BE IT RESOLVED BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF I

- MINA'BENTE OCHO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:
- 3 **WHEREAS**, the *Gef Pa'go* pavilion was no longer safe to shelter visitors
- 4 or to hold events because the roof needed replacement; and
- 5 **WHEREAS**, Gef Pa'go lacked the funding needed, but had a labor force
- 6 of historic building interns, Shawn Leon Guerrero, Daniel Diego, Luke
- 7 Paulino, Kenneth Atoigue, and Rodney Laniyo, funded by a training grant

- 1 from the Administration for Native Americans; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Gef Pa'go's training partner, Pacific Human Resource
- 3 Services, Inc (PHRSI), learned that the Guam Contractors Association was
- 4 looking for volunteers to build the Liberation Queen's stage in *Hagåtña* and so
- 5 traded the services of their interns to build the stage in exchange for the
- 6 building materials; and
- WHEREAS, Gef Pa'go interns and volunteers, under the direction of
- 8 PHRSI trainer John Pangelinan, built the huge stage in four (4) days, in time
- 9 for the July 1st Liberation Festivities opening, and thirty (30) days later,
- 10 demolished the stage; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Governor Felix P. Camacho, pending release of One
- 12 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) appropriated to Gef Pa'go by I
- 13 Mina'Bente Ocho Na Liheslaturan Guåhan, authorized various government
- 14 agencies to assist Gef Pa'go, a non-profit, community-service organization, so
- 15 that GIAA, GPA and GWA provided trucks to carry the materials to the Gef
- 16 *Pa'go* site in preparation for replacing the roof; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Supervisor Carlos Paulino, volunteer Roy Moore and
- 18 interns Shawn Leon Guerrero, Rodney Laniyo and Vernon Dulei began to
- 19 dismantle the old pavilion roof and discovered that the poles were too weak
- 20 to support a new roof; and
- 21 **WHEREAS**, Gef Pa'go Board of Directors Sherey Taimanglo, Cathy S.N.
- 22 Flores, Bill M. Paulino, Jimmy B. Mantanona, Eileen P. Flores, and Mayor
- 23 Franklin M. Taitague donated from their own pockets and solicited from
- 24 community members Gertrudes Castro, Mae Paulino, and Francisco P.

1 Camacho to purchase the initial bags of cement to begin the reconstruction;

WHEREAS, reconstruction of the poles had to be designed to use the original footings to avoid digging into the archaeological site below, so the Department of Public Works Engineering Division assisted with the architectural design, the Guam Waterworks Authority water treatment division donated used PVC pipe in which to pour cement, and the Guam Power Authority donated a crane to lift the pipes in place; and

WHEREAS, Hawaiian Rock Company donated a pump truck and nine (9) cubic yards of cement to fill the poles, and the Department of Corrections work crews spent five (5) full days of labor assisting *Gef Pa'go* crews in putting up the roof; and

WHEREAS, Ed and Lu Crisostomo of *Kusinan Gadao* cooked meals for the work crews, and additional meals and donations of food and other services were provided by *Gef Pa'go* Staff, Dr. Judy Flores, Barbara Mantanona, Betty DaHill, Margaret L.G. Hildebrand, Carlos M. Paulino, Roy Moore, Luis L.G. Paulino, Alison McKinnon, Yvonne McKinsey, Vince Reyes, Bernadita L.G. Niklaus, Francisco Naputi, Ignacio Taimanglo, Floren M. Paulino, Ana McKinnon, Jose Laniyo, Francine Tenorio, Tiara San Nicolas, Gineva Tenorio and the Bingo ladies Juliet M. Santos and Christine Cruz; and WHEREAS, Alfred Garthe and Wayne Lasater donated their professional services and roofing materials at cost, and Perez Bros., in

memory of Carmen and Francisco Perez, donated thirty-nine (39) cubic yards

of cement for the floor; now, therefore, be it
