I. OVERVIEW

Bill No. 79-33 (COR) was introduced on April 20, 2015, by Senator B.J.F Cruz, and was subsequently referred by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Guam U.S. Military Relocation, Public Safety and Judiciary on April 20, 2015.

The Committee on Guam U.S. Military Relocation, Public Safety and Judiciary convened a public hearing on Bill No. 79-33 (COR) on Monday, May 04, 2015 at 9:00AM in I *Liheslatura*'s Public Hearing Room.

Public Notice Requirements

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via e-mail to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on Friday, April 24, 2015 (5-Day Notice), and again on Wednesday, April 29, 2015 (48-Hour Notice). Notices were also published in the Marianas Variety Newspaper on Tuesday, April 28, 2015.

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 9:00 AM.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION**Chairman Aguon:**

Good morning ladies and gentlemen this public hearing sponsored by The Committee on the Guam U.S Military Relocation, Public Safety and Judiciary is now hereby convened. On the agenda on Monday, May 4th at 0900 (9 A.M.), we have three proposed measures. One is Bill No.79-33 (COR), which is relative to creating a category of privilege communications between victim and victim advocates. We have Bill No. 77-33 (COR), relative to the use of funds deposited into the prison industries revolving fund sponsored by Senator Espaldon, Speaker Won Pat, and Senator Blas, and just going back to Bill No.79-33 (COR), that was sponsored by Vice Speaker BJ Cruz. A third item on the agenda is Bill No. 73-33 (COR), which is relative to strengthening public safety efforts through the integration of surveillance cameras within Guam Emergency reporting systems sponsored by Senator Morrison, and Senator Frank Blas, Jr.

Chairman Aguon:

For information of the public in compliance with the open government law initial notification was forwarded to the stakeholders as well as to our partners in the media on the 24th of April and with a print in one of our print publications, Marianas Variety on Thursday April 23rd, highlighting the three proposed measures that will be discussed this morning, as well as the Oversight Hearing for the Guam Police Department this afternoon at 2:00PM. Also a subsequent second notice was forwarded and distributed to all the stakeholders inclusive again of our media partners on the 29th of April, and the print once again was forwarded with the adjusted timeline or changed date. Originally this public hearing was scheduled to be held on Friday last week but because of session and legislative activities we were able to move it forward to today's date. So with the changed date inclusive, the print media on the Marianas Variety was printed on Tuesday April 28th. Aside from that, I would like to go ahead and recognize my colleagues who joined us here this morning. Senator Espaldon, thank you very much for joining us. Senator Tony Ada, thank you senator, and I believe we are expecting a couple of other senators to join us. The first item is Bill No. 79-33 (COR) as was mentioned a little earlier if I can.

Senator Espaldon:

Mr. Chair.

Chairman Aguon:

Yes.

Senator Espaldon:

If I may, call for a temporary recess just that we don't have the bills in front of us at this point so it be possible, just call a recess so we can get the bills. Thank you.

Chairman Aguon:

Please take a recess, I apologize. This public hearing on the proposed measures that was previously discussed is hereby reconvened. Thank you Senator Espaldon for noting that copies were not distributed to the Senators. In light of the agenda we will proceed with Bill No. 79-33 (COR). Just prior to receiving testimony, I just want to highlight that the attorney general, although she does have representatives from her office here, she did communicate with the chair and requested a follow up discussion on this particular matter Bill No. 79-33 (COR), which is an act to *add* a new Chapter 163 to Title 8 of the Guam Code Annotated relative to creating a category of privilege communications of victims and victim advocates sponsored by Vice Speaker BJ Cruz. If I can invite the following individuals please to join us up front, Sister Trinie Pangelinan, Cathy Moylan, Adrianna Rios, and Scot Wade. If I can invite all four of you if you're going to provide testimony, if you're not going to provide testimony then we understand, and I want to thank you for signing in on this measure. Okay then, let me add to the list. Mr. Phil Tydingco from the Attorney General's office, Jackie Cruz, and Pauline Camacho, please, if you can join us up front. I understand Deputy Attorney General, Phil Tydingco, will be representing the Office of the Attorney General. I'd like to also, before I proceed, recognize Senator Mary Torres, thank you very much Senator for joining us this morning. As we discuss Bill No. 79-33 (COR). I would like to read the sponsors transmittal that was just received by the committee this morning. It reads:

I would like to welcome the Vice Chair of the committee, Senator Tom Ada. Thank you, Senator, for joining us this morning. Officer Wade, if you can please identify yourself for the record and you can proceed with your testimony.

Officer Wade:

Good morning Senators, ladies and gentleman, I'm Lieutenant Scott Wade of the Guam Police Department Auxiliary, Services Division. Thank you for the opportunity to testify on behalf of my unit specifically, The Domestic Assault Response Team of the Guam Police Department. We are in support of Bill No. 79-33 (COR). Traditionally, cases are addressed from the law enforcement and prosecution standpoint in which the investigation and successful prosecution is the main focus. The reason we support this bill is it follows the ideal and philosophy of the domestic assault response team, which is victim first. The bill allows the victim to have a say and control the communications between them and the advocates. The victim and advocate relationship is fragile and based on support and trust. To be subpoenaed and compelled to testify on intimate and personal matters shared between the two is difficult and makes the process a bit cumbersome. This bill allows the victim the ability to make decisions around those communications and what can be shared, which will allow the victim to be more open and direct with our advocates, which will allow our advocates to address the needs of our victims more specifically, more directly. The Guam Police Department Domestic Response Team is in support of Bill No. 79-33 (COR).

Chairman Aguon:

Thank you very much officer Wade for joining us this morning and providing testimony on behalf of the department. I'd like to, before I recognize Deputy Attorney General Phil Tydingco, if I can invite Karen Carpenter, please, if you would like to join us up front for testimony. Deputy Attorney General Tydingco, you may proceed with your testimony. Just identify yourself for the record and proceed.

Karen Carpenter:

Volunteer with Victim Advocates Reaching Out, and Erica's House.

Chairman Aguon:

Thank you for joining us this morning.

Phil Tydingco:

Good morning. Buenas, Chairman, Senator Frank Aguon and good morning to all you senators, Senator Torres, Senator Tom Ada, Senator James Espaldon, Senator Tony Ada, and Senator Tommy Morrison. On behalf Attorney General Elizabeth Barrett Anderson, and the Office of the Attorney General, we thank you for this opportunity to provide testimony. If I may, read her written testimony into the record for Bill No. 79-33 (COR).

And for the record my name is Phil Tydingco, Chief Prosecutor for the Prosecutor Division and I also join with the Attorney General and other members and stakeholders in support for the Vice Speaker Cruz's Bill No. 79-33 (COR). It is a needed piece of legislation and privilege we need at law and I think it will contribute immensely to the compendium of laws and services that are evolving in the protection of victims of crime rights. Thank you.

Chairman Aguon:

Thank you very much Chief Prosecutor, and please extend our appreciation to the Attorney General for submitting testimony this morning. Ms. Carpenter.

Karen Carpenter:

Yes. I don't have written testimony but Victim Advocates Reaching Out too is in full support of this bill. We feel it would really be assistance for our victim advocates. Our President Julia Ullao Heath isn't able to be here today because she had a prior commitment, but I am on the board for our advocates.

Karen Carpenter:

As they have said before you know, when you're working with a victim and we're crisis responders so we are there early on and they need to be able to talk it out without fearing that somebody later down the line would say you said this now and you said this later. If you know anything about trauma, victims don't tell their stories in a linear manner. They don't start here and go here, here, here, and they go there and then they're here because they are in that trauma situation. So it's really important for the advocates to be able to listen and assist the victim without the victim being concerned that their words are being thrown back at them later.

Chairman Aguon:

Thank you very much Ms. Carpenter for your testimony this morning. I would also like to welcome to the committee Senator Morrison. Thank you, senator, for joining us this morning. Senators any questions any comments with regards to Bill No. 79-33 (COR). Senator Espaldon?

Senator Espaldon:

Thank you Mr. Chairman. Just a simple question. Aside from the Attorney General's office, and we appreciate your testimony by the way, Ms. Carpenter, thank you for being here. Between GPD (Guam Police Department) and the AG's office (Attorney General's Office) and of course now we have FERA, any other entities out there that might be victim advocate agencies. If there are, can you just kind of spell them out for me please, or whatever you might know. Anybody can answer that question.

Karen Carpenter:

I know that Oasis has some victim advocates. I believe Guma' Mami does. Help me here guys. Sanctuary. Ali Shelter, so there's a variety of them in the community at different agencies that do help the victims.

Senator Espaldon:

I guess the follow up question to that and do you know of any examples where a person acting as a crime victim advocate has revealed confidential or potentially confidential information that would be detrimental to them?

Officer Scott Wade:

There's been some incidence where the victim advocates assigned to the Guam Police Department Victim Assistance Unit have subpoenaed by defense attorneys and compelled to testify on communications between the victim and themselves during the course of the trial.

Senator Espaldon:

Okay. Thank you very much. Thank you Mr. Chairman.

Chairman Aguon:

Thank you very much, Senator Espaldon. Just in line with the question that was just posed. Now with the victim advocates, the way this legislation is written would also cover victim advocates in the other non-profit organizations? Is that correct?

Phil Tydingco:

Yes. The definition of crime victim advocates includes private and public entities so it's fairly broad. It means that a person who is employed or authorized by a public or private entity to provide counseling treatment or other support assistance to crime victims. So that's a fairly broad definition. Although I suppose you could make it broader or narrower depending on what the policy is here, but it seems pretty inclusive to cover both governmental and non-governmental entities or agencies.

Chairman Aguon:

Okay. Thank you very much. Thank you folks for your testimony this morning. Senators, no other questions? Thank you again.

**AN ACT TO *ADD A NEW* CHAPTER 163 TO TITLE 8 OF THE
GUAM CODE ANNOTATED; RELATIVE TO CREATING A
CATEGORY OF PRIVILEGED COMMUNICATIONS
BETWEEN VICTIM AND VICTIM ADVOCATE.**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. A *new* Chapter 163 is *added* to Title 8 of the Guam Code
Annotated to read as follows:

“CHAPTER 163

VICTIM-ADVOCATE PRIVILEGE

§ 163.10. Definition.

§ 163.20. Victim-Advocate Privilege.

§ 163.30. Consultation Between Crime Victim Advocate and Victim;
Privileged Information.

§ 163.40. Severability.

§ 163.10. Definition. As used in this Chapter, *crime victim advocate*
means a person who is employed or authorized by a public or private entity
to provide counseling, treatment or other support assistance to crime victims.

§ 163.20. Victim-Advocate Privilege.

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1 (a) A crime victim has a privilege to refuse to disclose, and to prevent
2 any other person from disclosing, a confidential communication made by the
3 victim to a crime victim advocate or any record made in the course of
4 advising, counseling or assisting the victim. The privilege applies to
5 confidential communications made between the victim and the advocate, and
6 to records of those communications. This privilege *does not* include
7 communications excluded under § 163.30(c).

8 (b) The privilege may be claimed by the following:

9 (1) The victim, or the victim's attorney on behalf of the victim.

10 (2) A guardian or conservator of the victim.

11 (3) The personal representative of a deceased victim.

12 (4) The crime victim advocate, but only on behalf of the victim.

13 The authority of the advocate to claim the privilege is presumed in the
14 absence of evidence to the contrary.

15 **§ 163.30. Consultation Between Crime Victim Advocate and**
16 **Victim; Privileged Information; Exception.**

17 (a) A crime victim advocate *shall not* disclose as a witness or
18 otherwise, any communication made by or with the victim, including any
19 communication made to or in the presence of others, unless the victim
20 consents in writing to the disclosure.

21 (b) Unless the victim consents either verbally or in writing to the
22 disclosure, a crime victim advocate *shall not* disclose records, notes,
23 documents, correspondence, reports or memoranda that contain opinions,
24 theories or other information made while advising, counseling or assisting
25 the victim or that are based on communications made by or with the victim,
26 including communications made to or in the presence of others.

1 (c) The communication is not privileged *if* the crime victim advocate
2 knows that the victim will give or has given perjured testimony or *if* the
3 communication contains exculpatory material.

4 (d) Notwithstanding subsections (a) and (b), with the written or verbal
5 consent of the victim, a crime victim advocate who is employed by the
6 Attorney General's Office may disclose information to the prosecutor

7 (e) *If*, with the written or verbal consent of the victim, the crime
8 victim advocate discloses to the prosecutor or a law enforcement agency any
9 communication between the victim and the advocate, or any records, notes,
10 document, correspondence, reports or memoranda; the prosecutor or law
11 enforcement agent *shall* disclose the material to the defendant's attorney
12 only *if* such information is otherwise exculpatory.

13 (f) Notwithstanding subsections (a) and (b), with the written or verbal
14 consent of the victim, a crime victim advocate may disclose information to
15 other professional and administrative support persons with whom the
16 advocate works for the purpose of assisting the advocate in providing
17 services to the victim.

18 **§ 163.40. Severability.** If any of the provisions of this Chapter, or the
19 application thereof to any person or circumstance, are held invalid, such
20 invalidity *shall not* affect any other provision or application of this Chapter
21 which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to
22 this end the provisions of this Chapter are severable."

23 **Section 2. Enactment.** This Act *shall* become effective upon enactment.

VICTIM-ADVOCATE PRIVILEGE

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Victim; Privileged Information; Exception.

§ 163.40. Severability.

§ 163.10. Definition. As used in this Chapter, *crime victim
advocate* means a person who is employed or authorized by a public or
private entity to provide counseling, treatment, or other support assistance to
crime victims.

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3 to prevent any other person from disclosing, a confidential
4 communication made by the victim to a crime victim advocate, or any
5 record made in the course of advising, counseling or assisting the
6 victim. The privilege applies to confidential communications made
7 between the victim and the advocate, and to records of those
8 communications. This privilege *does not* include communications
9 excluded under § 163.30(c) of this Chapter.

10 (b) The privilege may be claimed by the following:

- 11 (1) the victim, or the victim's attorney on behalf of the
12 victim;
13 (2) a guardian or conservator of the victim;
14 (3) the personal representative of a deceased victim;
15 (4) the crime victim advocate, but only on behalf of
16 the victim. The authority of the advocate to claim the privilege
17 is presumed in the absence of evidence to the contrary.

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19 **Victim; Privileged Information; Exceptions.**

20 (a) A crime victim advocate *shall not* disclose, as a witness
21 or otherwise, any communication made by or with the victim,
22 including any communication made to or in the presence of others,

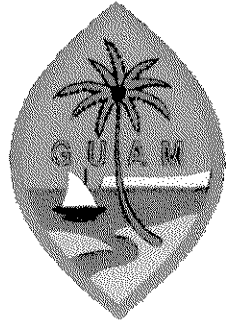

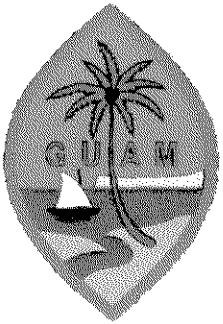

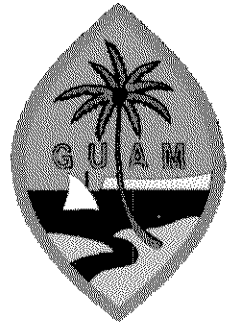

Dear Chairman Aguon:

Håfa Adai! I want to begin by thanking you for holding today's public hearing relative to Bill No. 79-33 (COR), "An act to *add* a new Chapter 163 to Title 8 of the Guam Code Annotated; relative to creating a category of privileged communications between victim and victim advocate." Unfortunately, I could not be here with you today because of a previously scheduled commitment to speak before the Guam Non-profit Congress at the Guam Community College.

In my statement this morning, I would be remiss if I did not also thank Attorney General Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson. Drafted in consultation with her office and introduced at the beginning of National Crime Victims Week, Bill No. 79-33 (COR) recognizes what many other jurisdictions have known for decades: that victims, their counselors, and advocates deserve an environment built on trust protected by the force of law.

Both courts and legislatures have acknowledged the importance of confidentiality in promoting an effective counseling relationship. The U.S. Supreme Court, in *Jaffee v. Redmond*, 518 U.S. 1 (1996) observed that:

"[E]ffective psychotherapy [...] [d]epends upon an atmosphere of confidence and trust in which the patient is willing to make a frank and complete disclosure of facts, emotions, memories, and fears. Because of the sensitive nature of the problems for which individuals consult psychotherapists, disclosure of confidential communications made during counseling sessions may cause embarrassment or disgrace. For this reason, the mere possibility of disclosure may impede development of the confidential relationship necessary for successful treatment."

Likewise, the Illinois Supreme Court noted “if a rape crisis counselor could not guarantee confidentiality to a victim, the effectiveness of rape crisis centers would be undermined.”¹

New Jersey’s semi-absolute victim privilege law specifies the legislature’s intent in enacting a law that states, “Counseling of violence and victims is most successful when the victims are assured their thoughts and feelings will remain confidential and will not be disclosed without their permission [...] Confidentiality should be accorded all victims of violence who require counseling whether or not they are able to afford the services of private psychiatrists or psychologists.”²


Moreover the U.S. Department of Justice’s proposed model legislation contains a findings and purposes section that outlines the need to protect victims’ confidential communications with their counselors:

“This Act recognizes the important role of counseling in the ability of victims to recover from the trauma of the crime and in the achievement of legal safeguards and of the social and economic assistance essential to achieve protection from further criminal assault [...] Without assurances that communications made during the counseling relationship will be confidential and protected from disclosure, victims will be even more reluctant to seek counseling or to confide openly to their counselors and to explore legal and social remedies fully.”³

This bill is intended to prevent further victimization but its protections are not absolute. Specifically, the communication is not privileged if the crime victim advocate knows that the victim will give or has given perjured testimony or if the communication contains exculpatory material.

As such, I hope that the Chairman, his Committee on the Guam U.S. Military Relocation, Public Safety, and Judiciary, and those in attendance today will join me in making this measure better where necessary – allowing it to move to the floor during the next available session.

Hafa Adai Mr. Chair and Members of the Committee:

The Office of the Attorney General stands in full support of Bill 79-33, An Act to create a victim-advocate privilege. This law stems from discussions with community-based victim organizations that provide direct services to victims of crime. It would establish privilege over communications between a crime victim and advocates.

The privilege is intended to give crime victims protection. It fosters trust in the relationship between a crime victim and the advocate. A victim can be assured that what is communicated to an advocate in the course of direct services such as facilitating advice, providing supportive assistance, or direct counseling will remain confidential. This privilege is similar to protections afforded an attorney-client, or a doctor-patient. It belongs to the victim.


The purpose of the privilege over communications between a victim and an advocate is to protect communications from being revealed at any stage of a criminal investigation or judicial proceeding. It is a prohibition enforceable against both law enforcement and defense. There are certain limitations to the protected speech such as where the advocate is informed the victim intends to engage in perjured speech.

Most states have some form of victim-advocate privilege. It is an important tool to build the trust between a victim and the advocate during the trauma of domestic violence, criminal sexual assault, and many other similar traumatic types of crime.

We ask the Committee for its full support of the proposed legislation.
