Relative to recognizing the Vietnamese Heritage and the flag of the former Republic of Vietnam (South Vietnam) as the official symbol of the Vietnamese-American Community on Guam.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF I

MINA'BENTE OCHO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

- 3 WHEREAS, the current Vietnam Hanoi Communist Regime continues
- 4 to be a one party state ruled by an un-elected and unaccountable government
- 5 that continuously and arbitrarily infringes upon the human rights and
- 6 religious freedom of its people; and

WHEREAS, the end of the Vietnam conflict resulted in an exodus of 1 over two million (2,000,000) Vietnamese seeking political asylum and the 2 3 island of Guam, where America's day begins, was the first home on the free 4 world for those who bravely risked their lives to live under the prosperity of 5 democracy; and WHEREAS, the island of Guam became home for many Vietnamese-6 Americans, a community having made substantial contributions to our 7 8 culture, business, and commerce; and 9 WHEREAS, the vast majority of Vietnamese-American embrace the flag of their former country as the symbol of their community; and 10 WHEREAS, the flag of the former Republic of Vietnam (South Vietnam) 11 dating back to 1948, has long symbolized the resilience, freedom and 12 13 democracy of and for the Vietnamese community; and WHEREAS, the people of the former Republic of Vietnam were valiant 14 15 in their resistance to the aggression of communist North Vietnam, and the refugees from the Republic of Vietnam, who emigrated and settled in the 16 island of Guam, should be honored and remembered for their sacrifices; and 17 WHEREAS, the Vietnam Veterans of America, Chapter 668 endorses the 18 recognition of the Vietnamese Community of Guam's freedom flag of the 19

former South Vietnam; and
