COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

Bill No. <u>73-33</u> (COR) was introduced on April 07, 2015, by Senator Tommy A. Morrison, and was subsequently referred by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Guam US Military Relocation, Public Safety and Judiciary on April 07, 2015.

The Committee on Guam US Military Relocation, Public Safety and Judiciary convened a public hearing on Bill No. <u>73-33</u> (COR) on Monday, May 04, 2015 at 9:00AM in I *Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room.

Public Notice Requirements

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via e-mail to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on Friday, April 24, 2015 (5-Day Notice), and again on Wednesday, April 29, 2015 (48-Hour Notice). Notices were also published in the Marianas Variety Newspaper on Tuesday, April 28, 2015.

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 9:00 AM.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

Chairman Aguon:

Good morning ladies and gentlemen this public hearing sponsored by The Committee on the Guam U.S Military Relocation, Public Safety and Judiciary is now hereby convened. On the agenda on Monday, May fourth (May 4th) at zero nine hundred (9:00AM), we have three proposed measures. One is Bill number seventy-nine dash thirty-three COR (Bill No.79-33 COR), which is relative to creating a category of privilege communications between victim and victim advocates. We have Bill number seven seven dash three three (Bill No.77-33 COR) relative to the use of funds deposited into the prison industries revolving fund sponsored by Senator Espaldon, Speaker WonPat, and Senator Blas, and

Chairman Aguon:

just going back to Bill number seventy nine (Bill No.79-33 COR) that was sponsored by Vice Speaker BJ Cruz. A third item on the agenda is Bill number seventy-three dash thirty three (Bill No. 73-33), which is relative to strengthening public safety efforts through the integration of surveillance cameras within Guam Emergency. For information of the public in compliance with the open government law initial notification was forwarded to the stakeholders as well as to our partners in the media on the twenty fourth of April and with a print in one of our print publications, Marianas Variety on Thursday April twenty third highlighting the three proposed measures that will be discussed this morning, as well as the Oversight Hearing for the Guam Police Department this afternoon at two PM (2:00PM). Also a subsequent second notice was forwarded and distributed to all the stakeholders inclusive again of our media partners on the twenty ninth of April, and the print once again was forwarded with the adjusted timeline or changed date. Originally this public hearing was scheduled to be held on Friday last week but because of session and legislative activities we were able to move it forward to today's date. So with the changed date inclusive, the print media on the Marianas Variety was printed on Tuesday April twenty eighth. Aside from that, I would like to go ahead and recognize my colleagues who joined us here this morning. Senator Espaldon, thank you very much for joining us. Senator Tony Ada, thank you senator, and I believe we are expecting a couple of other senators to join us. Ladies and gentlemen, we are going to proceed to the next item on the agenda which is Bill No. 73-33 (COR) and it is an act to strengthening public safety efforts through the integration of surveillance cameras with Guam Emergency reporting systems. If I can invite Chief Joey San Nicolas, you can join us up front and before we proceed with your testimony, I would like to ask Senator Morrison, the primary sponsor of the legislation to provide his comments.

Senator Morrison:

Thank you Mr. Chairman, and also committee members for scheduling this public hearing and also I want to thank you Mr. Chairman ahh., for also ahh., co-sponsoring this Key Legislation and also ahh., Senator Frank Blas Jr. for ahh.. our first homeland advisor for also taking part of co-sponsoring this legislation. Bill 73 was introduce to strengthen public safety efforts by integrating the use of video surveillance cameras within the Guam's E-911 system. Bill 73 recognizes the urgency of integrating video surveillance cameras as a smart and efficient approach to deterring, reporting, and responding to crime, medical and other emergencies. Video surveillance cameras has a strong proven track record. Mr. Chair I'll share some national examples.. Chicago, camera's used as a very effective tool in fight against gangs, guns and drugs, while narcotic related calls declined by 76%, at the same time, narcotic related arrest declined 3.3% on beats where Police Observation Devices cameras were located, but increased 151% on the beats immediately surrounding the Pod beats. In Sacramento the technology helped the California Highway Patrol to recover 1,524 stolen vehicles statewide in 2014 and led to 194 arrests video recordings are becoming a key investigative tool, led to arrest following fatal shootings, robberies at local retail stores, etc. Installation of video monitoring systems on light rail trains and stations have also led arrest following various criminal activity. Some local examples, the Young Pagat Market robbery, The Tumon Condo man caught on camera trespassing, Bank of Guam Yigo robbery, Simon Sanchez highshool Break in, Anigua Mobil Gas Station robbery that's just some of the examples Mr. Chair what this tool has.. what it is able to do on our, our law enforcement.. while GFD will maintain full authority over the E-911 fund, one of the main objectives of Bill 73-33 will be to obtain buy-in from GPD, Mayor's, Mayor's council of Guam, GVB, Homeland Security, and other public organizations.

Senator Morrison:

Bill 73-33 provides us with an opportunity to share resources, manpower, training, collaboration, perhaps GPD's reserve officers and Cape volunteers, with the proper training can also be the primary part of this overall approach to integrating video surveillance cameras within Guam's emergency reporting system. Bill 73 also creates an opportunity to partner with DOE in the use of school surveillance cameras for the benefit of our school children, teachers, staff and the villages they call their second home. Public Lot 32-09 provide a funding for the procurement of security cameras for all public schools that provide a win win for DOE law enforcement and the villages and also to put credit for the partnership between the neighborhood watch programs, GPD, and DOE. Thank you Mr. Chair I look forward to a public testimony and ahh... to ahh... strengthen the legislation.

Chairman Aguon:

Thank you very much Senator Morrison as the primary sponsor of the legislation. Just for the information of the members of the Legislature we do have written testimony from the Chief of Police. Chief San Nicolas, if you can go ahead and proceed.

Chief San Nicolas:

Hafa Adai and good morning, Senator Aguon and members of the 33rd Guam Legislature. I'm happy to be here to support Bill number seventy-three dash thirty three(Bill No. 73-33), and like the speaker prior to me, Senator Morrison eloquently pretty much said everything that needs to be said but just to pre-empt my testimony, I just want to make it clear that I believe that the primary purpose of this bill for us is to give us the authority to utilize these types of cameras in the execution of our mandates for public safety. On the Guam Fire side it is to provide information to the emergency responders as they respond in real time if we do get access to these cameras; and on the Law Enforcement side, to also provide real time information in the enforcement of laws in public settings. So I'll go ahead and read my testimony.

Chairman Aguon:

Thank you very much Chief San Nicolas, and certainly from the chair, I understand the need for you to continue to preserve the fund and ensure that the 911 system is improved over the course of upcoming years so I appreciate the ongoing efforts in regards to that. Any questions or comments? Senator Morrison?

Senator Morrison:

Thank you Mr. Chair and thank you Chief San Nicolas for your testimony. I also want to note, I know that it was stated earlier by the Chairman that GPD also provided testimony and it's actually consistent with your request, so that's duly noted, we'll certainly work with the committee to make these necessary changes. I also want to point to some of the discussions that were also made that we are the process of, I think you also mentioned that, we're very close to enhancing our 911 system. One of the questions that was brought up was "Does this also involve the di-network or to ensure that we can have that ability to tap these cameras if necessary?" So I know it's a new system but I'm sure the technology, given that this legislation is only providing for authorization, that we'll have the capabilities by integrating these cameras.

Yes, Senator, thank you for that question. Yes, in the specifications we have for the E-911 system, it does allow for upgrades and improvements as needed and with the current technology, I think it will be very simple to gain access to any type of surveillance cameras or security cameras, especially the cameras that are coming out nowadays, where they take advantage of IP addresses. I know on home security cameras, you could easily access it with your cell phone or smart phone, and I have real time video footage of what's going on at home. So I think the same technology, and probably even better, will be used for public cameras.

Chairman Aguon:

Thank you Senator Morrison. Senator Tony Ada?

Senator Ada:

Thank you, Mr. Chair. Chief, where are we at currently with the 911 system? Are we able to actually integrate this type of security camera with the current system?

Chief San Nicolas:

I absolutely that this question was probably going to come up. The 911 procurement is everything that Guam Fire Department can do, is complete. It's been forwarded to the signature route and is currently sitting at BBMR just finalizing the amount and the cost of the system and what we can afford to use for an annual basis to support this system. Again, like I was saying earlier, yes, the system today, I would have to get back to whether it can access these cameras. Given that we do have access to internet at the current system, I believe it will, it can, and if not, it would be as simple as putting a couple more monitors and setting up a hotline or an internet wire, internet access. But the new system definitely, I think we're very close to getting to GSA so that we can start the procurement process and once that happens, I'll definitely announce it. It will be a proud moment for GFD.

Senator Ada:

So would there be any additional costs or that's already integrated into the system and that's all you do, it's a plug and play type system?

Chief San Nicolas:

I believe we've covered, as far as total cost, we're talking about roughly 300,000-400,000 a year in the equipment lease and maintenance, and automatic basic upgrades if had to. So if it's not capable at this time, we do have a provision in there to allow it to be upgraded to that.

Senator Ada:

Thank you, Chief. I appreciate it. Thank you, Mr. Chair.

Chairman Aguon:

Thank you, Senator Tony Ada. Vice-Chair Tom Ada?

Vice-Chairman Ada:

Thank you, Chief San Nicolas. I'm certainly happy to hear that you're slowly making progress in getting the upgraded system in. Does that system have the capability to receive text, 911 text messages?

Chief San Nicolas:

Yes, the new system, yes. Basically without trying to select a vendor or so, we're definitely chasing a next generation E911 system, which has all those capabilities.

Vice-Chairman Ada:

So this new system that you're putting in, will not have the capabilities to receive 911 text messages?

Chief San Nicolas:

Yes, it will, the new system, yes.

Vice-Chairman Ada:

It will?

Chief San Nicolas:

Yes.

Vice-Chairman Ada:

I mean, it's not going to be something that we have to turn around and then put out another bid to upgrade it?

Chief San Nicolas:

No. We specifically stated in the specification that it must be able to receive text. Yes.

Vice-Chairman Ada:

Now, I'm not sure I understand. I guess with the bill here is to give you the authority to go out and procure cameras to be able to provide surveillance in certain areas. Is that the way you understand the bill?

Chief San Nicolas:

Well, I believe the way that the bill is written, I believe that is what is literally stated in the bill, but I like to focus more on the authority of getting these cameras and access to it. I believe there is a follow up rider bill that was also introduced that kind of addresses exactly what you're talking about, where we're developing private-public partnerships and allowing private organizations to purchase a camera and then allow us to get access to it if it's facing a public setting.

Vice-Chairman Ada:

The way I read this, it's going to give GFD the authority to use 911 funds. The way I read this, is that it's going to give GFD the authority to use 911 funds, to go an procure cameras, surveillance cameras.

Chief San Nicolas:

Right, to expend a portion of the funds if needed, yes.

Vice-Chairman Ada:

Right. Do you really think you have that extra amount of funds available?

Chief San Nicolas:

At this point, my focus is on the E911 system right now and after that dust settles, we can address whether we can afford to get cameras that we believe are best used in certain areas. If not, we've always talked about re-visiting the dollar surcharge. But like I've stated many times, at this table, I'd like to see us first maximize the current dollars that we're using, make sure that we're using everything before we start talking about getting more.

Vice-Chairman Ada:

I want to commend you for your artful way of saying "thank you, but no thank you" because right now, we really need to focus on that 911 system and the way it was designed to allow the expenditure of funds for surveillance cameras kind of detracts from that focus of which limited 911 dollars are available to support, even the fundamental mission of 911 and its requirements, so I want to commend you for your artful way of saying "thank you, but no thank you".

Chief San Nicolas:

Thank you, Senator.

Chairman Aguon:

Thank you, Senator Ada. Senator Mary Torres?

Senator Mary Torres:

Thank you, Chief San Nicolas. I was thinking along the lines of my good Senator Ada. I'm just looking at your testimony and there are three things that struck me as we are looking at this. One is your emphasis on protecting the E911 fund to ensure that it is appropriately used for its intended purpose. And you also, within the same paragraph, talked about the communications center and the progress that you're making towards realizing a new communication center for the E911 system and the radio system and the broadband network as well. You end the paragraph, second to the last, with stating that any alteration to this course will set back years of hard work, and I think you are alluding to the control of the fund, but do you believe that incorporating surveillance component into the E911 system right now, as contemplated, and getting it up to speed, is going to throw you back? The progress of realizing the communication center? Do you think that this is a throwback to that progress?

Not specifically, Senator. That's a very good point. That's kind of why I opened up my testimony to try to set a baseline of what I was trying to say. A lot of times when we read this testimonies over and over again, we start to come up with different thoughts of what was being said. But, I think that with my focus, and Senator Ada brought it up earlier, with my focus on getting this 911 system upgraded, it will not derail, I will not allow it to derail it. But, I think that it's very important that the authority to use these surveillance cameras is explicitly stated somehow, someway, so that when the opportunity does come up and it becomes truly necessary to get it up and going, this will be once obstacle that is removed. Again, I don't think it will really detract that much, but I am concerned about allowing other, without trying to offend my fellow peers or others, I'm concerned that having too many people having authority over the fund is going to cause problems and it has. This is not the first try to get other people into the fund. We've been very successful in protecting it and making sure that it's to the original intent and that's what I'm trying to say.

Senator Mary Torres:

Thank you and I think also many member in the community, 911 is critical. They want to know that 911 is up and that when they dial those three numbers, it's going to work for them and help is on the way. So that's the concern that is at the foremost of my thoughts this morning.

Chief San Nicolas:

I appreciate that, Senator.

Senator Mary Torres:

Thank you.

Chairman Aguon:

Thank you, Senator Torres. Senator Espaldon?

Senator Espaldon:

Thank you, Mr. Chair. Good morning, Chief.

Chief San Nicolas:

Morning.

Senator Espaldon:

You mentioned a price tag of about 300,000-400,000 for equipment lease and maintenance of these cameras. And again, I know that was kind of a ball park figure, that you threw out, that maybe a vendor threw out to you, but within that cost or that estimate, how many cameras are we talking about?

Chief San Nicolas:

I would have to get back to you on that, I never really took the time to get into the costs of cameras as this bill was brought up, we had a few other things happening. But, I will get back to you on that, on the cost of cameras, but my understanding at this point is a professional, high-end camera for public use, all weather cameras, run around, for the entire system, about 2,500-5,000, I believe. I know the home security cameras cost around 250 for two cameras, hooked up, and this is bought of course on

base, but outside, it's probably just a little higher, but those are more low-end for home use, but as far as commercial cameras that need to withstand all kinds of weather, it probably costs upwards of that amount.

Senator Espaldon:

Okay and again, I know you're looking for the authorization that when the time does come, that at least this will be in place. There are concerns again, as stated by my colleagues earlier, however, within that costs of 300,000-400,000 dollars, does that include the costs of an outside vendor, to be the ones monitoring the camera system, or would it be an in-house job.

Chief San Nicolas:

Okay, for our sake, when we get access to these cameras, we won't be monitoring it, per se, on a 24-hour basis, that's not we do in the fire service. That's where it turns into more of a surveillance type of thing, that's a law enforcement aspect, which I would leave to GPD to answer that question. For us, it's when we need it we'd be able to access it for the purpose of gaining information to provide for the scene size up and extra safety measures for our responders. As an example, what we have today, or what could be happening today, is that DPW has a project with traffic light cameras, and we are in discussion with them to gain access to those cameras, as needed, and really, all that requires, is an IP address. And with our personnel, our 911 dispatchers in front of a computer, able to pull up an IP address and take a look at real time, what's happening, for instance, a traffic accident, we can already give a lot of information to our first responders before they even get there, that can actually happen already with our current system and again it's just an IP address.

Senator Espaldon:

And that leads to the point of your recommendation, where we strike out the clause "in collaboration with GPD and other public safety agencies" and basically that's as to the use of the funds for the camera project. It seems to me that, and correct me, please Chief, if I'm wrong, the Guam Fire Department, really has no necessity in its core mission to have any kind of surveillance out there. This is more of a GPD function, isn't it?

Chief San Nicolas:

Correct, and that's why I referred to, I tried not to use the word surveillance. Surveillance is a law enforcement term, absolutely. For us, it's just more of an advantage point. Having eyes on the scene, before we even get there, is critical to any type of emergency, life-saving, critical mission. It's basically, in a military sense, providing intelligence for us, before we send our guys in there. I think it's very important to have access to these cameras if it's available and the authority to do so.

Senator Espaldon:

Right, it just seems to me, though, that if, and again I'm not really sure how this works. I mean, the intent, I understand it, and I can applied the author on that and looking forward to how other jurisdictions use it and how camera surveillance systems have been instrumental in helping the cause of GPD and identifying after the fact, who may have been involved, what the facts of the incidents that happened were and things like that, but this is not really specifically a Guam Fire Department issue going forward. I think the only issue is, because you man the 911 system, and that's the reason why it's given to Guam Fire Department, or at least most of the responsibility for the surveillance cameras. Is that an accurate statement or am I off-base?

I'm not sure I'm reading it as the responsibility of these cameras, I think it's just giving us access to it.

Senator Espaldon:

Right, but the funding will be, I mean, you're recommending that we strike out Guam Police Department and other public safety agencies, so bottom line, you will have full, GFD would have the full authority to implement it, without anybody else input.

Chief San Nicolas:

As it is today but collaboration should include them, may include them.

Senator Espaldon:

It should include them but your recommendation, you're asking us to delete the word "shall" and replace it with the word "may" so they're in other words, it's not mandatory that they be in there. It'll be to the call of Guam Fire Department, I would imagine.

Chief San Nicolas:

You know, my concern really is, if you want to get the core of my concern, is the portion of the funds. What I want to prevent is over 26-some mayors, GPD, DPW, Guam Visitors Bureau, all these different agencies, giving me a list of cameras and saying "fund it." And I'm going to be the bad guy and I'm going to turn around and say, either one, we can't afford it or two, somebody's more important than you. I'll hold GPD more important over, I won't even say. But the thing is, we're a common sense people, we know what our mission is, we know what's important, and trust me, like I've done in many of my projects, I've always collaborated with all stakeholders and, of course, with approval from the administration, in the best interest of the public and the community, so I will work with these people. I just need to make sure that the fund is protected in a way so that we continue with our projects going forward, that this body has held me to on many occasions.

Senator Espaldon:

Okay, I appreciate that and I am glad. I did want to hear your real concern in going forward and again, as was expressed by my colleagues up here, the protection of the funds for the core mission of 911 because then we would have to then ask, once what, and that's why I asked how much it would cost. Another senator asked that, 300,000-500,000, and that's only for a pilot project, we're not even talking total coverage, and you're right. If all these other agencies are involved, and you're the guy who's going to make that decision of where the cameras going to be placed, really, it doesn't address the core function of your mission as the Guam Fire Department, then you're put on the hot seat for nothing. I have concerns about that as well. That's all the questions I have now, Mr. Chairman, thank you.

Chairman Aguon:

Thank you very much, Senator Espaldon. And Senators, thank you for your line of questions. Chief San Nicolas, thank you for presenting testimony this morning.

Chief San Nicolas:

Thank you.

This concludes the discussion on the agenda for this morning. Just for the information of the public, we will recess until 2 P.M. this afternoon, where the committee will be conducting an oversight hearing on the Guam Police Department. The Guam Fire Department (GFD), in collaboration with the Guam Police Department (GPD) and other public safety agencies, is authorized to expend a portion of Fund proceeds as provided in § 12304 of this Article to procure surveillance video security cameras as part of Guam's emergency reporting system. Moreover, GFD and the Guam Police Department (GPD) shall, with the assistance of everdinate with other government entities and pertinent organizations, to develop an pilot program Implementation Plan relative to the use integrating of video security surveillance cameras in public areas. Organizations Entities shall include, but not be limited to, the Office of the Attorney General, the Mayors2 Council of Guam, Guam Homeland Security -Office of Civil Defense, the Department of Public Works, the Department of Parks and Recreation, the Guam Power Authority, and the Guam Visitors Bureau. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, no monies in the Fund shall be expended without appropriation by I Liheslatura. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, no monies in the Fund shall be expended for purposes other than provided for in this Section, without the expressed approval of Liheslatura. The Fund is exempt from any transfer authority.

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(b) Rules and Regulations. No later than One Hundred and Eighty (180) days following the enactment of this Act, GFD, GPD, and the Attorney General shall develop the rules and regulations, pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Law, governing the use of video security cameras in public areas. Such rules and regulations shall guide the government of Guam's implementation

I and use of video security cameras within its emergency reporting system, and shall 2 further address basic elements involved with the integration of video security 3 cameras in public areas including, but not limited to, access to recorded video security camera footage by other government of Guam entities, including any 4 5 video security footage recorded and maintained by the Guam Department of 6 Education as a result of electronic security systems implemented pursuant to P.L. 7 32-009; training requirements for operators with access to public video security 8 cameras; and, the issuance of public notices for the benefit of residents and 9 business owners within the general vicinity where video security cameras are 10 posted that state, in clear language, that such location is subject to observation and, 11 if applicable, recording, by a video security camera. Posted signs shall be installed 12 no less than seven (7) days following the activation of video security cameras, and 13 shall be in clear language, large type, and in a conspicuous location plainly visible 14 to persons present in the areas where the video security cameras are installed. 15 Notices need not, however, disclose the precise location of the cameras.

(c) Video Security Cameras: Compatibility; Registration. All government agencies and other entities, prior to procuring video security cameras and associated equipment, materials, etc. that are to be used to deter and report criminal activity in public areas, *shall* verify if such devices are compatible with the technical requirements of Guam's emergency reporting system which *shall* be determined by GFD and GPD. Both agencies *shall* maintain a registry of all video security cameras used to deter and report criminal activity in public areas in accordance with the rules and regulations required pursuant to § 12314(b) of this Article.

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(d) Protection of Personal Privacy Rights; and, against Misuse and/or Ineffective Use of Video Security Cameras, Footage. To the extent possible, the rules and regulations required pursuant to § 12314(b) of this Article *shall* further

- ensure that yideo security cameras in public areas protect personal privacy rights.
- 2 Moreover, such regulations shall protect against the misuse and/or ineffective use
- 3 of video security cameras and any footage recorded by such devices.
- Resource Sharing. In facilitating the integration of video security 4 5 cameras in public areas, as part of Guam's emergency reporting system, GFD and 6 GPD shall consider the availability of resources that may be made available by 7 other government of Guam entities, the U.S. Military, the federal government, and/or Guam's private-sector community, including funding support, education 8 9 and training opportunities, and sharing of public safety and law enforcement equipment and similar resources, consistent with the rules and regulations as 10 required in § 12314(b) of this Article. Please accept this **Testimony in Support to Bill 73-33 (COR)** contingent on the following recommendations. Bill 73-33 (COR) seeks to amend Section 12304 of Article 3, Chapter 12, Title 12, Guam Code Annotated to authorize the use of the Enhanced 911 Emergency Reporting System Fund (E911 Fund) to procure surveillance cameras as part of Guam's Emergency Reporting System or E911 System.

Bill 73-33 authorizes the Guam Fire Department and the Guam Police Department access to surveillance or security cameras for the purpose of Public Safety which I believe is important. However, the Guam Fire Department is the steward of the E911 Fund and we must protected it to ensure that it is appropriately used for its intended purpose. We have made major progress in updating, upgrading and replacing the current E911 System and have a direction to build a Communications Center that will house the new E911 System, Land Mobile Radio System and Public Safety Broadband Network. Any alteration to this course will set back years of hard work. Therefore it is GFD's request that the following amendments be made:

- 1. Page 2, line 1-3 Strike out "in collaboration with the Guam Police Department (GPD) and other public safety agencies," in its entirety.
- 2. Page 2, Line 6 Strike out "shall" and replace with "may"



Buenas yan Hafa Adai! On behalf of the men and women of the Guam Police Department, I hereby submit this written testimony in support of Bill No. 73-33 - An Act to Strengthen Public Safety Efforts through the Integration of Surveillance Cameras within Guam's Emergency Reporting system, by Amending Section 12304 of Article 3, Chapter 12, Title 12, Guam Code Annotated.

We note within the legislation the provisions of mandating the authorization of the Guam Fire Department (GFD) to expend funds for surveillance cameras while ensuring collaboration between the Guam Fire Department and the Guam Police Department (GPD) and with other public safety agencies to implement the integration of surveillance cameras for emergency purposes.

Although both the GFD and GPD have been separated from the former Department of Public Safety, we have continued to collaborate and coordinate our response to emergency situations. Considering continued collaboration today and for accountability purposes, we suggest modifying the current language of the legislation to specify only that GFD would be accountable and authorized for the expenditure of the 911 Emergency funds to meet the intent of the legislation.

We are confident that GFD, noted within this legislation as responsible for particular expenditures of 911 funds, understands the value of situation awareness with the use of camera technology in areas where unusual emergency events may occur on the island from threats such as vandalism or theft of Government or business assets defined within the context of homeland security critical infrastructures. Security cameras may be used to record activities around fuel pipelines, telecommunication repeater sites, village water tanks, even highway or roadway crashes involving hazmat materials.

In addition, there are some suggestions provided to our department about the degree or level of "surveillance" using cameras and the issues of privacy within the context of the term "surveillance." With this considered, we suggest possibly changing the wording of "surveillance" cameras to "security" cameras. We understand that with any language used about the purpose of the cameras, there may be opposition no matter what terms may be provided within the proposed legislation.

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



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GFD supports bill integrating surveillance cameras with E-911

The Guam Fire Department is supporting legislation aimed at strengthening public safety efforts on Guam, Bill 73 introduced by Senator Tommy Morrison would integrate the use of surveillance cameras within Guam's E-911 system.

Lawmakers however questioned Fire Chief Joey San Nicolas on the status of upgrades to the E-911 system and whether these security cameras can actually be integrated. "Given that we do have access to internet at the current system, I believe it will, it can and if not, it would be a simple as putting up a couple of more monitors and setting up a hotline or internet access, but the new system definitely, I think we're very close to getting to GSA so we can start the procurement process and once that happens I'll definitely announce it and it will be a proud moment for GFD," he said.

San Nicolas says the Bureau of Budget & Management Research is finalizing the amount and cost of the system. He adds parts of the upgrades include building a communication center that would house a new E-911 system, land mobile radio system and public safety broadband network.

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

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News Local News Fire Department Chief Joey San Nicolas yesterday asked senators to allow the department to retain control of funds dedicated to revamping the island's 911 system.

Senators yesterday held a public hearing on Sen. Tommy Morrison's Bill 73-33, which authorizes GFD to buy surveillance cameras as part of the island's 911 system.

According to the bill's text, the law would allow GFD to work with the Guam Police Department to buy the cameras and develop a pilot program with other agencies, including the Office the Attorney General, Mayors' Council of Guam and others.

Morrison, R-Umatac, presented his bill and noted the track record security and surveillance cameras have had combatting crimes in the U.S. mainland and Guam. Morrison referred to law enforcement efforts in Chicago and Sacramento that have targeted gang and drug

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activity and helped recover stolen vehicles.

In Guam, Morrison noted the role surveillance cameras installed at homes, schools and businesses have played in solving robberies and burglaries.

"Bill 73 recognizes the urgency of integrating video surveillance cameras as a smart and efficient approach to deterring, reporting and responding to crime, medical and other emergencies," he said.

During his testimony, San Nicolas told senators that while he supports the bill's intent, he was concerned about giving so many agencies access to the fund.

San Nicolas told senators the Guam Fire Department has a responsibility to ensure that any money that goes into the 911 fund is used for its intended purpose: paying for upgrades and maintenance of the new system.

The department has made "major progress," he said, in upgrading the system and is on course to having the new system in place.

The new system, the chief said, allows for improved abilities to identify a caller's location and allow the 911 system to accept emergency calls via text messages.

"Any alteration to this course will set back years of hard work," he said.

As a result, San Nicolas asked senators to strike portions of the bill that require GFD to work with police and other agencies in acquiring the cameras.

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"What I want to prevent is ... all these agencies giving me a list of cameras and saying 'fund it," he said. "And I'm gonna be the bad guy and i'm gonna turn around and say, one, 'We can't afford it,' or two, 'Someone's more important than you.'

"I just need to make sure that the fund is protected in a way that we continue with our projects going forward," he added.

The chief told senators that even with those amendments, he committed the department to working with "all necessary stakeholders and community members" in all plans.

San Nicolas estimated the new system will cost about \$300,000 to \$400,000 a year to lease and upgrade equipment.


He said the system's specifications allow for upgrades and improvements, such as cameras, "as needed."

"If it's not capable at this time, we do have a provision in there to allow it to be upgraded to that," he said.

The specifications for the new system are currently at the Bureau of Budget Management and Research, San Nicolas said, and costs are being finalized.

"I think we're very close to getting to (the General Services Agency), so that we can start the procurement process," he said.

There's no established date for when the new system will be in place, said Lt. Edward Artero, spokesman for Guam Fire Department. It depends on how the procurement process unfolds, he said.





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
