



I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Higher Education, Culture, Public Library, and Women's Affairs convened a public hearing on Monday February 23, 2015 at 1:30 p.m. in *I Liheslatura*'s Public Hearing Room. On the agenda was the consideration on the appointment of Ms. Reyna A. Calvo as a member of the Guam Council on the Arts and Humanities Agency (CAHA) Board

Public Notice Requirements

All legal requirements for public notices were met, with requests for publication sent to all media and all Senators; 5 day notice was sent on February 13, 2015 and the 48 hour notice was sent on February 20, 2015 via email. Copies of the hearing notices are appended to the report.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Speaker Judith T. Won Pat Ed.D. stated for the record, "Buenas yan Hafa Adai, the Committee on Higher Education, Culture, Public Library and Women's Affairs will conduct a public hearing on the appointment of Reyna A. Calvo as a member of the Guam Council on the Artsand Humanities Agency (CAHA) Board followed by the Guam Museum Informational Briefing. A 5 day notice was sent on February 13, 2015 and the 48 hour notice was sent on February 20, 2015. Testimonies should be addressed to Speaker Judith T. Speaker Judith T. Won Pat Ed.D. also mentioned that she received testimony via email from Lisa V. Baza, Ph.D. in support of Ms. Reyna A. Calvo's confirmation.

Speaker Judith T. Won Pat Ed.D. called Ms. Monica Guzman, Ms. Hope Cortez, Dr. Judy Flores, and Mr. Joseph Cameron to testify on behalf of the appointee. Speaker mentioned if it is a written testimony that a copy should be submitted so it can be appended to the committee report. Speaker Judith T. Won Pat Ed.D. also mentioned to state your name, whether you are representing yourself, agency, or an organization and if you are in support of the nominee.

Ms. Monica Guzman mentioned that she is in support of the confirmation hearing for Ms. Reyna Calvo and her testimony is attached to the committee report. She mentioned that Ms. Calvo provides a rare breed to the CAHA board because she brings a different dimension coming from a background of social work and psychology. Ms. Guzman also mentioned that she can feel the excitement and hopes that Ms. Reyna Calvo will bring her experience and talents to the board.

Ms. Hope Pangelinan Cortez stated that she has a written testimonial and that she is not representing the Guam Board of Social Work, the American Medical Center, LLC, or the Military and Family Life Counseling Program; her written testimony is appended to the committee report in favor of Ms. Reyna A. Calvo.

Dr. Judy Flores stated that she is here to support the nomination and that she does not know Ms. Reyna Calvo personally. She also mentioned that she is impressed with her resume and that she is very excited as to what she can do for the board. Dr. Flores stated, "Like Monica said, Ms. Reyna A. Calvo will expand the talents of the arts council, so therefore I am here giving oral testimony in support of Ms. Reyna A. Calvo.

Mr. Cameron is in favor of the appointment of Ms. Reyna A. Calvo; his written testimony is appended to the committee report.

Speaker Judith T. Won Pat Ed.D. called the nominee Ms. Reyna Calvo to provide her testimony; her testimony is appended to the committee report.

Speaker Judith T. Won Pat Ed.D. mentioned that looking at the appointment packet and try to see the individual and not education or work experience. And just by reading your resume, the different dimensions such as drama therapy, arts, dance this creates nods from the audience who are agreeing. Speaker Judith T. Won Pat Ed.D. mentioned that she does not have any questions and that she is in support of the appointee. Speaker Judith T. Won Pat Ed.D. asked if any of the committee members have questions or comments.

Senator Mary Torres mentioned to encourage the young generation. She stated, "That you certainly have my support and to consider the artisans that put extra efforts. Senator Torres mentioned that a lot of the artists need more incentives and that the cost of producing art work is expensive and that artisans need venues to display their artwork.

Senator Tina Muña Barnes mentioned that looking at your resume I want to thank you for coming home. She also mentioned that you can make 10 to 20 times more back in the states, the experience training that you have is not easy to find. Stepping up to the plate and your dreams and wanting to share that and volunteer, for the CAHA board- it is a blessing thank you for stepping up to the plate. Senator Tina Muña Barnes stated, "You do have my vote." Senator Tina Muña Barnes also mentioned that CAHA is glad to have a beautiful woman, with all the talents you have I hope you can share that for us and bring it to the board.

Senator Nerissa B. Underwood Ph.D. mentioned that she was very excited about Ms. Reyna Calvo's testimony and background. Senator Underwood mentioned that one of the things that came through in graduate school was that the development of our children's conceptual framework where we were to give them the commutative skills and the reality even to solve problems or to be part of the community. Senator Underwood thanked the appointee for sharing her talents and that she in support of the confirmation hearing.

Speaker Judith T. Won Pat stated, "As of now we have 4 votes. And we want to thank you for your testimony."

Speaker Judith T. Won Pat also reminded that testimonies can still be provided; Speaker Judith T. Won Pat adjourned the hearing.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The current community service work Ms. Calvo is involved in pertains to providing services to veterans on Guam and in the region via the Red Cross. She underwent volunteer training as a facilitator for a Reconnection Workshop. This vital training will assist the veteran population and their families on Guam.

In conclusion, I believe that Ms. Calvo's qualification extends beyond the criteria as a board member of CAHA. Her expertise in the arts and humanities as well as her inherent commitment to volunteerism is demonstrated by her educational, professional and personal experiences. CAHA's mission relates to the development of programs in music, visual arts, cultural heritage, literature, and arts education. CAHA fosters opportunities for the participation in the arts and humanities. Their objectives include promoting the arts through promotional materials. Ms. Calvo will make a significant impact and addition to the CAHA board.


