qualifying certain applicants for the PE Examination was reasoned to be insufficient engineering experience "after" successfully passing the Fundamentals of Engineering (FE) examination. What I believe had influenced the Board's interpretation of creditable experience seems be the expression "an additional" preceding "four (4) YEARS or more of progressive experience..." in Section 32113. In other words, the PEALS Board currently recognizes as "creditable" only the experience [a minimum of four (4)) obtained after a candidate successfully passes the FE examination. In my opinion as well as those of most of my peers, the referenced Section does not specifically state a time at which the additional four (4) years of required engineering experience is to be considered creditable as is defined by the Guam PEALS Board in obtaining licensure. In fact, Section VII of the "rules and regulations" defines experience during evaluation as "only work of an engineering nature which following graduation is creditable." Therefore, engineering experience gained prior to the applicant receiving an Engineer Intern certificate must be considered. Nevertheless, the PEALS Board seems to have qualified that creditable experience can only be obtained after a candidate successfully passes the FE Examination.

We believe Section 32113 of 22 GCA, Chapter 32 has been misinterpreted. It is my understanding that the steps prior to being accepted to sit for the professional engineering examination are not sequential after receiving a Bachelors of Science in Civil Engineering from

an ABET (Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology) accredited institution. The PEALS law is also inconsistent with regard to engineering experience considered for those applicants graduating from a Non-ABET accredited institution. In fact, ironically, the same applicant would qualify to sit for the PE Examination if he or she graduated from a Non-ABET accredited institution instead of an ABET accredited institution.

Apparently, the Board intends to apply this reasoning when reviewing applications for the PLS Examination as well, although the wording under Paragraph (5) (A) for Land Surveyor is different.

The impact of this interpretation unfairly prolongs the ability of an Engineer Intern or a Survey Intern to pursue professional licensure in complete disregard for actual work experience prior to taking and passing the Fundamentals examination.

I understand that the Guam PEAL's Law and Rules were created to emulate the NCEES Model Laws and Model Rules. In fact, Guam is a member of the NCEES organization. NCEES does not state that creditable experience shall be accrued only after successful completion of the Fundamentals examination. In fact, we know of no other jurisdiction within the United States and Territories that determines creditable PE and PLS experience as does the Guam PEALS Board.

The PEALS Board has admitted to the inconsistencies of the PEALs Law and has collaborated with your (Senator Ada's) staff in drafting this legislation.

I urge the Legislature to pass this bill as soon as possible as it currently affects numerous Engineer and Surveyor Intern applicants.





Senator Tom Ada Introduces Bill to Change Experience Requirements for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors

Hagåtña, Guam: On Monday, March 30, 2015, Senator Tom Ada introduced Bill 62-33 (LS), an act to change experience requirements for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors.

Guam law currently requires four years of professional experience before an individual may be eligible to take the Professional Engineer (PE) examination. This prerequisite follows standards established by the National Council of Examiners for Engineering and Sciences (NCEES).

However, the Guam Board of Professional Engineers, Architects and Land Surveyors (PEALS Board), which oversees administration of the examination, finds that the wording of local law requires that these four years of creditable experience begin only after an individual has taken and passed the Fundamentals of Engineering (FE) examination.

"Ideally, an individual would take the Fundamentals of Engineering examination immediately upon graduating from college, and then, after a few years of experience, go on to take the Professional Engineer examination. However, there may be circumstances when this is not possible because the individual is fully engaged as a junior engineer, and they would begin accruing their professional experience prior to taking the FE exam", Senator Ada said.

Guam law currently contradicts the standards established by NCEES, which does not require passage of the FE examination before one begins accruing the mandated four years of experience. "Unfortunately, the wording of current law has, to date, prevented otherwise qualified and deserving individuals from completing their professional credentialing requirements to become a registered Professional Engineer in a timely manner," said Senator Tom Ada.

Bill 62-33 amends local law to match standards established by NCEES, by clarifying that the four years of required experience may begin accruing at any point in a candidates engineering career prior to taking the PE examination. "The intent of the law has always been to match national standards," said Senator Tom Ada, "and the PEALS Board is supportive of this change." He continued, "by updating the wording of the law to eliminate any points of confusion, Bill 62-33 allows the PEALS Board to better administer the Professional Engineers examination and to meet the standards set by NCEES." The Guam PEALS Board is a member of NCEES.

Bill 62-33 also amends local law related to the experience requirement for taking the Professional Land Surveyors examination. While this requirement has not been yet been challenged, Bill 62-33 anticipates the potential for similar issues within this section of law, and proactively amends it to clearly match the standards set forth by NCEES.

Lastly, Guam law requires applicants to pass the Intern Development Program (IDP) of the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards before becoming a Professional Architect. Because the IDP process has been updated on the national level, the Guam PEALS Board has requested that Bill 62-33 incorporate corresponding updates in Guam law. These minor amendments were included in the legislation.
