COMMITTEE REPORT

II. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Early Learning, Juvenile Justice, Public Education, and First Generation Initiative convened a public hearing on March 26, 2015 at 4:00 pm in I Liheslatura's public hearing room. Among the items on the agenda was the consideration of the appointment of Mr. Francis G. Toves, to serve as the Accounting/Finance Representative to the Guam Academy Charter Schools Council, and whose appointment history is as follows:

- 1. Appointed by Governor Edward B. Calvo on January 15, 2015 to serve three (3) years from date of confirmation by the Legislature.
- 2. Appointment packet forwarded to I Liheslatura on January 15, 2015;
- 3. Appointment packet forwarded to this Committee for public hearing on January 15, 2015.

I. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

Chairwoman Nerissa Bretania Underwood: The confirmation for the appointment of Mr. Francis G. Toves to the Guam Academy Charter School's Council as the Accounting Finance Representative. We have Mr. Francis Toves; please come up. If you could please state your name.

Mr. Francis Toves: My name is Francis Patrick G. Toves. I come here today as the appointee for the Charter School Council Finance Representative. I want to give a little background - Senator Aguon if your remember during a Barrigada procession, Rosa Palomo asked me about being on the council and you were next to me and so that's how it started. She inquired and I said, 'yeah that would be something that I would be interested in'.

As recently as last year I was telling a good friend of mine and classmate, the Vice Mayor of Agat, who just recently passed, that the appointment was coming up and I wasn't too sure about it. He actually urged me to continue on and not turn it down. That's kind of how things went.

I come here.... most of the time my family is saying, "Can we hold back and not... let's focus on our business and get our business profitable and that kind of thing". Since I stay in the private sector and I've been there for quite a while and I have family that has served in different capacities in this government. So, when asked whether or not I was hesitant, I am still willing to serve. And that is it.

Chairwoman Nerissa Bretania Underwood: Thank you and I will yield to my colleagues. Do you have any questions? Senator San Nicolas.

Senator Michael San Nicolas: Hi Frank.

Mr. Francis Toves: Hi.

Senator Michael San Nicolas: You know you're my neighbor and I didn't know you had this long resume. Always need to find out something new about people. The position that you will be assuming is for the Accounting and Finance Representative of the Guam Academy Charter School Council. I just wanted to ask...

Mr. Francis Toves: My background?

Senator Michael San Nicolas: No, one of the things that always been brought to everybody's attention is, especially up here is how the Charter School's budget doesn't include amounts for the school lunches. I remember that was an issue that was discussed back in one of the budget cycles. If you assumed the position, I fully support your nomination. If you could put a bug in your ear to just get back to us before the next budget cycle on what the status is on the school lunch program at the Charter School and whether or not it is included on the budget allotment that they provide. I remember that was concern - if not in the last budget then the one before that and I wanted to see if we can get a follow up.

Mr. Francis Toves: It should just be a notation in their budget but on a lump sum budget it should be included.

Senator Michael San Nicolas: I don't think it was itemized in the Guam Legislature's appropriation.

Mr. Francis Toves: But in the miscellaneous provisions there should be something in there. Apparently there is some oversight...

Senator Michael San Nicolas: If you could help us just get a handle on that figure and what the amount may be and whether or not that amount is factored into the \$5,500 per pupil that is currently part of their calculation. I just wanted to get a better understanding of what the status was on that. But that was really it for me. Thank you Madam Chair.

Chairwoman Nerissa Bretania Underwood: Thank you Senator San Nicolas. Senator Torres?

Senator Mary Torres: Mr. Toves, are you presently serving on the Charter School board?

Mr. Francis Toves: I am not.

Senator Mary Torres: But you have experience in other government roles?

Mr. Francis Toves: The Guam Board of Education.

Senator Mary Torres: I noticed that the appointment is for the position for the Accounting / Finance Representative.

Mr. Francis Toves: Yes.

Senator Mary Torres: I imagine in the composition of boards, they tap on different talents and expertise to balance the discussion for direction among the representative. Clearly in accepting the appointment, you understand that you're filling a position within the board that has contemplated that you have expertise and knowledge to lend to the composition of the board. Correct?

Mr. Francis Toves: Yes.

Senator Mary Torres: And do you know that this specific position to which you're being referred and your background and education and expertise?

Mr. Francis Toves: Yes. Currently I am the treasurer for the Young Men's League of Guam. Comprised of well over \$1,000,000 of fixed and financial assets.

Senator Mary Torres: The reason I ask is we understand that the Charter Schools are going [audio cuts off] concerns in addition to the steady management and consistent management are the financial picture and the needs. I just wanted to hear from you that given that you're being appointed in the capacity of a Accounting and Finance Representative that you feel comfortable in the responsibility and expectations that are being placed on you as a member with that background and expertise to lend.

Mr. Francis Toves: You know, I am a math major and an engineer with the finance background in formal education. I've been a licensed broker and registered representative to sell securities at one time in my life. I learned it not to sell securities. I learned it to learn plans. My company that I am president of is "Toves Development and Investments". I own and operate my own real estate apartment rental program and I manage my own construction, which I have managed for thirty years. That's something not necessarily new. When I first came into government in 1994 on Guam, I was to handle the return of Tiyan, SRF and 3,000 acres of federal excess lands.

Normally you judge the wellness of a program as to how well it does. You didn't have the problems with the transition of SRF or the airport turning from NAS Agana to the airport; that was the transition between the Ada Administration into the Gutierrez Administration. I am still able to work with both sides of the isle even though I was treasure for the GOP for over a decade. So yes I've had some dabbling in finances.

Senator Mary Torres: I know you personally. It was good to hear you affirm your confidence and willingness to serve in this capacity and that's what I wanted to hear because we sometimes don't see it in the application. I know that there are a lot of people who are very, very concerned with the Charter School system right now. The ones that are the most concerned are the students that believe in it. So we would like to see it thrive and that's why I asked those questions.

I appreciate your candor and I think it was good for you to discuss that because I think that it does lend a level of confidence and surety to those people who might not otherwise have known about you or what you might be able to contribute. But there's also something very admirable about a citizen who is willing to step up and serve the government in a board capacity because it is a great deal of responsibility. I know you could be enjoying all the things that you do in your life, but it's good that you offer this kind of service. Thank you for answering that question. I didn't mean to be rude I just wanted to hear it from your mouth.

Mr. Francis Toves: Actually I don't really announce those kinds of details. It's not normal to announce that kind of information.

Chairwoman Nerissa Bretania Underwood: You're humble. Ok.

Senator Mary Torres: Si yu'os ma'ase.

Mr. Francis Toves: Hagu mas, Senator.

Chairwoman Nerissa Underwood: Thank you Senator Torres. Senator Espaldon? Ok. I just a couple of questions. You have had experiences as a member with the Guam Education Policy Board. So, I am just wondering, based on that experience and what you have learned from your experience, how would you apply that to being a member of the Guam Academy Charter School Council?

Mr. Francis Toves: You know, I have a lot of respect for boards and commissions because serving on them is a difficult task. However, it has been unfortunately my experience that at times some of the members tend to reach in terms of their authority as board members and we tend to — without finding a better word for it - micro manage the efforts of the executive that's in charge. It's not just the Board of Education; it happens in many boards and it depends on the composition of that board. But, that's been the most difficult and frustrating part of it because I come from the private sector and if you're on the board and you don't like that executive then once, twice and you may not get to a third time.

You've disapprove a plan of action, and you've already defanged that executive and it's just a matter of time. I wouldn't go that far to disapprove a plan of action because every executive ought to have the chance to try and put their best foot forward. If you give them that latitude and he fails, then he fails with his ideas all on his shoulders. You can't go blame it on somebody else.

It's been my experience that a lot of times well-meaning board members tend to reach more into what authority they don't have. Since their authority comes as a board and not as individual members. It's the restraint that board members need to know. You don't have to be an expert in everything but you have to hold the executive accountable. My side is finance. I can easily see whether or not they are going to provide that oversight and follow through those particular objectives.

Chairwoman Bretania Nerissa Underwood: Ok. So, what would be your two priorities as a member of the council?

Mr. Francis Toves: The first is to get our board to relax and not try and breach and micro manage and be clear on what you want and not delving into any one particular item. I find that a lot of times we're not clear. We give to many different activities or events that we want the executive to accomplish and then wonder why all not all of them were accomplished. There are limits within this government that we can do and we ought to remember what some of those limits are. We can't always do certain things and when it's appropriate I think that those things should be - we should have affirmed those things.

It's like Senator San Nicolas's bill. I take a different standpoint on. It's nice to say that we're going to collaborate and that we are going to do all these nice things and say we are going to take 18 months to come up with a plan. It's just my experience that the 18 months will pass and we still won't have a plan and we won't have any execution of that plan. I'd rather, like what Dr. Cruz said, just pound it forward a little bit and in six

months if something doesn't come up and they haven't moved forward, have a round table discussion and try to move it further along. Sometimes you have to egg it on a little bit.

You have to overcome that little momentum that there's some anchors that people are dropping on the way over. You got to try and move things along; sometimes not everybody is on the same sheet of music. That boat is kind of overweight.

Chairwoman Nerissa Bretania Underwood: Sounds like a little bit of management.

Mr. Francis Toves: Yes. I'd like management to work on it. It's something they need to do. Sometimes you have to tell management that it's time to get going. But it's ok. We can be firm; just like we are with our kids. Yes we live in a democracy. But, once you get somebody in charge they have to make things happen. So I'm just suggesting we...

Chairwoman Nerissa Bretania Underwood: You facilitate it.

Mr. Francis Toves: Yes.

Chairwoman Nerissa Bretania Underwood: Without micro management.

Mr. Francis Toves: That's right.

Chairwoman Nerissa Underwood: Ok. I thank you Mr. Toves for accepting the nomination and we have two Charter Schools now and yes, indeed there were challenges with Guahan Academy but I believe that you can contribute with the experience that you've had with the Guam Education Board and your expertise in finance. Even your experience in being a member of our community. It is tough being a board member and it does take, not only a lot of your time but energy and the concentration with the matters at hand. So, I thank you very much for that. Thank you for your testimony and for your presence and the public testimony this afternoon.





The Guam Federation of Teachers takes no position regarding the Confirmation of Mr. Frances G. Toves.

In regard to proposed Bill No. 47-33, "an act to establish a Financial Education Curriculum within the Department of Education by adding a new 4110 to Chapter 4 of Division 2, Title 17, Guam Code Annotated", the Guam Federation of Teachers is submitting both written and verbal input pertaining to the proposed bill. The oral testimony will be provided by Ms. Melissa Duenas, of the Guam Federation of Teachers; who is a Member of the Guam Department of Education Joint Committee for Curriculum and Instruction. In addition, I am submitting herewith the written position of the Guam Federation of Teachers concerning the proposed Bill.

The Guam Federation of Teachers does not take issue with the desirability of the young men and women within Guam's Educational system being better informed concerning the matters and areas as set out in the proposed bill. However, the Guam Federation of Teachers is in opposition to the proposed Bill in that it seeks by way of a Law, from the Guam Legislature, to dictate and mandate the creation of a certain Curriculum for the Guam Department of Education and Guam Education System.

It is respectfully submitted that there already exists within the Guam Department of Education, and the Teaching Profession, the means and apparatus to consider, introduce, modify or revise Curriculum.

There exists now, a Guam Department of Education Board; Guam Department of Education Management in the form of a Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent for Curriculum; as well as the Joint Committee, can and do, review and consider Curriculum for the Guam Education System.

Accordingly, it is submitted that the well-placed concerns introduced by Senator Michael San Nicolas in the proposed Bill are better addressed; instead of creating a Law, in the form of a Letter or Memorandum to the Chairman of the Board of Education and the Superintendent of Education, for appropriate action on the proposed Subject Curriculum.

I note to you also, that at a meeting last night of the Guam Federation of Teachers/Department of Education Union Stewards, it was their unanimous position, that as I said herein, the subject matter of Bill 47-33, is not appropriately established by a new Law, but instead better introduced by working with the already established Guam Department of Education Curriculum Apparatus for consideration, review and implementation.



Crisostoma's presenta-Performance-"Can tion. based Budgeting Work for the Government of Guam?" covered historical timelines on performance-based budgeting, in terms of legislation, as well as recommendations on how to make the plan work for the government system.

As stated in the law, the heads of the Department of Administration, Bureau of Budget and Management Research, as well as the Departments of Revenue and Taxation, Parks and Recreation, Land Management, Agriculture, and the Bureau of Statistics and Plans were to develop and implement performance-based budgeting no later than the deadline. Moreover, appropriate employees of agencies are to attend all workshops and training opportunities regarding performance-based budgeting offered by DOA.

Crisostomo also cited P.L. 30-55, which also has a provision setting a 20 percent salary reduction for noncompliance.

The third statute, P.L. 29-019,

System to implement performance-based budgeting for its central operations within the same timeframe.

Crisostomo mentioned a press release from the office of Vice Speaker Benjamin Cruz calling upon the executive branch to implement performance-based budgeting for fiscal 2016.

In September 2014, Cruz noted that an executive order creating a "Performance Based Management System Executive Steering Committee" was issued in 2012, yet none of the budget bills submitted since then has followed performancebased budgeting guidelines.

Cruz urged Adelup to implement the plan by selecting eight to 12 agencies and departments of varying sizes to submit performance-based budgets for fiscal 2016, with the ultimate goal of having all GovGuam agencies and departments doing the same by FY 2018.

Executive Order 2012-10, issued by Gov. Eddie Calvo, endorsed the implementation of a performance-based budgeting system in promoting greater efficiency and accountability throughout the government.

The executive order stated its implementation throughout government would greatly performance-based budgeting

The seven-member steering committee would comprise the governor's chief fiscal advisor, chief of staff and communication director, and the heads of BBMR, DOA, BSP, and Guam Economic Development Authority.

According to Crisostomo, performance-based budgeting consists of a plan for relating resource inputs to the efficient production of outputs.

She said implementing performance-based budgeting shortens the budgeting process and makes the agency more focused on its list of resources. and sets out specific goals for the following year.

To make performance-based budgeting work for GovGuam, Crisostomo said it is essential for the legislature and the governor to support its implementation. Likewise, effective communication must be established with the agencies who will be implementing performance-based budgeting.

Moreover, she said strong change management perspective must be applied and a performance-based specific budgeting model selected and implemented for the government.

The initiative began while Won Pat was serving as president of the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures (APIL). The first step is to conduct an actuarial study to determine the feasibility of such a regional health insurance system.

To push the implementation of the study, Won Pat sent letters to the health ministers of the FSM and RMI governments, requesting that they include in their application for unspent 2014 Compact funds, a grant proposal request to help fund a sustainable health care financing study.

Representatives from the FSM and RMI governments will be traveling to San Francisco next month to participate in the U.S -FSM Joint Economic Management Committee (JEMCO) and the U.S.-RMI Joint Economic Management and Fiscal Accountability Committee meetings, where unspent 2014 Compact funds will be discussed and reprogrammed.

Won Pat has asked the FSM to request \$400,000 to \$100,000 per state and the RMI to request \$100,000, thus providing a total of \$500,000 to fund the study.
