COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

Bill No. 97-33 (COR) was introduced on May 14, 2015 by Senator V. Anthony Ada and was subsequently referred on May 14, 2015 by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement.

The Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement convened a public hearing on June 26, 2015 at 1:00 pm in *I Liheslaturan Guahan*'s Public Hearing Room to receive public testimony on Bill No. 97-33 (COR).

Public Notice Requirements

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on June 19, 2015 (5-Day Notice) and again on June 24, 2015 (48-Hour Notice).

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 1:00pm.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Chairperson Ada called the Public Hearing to order and yields to the sponsor to give an introduction of the bill.

Senator V. Anthony Ada: He started by saying Bill No. 97 is a consumer protection measure, in cases where an insurance company determines it is not feasible to repair a vehicle. When a vehicle is deemed total loss or totaled, such vehicles should be issued a salvage title, by the Department of Revenue and Taxation. When the insurance companies determine a car is totaled and pays off the insured value of the car, it requires the insurer to sign over the title of the car. Then the insurance company usually sells the remnant of the car for parts but often repair shops restore these vehicles. He goes on to say an unsuspecting buyer would be unaware that it has been in a major collision.

These vehicles are then sold as used, without informing the buyer of the collision history. Buyers would not know if the chassis was welded or if the airbags were deployed or other major problems with the vehicle. The buyer should always be aware but having a salvage title for the vehicle will alert prospective buyers, that there may be more damages to the vehicle then is evident. Senator Anthony Ada then states that this bill is about a buyers right to know

that the vehicles they are buying are safe to use on our roadways. It is also to prevent anyone from selling a total car that has been repaired.

Chairperson Ada continues by calling those who have signed up to give a testimony.

Jennifer Camacho, *Cars Plus/GADA:* She states that she is speaking on behalf of the Guam Automobile Dealers Association. The association consists of the 6 new auto dealers Cars Plus, Guam Auto Spot, Atkins Kroll, Nissan, Triple J and Prestige Automobiles. She then reads the testimony in support of Bill No. 97-33 by GADA from Jay B. Jones, President.

Senator Muña Barnes: She starts by saying one of the concerns that was brought to her attention as one of the co-sponsors of the bill, was if the vehicle was deemed a salvage title and is then refurbished, that none of the insurance companies will insure the vehicle and in order to drive on our streets the vehicle has to be insured. With that would liability insurance be the only available option or could a refurbished care get insured 100% and they too would also get notified that the care was salvaged and repaired?

Ms. Camacho: She replies that it may come from the insurance company, they are the ones that will deem the vehicle unsalvageable. The loophole may be in the smaller shops that take in the vehicles, which have been completely totaled and putting them together. So of course the vehicle looks good but the consumer doesn't know that the vehicle has been salvaged. She goes on to say that the drop in the system right now, is those shops are able to register the vehicle, not knowing it is a salvage unit.

Senator Muña Barnes: Could a salvage unit be insured?

Ms. Camacho: She responds, right now, yes. It is unknown that the vehicle is a salvage title, which is why GADA wants to come forth and push the bill forward. And the bill allows protection to be there.

Joey Crisostomo, Cars Plus, GADA: He begins by saying that on a vehicle that is salvage, whether it has been damaged by accident or in a flood, the values in those cars drop up to 60%. Banks don't want to finance the vehicle but they won't know that there is a salvage title because they will look at a blue book but yet the car has been totaled. Salvage vehicles can get insurance, liability insurance but the bank won't finance it and the values are much less. A real life situation is that someone buys a one-year-old car and bought it from a third-party, not knowing that it was a total loss vehicle, frustration then starts for that buyer.

He says over the past five years he has seen it personally; someone has bought a car not knowing it has been in a major accident. They can buy the car and the body shop puts it together but the main concern is the buyer being aware. The buyer is unaware going into a situation that the vehicle has been totaled. He then states that there are many totaled vehicles on Guam that make it back onto the streets, with the buyers not knowing.

Chairperson Ada: He reinstates, that when a car gets totaled, the insurance company pays the full value, that company then takes possession of the car, and gets the title documents as

well. So when the repair shop buys that car from the insurance company and along with that comes the title, the car is then restored and sold to a buyer. So when the insurance company declares the vehicle as totaled and before it is sold, it has to be reported to?

Mr. Crisostomo: The Department of Revenue and Taxation, they will then brand the title as salvaged and that brand stays on the title forever, he responded.

Chairperson Ada: He goes on to saying that covers the vehicles here on Guam. There are also used cars that are bought into Guam, how are we to know the status of the vehicles being brought into Guam?

Mr. Crisostomo: He responds that this situation is practiced in the states. Every state has a branding title and there are several cars that have come into Guam with salvage titles.

Chairperson Ada: He asks if that is a process in all 50 states?

Mr. Crisostomo: All 50 states, he responded. They get branded titles, so he is able to pull up a program like CarFax and it pulls information from Department of Motor Vehicles in the mainland and it will show, salvage vehicle. He goes on to say that the buyer knows that there is no warranty and are aware of what they are purchasing.

Chairperson Ada: So that takes care of the situation off-island, it is the situation here onisland that is not covered?

Mr. Crisostomo: He goes on to say that when a person here goes to transfer their title to a Guam title, it will have a salvage stamp on the title coming in. It is important that Department of Motor Vehicles follows it and marks salvage on the new title from Guam.

Chairperson Ada: He asks if a Dodge vehicle comes into your shop and wants to claim their warranty, your shop would be able to detect if the vehicle was salvaged?

Mr. Crisostomo: He replies yes, they are able to go into a program using the VIN number and that will give the history of the car. In that history includes the day the car was built, to its first servicing, all the way to the day that it was salvaged. He goes on to say that information on who the dealer was, the previous owners, etc. can be found.

Chairperson Ada: He states but that is in the mainland, where the salvage title is being used. How about here on Guam?

Mr. Crisostomo: He replies that here on Guam they won't know that the vehicle was in an accident. In other words, if you got into an accident with your car and it was a total loss and you never came back to the dealer, there would never be any knowledge of the incident. He goes on to say, so the new buyer buys the car and brings it in for warranty, they would not know. It is a shame on him for not catching if the vehicle was salvaged but to give the buyer information that their car was in a major accident is also disheartening.

He continues that they have had discussion with some of the insurance carriers and they are in favor of the bill as well. They would have no problems with the bill but he is not speaking on their behalf.

Chairperson Ada ends the public hearing for Bill No. 97-33 (COR).

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

3 **Section 1.** Section 7117 of 16GCAis *amended* to read as follows:

5 §7117. Certificate: Contents.

- 6 (a) The certificate of ownership shall contain upon the face thereof the identical
- 7 information required upon the face of the registration card.
- 8 (b) The certificate of ownership shall contain upon the reverse side, forms for
- 9 notice to the Department of a transfer of the title or interest of the owner or legal
- 10 owner and application for such transfer by the transferee.
- (c) The certificate of ownership of a vehicle where title is acquired by an insurance
- company as a result of payment of an insurance claim shall prominently display the
- words "Salvage Title" on said certificate. The words "Salvage Title" shall remain
- on the certificate title in perpetuity for all successive owners of said vehicle or any
- 15 secondary vehicle from which said vehicle's chassis or parts of said vehicle's
- 16 chassis is used to repair, replace or refurbish the secondary vehicle.

- 2 Failure to disclose such insurance claim information, supra, to the Department of
- 3 Revenue and Taxation when transferring ownership is a civil violation and subject
- 4 to a fine of not less than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500). For purposes of this
- 5 subsection, salvage refers to any vehicle for which an insurance company has
- 6 <u>deemed not economically feasible to repair.</u>
- 7 (d) An insurance company that obtains ownership by payment of a claim for the
- 8 <u>full insured value of a vehicle shall obtain a salvage title certificate of ownership,</u>
- 9 within ten (10) days of the payment of such claim (weekends and government of
- 10 Guam holidays excepted), from the Department of Revenue and taxation prior to
- 11 selling or otherwise disposing of the vehicle. The Department of Revenue and
- 12 <u>Taxation may charge said insurance company a fee not to exceed Three Dollars</u>
- 13 (\$3.00). Subsequent sales or transfers of a vehicle with a salvage title shall be
- subject to a fee of Twenty Five Dollars (\$25). Fee revenues herein shall be
- 15 deposited in the Better Public Service Fund and are continually appropriated the
- 16 Motor Vehicle Division of the Department of Revenue and Taxation.
- 17 (e) In the event that an insurance company pays a claim for the full insured value
- of a vehicle and allows the insured to retain ownership of the vehicle, the insurance
- company shall, within ten (10) days of the payment of such claim (weekends and

Often these vehicles are sold to unknowing consumers who have little recourse should there be future mechanical or safety concerns with these rebuilt vehicles.




