



Committee Report Digest

I. <u>OVERVIEW</u>

The Committee on Higher Education, Culture, Public Libraries, and Women's Affairs convened a public hearing on Tuesday, May 17, 2016 at 3:00 p.m. in *I Liheslatura*'s Public Hearing Room. On the agenda was the consideration of the appointment of Francisco B. Rabon; Folks Art Representative, Council on the Arts and Humanities (CAHA) whose appointment history is as follows:

- Appointed by the Governor Edward Baza Calvo on April 25,2016
- Appointment Packet forwarded to I Liheslaturan Guåhan on April 26, 2016
- Appointment Packet forwarded to the Committee on April 27, 2016.

Public Notice Requirements

All legal requirements for public notices were met, with requests for publication sent to all media and all Senators; 5 days notice was sent on May 10, 2016 and the 48 hours notice was sent on May 15, 2016 via email. Copies of the hearing notices are appended to the report.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. mentioned that the Committee on Higher Education, Culture, Public Library and Women's Affairs will conduct a public hearing room on the following appointment of Francisco B. Rabon; Folks Art Representative, Council on the Arts and Humanities (CAHA), Francisco C. Lizama, Folks Art Representative, Council on the Arts and Humanities (CAHA) , and Bill No. 302-33 (LS) - An act to add a new § 849.12 to article 1 of chapter 8 of title 1 Guam Code Annotated, relative to naming the thirty four (34) Festival of Pacific Arts Village Houses "lugåt i manma ñaina-ta" and each house individually after heroes and leaders of the Chamorro Spanish War. A 5 days notice was sent on May 10, 2016 and a 48 hours notice was sent on May 15, 2016.

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. acknowledged the presence of Senator Mary Camacho Torres.

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. mentioned that 10 individuals signed in support of the nomination of Mr. Francisco Rabon and called up Eileen Meno who represents the tribal council to testify.

Ms. Eileen Meno stated, "Hafa Adai my name is Eileen Meno. Since the year 1992, I have studied under Francisco B. Rabon as a student from Inarajan High School up to the present day. Under his tutelage, he has helped to develop many programs, under his program that help continued the program and the promotion and perpetuation of the Chamorro language and culture through the form of dance and through his tutelage and guidance he has set many fundamentals. He was very instrumental in guiding many people to believe in who we are as indigenous people to this island and I am here on behalf of my brothers and sister of the Chamorro traditional dance genre, and on behalf of them we fully support the nomination of Mr. Rabon. I believe that his participation in the folk arts aspect at CAHA will fully impact and continue to impact the community as he done so in the many years as the mentor, director, and owner of Taotao Tano. So he has directly contributed and impacted many lives. So through this nomination along with my brothers and sisters I fully support as well as the children who has come across in this journey alongside him. Saina Ma' åse."

Ms. Rose Mantanona stated, "Hafa Adai si Rose Mantanona yu', I am the fafa'någue of I Guma'taotao tano' gaige giya San Diego, California, and I fully support the nomination of my Saina Francisco B. Rabon to be appointed and represent our cultural dance genre with all the Guma's whether it is on island, CNMI, Japan, or across the United States. Clearly, that signifies the magnitude of how our saina has definitely has impacted our lives. And we therefore have gone forward to continue to spread that knowledge with the rest of our students that we have come across through time. I don't know what else to elaborate on, needless to say, Mr. Frank has established a visual aspect of how some body can depict our way of life. I too was in Inarajan High school with Saina Eileen, and since then we became basically his catalyst, we became the founding building blocks for this dream. With 12th Festival of Pacific Arts being on Guam I am hoping that we can capture this in a time capsule so that when the delegations come in they can certainly see a glimpse of our rich history and our past as supposed to us passing out a c.d. or trying to come out with 15 different versions of who we think we are. So the identity of our people are vividly clear and the younger generation can come and be educated for an after school program. So this is beneficial for our Saina to be on the CAHA board."

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. thanked Ms. Rose Mantanona for her testimony and called up Francisco B. Rabon to testify.

Francisco B. Rabon mentioned that he is here to sit down with the committee to further understand his nomination and the intention of the CAHA board. He asked the question, "Why is the CAHA board under the direction of the Department of Chamorro Affairs."

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. stated, "I am going to answer, based on the actions of the governor. The governor, even in the previous administration attempted to do some reorganizing to consolidate some agencies to avoid redundancies and to cut back on expense in terms of having directors and deputy directors. In this particular case, at the Department of Chamorro Affairs, CAHA was incorporated into the Department of Chamorro Affairs, the Museum, the Library, in the hopes to cut expenses. And is now headed by one director and that is Mr. Cameron. That is how we can see departments or agencies that are small that can still make one large departments. Similar to Ancestral Land Trust and the Chamorro Land Trust, all fall under one department, the Department of Land Management. So they try to find departments and agencies of the same matter and put them in under one. The structure of the board remains, that has not change and I think primarily because some of the functions of CAHA are different than the other. So at least in that part the board members are active. And that's why now, you have your appointment. Now, the other question in terms of you being a member at one time of course for Fest Pac that by law that was created 3 terms ago when Guam was going to put its bid for Fest Pac. The bill was written its set up the makeup of the members of the Fest Pac committee, other than those mandated by law, the governor appoints all others. That why you see many of these changes. That's why all stayed, because it was required by law."

Francisco B. Rabon mentioned that now that everything is clear, that he has documents to include a Resume, a complete biography, as well as credentials in regards to the work that he has been doing as a cultural practitioner. He also mentioned that the documents provided stipulates many of the grants that has been a part of writing and implementation as staff under Pa'a Taotao Tano', a non-profit organization. Mr. Rabon also mentioned that he has also been very active in a lot of nonprofit organizations primarily in the cultural aspects of our people's indigenous identity and within the community with the preservation of the Chamorro language and culture. Mr. Rabon also mentioned that if it is what the nomination is seeking, then he feels that he is very much honored. Mr. Rabon lastly stated, "I don't need to read this for you but for it to be placed in records. If there is nothing else now, I am clear with what the board is about and that is what I want."

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. thanked Mr. Rabon for accepting the nomination by the governor to be in the CAHA board. Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. stated, "I don't think there is no one on island that can testify to the fact that you are not qualified, because right here before me with your application are volumes that you put down for work experience and festival participation. For somebody who have accomplished so much, you're truly a master at what you do. Where all your students at St. Francis all became masters themselves. I want to thank you for offering your time. You are not going to get any push back from me, you have my full support. I don't anticipate any of my colleagues not supporting you. We will prepare the committee report and put your confirmation up for vote."

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. asked if Senator Mary Camacho Torres has anything to say, before Mr. Rabon leaves to greet the delegation that is coming in.

Senator Mary Camacho Torres stated, "Mr. Rabon I just want to acknowledge that we have

watched you for many years and we are always impressed. I am hoping that when you get into the CAHA board that you remember what it took to get where you are and hopefully you can bring that to the table. What it is to get other people who are really in no position right now to start up to get them inspired to start up. And the only way to grow this forest in our tradition is to plant one seed at a time and to get others not only on your influence but other people that you may have not worked with or who don't know you to also start something up on their own. So that is what I am looking forward to with having someone like you. You have gotten to a really great place, but you started somewhere, where maybe it was just a dream that grew a spark somewhere, somewhere deep. So Si Yu'os Ma'ase. I will most importantly support your nomination."

Speaker concluded the Public Hearing.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Higher Education, Culture, Public Libraries, and Women's Affairs to which was referred the appointment of Francisco B. Rabon; Folks Art Representative, Council on the Arts and Humanities (CAHA) whose term expires December 31, 2020 does hereby report out with the recommendation to D CONFIRM.

BIOGRAPHY Taotao Tano'/Francisco B. Rabon

Hafa Adai, my name is Francisco B. Rabon, AKA, Frank or Uncle Frank to everyone, and a Chamorro by birth, born and raised on the Island of Guam. I am 60 years old and have spent a majority of my life on island, as well as spending time traveling and educating myself off island. I am the 7th of 10 children of Jesus Bontugan & Rosa Benavente Rabon (familian Tugan (Bontugan), Kokora (Cepeda), Lalu (Rivera), yan Bobu (Benavente). I was raised in the traditions of my ancestors, prior to development entering our island, in the village of Barrigada. I speak, write and read the native language fluently, and I am very familiar with the old and new ways of the traditions of my people. I have always been a lover of arts in its various medium, both traditional and contemporary, and I've always found the history and cultures of my people and others fascinating. Despite the technological influences on our island, traditions have always been held very special in my family's upbringing. Coming from a fairly large family the influences have assisted me in taking and molding the path I have chosen today. The close extended family upbringing, which is engraved in our culture, (ina'fa maolek para I familia), also has played a major role in molding me as an individual today. I have learned to take pride and cherished my identity as a Chamorro, knowing the history and genocide that has occurred towards our people throughout the years. Because of this I hold dear to my heart the importance of my indigenous heritage, knowing just how much have been lost, through outside influences. I also understand and respect others of culture who are struggling to preserve their heritage.


Growing up I was exposed more to the borrowed traditions of the Chamorro, the 400 years of Spanish Colonization, and the American contemporary forms of dancing. Information concerning the Taotao Tano period was never introduced simply because it was not easily acquired. Eventually books, manuscripts, and periodicals started to surface about the origins of the Chamorro people and its history. This historical information started to interest me so I ventured into researching more about my ancestors, particularly in the field of chanting, songs, and ceremonial dances. The more in-depth I researched I realize that the writers were vague in documenting the lifestyles especially dancing of the Taotao Tano period, which lead me to believe that the only way to established the existence of my people, prior to outside influences, was through re-creation of one's traditions, This is what lead me to dedicating the last 32 years towards re-creating, perpetuating,



and educating the existence of Taotao Tano, by forming Guma Taotao Tano'. This organization was established with the philosophy that any member carries the following statement. (1) That we take from the past combined with the present and build for the future. (2) That we instill in future generation the pride of the existence of the Chamorro people and her traditions. (3) That through performances we educate and share, to others, the uniqueness, of the indigenous traditions of our people. (4) That we respect others of culture in their struggles to preserve their indigenous traditions.

My interest in dancing started at an early age, being influence in borrowed Chamorro culture (Spanish) and Western Contemporary forms of dancing. For the past 40 years I have been using my knowledge of dancing professionally, particularly in the field of culture. My first exposure to indigenous cultural dancing was 1970, under the direction of Kumu Hula Janelle Kawa, from Hawaii. She taught me indigenous pacific dances in its true form, as it was past down from Ui Lani O Polynesia was the contractual name for the group generations. performing at the Hilton Hotel, Guam, (1972). During my participation in the group I started to absorb and compare the similarities in dance forms within the pacific region. It also transcended onto the Asian region being that theoretically we originated from the Austronesian Speaking Tribes of Taiwan (Formosa). I left the island in 1976 to pursue my education abroad and continued dancing in the United States, (Hawaii, Washington, Oregon, and California), just to keep up with my knowledge of cultural dancing. Upon my return to Guam in 1983, I became active again in the entertainment business, performing at the Pacific Islands Hotel. I was also asked by a former dance friend to assist in the teachings of cultural dancing to young local kids interested in learning. After assisting her for eight months she requested that I take over the group because she was returning back to Hawaii. This was the beginning of Taotao Tano Cultural Dancers (Guma Taotao Tano') ... This was the beginning of the thirty-two years of dedication I have devoted to recreating and re-establishing the indigenous Chamorro culture of songs, dances, and chanting.

In the thirty-two years as the director of Guma Taotao Tano', I have recreated and establihed basic standard dance steps, that are now accepted and recognized as represententive of our people's 4,000 year old existence. Basic dance steps such as; (*apunta, hinanao, pokkat, fisga, uritao, krusa, tolaika, panglao, paluma, khakhak, sitculo, galoppe, kadiding, totbus, sekat, galaide, lina'la*), are just a few that have become standards in all of the Chamorro performing arts group (Guma). I have also created dance movements that depict our indigenous lifestyles prior to colonization influencing our indigenous heritage.



Dance movements such as: (Bailan Lina'la, Bailan Uritao, Bailan Gapotulu, Bailan Galaide, Bailan Fisga, Bailan Tunas, Bailan Fa'i, Bailan Palito, Bailan Fayao, Bailan Sekat), are also mainstream dance movements with all Chamorro performing arts group (Guma). As the director of Guma Taotao Tano' I have re-established the (rites of passage - Chalan Lina'la/Chalan Fuetsa), so that members of Guma Taotao Tano' will truly understand the value of the path they have chosen as cultural practitioners of our Chamorro language and culture. As a young boy I witness many of these process (rites of passage) applied to members of our village community as they aspired to become prayer leader (Techa) and healers (Suruhanas/o). I took the knowledge and applied it to the Chamorro performing arts, and has become a standard practice to all members of an established cultural house (Guma). I have also composed many songs and chants depicting our indigenous heritage, legends, and lifestyles of our Chamorro people. I have also authored and published articles and literatures documenting the path that many members of Guma Taotao Tano' took in joining me in establishing what is now mainstream Chamorro dance.

In the thirty-two years that Guma Taotao Tano existed numerous recognition has been bestowed upon the group for continued perpetuation and preservation of the Chamorro traditions. I as the director/choreographer have been honored the "MASTER OF CHAMORRO DANCE" and "LIFE TIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD" by the Council of the Arts and Humanities. As a performing group we have travel to many countries to share and learn the beauty and importance of one's culture in this ever-changing world. As educators we have strive to instill a sense of identity to the people of Guam, and the importance of preserving and perpetuating the traditions of our ancestors. We continue on the path that are ancestors have struggle before us, knowing that we have only started to rekindle the fire that burns within the hearts of our people. May we hold dear to our hearts the saying "SUSTENI I KUTURAN I CHAMORRO SIHA, I MAN MAPOS, PAGO YAN I MAN MAMAILA", for the sake of future generations and for our people.

This non-profit organization was created through my partnership with the late Speaker Carlos Taitano who recommended that by applying for federal grants through the Administrative of Native Americans we could further the mission of cultural preservation, perpetuation, promotion, and education of the Chamorro Culture of (songs, chants, dances, and weaving), that was established by Taotao Tano' Cultural Dancers in 1983. As the creative directive of Pa'a Taotao Tano' we have provided cultural services to the community of Guam, Department of Education, Guam Visitors Bureau, Government of Guam's cultural agencies (Council of the Arts and Humanities and Department of Chamorro Affairs). In the 10 years of Pa'a Taotao Tano's existence we have provided the following cultural programs.

- 1998 Organization created.
- 2001 Present Organization was Incorporated as a Non-profit organization.
- 2003 Present Established Dinana Minagof Chamorro Dance Competition/Festival in partnership with Gef Pa'go, Inalahan, and now has been the signature cultural event for Pa'a Taotao Tano'. With all this accomplishments and travels I have been blessed to have met many great esteem individuals who have dedicated their lives for the preservation of their people's traditions. They have in some ways encouraged me to continue the path I have chosen. Taotao Tano' in its existence has produce 7 generations of members, and their continued dedication to the mission has inspired me to remain within my chosen path, and continue passing on the knowledge that my ancestors have taught me.

I am optimistic that the flame continues to burn in the hearts of the members of Guma Taotao Tano' and transcends unto the coalition of Chamorro Groups. Hopefully the branches of the tree will fall and sprout new seedlings, and spread like wildfire.
