- 5 resulting in one hundred-four (104) civilian deaths, nine hundred forty-eight

1 (948) injuries, and One Hundred Twenty-six Million Dollars (\$126 million) in

- 2 property damage each year in the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the latest statistics show that candle fires are on the rise,
- 4 with nine thousand nine hundred-thirty (9,930) reported in 1996 and eleven
- 5 thousand six hundred (11,600) in 1997, which is the highest total in the
- 6 eighteen (18) years for which statistics are available; and
- WHEREAS, in the year 2004, residential fires accounted for seventy-
- 8 eight percent (78%) of all structure fires; and
- 9 WHEREAS, the number of candle fires in the United States has tripled
- 10 since 1990; and
- WHEREAS, in 2002, an estimated eighteen thousand (18,000) home fires
- 12 started by candles were reported to fire departments, and said fires caused
- one hundred-thirty (130) deaths, one thousand three hundred-fifty (1,350)
- 14 injuries, and an estimated property loss of Three Hundred, Thirty-three
- 15 Million Dollars (\$333 million); now, therefore, be it
