I. OVERVIEW

Bill No. 99-33 (COR) was introduced on May 20, 2015, by Senator Brant T. McCreadie, and was subsequently referred by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Guam US Military Relocation, Public Safety and Judiciary on May 20, 2015.

The Committee on Guam US Military Relocation, Public Safety and Judiciary convened a public hearing on Bill No. <u>99-33</u> (COR) on Monday, June 8, 2015 at 5:00PM in I *Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room.

Public Notice Requirements

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via e-mail to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on Thursday, May 28, 2015 (5-Day Notice), and again on Tuesday, June 2, 2015 (48-Hour Notice). Notices were also published in the Marianas Variety Newspaper on Friday, May 29, 2015 and on Wednesday, June 3, 2015.

Chairman Aguon:

Then subsequent to that the second notice was disseminated on the 3rd of June once again to all our senators, the media and stakeholders, and then printed in on Wednesday June 3rd. Chairman Aguon:

The agenda for this evening's public hearing will be on Bill No. 88-33 (LS), which is relative to the compensation of members of the territorial parole board while serving under territorial parole board. Bill No. 89-33 (LS), which is relative to composition of the Guam Parole Board and then our final discussion will be on Bill No. 99-33 (COR), which is relative to establishing a hormone of anti-androgen pilot treatment program for persons convicted of sex crimes sponsored by the good senator to my immediate left, Senator Brant McCreadie, and also cosponsored by Senator Tony Ada.

Ladies and Gentlemen before I proceed to Bill No.99-33 I just would like to thank Vice Speaker and former Senator Ted Nelson for joining us in the audience. Thank you very much Senator. We will now proceed to Bill No.99-33, which is relative to establishing a hormone or anti-androgen pilot treatment program for persons convicted of sex crimes sponsored by Senator Brant McCreadie and before I allow him to provide his opening comments, I would like to invite Mr. Joseph Lastimoza and if there's anyone else in the audience who would like to provide testimony, you're more than welcomed to join us upfront. Mr. Lastimoza if you would like to join us up front and then I'd like to invite Senator McCreadie to provide his opening comments with regards to his legislation. Senator?

Senator McCreadie:

Thank you Mr.Chair. Bill 99 is an act to add a new Article 7 to Chapter 80 of Title 9, Guam Code Annotated, relative to establishing a hormone or anti-androgen pilot treatment program. Now the most recent statistics, which dates back to 2013 ranks Guam 3rd highest in the country. We did some research also a few years ago which also ranked us number 1. This is the safest and most effective measure to reduce recidivism. That was wrote by an author and researcher Cathy Amilin. She also reported that chemical castration decreases the occurrence of repeat offenses from 75 percent to 2 percent. So I think Mr. Chairman, Bill No. 99 speakers for itself. In totality Guam has a serious problem and we need to address this problem. This is considered in my view the ultimate protection for victims and possible victims in the future. Thank you very much.

Chairman Aguon:

Thank you very much Senator McCreadie, and with that in mind I would like to go ahead and invite Mr. Lastimoza to please, if you can turn on your mic, identify yourself for the record and proceed with your testimony.

Joseph Lastimoza:

Yes. My name is Joseph Lastimoza, and actually I just realized I signed in to make a testimony, but since I'm up here I just wanted to more or less my feelings because I myself have a sex offender registry and that was in 1981 and I've been out since 1999 and with the traditional methods of rehabilitation and of course remorse. Well with the help of God and being religious, the traditional method a lot times is more focused you know in the religion of the person. Now with my feelings of not for this bill is more towards the inhumane act to actually administer these kind of chemicals into a person, but other than that I have really not done any much research to counter a lot of your statistics. It was just a whim, actually. To be honest with you, like I said I didn't know I signed in for to be a witness, but.

Chairman Aguon:

Mr. Lastimoza thank you very much for being courageous and sharing your perspective with us and I would like to yield to the sponsor of the legislation. Do you have any comments or questions? If not that concludes our discussion on Bill No.99-33 (COR)

For the information of the community, the committee will continue to receive on all three pieces of legislation that was entertained this evening, for the next ten days and we will conclude by closing the committee report and report the proposed legislation to the main body of the legislature. With that in mind, I want to thank Senator McCreadie, thank you very much for joining us this evening and too everyone who provided testimony. Thank you very much.

Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Chemical

Castration for Sex Offenders Act."

Section 2. A *new* Article 7 of Chapter 80, Title 9, Guam Code Annotated is added to read as follows:

- (c) The Parole Board shall require as a condition of parole or postprison supervision hormone or antiandrogen treatment during all or a portion of parole or post-prison supervision hormone or antiandrogen treatment during all or a portion of parole or post-prison supervision of persons required to participate in the hormone or antiandrogen treatment program described in subsection (b) of this section.
- (d) A person required to undergo a treatment program under subsection (b) of this section violates a condition of parole or post-prison supervision and is subject to sanctions if the person:
 - (1) Fails to cooperate in the treatment program required under Subsection (b) of this section; or
 - (2) Takes any steroid or other chemical to counteract the treatment required under subsection (b) of this section.
- (e) If a person voluntarily undergoes a permanent surgical alternative to treatment under subsection (b) of this section, he or she shall not be subject to hormone or antiandrogen treatment under this section. All costs of such permanent surgical alternative shall be paid by the person undergoing such procedure.
- (f) Any physician who acts in good faith under this section in the administration of hormone or antiandrogen treatment or the evaluation of persons for hormone or antiandrogen treatment shall be immune from civil or criminal liability in connection with such treatment or evaluation.

Last week, Senator Brant McCreadie introduced the Chemical Castration for Sex Offenders Act in an effort to prevent recidivism, protect the community, and address the island's high rate of reported sexual assaults. According to the Guam Police Department's Unified Crime Report, there were 106 reports of rape in 2013 or 64 reported rapes per 100,000 people, ranking Guam third highest in the nation. Keep in mind that these numbers do not reflect the instances of rape that are not reported. We may not be able to prevent all crime from occurring, but we can seek solutions to protect ourselves, families, and the most vulnerable in our community – victims of heinous sex crimes like rape and incest of which occur too often in Guam.

This measure seeks a solution by establishing a program to reduce the testosterone levels in sex offenders. Some make the argument that chemical castration will not be an effective treatment as reducing testosterone levels diminishes sexual arousal and sexual offenses such as rape are committed to experience feelings of power and control and not for the sexual act itself. However, testosterone hormone levels are also correlated to aggression levels. By reducing testosterone, aggression is also reduced, a factor believed by some to be the main motivator of sexual crimes. Some people have also made the argument that chemical castration may be in violation of the eighth amendment of the Constitution, but I have to disagree. The chemical castration

program proposed by the Act is a treatment, not a punishment. Chemical castration does not cause pain or suffering of any type, and it is a treatment method used to control sexual urges. Another argument made against chemical castration is that there may be side effects as a result of the hormone treatment. However, the bill addresses this issue by requiring the Department of Corrections to refer sexual offenders to a competent physician for a medical evaluation to determine their suitability for hormone treatment and inform them of the side effects. The bill allows for medical professionals to determine one's eligible by requiring a medical evaluation.

As a registered voter, I believe that the main concern of lawmakers and government leaders should be the safety and security of the victims, which should be central in the discussion of this bill. Statistics and opinions will be exchanged. However, I believe that one person's freedom ends where another person's freedom begins and that the safety and security of our community should take precedence over the rights of convicted criminals. Some may say that this may be an extreme position and this is a ruthless measure, but it is a course of action that can be done to solve this growing problem. Senator Brant McCreadie has taken action by introducing this measure, and I hope to see it passed by the Legislature and signed into law. We cannot afford to wait any longer and put more victims at risk of being sexually assaulted.

Senator Brant McCreadie introduced Guam's toughest anti-rape legislation with chemical castration for pedophiles and convicted sex offenders.

In an effort to try and put a stop to pedophiles and repeated sex offenders from re-offending, Senator Brant McCreadie introduced Bill 99, which would require convicted sex offenders who will be released either for parole or post-prison supervision in six months to undergo chemical castration.



McCreadie says, "This is a strong stern message. When you first hear about it, you kind of get concerned

like 'wow that is a tough law' but when you look at the statistics on Guam, we're talking about number 1, 2, 3 in the world depends on what year per capita, this is a necessity."

Chemical castration is a process in which a person is injected with a medication that is designed to reduce desire for sexual activity.

If the bill is passed, the Department of Corrections will be responsible for establishing the pilot program. The bill states that DOC will then have to screen sex offenders that are up for release. If they are deemed suitable for this treatment, they are required to start receiving the chemical castration treatment a week before they are released. Also under the bill, the individual would have to pay or reimburse all costs associated with the treatment.

The bill is co-sponsored by Senator Tony Ada and according to Senator McCreadie the governor is also in support of the bill.

McCreadie says, "I had a conversation with the governor and I told him three months ago that I was interested in introducing this piece of legislation and he assured me that he supports something like this. Hopefully we let this process through the legislature and the public hearing, gets to his desk and hopefully he signs it."

According to the release from Senator Brant McCreadie's office, 25.2 per 1000 people is the FBI's national average for reported rape cases, Guam is more than twice that average with 64.2 per 1000.

Guam Medical Association will discuss chemical castration

The Guam Medical Association will be meeting tomorrow and according to Dr. Tom Shieh Bill 99 will be one of the items that will be discussed. The legislation otherwise known as the Chemical Castration for Sex Offenders Act was introduced by Senator Brant McCreadie on Wednesday. The bill was introduced in direct response to the alarming and growing number of rape and sex offense cases locally. The measure would impose the treatment of chemical castration for convicted sex offenders who are eligible for parole or post-prison supervision.

In chemical castration, drugs are administered in regular intervals to reduce the levels of testosterone in the body, thereby reducing sexual drive and resulting in infertility.Dr. Shieh was unavailable for an interview but posted a comment on his facebook page stating he applauds senators who want to fight hard against crimes, especially crimes on sexual assault. This legislation certainly is no guarantee that a release with conditional medications will prevent recurrence. He added that while we debate this issue, as physicians, we have to tread carefully on how we use medications to affect social change. Chemical castration laws are in effect California and Florida.

Additionally other states such as Iowa, Louisiana, Georgia, Montana, Oregon, Texas and Wisconsin have experimented with chemical castration.





McCreadie wants to hit sex offenders where it hurts most

Throughout his legislative career, Senator Brant McCreadie has made it no secret he's going after criminals to keep Guam safe, and this morning he's introduced his most controversial legislation yet, this time going after sex offenders where it hurts most.

The gloves have come off, and the second-term policymaker is fighting crime like never before. "Chemical castration is a bill that's a ruthless and relentless attempt by my office to eliminate pedophiles and rapists," he said. Bill 99, otherwise known as The Chemical Castration for Sex Offenders Act, is in direct response to the alarming and growing number of rape cases." Commenting on Guam's sex offender statistics, McCreadie said, "We rank up there number one in the world per capita for those kinds of crimes."

The Republican lawmaker is behind tough crime laws such as the Predator Prevention Act, the island's Three Strikes Law, and the Vulnerable Victims Act. The intent of Bill 99 is to impose the treatment of chemical castration for convicted sex-offenders who are eligible for parole or post-prison supervision. In chemical castration, drugs are administered at customary intervals to reduce the levels of testosterone in the body, in doing so reducing sexual drive and resulting in infertility.

"To me, it's not controversial. It's a necessity," he said.

Chemical castration laws are in effect in California and Florida. Several other states such as Iowa, Lousiana, Georgia, Montana, Oregon, Texas and Wisconsin have experimented with chemical castration. He continued, "All that's left now is the vetting process moving through the Legislature and the public hearing and seeing what the public has to say. We have to do something, and obviously what we've been doing may not be working so this is an extreme measure."

Bill 99 is co-sponsored by Minority Leader Senator Tony Ada, who also is tough on crime. Senator Ada is the author of Guam's Castle Doctrine Law.

Bill: Chemically castrate sex offenders

News Local News In hope of reducing recidivism rates, Sen. Brant McCreadie, R-Agana Heights, is proposing the use of a medical treatment known as "chemical castration" on sex offenders qualified for parole.

According to Bill 99-33, the "Chemical Castration for Sex Offenders Act," DOC would initiate a pilot program to begin screening convicted sex offenders eligible for release on parole within six months and refer them for anti-androgen treatment a week before their release.

"This is a ruthless and relentless solution, but I think it's necessary," McCreadie said. "It's necessary to also send out that message that enough is enough."

Chemical castration, or anti-androgen treatment, is the use of hormone medication such as medroxyprogesterone acetate, or MPA, to control inappropriate sexual behavior.

Under the program, sex offenders would go through a medical evaluation to determine whether they are healthy enough to for the treatment, McCreadie said. Upon DOC's

referral, the Parole Board would require the individual to participate in the hormone treatment program "during all or a portion" of their parole, according to the bill.

Another provision in the bill mandates the sex offender pay for the costs associated with the treatment program. Individuals could opt for physical or surgical castration, the measure states.

"It's not an extreme amount of money, ... when you look at the cost (of the treatment) and the price (the crime) has on the victim. ... You cannot even put a price on that," McCreadie said. "If medication costs \$100 a month or \$200 a month, as opposed to a life shattering crime, it kind of speaks for itself."

Although he's unsure the treatment is available on island, McCreadie said Gov. Eddie Calvo has expressed support for the bill and would make sure Guam has access to the drugs if the measure passes.

"Through the vetting process, I'm sure we will be informed of the ability

to acquire the medicine. If we don't have it, then we're going to have to get it," McCreadie said: "I had spoken to the governor about this and he supports this. As the head of the executive branch, he will instruct his people to get this readily available if it becomes law."

A handful of states, including California and Florida, have their own castration laws for sex offenders, according to lke Aguigui, McCreadie's legal counsel. The pilot program proposed in Bill 99 is closely modeled after the program Oregon launched in 2007.

Aguiguí said the hormone treatment isn't meant to be punitive but rather a condition of parole, therefore not in violation of "double jeopardy" rules.

"This is a condition of parole. This is not something being penalized," Aguigui explained. "The parole board has the authority to impose conditions. ... Parole is not something that's automatically granted. It's not uncommon that any other conditions are imposed."

KUAM News received comment on Senator Brant McCreadie's Chemical Castration for Sex Offenders Act from former senator Frank Ishizaki, who is also a former FBI agent, former chief of police, and former director of the Department of Corrections. He said, "I think it has potential and should be debated by the public. The Legislature should pay special attention to the opinion of attorneys and medical practitioners. I don't know if there might be a constitutional question with respect to the 'cruel and unusual punishment'. Castration should probably be offered as an option but not be a requirement. Any effort to reduce sexual drive will be helpful for reducing risks with most but probably not all offenders".

There's been a lot of talk about chemical castration after Senator McCreadie introduced the "Chemical Castration for Sex Offenders Act" yesterday but at least one doctor believes there is no guarantee that chemical castration will prevent recurrence.

Guam Medical Association President Dr. Tom Shieh responded to inquiries about the bill from a medical standpoint. And while he applicated the senators who want to fight hard against crimes and keep those who commit crimes behind bars, ultimately, he explains this legislation is no guarantee that a convicted sex offender upon release undergoing chemical castration will be prevented from re-offending.

Shieh says that as physicians, they have to tread carefully on how they use medications to affect social change. He says that while a court has the ability to identify criminal behavior, a court does not have the ability to make a medical diagnosis or determine the type of treatment that will be administered. Shieh says physicians should treat patients based on sound medical diagnoses, not court-defined behaviors.

SEN. Brant McCreadie has introduced Bill 99-33, which calls for the chemical castration of sex offenders.

Co-sponsored by Sen. Tony Ada, the legistation seeks to impose the treatment of chemical castration for convicted sex offenders who are eligible for parole or post-prison supervision.

Citing the FBI's national average for reported rape cases, McCreadie said Guam has more than twice the national average of 25.2 cases per 100,000 people, with 64.2 cases per 100,000.

The senator also said Guam ranks third in the nation for rapes behind South Dakota which has 70,2 and Alaska at 79.7. He added that ranking third only sheds a little light on the issue, as 51 percent of Guam's victims identified the perpetrator as a family member while an additional 36 percent claimed the attacker to be an acquaintance.

"Sexual abuse is obviously an issue on our island and it needs to be addressed," McCreadle said, "The purpose of this ... treatment program is to reduce the risk of re-offenders after the release on parole or post-prison supervision as well as a deterrence to prevent sexual abuse in our community."

If the bill is enacted, McCreadie said convicted sex offenders who are eligible for release will undergo. medical evaluations and begin the chemical castration treatment the last week of incarceration.

According to Mccreadie, there are 879 registered sex offenders on Guarn; 60 of them are repeat offenders.

"With the support of my colleagues, we can bring a recidivism rate of 6.8 percent as close to zero as we can with the Chemical Castration for Sex Offender Act," the senator said.

Oversight hearing

Also yesterday, McCreadie requested Sen. Frank Aguon, chairman of the legislative public safety committee, to hold an oversight hearing for the Department of Corrections after the recent escape of one of its detainees.

"Concerns over the ongoing issues of the prison and overcrowding at the Department of Corrections must be addressed. Despite the efforts of the department to make improvements to the dilapidated facility, there has been a steady increase to the prison population over the past few months. With over 800 inmates and detainees, the safety of the public has been compromised, yet again, with the recent escape of a detainee charged with rape," McCreadie said,

The senator also wrote to Gov. Eddie Calvo, reiterating the need to build a new prison after the escape of the DOC detainee.

"With the recent escape of a detainee charged with rape, I ampleading with you, governor, to exercise your authority by issuing (a request for proposals) so we can build a new prison. The longer we wait, this issue becomes a victory for the prisoners and a defeat for the safety of our community," McCreadie said,

"As you know, public safety and the absolute protection of our citizens is my main focus as a lawmaker, it is for this reason that we must, once and for all, solve the problems of overcrowding, successful escapes and a dilapidated facility by building a modern facility that will ensure protection of generations to come."



Bill 99 is an innovative measure

Sexual crimes are a significant problem on Guam. The increasing frequency of arrests for sexual offenses is alarming. Just read the news.

Sen. Brant McCreadie's Bill 99-33 is an innovative measure. The goal is to implement a chemical castration program to reduce the likelihood of convicted sex offenders committing new sexual crimes after they are released from prison, on parole. I believe that the bill is forward-thinking, and — against a backdrop of healthy controversy and debate on the matter — courageous.

Certainly, efforts to prevent the recidivism (the relapse into criminal behavior) of convicts and thus to protect our communities are commendable.

The bill, the "Chemical Castration for Sex Offenders Act," is not as draconian as it sounds. I retrieved a copy from the Guam Legislature's website and read it. The bill is not about surgical castration (the physical removal of part of the sexual organs) — which is the term that evokes the most lurid images in everyone's mind. Instead, what the bill proposes to establish is simply a chemical

"treatment program" through the collaborative efforts of the prison system and medical professionals.

The program involves the administration of approved chemical substances, which are hormones or anti-androgens. Those substances are administered to sex offenders who pass a medical assessment under the program. From what I understand, the chemical treatments are administered periodically, under the supervision of a doctor.

Obviously, they involve no removal of sexual organs. The treatments are not permanent, and their effects are generally reversible once discontinued. The treatments are geared toward reducing sexual drive and sexual interest (and therefore reducing the propensity of of fenders to commit new sexual crimes) by the reduction of testosterone in the body. The treatments are not a form of sterilization.

Guam is not alone in its quest to adopt some form of chemical castration. Several states have implemented variations of chemical castration measures. Certain states have allowed judges to impose penal sentences involving chemical castration, in addition to prison terms. Other states have opted (perhaps more wisely) to go the treatment route, as Guam now proposes to do, which involves a collaboration between the penal system and the medical community in general.

When sexual offenders are allowed back into the community, what assurances do the public have that offenders will not regress to their former criminal behaviors and commit new sexual crimes, involving new victims, or even previous victims? Obviously, parole officers and other law enforcement officers cannot keep watch 24 hours a day.

Up until now, there has been no real solution to the problem — that is, until McCreadie's bill arrived.

It would be unrealistic to assume, even hope, that chemical castration will prevent all instances of new sexual crimes committed by paroled sex offenders. However, if chemical castration could save even one innocent victim, one innocent life, it is definitely worthwhile. The innocent victim saved could be someone you know, one of your own children, one of your family members.

Think about it.

Prioritize

Guam needs to first bolster mental health treatment, services

Thile Guam lawmakers and Gov. Eddie Calvo should explore the effectiveness of a controversial medical treatment known as "chemical castration" in reducing recidivism among sex offenders, it would make more sense for elected officials to first prioritize funding that strengthens and bolsters mental health services.

Our island's mental and behavioral health agency doesn't have the capacity or the expertise to adequately and effectively treat and rehabilitate convicted sex offenders. This leaves the entire community, especially children and women, vulnerable and at risk. According to the U.S. Department of Justice, sex offenders are very likely to be rearrested for a sex crime within three years after their release from prison.

Sen. Brant McCreadie, R-Agana Heights, has proposed chemical castration for sex offenders qualified for parole. Bill 99-33, the "Chemical Castration for Sex Offenders Act," would have the Department of Corrections screen convicted sex offenders eligible for release on parole within six months and refer them for anti-androgen treatment before their release. Chemical castration is medication given to sex offenders that greatly reduces sexual activity.

Under Bill 99, sex offenders would go through a medical evaluation to determine whether they are healthy enough to for the treatment. Upon DOC's referral, the Guam Parole Board would require the individual to participate in the hormone treatment program during all or a portion of their parole. The bill mandates the sex offender pay for the costs associated with the treatment program. Individuals could opt for physical or surgical castration.

Even though chemical castration is controversial, some states have adopted it, arguing the people's right to protection, especially children, is far more important that the freedoms of pedophiles.

There is debate on chemical castration being a cure-all. Although such drugs as Depo-Provera and Depo-Lupron can help control some sexual disorders, they may not control a violent serial rapist who targets adult women out of anger and a need for control, according to The Washington Post. The drugs also can have serious side effects.

Given the alarmingly high number of sex crimes in Guam, such a program may be an effective tool as part of a larger system of treatment for convicted peodophiles and other sexual predators. But our island lacks a foundational treatment system and the rehabilitation programs that would greatly protect our community.

And until elected officials make bolstering mental health services a priority, piecemeal solutions will ultimately fail.

Chemical castration bill gets little feedback at public hearing

Only one person Monday weighed in on a measure to require certain convicted sex offenders being released on parole to take anti-androgen treatment, most commonly referred to as "chemical castration."

Sen. Brant McCreadie last month introduced Bill 99-33, in an effort to curb rape cases on island and reduce recidivism rates at the Department of Corrections. Citing the FBI's 2013 crime statistics, McCreadie said Guam ranks third in the nation for rape cases.

"In totality Guarn does have a serious problem and we need to address this problem," he said. This is "the ultimate protection for victims and possible victims in the future."

If the bill is enacted, DOC would be tasked with initiating a pilot program in which qualified sex offenders are evaluated to determine whether they are healthy enough to undergo the treatment.

Upon DOC's referral, the Parole Board would require the individual released from prison to participate in the hormone treatment program during the duration of their parole, according to the bill.

Chemical castration, according to McCreadie, is the "safest and most effective" way to reduce recidivism rates.

During the hearing, Joseph Lastimoza, who noted that he's on the sex offender registry, having served time in prison from 1981 to 1999, said traditional methods and his belief in God helped to rehabilitate him.

He acknowledged that he didn't do any research prior to his testimony, but opposed the measure, believing the chemical castration method is inhumane.

"Now with my feelings of not (being) for this bill, is more towards the inhumane act to actually administer these kind of chemicals into a person," Lastimoza said.

Researchers in a 2013 journal article published in the U.S. National Library of Medicine argue that the autonomy of convicted sex offenders could improve if they are given the option of chemical castration.

"Castration may increase the offender's future autonomy by removing internal, psychological barriers to autonomy, such as irresistible sexual urges, and by allowing the offender to be released from prison, thus reducing restrictions on freedom of movement, association, and expression," the article states.

According to the researchers, nine states in the U.S. currently have laws that allow for castration of qualifying sex offenders. States such as Oregon and Montana provide for chemical castration only, while others including California and Ftorida allow for both chemical and physical castration.

McCreadie's version, although modeled very closely to Oregon's legislation, does give sex offenders the option of physical castration,
