### **COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST**

### I. OVERVIEW

Bill No. <u>89-33</u> (LS) was introduced on April 27, 2015, by Senator Frank B. Aguon, Jr., and was subsequently referred by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Guam US Military Relocation, Public Safety and Judiciary on April 27, 2015.

The Committee on Guam US Military Relocation, Public Safety and Judiciary convened a public hearing on Bill No. <u>89-33</u> (LS) on Monday, June 8, 2015 at 5:00PM in I *Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room.

### Public Notice Requirements

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via e-mail to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on Thursday, May 28, 2015 (5-Day Notice), and again on Tuesday, June 2, 2015 (48-Hour Notice). Notices were also published in the Marianas Variety Newspaper on Friday, May 29, 2015 and on Wednesday, June 3, 2015.

### II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

### Chairman Aguon:

This public hearing on The Committee on Guam US Military Relocation, Public Safety and Judiciary is hereby convened on Monday June 8th 2015 at 5 P.M. Just for the information for the community the initial notification was disseminated on the 29th of May with regards to this particular public hearing to all the stakeholders. In conjunction with that, it was printed on the 29th also of May, in one of our print media partners. Then subsequent to that the second notice was disseminated on the 3rd of June once again to all our senators, the media and stakeholders, and then printed in on Wednesday June 3rd. So if there is any questions with regards to the open compliance with the open government law please refer your questions directly to members of my staff.

### Chairman Aguon:

The agenda for this evening's public hearing will be on Bill No. 88-33 (LS), which is relative to the compensation of members of the territorial parole board while serving under territorial parole board. Bill No. 89-33 (LS), which is relative to composition of the Guam Parole Board and then our final discussion will be on Bill No. 99-33 (COR), which is relative to establishing a hormone of anti-androgen pilot treatment program for persons convicted of sex crimes sponsored by the good senator to my immediate left, Senator Brant McCreadie, and also cosponsored by Senator Tony Ada.

We will now transition to Bill No. 89-33, which is relative to the composition of the Guam Parole Board, and I will yield to the members of the parole board. Incidentally, just for the information of the public, these two ideas and requests originated from members of the parole board based on the service that they have been providing our island community. So, I'd like to yield to the members as well as to the director in terms of being able to share their perspective as it applies to Bill No. 89-33. So, Mr. Director if you would like to commence.

### **Director San Agustin:**

Mr. Chair and Senator Brant McCreadie thanks again. Before I start, I just want to say, looking at the Bill 89-33,in 2011 based on public law 31-03, the Parole Board was not able to meet for a period of 9 months. 2012, looking at the data provided to me, the Parole Board were not able to meet for 3 months. That's from January, May, and November. In 2013, 6 months, January to May and September, a six month period, the board did not meet for six months total for 2013. In 2014, they did not meet for three months, and in 2015, because we just started, they did not meet for the month of May as it were March. If I may, I just want to read my testimony because that's what I do best is reading.

### Chairman Aguon:

Please proceed.

### **Director San Agustin:**

### [Written Testimony Attached]

In saying this, the intent because I was part of this 31-03, initially the intent is to really raise the bar and have higher standards, higher requirements. We want to have members on the board that can make best decisions based on, again, their education. By evidence of the document here provided, they were not able to meet quorum on many occasions. More so, nine times in 2011,and so on and so on.

### [Continue with Written Testimony]

Therefore in saying this, it did not indicate that we took away the initiative or the capability of what this board can do, but what we did was just remove two positions. One from each of what I indicated, and therefore the higher standards that we expect is still there. So with that said, I support this bill, and I hope the Board members and the Chair will do the same.

### Ms. Taitano:

Thank you again Mr. Chair, Senator McCreadie. So I am here to support Bill 89, and for many of the same reasons that the Director just shared. Again, a little history just for those present, when the initial bill was created to go to seven members, we objected to the number seven. We didn't object to the credentialization of the folks. I think it's a great idea. However, I just made a note back then and I'll make it again today is that the folks that are in these industries are currently in our community doing the work, and they're full time, and they're less likely to come on board as they have not to date to serve in a free capacity and to do service as we are currently doing. So in that, not to take away from the credentializing of the folks to possibly come on board but to also make it less cumbersome because there are people out there who have experience and we want to be able to open it up to them because it is high risk. We've encountered harassments and threats and vandalism and all the things that don't normally go with normal board work. So there is a lot of risk involved and that our own physical safety and the safety of our family members need to be considered. So, it's not easy, it's not an easy board to serve on, but i guess with some of our background we are able to mitigate those risks in our lives. I also just want to share that all here sounds good. I'm in agreement to decrease to five and keeping the credentials. I do just want to make a note sir on page 2, actually 85.10 of the amendment on number (a)(1). Actually number (2), there lacks or professional experience in these areas of study. I would just like to say that in 89, if we can put that, insert that part which is part of (a)(1) into part (a)(2) as the ending part. I thought it was there earlier, but I didn't see this until last week sometime in a review of it. So if we could insert that, that would be better because then it opens again that area of folks who have been in the industry and have the professional experience in these areas. And, otherwise, I just want to say thank you again for allowing the amendments of this bill because we do want to be able to continue to meet, and in the past, we have met with three people sir, and we were able to operate with three board members and make the decisions even though they were hard, but we were able to do that, and just FYI, the state of Nebraska, a little bit more population than Guam, they only have three board members, so just as an FYI. Although they're full time workers in their capacities, but thank you again, and I do support this bill.

### Chairman Aguon:

Thank you very much Ms. Taitano for your testimony this evening. Pastor Van Engen?

### Pastor Van Engen:

Thank you again Senator Aguon, Senator McCreadie. I also support this bill. It's been frustrating. You may remember, I think I told you before that I felt a need to volunteer for this board because I felt bad for the prisoners who have a legal right to have a hearing for their parole, and when I read in the paper and in the PDN that the board could met because of this. This I believe goes a long way to solve that problem. We're all well qualified according to the guidelines that you have here. As our Chair said, that's not the issue. I didn't really realize how valuable my Bachelor's degree in psychology would be all these many years later, but I have other experiences as well toward this effort as you know. So we're just thanking you for doing this. This is solving a problem that, not only do we have as board members serving on the Guam Parole Board, but for those prisoners we do see some who want a second chance and really do work at trying to get themselves right and back on a good track for their lives. So, this is for them too. A little known statistic is that a large portion, a large majority of the people who go to prison get out, and if we don't treat them right

when they're in and if we don't give them the rights and responsibilities that they have that doesn't necessarily create a very good attitude in their part so I think this is going to help that. I'm very much in favor of this bill and thank you for presenting it.

### Chairman Aguon:

Thank you very much Pastor Van Engen. Appreciate your testimony this afternoon. Mayor Wesley?

### Mayor Wesley:

Thank you Mr. Chairman, Senator McCreadie. I agree also with the Director with the professional of people chosen. Also I agree with Pastor and the Chairwoman, but we have to think also beyond the society, the people out there that we need to protect. With this board that we have here, when we have less we can do much, but when we have better tools that we're gonna use is where we get together and use that tools to benefit for our people of Guam. So again Mr. Chair I do support this Bill 89-33, and I hope that the rest of the members also agree with us that we need to reduce down from 7 to 5 and 3 to 4. Thank you very much.

### Chairman Aguon:

Thank you very much Mayor Wesley, and let me just conclude. I know that Senator McCreadie is anxiously anticipating his legislation, but let me just conclude with this final closing statement. I know I started it off with the previous legislation but you know with the nature of the responsibilities that the board has in making that decision ultimately when someone who has lived life of confinement, whether it be one year or five years or ten years, and ultimately making that decision to allow that individual to integrate into the larger community I think that that's always a challenge and a difficult decision for the board members, and in this case it reflects the three of you as well as Mayor Duenas. It's a difficult decision, but I know that all three of you, all four of you, take it seriously. Five members, I apologize. All five of you take it extremely seriously. In terms of ensuring that this individual is ready and willing and able to be a productive citizen in our community. So, for your service I just want to thank you all very much for your continual service, and we look forward to the eventual consideration of these two pieces of legislation before the legislative body. So, thank you for your testimony, and Mr. Director, Si Yu'us Ma'ase. Thank you very much.

### Chairman Aguon:

For the information of the community, the committee will continue to receive on all three pieces of legislation that was entertained this evening, for the next ten days and we will conclude by closing the committee report and report the proposed legislation to the main body of the legislature. With that in mind, I want to thank Senator McCreadie, thank you very much for joining us this evening and too everyone who provided testimony. Thank you very much.

Introduced by:

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AN ACT TO AMEND §§ 85.10 AND 85.14 OF CHAPTER 85, TITLE 9, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED; RELATIVE TO THE COMPOSITION OF THE GUAM PAROLE BOARD.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that Public Law 31-03 increased the size of the Guam Parole Board (Board) to

seven (7) members changing the requirements for four (4) of the Board positions:

two (2) members must have ten (10) years of law enforcement experience or a

degree in criminal justice; and two (2) members must have ten (10) years

experience as a social worker, or a degree in psychology or sociology or a medical

degree. As a result of these restrictive provisions, the Board has encountered

challenges reaching Quorum during regularly scheduled monthly Board meetings.

I Liheslatura further finds that the Board cancelled regularly scheduled monthly meetings due to no Quorum during the following Calendar years:

12 (a) '2011 – nine (9) months from April to December;

(b) '2012 – three (3) months from January, May and November;

(c) '2013 – six (6) months from January to May and September;

(d) '2014 – three (3) months from March, June and July; and

(e) '2015 – one (1) month in March.

It is, therefore, the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to *amend* §§ 85.10 and 85.14 of Chapter 85, Title 9, Guam Code Annotated so the island has a fully functional and effective Territorial Parole Board.

**Section 2.** Territorial Parole Board Created. §§ 85.10 of Chapter 85, Title 9, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby *amended*, to read:

### "§ 85.10. Territorial Parole Board Created.

There is in the Executive Branch of the government of Guam, a Guam Parole Board, hereinafter referred to as the Board, consisting of five (5) seven (7) members appointed by *I Maga 'lahi* [the Governor], by and with the advice and consent of *I Liheslatura* [the Legislature]. Only persons, who by their knowledge and experience are prepared to perform efficiently the duties of the Board as hereinafter provided, *shall* be eligible for such appointment. Any person holding an elected office *shall not* be eligible to serve on the Guam Parole Board. No person who has a family member of the first consanguinity serving a local sentence, or on parole, *shall* be eligible to serve on the Board.

- (a) The composition of the Board members *shall* be comprised of the following minimum background and experience:
- (1) at least one (1) two (2) Board members shall have at least ten (10) years in law enforcement work, or a baccalaureate degree in criminal justice from a college or university accredited by a United States accrediting body recognized by the Council on Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA) or its successor, or an equivalent

foreign university as determined consistent with 17 GCA § 3104 (a)(l), or professional experience in these areas of study;

- (2) at least one (1) two (2) Board members shall have at least a baccalaureate degree or higher from an accredited U.S. institution of higher education in social work, sociology or psychology or a medical degree from a college or university accredited by a United States accrediting body recognized by the Council on Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA) or its successor, or an equivalent foreign university as determined consistent with 17 GCA § 3104 (a)(l); and
- (3) the three (3) remaining Board members shall have at least ten (10) years of experience in human resources development, or legal background or professional experience in these areas of study, or any person of good moral character."

**Section 3. Chairman Appointed: Meetings at Least Monthly.** § 85.14 of Chapter 85, Title 9, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby *amended*, to read:

### "§ 85.14. Chairman Appointed: Meetings at Least Monthly.

The Board *shall* elect a chairman from among its members. The chairman *shall* be elected by its members every two (2) years. The Board *shall* meet regularly at least once a month. Special meetings may be called by the chairman. *Not less than* three (3) four (4) voting members present *shall* constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and the affirmative vote of three (3) four (4) members present *shall* be required to make any action of the Board valid. No action *shall* be taken by the Board at any meetings or hearings, unless a quorum is present. The election for chairman from among its members *shall* follow upon enactment of this Act."

Section 4. Severability. If any provisions of this Code, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect any other provision or application of this Code which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Code are severable.

I am Jose A. San Agustin Director of the Department of Corrections and I am here to provide support for Bill 89-33 (COR), an Act to amend §§85.14 of Chapter 85, Title 9, Guam Code Annotated; Relative to The Composition of the Guam Parole Board.

Public Law 31-63 increased the composition of the Guam Parole Board to seven (7) members changing the requirements for four (4) of the board position: Two (2) members must have ten (10) years of law enforcement experience or a degree in criminal justice. Two (2) members must have ten (10) years experience as a social worker, or a degree in psychology or sociology or a medical degree. As a result of these restrictive requirements, the board has encountered challenges reaching Quorum during regularly scheduled monthly meetings. The lack of Quorum has prevented inmates from the legitimate expectation of the parole process, as well as addressing parole revocations.

In reviewing the proposed amendment it is the intent of the Liheslaturan Guahan to amend §85.10 of Chapter 85, Title 9, Guam code Annotated:

Guam Parole Board, hereinafter referred to as the Board, consisting of five (5) members appointed by the Maga' lahi [ the Governor], by and with the advice and consent of 1 Liheslatura [ the Legislature], The composition of the Board members shall comprise of the following minimum background and experience:

- At least one (1) Board member shall have at least ten (10) years in law enforcement work, or a baccalaureate degree in criminal justice.
- At least one (1) board member shall have at least a baccalaureate degree or higher in social work, sociology or psychology or a medical degree.
- Three (3) board members shall have at least ten (10) years in human resources development or legal background or any person of good moral character.

As difficult as it may be to reach Quorum we must be mindful that higher standards and requirements provide for better results. There for I support this amendment.

# Redress: Fix problems so the Guam Parole Board can meet, function

The Guam Parole Board's failure to meet because of a lack of a quorum must be fixed so the board can do its job.

The board's chairwoman said the lack of a quorum is the result of a law passed in 2011 that increased the size of the board to seven members. The same law also changed the requirements for four of the board positions: two members must have 10 years of law enforcement experience or a degree in criminal justice; and two members must have 10 years experience as a social worker, or a degree in psychology or sociology or a medical degree.

Currently, the board lacks two members with either a medical degree or a degree

in sociology, social work or psychology, according to board Chairwoman MiChelle Taitano.

As a result, 11 cases before the Parole Board won't be heard until the board's next monthly meeting at the end of April.

The lack of a quorum also keeps parole violators on the street. When a paroled inmate violates the terms of his or her release, he or she must go before the board, which determines whether

the person should be returned to prison. If the board can't meet, it means violators remain free.

This isn't a new problem. In 2011, a lack of quorum resulted in a backlog of 90 inmates waiting for parole hearings, and 15 convicts who were on parole and arrested for alleged parole violations were released back into the community because of the Parole Board's inability to officially meet and revoke their parole.

Guam law requires the Parole Board to hold hearings for people who violate their parole within 60 days of the parole violation.

The Parole Board, Gov. Eddie Calvo and senators must not let this happen again. The lack of quorum needs to be rectified immediately. The governor must appoint members to fill the two open slots on the board.

Elected officials also need to re-examine the law that was passed in 2011 and figure out what needs to be changed so the island has a fully functional and effective parole board.
