Committee Report Digest

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Higher Education, Culture, Public Libraries, and Women's Affairs convened a public hearing on Tuesday, May 17, 2016 at 3:00 p.m. in *I Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room. On the agenda was the consideration of the appointment of Francisco C. Lizama; Folks Art Representative, Council on the Arts and Humanities (CAHA) whose appointment history is as follows:

- Appointed by the Governor Edward Baza Calvo on April 7, 2016
- Appointment Packet forwarded to I Liheslaturan Guåhan on April 7, 2016
- Appointment Packet forwarded to the Committee on April 8, 2016.

Public Notice Requirements

All legal requirements for public notices were met, with requests for publication sent to all media and all Senators; 5 days notice was sent on May 10, 2016 and the 48 hours notice was sent on May 15, 2016 via email. Copies of the hearing notices are appended to the report.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. mentioned that the Committee on Higher Education, Culture, Public Library and Women's Affairs will conduct a public hearing room on the following appointment of Francisco B. Rabon; Folks Art Representative, Council on the Arts and Humanities known as CAHA, Francisco C. Lizama, Folks Art Representative, Council on the Arts and Humanities, and Bill No. 302-33 (LS) - An act to add a new § 849.12 to article 1 of chapter 8 of title 1 Guam Code Annotated, relative to naming the thirty four (34) Festival of Pacific Arts Village Houses "lugåt i manna ñaina-ta" and each house individually after heroes and leaders of the Chamorro Spanish War. A 5 days notice was sent on May 10, 2016 and a 48 hours notice was sent on May 15, 2016.

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. mentioned that 11 people signed up to show their support and called up Roxanne Garrido-Chang to testify.

Roxanne Garrido-Chang thanked Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. and Senator Mary Camacho Torres for listening to hear the support for the nominee. Ms. Roxanne Garrido-Chang mentioned that

she is in support of Mr. Lizama. Ms. Roxanne Garrido-Chang stated, "It is kind of biased because I am the niece, but more importantly I am here to support and let you know what you already know which he is the Master Blacksmith. I feel and truly believe this because of his passion and experience of the craft of blacksmith, nurturing, and teaching our children and teaching the art. We need him to pass it on. And I feel like he will be an excellent candidate."

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. called up Francisco C. Lizama.

Francisco C. Lizama stated, "My name is Francisco C. Lizama, also known as 'Corn Beef.' Actually, nobody knows me on this island by my name but by my nickname. So many years ago, this is the second time I am going to appear before the legislature. Many years ago, it was for the nomination for Fire Chief. As I look around, about what the job is for at CAHA, in making decisions. As far as my decision making is that I do it from the heart. When I look at when someone goes up for a master board, I hope that this decision is not like a freebie. It has to be genuine and not false. And that is what I look at for this, hopefully in the future; I will be of assistance to meet its requirements." Mr. Lizama asked the committee if there are any questions.

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. mentioned that she is happy to hear that Mr. Lizama is knowledgeable, skillful, genuine and passionate about the craft and not just for the title. Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. hopes that Mr. Lizama will bring that to the table. Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. stated, "I heard people who want to be recognize, I am not in any position to that, and that is where you come in. Everyone would like to have a title, but some of these types are different so I appreciate you saying that. In reviewing your packet you have a wealth of knowledge and experience. Throughout your experience and academic training but yet you have been able to master black smith. So you far surpassed as an individual being nominated, and we try to stretch as much as we can. I like would to say, you have others who have submitted written testimonies. And this will be included in the committee report. Similar to Mr. Rabon, I wholeheartedly support your nomination and move forward so the committee report will be submitted the committee report. I am glad you accepted the nomination from the governor."

Senator Mary Camacho Torres stated, "Siñot, I just want to correct you on something I never knew you as 'corn beef' and I have a hard time calling you by corn beef, I always knew you as Siñot Lizama. I remember you when you were in the Department of Chamorro Affairs Board, and a lot of times I seen you out when they have cultural events and crafts that are being showcased. And one of the things that you and I talked about were, what can we do to expand it and to perpetuate the crafts and to teach the traditional skills here on Guam. And one of the hardest thing is that a lot of people are working jobs, or they don't have money for resources to either by the tools or the materials. They cannot take their passion for learning something, because they do not have the resources. How then we take a trade and teach it and expand it, so they can build and learn. Is that something that you are interested in as a board member?"

Francisco C. Lizama responded, "Yes."

Senator Mary Camacho Torres mentioned that we need to look at the teachers; to teach our kids, we need resources such as wood, rope to perpetuate our arts.

Francisco C. Lizama mentioned that when he looks at the senior citizens center, they are all dying, because they are not being active. They need to be dancing, showcasing their way of life. They need to go out there, no matter what race they are and show case their trades and art to the children, to teach the way of life.

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. just like the artist who used to play the Bileombutuyan.

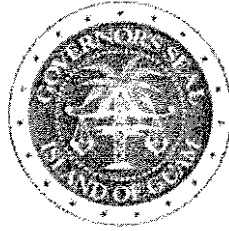
Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. stated, “Based on the discussion, that is something CAHA should look into. We are adding different types of cultural practices. And it is not just the arts, other types of arts, like how to make Bileombutuyan, how to make Tuba, so I am hoping then that you take it up one notch up, to expand it beyond what they are doing. So I go to CAHA and every night they have in display like what you do and what others do should be part of our culture. I love the idea of senior citizens center, our Manârnko’ to teach and tell the stories to the children what they know and what they can pass on before they pass on.”

Senator Mary Camacho Torres stated, “What I respect the most is that you are humble and rooted. It is not about making a product and making money. It’s a mission with you. And I understood it, about where we are going with our culture and who is learning and what can start. It’s a very practical vision. Senator Mary Camacho Torres lastly mentioned, she who heartedly supports the nomination.

Speaker concluded the Public Hearing.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Higher Education, Culture, Public Libraries, and Women’s Affairs to which was referred the appointment of Francisco C. Lizama; Folks Art Representative, Council on the Arts and Humanities (CAHA) whose term expires December 31, 2020 does hereby report out with the recommendation to DO CONFIRM.

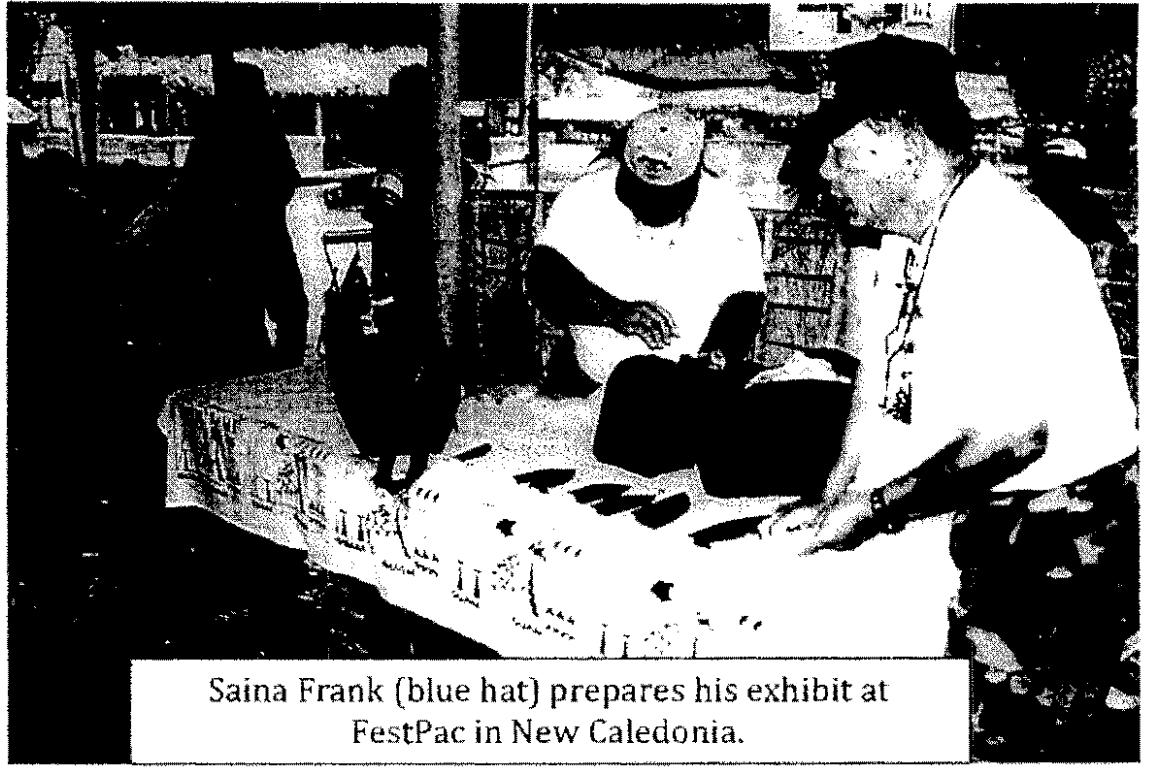
