COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

The appointment of **Mr. Peter S. Calvo** to serve as Executive Director of the Civil Service Commission was executed by Governor Edward J.B. Calvo on March 4, 2016. The appointment packet was received by the Office of the Speaker Judith T. Won Pat on March 9, 2016, and was subsequently referred to the Committee on Appropriations and Adjudication on the same day.

The Committee on Appropriations and Adjudication convened a confirmation hearing on Friday, March 18, 2016, beginning at 10:00AM in the Guam Legislature Public Hearing Room. The first item on the agenda was the appointment of Mr. Peter S. Calvo to serve as Executive Director of the Civil Service Commission. The confirmation hearing for the appointment of Mr. Peter S. Calvo began at 10:02AM and ended at 10:27AM.

Public Notice Requirements

All legal requirements for public notices were met, with requests for publication sent to all media and all Senators on March 11, 2016, and March 16, 2016, via email. Copies of the hearing notices are appended to the report.

II. TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

Chairman Cruz read the public hearing statements and called the confirmation hearing of Mr. Peter S. Calvo to order. He called upon the first panel of speakers to provide testimony.

Ms. Edith C. Pangelinan thanked Chairman Cruz, introduced herself as Chairwoman of the Civil Service Commission, and proceeded to read her written testimony (appended to this report), in support of Mr. Calvo's appointment.

Chairman Cruz thanked Ms. Pangelinan for her testimony. Chairman Cruz then prompted Mr. Alberto A. Lamorena V. to testify.

Mr. Lamorena greeted Chairman Cruz and members of the Committee on Appropriations and Adjudication (Committee) and proceeded to testify <u>in support</u> of Mr. Calvo's appointment.

"I am supporting [Mr. Calvo ("Pete")] [not only] because I feel he is qualified, but [also] because he is a proud John F. Kennedy High School Islander like myself. I've known Pete's family from Tamuning. We've lived across the street from each other [for] many, many years. I've seen his family grow. Actually, Pete, how many are in your family? Thirteen (13)? I quit counting after eight (8). But Pete and I [are] not only neighborhood friends, we've also grown to work together in the [government of Guam], from the terms of Governor Joseph F. Ada to Governor Felix P. Camacho to, currently, Governor Edward J.B. Calvo.

"I've seen his management and leadership skills, not only in the government, but [also] as [Chairman Cruz] had stated, in civic organizations. I know Pete has been active with local sports—taking after his dad, the late mayor of Tamuning, Gregorio Calvo, who really was one of the founders of Little League on Guam. And it's nice to see Pete get involved in not only the government, but also civically as well. I have full confidence in Pete. We worked very closely when he was at Agency for Human Resources Development (AHRD) under [Governor] Ada's Administration and likewise, [at] the Guam Energy Office with this administration. And I feel that the work that is still needed to be done will continue and move forward with his leadership. I encourage the Legislature to confirm him to the position of Executive Director of the Civil Service Commission. Thank you, Mr. Chair."

Chairman Cruz thanked Ms. Pangelinan and Mr. Lamorena for their testimonies. After excusing the first panel of speakers, the Chairman called upon the appointee, Mr. Peter S. Calvo, to testify.

Mr. Calvo thanked Chairman Cruz and proceeded to read his written testimony (appended to this report).

Chairman Cruz thanked Mr. Calvo for his testimony and took a moment to recognize the presence of Senator Mary Camacho Torres, whom the Chairman noted sponsored the legislation [Bill No. 81-33 (COR); Guam Public Law 33-55] that both Mr. Calvo and Ms. Pangelinan referenced in their testimonies. The Chairman also thanked Senator Torres for allowing him to co-sponsor the legislation.

Chairman Cruz continued:

"Pete, I was very happy that you came by and saw me. I'm even happier that you went in and saw some of the other senators. And I think you may have allayed some of their concerns which might account for their non-presence this morning, because they're confident in your capability and your willingness to accept this position. I'll let Senator Torres speak for herself, if she has any questions or comments."

Senator Torres thanked the Chairman and provided commentary on Mr. Calvo's appointment:

"Mr. Calvo, I also appreciate the fact that you came and visited with us. One of the sensitivities that we had as senators, and as people in the community who have families and friends who have worked for the government, [is that] we always want to ensure that their rights under the merit protection system are true and that there is no interference of politics in the appeal process. And one of the things [that] I was very happy to hear from you is [that] you also have had friends who have gone through the grievance process, so you have first-hand knowledge and sensitivity to just how weighty the decision of the commissioners is on the lives of people. And that's something I appreciate, because there's something about taking a position where the person that's aggrieved is a true person in your eyes. And you're always conscious of your duty to follow through for the benefit of all, in all fairness.

"But one of the comments that you made was looking at ways to improve the process. What Senator Cruz and I were thinking when we introduced [Bill No. 81-33], was to facilitate the process by giving the Civil Service Commission (CSC) additional resources through the Administrative Law Judge (ALJ). But I was wondering, in the short period that you had to work as [Acting Executive Director]—when I think about your comment on the case-loads continuing to grow—I wonder if there needs to be another process where perhaps the CSC, working in conjunction with the Department of Administration (DOA), has some type of an outreach, educational, or training program to facilitate other Human Resource (HR) departments within the government agencies. Because I wonder sometimes if you can alleviate a lot of the problems by ensuring that the managers, the HR directors and the managers, are well-trained and well-

informed about the processes and the personal rules and regulations. You alleviate the need to always have employees appealing any disciplinary action. What are your thoughts on that?"

Mr. Calvo responded:

"Senator, you hit it right on the nail. Training opportunities need to be expanded. I've talked to the staff and even the Attorney General's (AG) Office. And we're going to start looking at lining up training more frequently—temporarily, one (1) or two (2) a year—to beef it up to four (4) or one (1) every quarter. And what we've talked about with the AG's office, [with Deputy Attorney General Karl Espaldon] is that perhaps what we do is do a little testing as well, to see the level of learning they've achieved during the training cycle. We expended second-tier training to include case study and perhaps actually having them write up the adverse action or defend the grievance. And so [we are] trying to build up the confidence in representation and hopefully make it more accessible to the employee as well as more comfortable to the management to allow for that negotiated part to be inserted.

"It seems that the management would look at the final outcome rather than looking at the procedural correction that could have been taken. And so we'd like to expand the understanding of the CSC's responsibilities and make them more comfortable in addressing their concerns more civilly. Again, we still just started our talks regarding this training. [Attending] the adverse training action, both by the CSC and the AG, initiated part of that. But also, [in regards to] the AG's comment on withdrawing some direct AG support to departments, I know that some departments are very shaky to represent themselves. But we really need to address that and make everybody feel comfortable about the process so that they can learn to use it and use it effectively."

Senator Torres continued:

"I'm glad to hear that because one of my concerns also, in my experience going before the CSC when I was in a leadership position in the government, is [that] you have to sympathize and empathize with those employees who don't have the means to have counsel with them, to either hire an attorney or to engage someone who can represent them who is experienced in the CSC procedures. And what it really boils down to when you think about it is [that] the whole premise is a violation of the personnel rules and regulations, right? And so you would think that the managers within the agencies would have command of the personnel rules and regulations, and that the employees were fully informed and trained in what the regulations are within personnel rules and regulations. It should arguably be at that level where the action is among the manager and the

one who took the disciplinary action and the employee, and they should be able to hash it out without—you would think—without having to hire outside people. There's always a disciplined advantage, and I feel sorry for employees that are in agencies that have attorneys on staff or on contract. Imagine you're one little guy [or] one little woman up against management with hired guns. It's very intimidating, and at times I've heard [of] many employees that don't want to appeal because, first of all, they don't think they're up to par and, secondly, they're so intimidated. I think if we had a true merit protection system, we should have those considerations that [prevent] one man [from] feeling outmuscled, because he has his rights and we have our rights as employees. If we feel we didn't do anything wrong, we should be able to defend ourselves without that pressure. I've heard so many people say, "Basta ti bali!" ["I'm going to lose"]. Part of the loss is that they don't even know how to open their mouth. They're afraid."

Mr. Calvo replied:

"I believe, Senator, you are correct about the different resource levels that can be expended here. The individual doesn't have that capacity and that's why we want to make them feel comfortable, [and] even agree to have lay representatives. Because even the lay representative, properly trained, can be just as effective as a lawyer. I've seen it in my short time. Some of those issues that could be corrected right there had the lay representative or the management better versed in the process."

Senator Torres continued:

"But I also want to congratulate you and the commissioners. I have a great deal of respect for what you [all] do and the sacrifices you have to make. And I know it's more than most of us would be able to accomplish and so we want to thank you for your service as well. And also, Pete, in the short time you've been there, you've given it a lot of serious and sincere effort. I want to acknowledge that as well."

Mr. Calvo responded:

"I still give much credit to the staff and, of course, the commissioners and my predecessor. Just watching them in action has been really heartwarming for me to know their hearts are in the process and the rule of law. So I'm proud to be with this organization."

Senator Torres noted:

"And we're here to facilitate if there are ways you think this body can address any [issues]. We're more than open to help with that process. Never hesitate to

contact Senator Cruz and I. Si Yu'os Ma'ase."

Chairman Cruz commented:

"Pete, thank you very much. I think Senator Torres's suggestion on prevention is better than having to do all this work. Again, I want to join her in echoing our appreciation to the commissioners. You have five (5) members of the CSC who are all here—so they're all behind you. They might not have gone up to speak but they all signed in support. So you have their support, and as Senator Torres said, you have our ear if there's anything that you need to improve the system. But please take the suggestion of prevention—going out and teaching the managers how to go about filing [and documenting] adverse action but also teaching the employees that there are rules that they're supposed to follow themselves and not violate it.

"I think we can lessen the workload and not have to carry ALJs for the next ten (10) years at that expense. But thank you very much, and again, I thank the commissioners for their hard work and diligence in protecting the merit system, because as Senator Torres put it, it's the most important part of this government: protecting the rights of the employees who have earned and competed for their position in the government and who should not be denied their position for political reasons and should only suffer consequences if, in fact, they truly violated a rule or law of the agency. So I thank you and you have our support to get [this confirmation] through to session before the end of the month."

Mr. Calvo responded:

"Mr. Vice Speaker, as I've mentioned to you, I don't really leave it to chance, but I'm just so pleased and honored that everybody showed up today. Thank you."

Chairman Cruz thanked Mr. Calvo, On account that there were neither additional questions from the Committee nor other individuals present to testify, the Chairman announced the confirmation hearing of Mr. Peter S. Calvo as completed.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Appropriations and Adjudication to which was referred the executive appointment of Mr. Peter S. Calvo to serve as Executive Director of the Civil Service Commission for a term beginning on the date of his confirmation at the pleasure of Governor Edward J.B. Calvo, hereby reports out the appointment of Mr. Peter S. Calvo to serve as Executive Director of the Civil Service Commission with a recommendation TO CONFIRM

CONFIRMATION HEARING TESTIMONY PETER SALAS CALVO

As Director of Civil Service Commission March 18, 2016, 10:00 am, Guam Legislature

BUENAS, HAFA ADAI AND GOOD MORNING HONORABLE SENATORS. CHAIRMAN CRUZ AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE ON APPROPRIATIONS AND ADJUDICATION, SI YU'OS MA'ASE FOR AFFORDING ME THE OPPORTUNITY TO COME BEFORE THIS IMPORTANT COMMITTEE.

WHEN MY FRIEND, FORMER SENATOR ALBERTO LAMORENA THE III, "Tony", ASKED IF I WOULD CONSIDER BEING RECOMMENDED FOR THE POSITION OF CIVIL SERVICE DIRECTOR, I WAS EXTREMELY HUMBLED THAT EVEN AS A FAMILY FRIEND, GROWING UP BEHIND HIM AND THE GROUP OF MY OLDER BROTHERS AND SISTERS, THAT HE WOULD FEEL COMFORTABLE TO ASK IF I WOULD CONSIDER SUCH AN HONORABLE POSITION. THE PRIDE SHOT THROUGH ME LIKE A GUST OF WIND, AND EVEN IF THAT WAS ALL IT WOULD AMOUNT TOO, I WOULD BE SATISFIED JUST BEING ASKED.

BUT EVEN MORE HAPPENED AS HE REQUESTED I OBSERVE A HEARING BEFORE THE COMMISSIONERS. AS I OBSERVED THE INTERACTION OF THE PARTIES AND THE OPEN LINE OF QUESTIONS AND FINALLY THE COMMISSIONERS OPEN DELIBERATION, I WAS IN AWE OF THE ASTUTE KNOWLEDGE OF THE CASE, STRENGTH OF RESOLVE, COURAGE OF COMMITMENT, AND THEIR TRANSPARENT DISCUSSIONS, ALL BEFORE THE OPPOSING PARTIES. AND I THOUGHT TO MYSELF, I WANT TO BE LIKE "MIKE"...LIKE THEM, COMMITTED TO DO THE RIGHT THING. IMANGINE MY PRIDE AND THE HONOR I FELT WHEN THE COMMISSION VOTED IN FAVOR OF MY RECOMMENDATION AS CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION DIRECTOR TO THE GOVERNOR.

THAT'S WHEN I THOUGHT..., GROWING UP I HAD EXPERIENCES THAT MAY RELATE TO FOLLOWING THE RULES, THE SENSE OF FAIRNESS, AND JUSTICE THE COMMISSIONERS DEMONSTRATED. I PLAYED, COACHED, MANAGED, COORDINATED, AND ADMINISTERED VARIOUS SPORTS ALL MY LIFE. I STOOD UP FOR MY YOUNGER BROTHERS EVEN OPPOSING MY OLDER BROTHERS. I HAVE STOOD BESIDE THOSE WHO WERE BEING

PICKED ON BY MY FRIENDS. I HAVE ALWAYS TRIED TO DO THE RIGHT THING - TO BE FAIR AND TO SEE JUSTICE PREVAIL. PROFESSIONALLY, AS THE FORMER DIRECTOR OF THE AGENCY FOR HUMAN RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT (AHRD), I REQUESTED FOR THE REGION NINE REPRESENTATIVE TO VISIT GUAM DURING THE BASE DOWNSIZING, WHEN THE MILITARY WAS NOT FORTHCOMMING ABOUT DISLOCATED WORKERS, FOR WHICH AHRD WAS RESPONSIBLE TO TRACK AND ASSIST. AT PARKS AND RECREATION, I ENFORCED NO PARKING ON THE BEACHES, BURNING ON THE GROUNDS, PERMIT FEES AND DEPOSITS, CONSTANT MONITORING OF ANIMALS ON PARK PROPERTIES, VENDOR REQUIREMENTS, AND HISTORIC RESOURCES..., EVEN IF IT WASN'T POPULAR. AS VICE MAYOR OF TAMUNING — TUMON, I HAD RECEIVED NUMEROUS CONCERNS REGARDING WIDE RANGING ISSUES FROM ALL SECTORS OF THE COMMUNITY WHICH REQUIRED INTERVENTION, MEDIATION, OR ABITRATION, SOMETIMES ALL WITHIN ONE CASE.

THE PAST FEW WEEKS THAT I HAVE HAD THE OPPORTUNITY TO WORK WITH THE STAFF AT THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION HAVE BEEN TRULY REWARDING AND ENLIGHTENING AND SHOWED THEIR PROFESSIONALISM. THEIR KNOWLEDGE AND DEDICATION TO THE JOB WILL BE A TREMENDOUS ASSET FOR ME, AND CONTINUE TO BE A GREAT BENEFIT FOR THE EMPLOYEES AND MANAGEMENT OF THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM. I AM LEARNING A LOT ABOUT THE PROCESS. IN FACT, I SEE THE RESPONSIBILITY SIMPLIFIED AS ALL ABOUT PROCESS, FOLLOWING THE RULE OF LAW AND JUSTICE. THE COMMISSIONERS HAVE THE HARD TASK OF MAKING DECISIONS.

THE COMMISSIONERS, MY PREDECESSOR, "Tony", THE STAFF, AND THIS LEGISLATURE HAVE ACCOMPLISHED MANY THINGS. MOST RECENTLY, THE PASSAGE OF PUBLIC LAW 33-55 WHICH HAS NOW BECOME ANOTHER CORNERSTONE IN THE EVOLUTION OF THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION. I FULLY SUPPORT THE INTENT AND WE ARE WORKING HARD TO BRING THIS BENEFICIAL TOOL TO FRUITION FOR THE COMMISSIONERS TO UTILIZE. THE FOUR (4) ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGES (ALL) - ATTORNEYS, HAVE APPROVED THE TERMS AND A FINAL CONTRACT FOR EACH IS IN PROCESS FOR SIGNATURES.

CSC HAS BEEN WAITING FOR THE RECRUITMENT LISTING FOR THE PERSONEL MANAGEMENT ANALSIS AND THE LEGAL SECRETARY SUPPORTING THE ALIS.

ADDITIONALLY, DOA IS REVIEWING THE ALJ AND PERSONNEL ACTION RULES AND PROCEDURES. THE CSC STAFF IS 75% COMPLETE IN REVIEW OF THE ADVERSE ACTION RULES AND WE ARE WORKING ON A LEGISLATIVE ADMENDMENT TO SUBSECTION 4403d ON THE CLARIFICATION OF "NULL AND VOID".

WHILE THE HIRING OF THE ALI AND SUPPORT STAFF WILL INCREASE OUR CAPABILITY AND CAPACITY, CSC ALSO REQUIRES ADDITIONAL ADMINISTRATIVE STAFFING FOR PAYROLL, PROCUREMENT, AND CLERICAL SUPPORT. CSC IS WORKING TOWARDS THE CONTINUED ARCHIVING OF ALL DOCUMENTS, SPACE CONSOLIDATION, UPGRADE OF THE RECORDING EQUIPMENT AND COMPUTERS, TO PROVIDE VIDEO CAPABILITY, PROVIDE NOTEBOOKS TO COMMISSIONERS, AND UNIT POWER SUPPLY (UPS) FOR EACH COMPUTER. MOREOVER, CSC DOES NOT HAVE OFFICIAL TRANSPORTATION ASSETS.

AS A DIRECTOR, MY GOALS ARE TO PROVIDE PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT TO THE CSC STAFF AND MANAGEMENT; AND PROVIDE EDUCATIONAL OUTREACH TO AGENCY MANAGEMENT AND EMPLOYEES ALLOWING FOR CONFIDENCE IN LAY REPRESENTATION FOR EMPLOYEES AND MANAGEMENT.

THE CHALLENGES REMAIN GREAT WITH CASELOADS INCREASING STEADILY OVER THE YEARS. I WOULD BE HONORED TO BE A PART OF THE SOLUTION AND RESOLUTION THAT AFFECT THE LIVES OF OUR FELLOW EMPLOYEES AND HOPE YOU WILL CONSIDER GIVING ME A CHANCE. THANK YOU ONCE AGAIN FOR THIS OPPORTUNITY TO SPEAK BEFORE THIS COMMITTEE.


