



I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Higher Education, Culture, Public Libraries, and Women's Affairs convened a public hearing on Tuesday, March 22, 2016 at 5:30 p.m. in *I Liheslatura*'s Public Hearing Room. On the agenda was the consideration of Richard P. Sablan to serve as a member, Guam Community College Board of Trustees whose appointment history is as follows:

- Appointed by the Governor Edward Baza Calvo on January 28, 2016
- Appointment Packet forwarded to I Liheslaturan Guåhan on January 29, 2016
- Appointment Packet forwarded to the Committee on February 1, 2016.

Public Notice Requirements

All legal requirements for public notices were met, with requests for publication sent to all media and all Senators; 5 days notice was sent on March 15, 2016 and the 48 hours notice was sent on March 18 and 20, 2016 via email. Copies of the hearing notices are appended to the report.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. mentioned that the Committee on Higher Education, Culture, Public Library and Women's Affairs will conduct a public hearing on: the Appointment of Richard P. Sablan as a Member, Guam Community College Board of Trustees and Bill 230-33 (COR) "An Act to Add a New §849.11 to Article 1 of Chapter 8 of 8 GCA Relative Designating the Guam

and Chamorro Educational Facility Museum as the "Senator Antonio 'Tony' M. Palomo Guam and Chamorro Educational Facility".

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. mentioned that a 5 days notice was sent on March 15, 2015 and a 48 hours notice was sent on March 18 and 20, 2016 and that all testimonies should be addressed to Speaker Judith T. Won Pat, Ed.D. and will be accepted via hand delivery at the Speaker's office; Speaker's mailbox at reproduction room of the Main Legislature Building at 155 Hesler Place, Hagatna, Guam 96910; or fbtorres@judiwonpat.com or through facsimile at 472-3589.

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. called up Mr. Frank Arriola, President Okada, and Mr. Eloy P. Hara. Speaker mentioned to, "Please state your name, the agency/department, whether you support or oppose the nominee or the bill."

Mr. Frank Arriola stated that Mr. Sablan's service as a trustee over the past five years has been instrumental in the success of the Guam Community College. Mr. Frank Arriola is in full support; his written testimony is appended to the committee report.

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. called up President Mary A. Y. Okada.

President Mary A. Y. Okada thanked the senators for the opportunity. President Okada stated "... his professional insights into many of GCC's programs, especially our Apprenticeship training program, have been exceptionally valuable to the college, and to myself as president." Dr. Mary A.Y. Okada is in full support; her written testimony is appended to the committee report.

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. called up Mr. Eloy Hara

Mr. Eloy Hara thanked the senators for the opportunity. Mr. Hara mentioned that as a freshman board member, he can sound off of President Okada and Mr. Arriola. He also mentioned that he was able to attend a dozen of board meetings and work sessions where he experienced Mr. Sablan to be an innovative thinker with strong business acumen where his input towards policies, goals has been tremendous and very appropriate. Eloy Hara mentioned that he is in full support of Mr. Sablan's reappointment.

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. asked her colleagues if there are any questions for the board members.

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. called up Mr. Richard Sablan.

Mr. Richard Sablan's written testimony is appended to this committee report.

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. mentioned that Mr. Sablan has served on the board for five years, and now he has accepted a second set of five years to serve. Speaker asked, "As busy as you are, the three businesses that you are a shareholder of, how do you find the time to continue to volunteer being on this board?"

Mr. Richard Sablan replied, "I make the time, you have to make the time- it gets busy but when we meet with our trustees meetings I make the time to attend so we can move forward with the business of running the college.

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D asked, "So in your own words, and with an evaluation of your peers and the president, can you share what within five years you have contributed to the college?

Mr. Richard Sablan replied, "I don't know if I contributed specifically to any one particular thing, when we meet as a board, we meet to discuss issues that shape the policies for the college. We have discussions in length and each of us provides individual inputs regarding some of these issues and at the end of the day we all come together to vote on these issues. And these issues become policy from the board. Being part of the discussion, I am able to be part of the discussion using my experience from running my businesses in some discussions we have in some of our policies. We have a good board, we come from different backgrounds and it is with pleasure, we are all individually committed which makes it quite easy, actually."

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D asked, "So you're saying the college basically has grown, changed, and developed- what will you like to see in the next five years?

Mr. Richard Sablan replied, "I would like to see the trend continue, I think, all these new building, that are taken place over the old buildings is a testament, to President Okada, and her team's vision, there is more as we mentioned, more on the horizon, these are going to be a lot of room for commitment and progress. It is going to be good for students and good for the island."

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D asked her colleague for questions or comments

Senator N.B. Underwood thanked Mr. Sablan for being willing to serve another five years, and congratulated President Okada for the success. Senator N.B. Underwood mentioned that she has seen the growth at the Guam Community College, and that it is not the same as it was eight years, ten years ago. Senator N.B. Underwood asked, "With every success, come its challenges, and I am pretty sure this wasn't a straight line, I am wondering during your five years of experience, what were some of the challenges that you have come up with as a member of the board in seeing the goals that you have achieved?"

Mr. Richard Sablan replied, "From my personal experience one of the major challenges is finding the funding to secure some of these projects and a lot of the funding that have been secured has come from grants or loans. Our president has been astute in sniffing out these grants and funding opportunities and I think that is the testament to her savvy. But she has found the money and with the support from the board, we have been able to secure the different funding sources and we have been able to fund these projects. That has always been the problem is finding the funding sources. Most of our buildings have been funded by federal grants, so I am to happy say that the local tax payers have not been able to pull out too much from their pockets for these new buildings."

Senator N.B. Underwood asked, "So GCC has been offering two year associates degrees, do you see the college offering four year degrees that the University of Guam may not be offering in the future. Because there are community colleges that offer 4 year degrees. What are your talks on that?"

Mr. Richard Sablan replied, "In my personal opinion, if it has been already offered at the University of Guam, then it would be redundant, and I would not like to see the Guam Community College compete with the University of Guam. I would like the institutions to coexist and complement each other. But if there were opportunities to offer 4 year degrees that the university is unable to provide and the college in the position to do so, then I will be willing to support it.

Senator V. Anthony Ada stated, "Mr. Sablan, I like how you say moving forward. That is exactly what it is about, it's about progressing. And I would like to thank you for accepting the governors reappointment for the board of trustees and for your support and unending support to President Okada in seeking and insuring the Guam Community College is always out there looking for grants or looking for funding or whatever it needs, so that educational facility could be one of thee or if not the best community college out there. I tell you what has been going on over the past couple of years, we can't just talk about it, it's more than words can ever say, so moving forward, you have my vote and full support.

Senator Mary Camacho Torres asked, "When we attended a forum at the Guam Community College, one of the topics that came up from the student body was how to make education more accessible and affordable to the student. And one of the points was looking at online courses for students who could not access the college because of family needs, or health care needs, perhaps transportation, are that area that you as a board member is looking at in terms outreach to, is that has something that has come to the board?"

Mr. Richard Sablan replied, "To my knowledge I cannot recall, but certainly can look forward to making higher education or continued education available to those who want it. And those who are not able to attend classrooms due to obligations or other obligations impeding their ability, if online course can help, I will certainly look at it, and look at the cost involved in providing the education. We have to make sure they have the resources in the college to carry it through. If it works and it helps others get their higher education then it would have my support."

Senator Mary Camacho Torres replied, "I would certainly appreciate that. Because as we look at ways to enhance education, the community college offers services and opportunities to a certain niche of demographics and to students who people feel that there in not in a position to invest in four year university track. So I look forward in the good news of that from the board. So as we look forward in educational opportunities, we have to broaden what the traditional format for acquiring education would be for Guam as well. But Si Yu'os Ma'ase.

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. stated, "You are appointed by the governor at his pleasure, I will never forget, former Unpingco's advice, in the appointment to serve by the governor, you are basically the conduit between the college and the governor. I know fortunately, you have a president that is very astute finding funding whenever she can. I have been in conferences with

her, if no one has ever given money to her, she would make sure she would have a conversation with you to make sure she gets some money from you. I know her caliber, however, there are times when of course when the government is unable to, and one of the problems is the availability of funds, and then as an appointee have you ever taken out the time to approach the governor to be that person to encourage or defend and show the governor you have an institution, and a president that has done very well, and fortunately.

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. asked for any closing remarks.

Mr. Richard Sablan thanked his fellow board members for their support.

Speaker concluded the Public Hearing.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS




