#### **OVERVIEW**

The Committee on Rules, Federal, Foreign and Micronesian Affairs; Human and Natural Resources, Election Reform, and Capitol District convened a public hearing on Wednesday, October 5, 2016 at 9:00 A.M. in the Public Hearing Room of I Liheslaturan Guåhan. Among the items on the agenda was the consideration of on the appointment of Mr. Jesse B. Rosario to serve as a Member of the Guam Ocean and Fisheries Management Council [Length of Term (4) Four Years] whose appointment history is as follows:

- Appointed by Governor Eddie Baza Calvo on September 13, 2016;
- Appointment packet forwarded to I Liheslatura on September 14, 2016;
- Packet forwarded to this committee for public consideration on September 15, 2016.

Hafa adai and Good morning Mr. Chairman (Senator Rory J. Respicio) and members of the  $33^{\rm rd}$  Guam Legislature,

My name is Jesse Blas Rosario, I am a citizen of Guam, born and raised on this beautiful island of ours. I am here before this committee on a nomination by *I Maga'lahen Guahan*, Governor Eddie Baza Calvo to serve as a **Committee**Member on the Guam Ocean and Fisheries Management Council for a four

(4) year term with the advice and consent of *I Liheslaturan Guahan*. I am a lifelong fisherman/peskadot starting at a very young age of seven (7) with my family, the Familian Tenbat, a fishing family for generations. Fishing is my passion and I am strong advocate and steward of our Ocean and Fresh water ecosystem and marine resources. To ensure that our ocean and freshwater resources are cared and protected, I've obligated my time and effort to engage and participate in various organizations and committees that serve to develop

conservation and management policies as well as perpetuating our traditional

and cultural practices involving our ocean and freshwater. Listed are some of my involvements.

I am an active member and Board Secretary to the Executive Board of the Guam Fishermen Cooperative Association (GFCA), and had served as Guam's representative on the NOAA Marine Fisheries Advisory Council (MAFAC), a member of the Recreational Fisheries Working Group (RFWC). I currently serve as the Advisory Panel member for the Marianas Fisheries Ecosystem Plan (FEP) team for the Western Pacific Regional Fishery Management Council (WPRFMC) located in Hawaii which is regulated and mandated by the Magnuson-Stevens Conservation and Management Act (MSA). While serving under the WPRFMC I've gained valuable knowledge and gained numerous contacts and friends abroad. I've also gained personal knowledge and experiences on fisheries management and conservations, attending scoping meetings with stakeholders on best practices on fisheries management and conservation. These meetings also provided the opportunity to listen to the stakeholders from various Pacific Island Nations (Hawaii, American Samoa, CNMI and Guam) on their fisheries challenges and issues. Through the Council, I've also learned to engage with Council Officers seeking their advice, the relative provisions and an understanding of the Magnuson-Stevens Fisheries Conservation and Management Act (MSA), the core manual for our existence. The Guam Ocean and Fisheries Management Council is a newly created Council for Guam, its Ocean, Freshwaters and Fisheries and my involvement and role is to ensure this Council fulfills the duties and obligations by promulgating the provisions of Public Law 33-144 formerly Bill No. 160-33. As a Council member. I will work with my Council colleagues to coordinate and promote conservation

and sustainable development of Guam's Ocean, fisheries, and marine resources; develop, impose and issue permits for the general public based on the approved Schedule of Fees; oversee the expenditure and management of funds in the Guam Ocean and Fisheries Conservation and Development Fund; to provide advice and information to *I Maga'lahen Guahan* and to *I Liheslaturan Guahan*; to develop programs to enhance and promote sustainable use of Guam marine and freshwater resources; and to collaborate with Department of Agriculture in the expenditures of the funds derived from marine activities, or federal grants, and other ocean, fisheries and marine related funding; to seek legal advise from the Attorney's General Office on the creation ocean and freshwater use policies, regulations and fees. To provide public education and awareness on the Guam's Ocean, Freshwater and Fisheries rules and regulations. And to network and partner with both the private and government sectors
