3	WHEREAS, in 1969, Ann Hardin married Mr. John W. Hardin and they
4	have two (2) sons, David and Chris; and
5	WHEREAS, Mrs. Hardin currently holds a Masters Degree in Social
6	Work from the University of Missouri in 1985 and a Bachelors Degree from
7	the same university. She also has an Associate Degree from Los Angeles
8	Metropolitan College overseas; and
9	WHEREAS, from June 1992 to the present, Mrs. Hardin provided
10	counseling in the following areas: Child and Adolescence; Marriage; Divorce
11	Conciliations; Domestic Violence; Child Sexual Abuse; Rape and Sexual
12	Assault; and group work with Victims of Violence and Community
13	Education. She was very instrumental and an active participant in the
14	committee/task force established to explore the issues of family violence; and
15	WHEREAS, Mrs. Hardin is licensed to practice in Individual, Marriage
16	and Family Therapy on Guam. She is a member in good standing with the
17	American Counseling Association, and the National Association of Social
18	Workers, Guam Chapter; and
19	WHEREAS, from June 1985 to June 1992, Mrs. Hardin worked at the
20	Navy Family Service Center on Guam. She provided extensive counseling,
21	training, group facilitation and crisis intervention to individuals, married
22	couples, families and children of active duty and retired military personnel
23	and their dependents. Much of her caseload included women and children
24	who had been abused physically or sexually; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Hardin conducted numerous workshops and training in the areas of Stress Management; Family Violence; Child Sexual Abuse, Rape, Incest and Acquaintance/Date Rape. She also conducted workshops related to Assertiveness Training, and Marriage Enrichment; in May 1988, she founded and facilitated the Sexually Assaulted Female Enrichment Group (SAFE), a weekly group for any woman (military or civilian) who had been a victim of rape or sexual assault at sometime during her life; and **WHEREAS**, while employed at the Navy Family Service Center, Mrs. Hardin was a member of the Governor's Task Force on Child Sexual Abuse, Suicide and the counseling team available around the clock during Operation Desert Storm and other crises on the island including numerous typhoon

University of Guam from August 1990 to the present. She taught social work courses such as: Practice with Groups and Practice with Communities. She also taught classes in Family Violence on Guam; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Hardin, throughout her career of helping people, received numerous honors and awards recognizing her efforts, dedication and

recovery efforts. Mrs. Hardin has been an adjunct member of the faculty at the

In 1977, she received a "Certificate of Appreciation" from the Aberdeen Area Indian Health Service; a "Certificate of Appreciation" from the Board of Directors on Project Concern International in 1978; in 1984, she was listed in the "Who's Who Among Students in America Colleges and Universities"; in 1985, she was selected as the "Outstanding Graduate Student" by the School of Social Work at the University of Missouri, Columbia; in 1988, she received a "Certificate of Award for Outstanding Performance" by the Department of the Navy; Mrs. Hardin received a

resolution from the Guam Legislature in 1989 in recognition for her efforts on 1 2 the Child Sexual Abuse Task Force; in 1991, she was named the "Social 3 Worker of the Year" by the Guam Association of Social Workers; she also received another resolution from the Legislature as the "Social Worker of the 4 Year" from her Section; in 1994, she was listed as "Who's Who Among 5 Human Service Professionals"; in 1998 and 1999, she was listed in the "Who's 6 Who in America" and "Who's Who in the World", respectively; in 2002, Mrs. 7 Hardin was named "Woman of the Year" by the Bureau of Women's Affairs, 8 9 Guam U.S.A.; in 2004, she received the "Lifetime Achievement Award" from 10 the National Association of Social Workers, Guam Chapter; now, therefore, be 11 it 12 RESOLVED, that the Executive Committee of I Mina' Bente Ocho Na 13 Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on behalf of I Liheslaturan Guåhan and the 14 people of Guam, honor, commend and congratulate Mrs. Ann Hardin, MSW, ASCW, for all her hard work, dedication and contributions to the Superior 15 16 Court of Guam, its constituents and the people of Guam; and to extending a 17 dångkolo na si Yu'os ma'åse' for her accomplishments and personal 18 commitment to helping our community, both military and civilian, and our 19 people in need; and be it further
