COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

Bill 92-33 (LS) was introduced on April 29, 2015 by Senator Thomas C. Ada and was subsequently referred on April 30, 2015 to the Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement. The Committee convened a public hearing on May 12, 2015 at 1:30 pm in *I Liheslaturan Guahan* Public Hearing Room.

Public Notice Requirements

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on May 5, 2015 (5-Day Notice) and again on May 8, 2015 (48-Hour Notice).

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 1:30pm.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Chairman Ada: Starts by explaining that bill 92-33 seeks to adjust the boundary of the cemetery and move northward. There are graves that are outside (north) of the cemetery boundary and in the Department of Agriculture property. Senator Ada is amending a previous law, P.L. 32-176, which incorrectly cited the boundary in question to be in the Northwest corner of the cemetery lot. The boundary in question is in fact in the Northeast corner of the cemetery. He then calls on the Administrator of the Veterans' Affairs Office and the Director of Department of Land Management to give their testimonies.

Martin Manglona, Admin. of the Veterans' Affairs Office: Is here today in support of Bill 92-33 which seeks to rectify a boundary issue in the Northeast corner of the Veterans' Cemetery Lot.. Mr. Manglona commented that it is unfortunate that we have graves outside of the Veterans' cemetery boundary and it will be more fitting to relocate the cemetery boundary to include those graves within the Veterans' Cemetery lot.

Chairman Ada: Says there are about 25 graves that are located outside of the cemetery boundary. Calls on the Director of Land Management to give his testimony.

Michael Borja, Dir. Of DLM: Reads his written testimony (please see attached). In summary, the DLM Director stated that 'To appropriately transfer a portion of Lot B-R7 (Masso Reservoir

Conservation area) to Lot B-6 (Veterans' Cemetery), both Lots need to be surveyed, consolidated, then parceled out in a manner that appropriately locates the desired northeast boundaries of the Lot B-6 (Veterans Cemetery)'. DLM recommends the outsourcing of the survey work, but states that an appropriation of \$30,000 would be needed.

Sen. Aguon: Addressed Mr. Borja about what he mentioned in his testimony in regards to surveying Lot B-R7 initially and then carve out that piece.

Dir. Borja: That is the way the surveying works. They have to determine the full measurements of Lot B-R7 and B-6 and then combine them as one property. Then the property is split into two with the added piece to be included into Lot B-6.

Sen. Aguon: Even if it is a small piece of lot.

Dir. Borja: That is what I originally thought of , but after consulting with his Territorial Surveyor it is not possible just to include that small piece of property to Lot B-6.

Sen. Aguon: Explained that the previous legislation highlighted 50 feet as a requirement to be transferred from the Department of Agriculture to the Guam Veterans' Affairs Office. The way Senator Aguon reads it, is that the whole Lot B-R7 would be transferred to Guam Veterans' Affairs Office.

Dir. Borja: Believes the language in the bill leaves it up to the discretion of the chief surveyor to make that determination. If they did sever that piece of lot to be included in the cemetery, then there would have to in the best place possible open up another access route for Lot B-R7. There has to be an access route to avoid Lot B-R7 from being land locked.

Sen. Aguon: Says the requirement for having an access would not be necessary because that is not the portion of sliver being transferred. The intent is to transfer that small sliver that is right near the access road and not necessarily the access road itself.

Dir. Borja: He can do that and determine where the access entrance can be, so they don't have to come and revisit this issue again.

Sen. Aguon: He understands that the Guam Veterans' Office want to honor their fallen soldiers inside the cemetery gates. Senator Aguon also understands the Director Of Land Managements request for 30,000 dollars, but if you have it in the land survey revolving fund then the chairman has the authority of providing you that to utilization of those funds.

Chairman Ada: Deem Bill 92-33 as being publicly heard.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

(1) The Director of the Department of Land Management requests an appropriation of \$30,000 dollars to allow for professional surveying services to be contracted and for the procurement of surveying equipment needed to complete the required tasks stipulated in Bill 92-33, in order to correctly adjust the northeast boundary of the Veterans' Cemetery.

(2) The Director of the Department of Agriculture has expressed a concern that "*a reduction or loss of usage at Masso will result in the reimbursement of USFWS Federal funds.*" The Committee finds that the adjustment of the boundaries will not result in a reduction or loss of usage at Masso.


(3) The Quitclaim Deed for the U.S. Veterans' Memorial Cemetery between the United States Government through the Administrator of General Services and the Territory of Guam specifically states that "*no existing graves will be relocated or otherwise disturbed.*" Bill 92-33 seeks to adjust the boundaries to include all existing graves within the new Guam U.S. Veterans' Memorial Cemetery lot and will thus ensure that the graves are not exposed to any possibility of relocation or disturbance.

The Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Land, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement hereby reports out **Bill 92-33 (LS) As Substituted**, with the recommendation to do pass.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guahan* finds that there are some Veterans' graves outside of the property boundaries of the Guam U.S. Veterans' Memorial Cemetery. The graves are located in the Northwest corner of *Lot Apra Harbor Reservation B-R7* (Lot B-R7), otherwise known as the Masso Reservoir Conservation Area. (See Exhibit A)

I Liheslaturan Guahan further finds that the Guam U.S. Veterans' Memorial Cemetery is located on *Lot Apra Harbor Reservation B-6* (Lot B-6). The Veterans' graves in question are located outside the Northeast corner of Lot B-6.

I Liheslaturan Guahan intends to transfer an area in the Northwest section of Lot B-R7 from the Masso Reservoir Conservation Area, and to consolidate the transferred area into the Northeast section of Lot B-6. Said transfer will then ensure that the Veterans' graves in question are situated are included, with the proper

1 setback, within the new Lot to be owned by the U.S. Veterans' Memorial Cemetery
2 property.

4 **Section 2. Section 2 of P.L. 32-176 is amended to read as follows:**

5 **"Section 2. Property Transfer.** (1) The real property described as fifty
6 (50) feet of boundary into the northwest corner of the Guam U.S. Veterans
7 Memorial Cemetery, Lot Apra Harbor Reservation Area B-R47, owned by the
8 Guam Department of Agriculture, is hereby transferred to the Office of Veterans
9 Affairs, government of Guam, with respect to the boundaries of the Guam
10 Veterans Cemetery.

11 (2) The Director of the Department of Land Management is hereby directed
12 to survey, consolidate and map the transferred Northwest corner portion of Lot B-
13 R7 into the Northeast corner of Lot B-6 so that the Guam U.S. Veterans' Memorial
14 Cemetery and existing gravesites are on one Lot. Said map shall be recorded at the
15 public documents Records Library in the Department of Land Management.

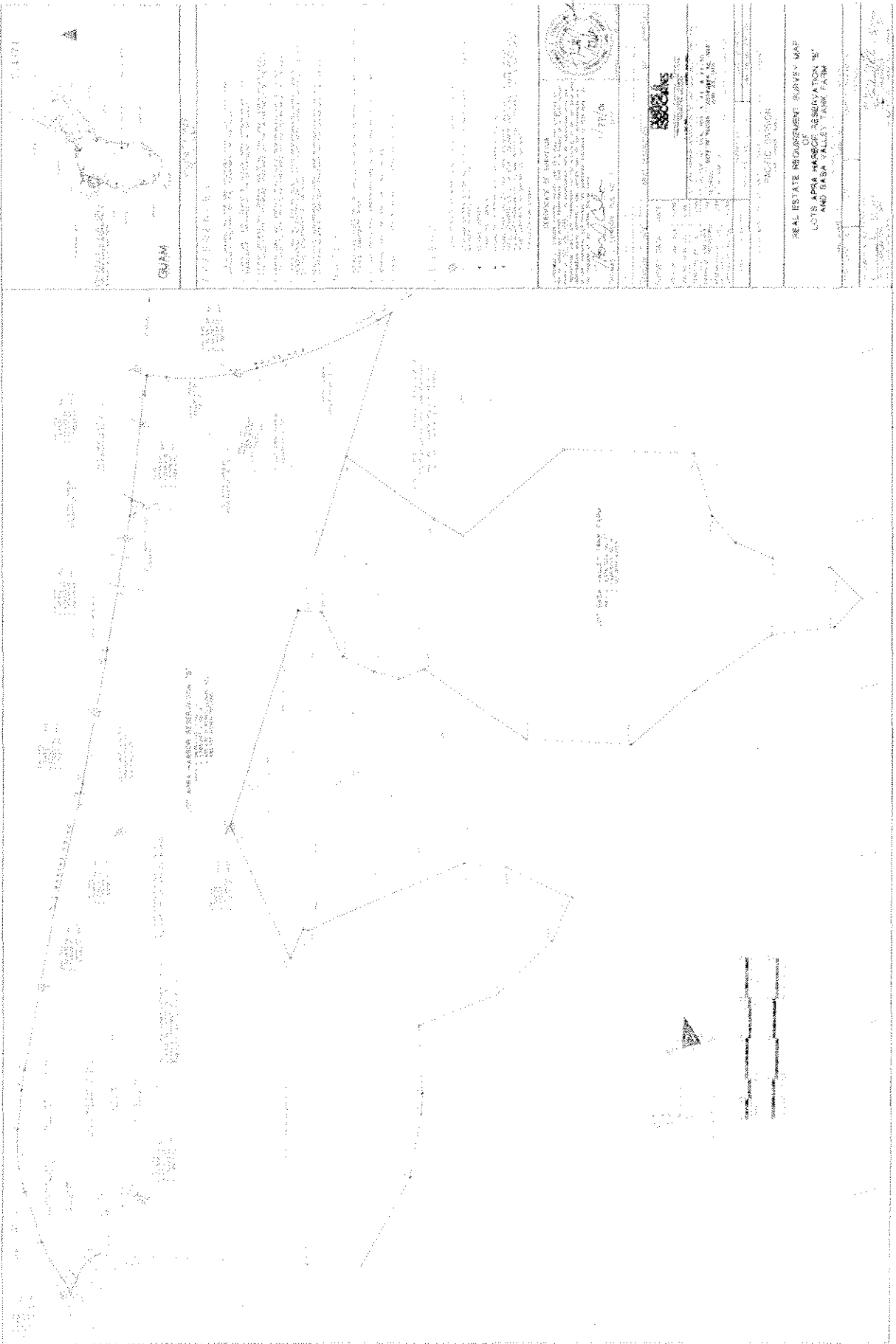

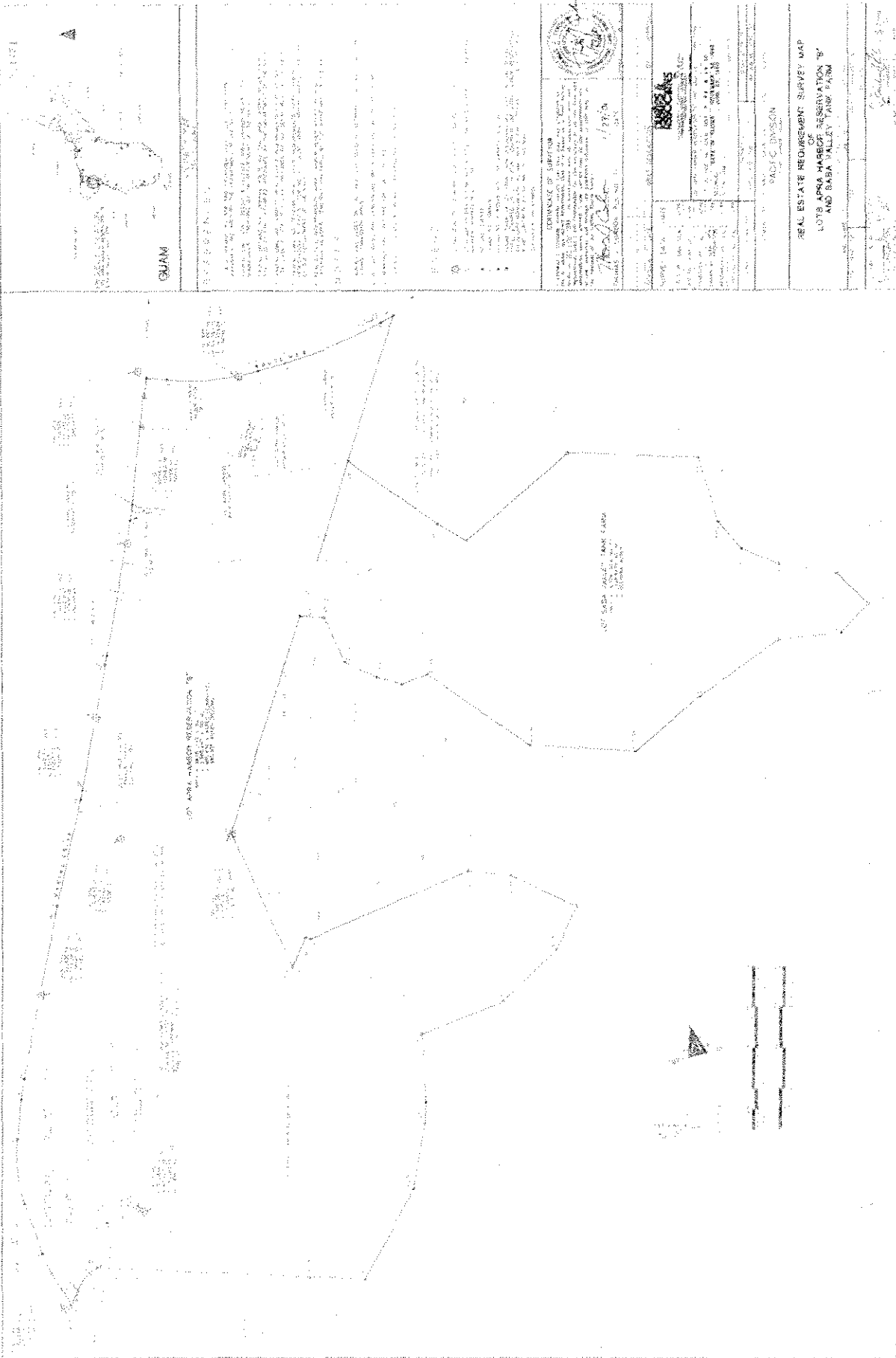

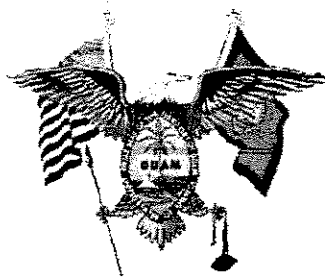

Senator Tom Ada, Chairman of Committee on Veterans Affairs and Distinguished Senators.

We are here today to discuss the acquisition of property adjacent to the Guam Veterans Cemetery at Piti for expansion as we look to our needs in the future.

At the current rate of utilization of about 100 grave sites annually, the Guam Veterans Cemetery will reach capacity over the next 20 years, with our current availability of around 700 single crypts and 800 double plots for veterans and their dependents.

However, our usage is postured to increase as we lose veterans and their dependents from World War II, Korean and Vietnam wars, and all subsequent wars, compelling us to plan for the future.

Acquisition of this property will enhance the longevity of the Guam Veterans Cemetery for more than 50 years with the current and anticipation rates of usage.

Another advantage in acquiring this property is that it will enable us to use the adjacent property to reroute the water run-off so that it no longer floods our current facilities during heavy rains.

In closing, I am in support of the proposed bills for the reasons so stated.

To appropriately transfer a portion of Lot B-R7, also known as the Masso Reservoir Conservation Area, to Lot B-6, the total area of almost 225,000 square meters of land needs to be fully surveyed. Additionally, when a portion of Lot B-R7 is transferred to Lot B-6, an adjacent portion of that area also needs to be identified as an easement to allow access to land locked Lot B-7. Due to the condition of the land and terrain, this is a labor-intensive and time consuming task.

As a result, the Department of Land Management recommends the appropriation of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) to engage in the professional services of a survey company to conduct the surveying duties necessary to complete the requirements of this bill. 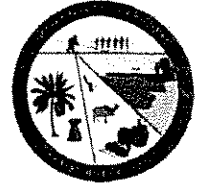

Hafa Adai Senator Ada and Committee:

The Department is not opposed to the intent of Bill 92-33, which serves to allow additional access to the Veteran's Cemetery by amending Section 2 of PL. 32-176 relative to the transfer of Guam Department of Agriculture property to the Office of Veterans' Affairs with respect to the boundaries of the Guam Veterans' Cemetery. The Department of Agriculture is not opposed to the intent of the Bill, which serves to allow additional access to the Veterans Cemetery. We highly encourage the committee to include in the bill language that ensures access to the Masso Reservoir is not impeded or eliminated. The Department has sought improvements to the Masso Reservoir with the intent of making it available to the public for recreational freshwater fishing. The reservoir has the added bonus of being a home to the endangered Moorhen. Various educational events such as Kid's Fishing Derbies and educational tours have been held at the reservoir.

There are several points we would like to emphasize:

1. The adjacent property was previously known as Alpha Bravo Parcel No. 2 was previous owned by the Department of the Navy. It was originally constructed for the sole purpose of providing an ample supply of water to DOD. As the reservoir was constantly inundated by soil run-off and erosion, the Navy-DOD closed the reservoir down, eventually transferring the property to the Government of Guam.

It was transferred to the Government of Guam. The transfer was made with a "reversionary clause" stating that the property was to be used solely for the enhancement of conservation on Guam. The area is now known as the Masso Reservoir.

2. The Masso Reservoir is located on a 29.5-acre parcel of land known as Apra Parcel No. 2, in the village of Piti, in the territory of Guam. Apra Parcel No. 2 was part of the Apra Harbor Naval Reservation. The Navy condemned the parcel on November 30, 1938 (Civil case No. 5-49). According to Navy records, the parcel was the property of the Government of Guam (river just west of the confluence of the north and south forks of the Masso River). The purpose of the reservoir was to provide drinking water to Naval Base Guam. The Navy abandoned the reservoir in 1951, citing chronic sedimentation issues, which made the reservoir not feasible as a drinking water source.
3. On January 12, 1976, a cooperative agreement between the Navy, the Department of the Interior, and the Government of Guam was signed. This agreement designates the Masso area as a fish and wildlife conservation and protection area, and names the Director of the Department of Agriculture as the government of Guam representative to administer the conditions of this agreement. The reservoir sat abandoned until 1978, when the Guam Department of Agriculture rehabilitated the reservoir, in order to turn it into a sport fishing facility. The reservoir was dredged, and stocked with fish. After two years, the project was abandoned, as vandalism caused the death of all the fish in the reservoir.
4. In the year 2000, the Department of Defense returned Apra Parcel #2 to the Government of Guam. In 2006, the governor transferred the parcel to the Guam Department of Agriculture. A sportfish grant was secured to convert the abandoned reservoir in to a sport fishing facility. Rehabilitation of the Masso Reservoir began in 2010. The reservoir was dredged, with approximately 15,000 cubic yards of material removed. A 200 foot long fishing platform was installed, and the reservoir was stocked with native fish; *Kuhlia rupestris*. Two sediment traps were installed on the south fork of the Masso River, to help reduce sediment input in to the reservoir. This work began in January 2010, and was completed by September of 2011. The total grant was approximately \$540,000 dollars. Subsequently, the Department of Agriculture, through the Division of Aquatic and Wildlife Resources, then had obtained additional funds through the USFWS Sport Fish Restoration Program to continue to enhance the Masso Reservoir.
5. In addition to these improvements to the reservoir, the reservoir is home to at least 2-3 pairs of the Endangered Common moorhen, known locally as Pulattat. As the reservoir remains filled with water, moorhen are seen throughout the year.

6. Forest Restoration measures that include the planting of seedling acacias, and other species of plants to stabilize the soil in this hilly area, and protect the adjacent Piti Bomb-Holes Marine Preserve from soil erosion and siltation. Partnership with Guam FSRD, and the Guam Nature Alliance, and Bureau of Statistics and Plans, have resulted in over 10,000 seedlings in the surrounding foothills. These conservation efforts have helped to improve the quality of the Piti Bomb-Holes MPA.
7. A reduction, or loss of usage at Masso will result in the Government of Guam reimbursing the Federal government - USFWS, of funds used for the improvements.

Thank you for providing us the opportunity to provide testimony on Bill 92-33 to the Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs, and Procurement.
