6 importance of service and maintenance of vehicles for their safety and that of
7 the public, and to assure these services attain the level of customer
8 satisfaction; and

9 **WHEREAS**, with over forty (40) combined years in the factory dealer
10 circuit, RPM has gone to great lengths to incorporate every type of automobile
11 service at reasonable prices; and

12 **WHEREAS**, RPM emphasizes an educational approach to automobile
13 care, as automotive technicians try to teach customers how to better maintain

23 at the intersection of Route 16 and Route 10, Barrigada; and


24 **WHEREAS**, RPM bounced back from its difficulties and attained its six-

3 foundation of RPM's success; now, therefore, be it


4 **RESOLVED**, that the Executive Committee of *I Mina'Bente Ocho Na*
