1 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF *I***
2 ***MINA'BENTE OCHO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN*:**

3 **WHEREAS**, the island and people of Guam have suffered the loss of
4 one of their most prominent and influential citizens, Mr. Anthony Aflague
5 "Tony" Leon Guerrero, who passed away in his San Francisco home on
6 Sunday, October 9, 2005, where he had been residing for some months
7 while receiving medical treatment; and

1 **WHEREAS**, "Tony," as he was affectionately known to friends and
2 family, was born on June 19, 1952, one of three children of the late Jesus
3 Sablan Leon Guerrero and Eugenia Calvo Aflague Leon Guerrero; and

4 **WHEREAS**, in addition to his mother, Tony is also survived by his
5 wife Mari Flor Herrero and three children, Maria Eugenia, Alexandra and
6 Jesus; by his brother Jesse and his wife Deirdre; and by his sister Senator
7 Lourdes A. Leon Guerrero and her husband Jeff Cook and their families;
8 and

9 **WHEREAS**, Tony graduated from University High School in Los
10 Angeles in 1970 and majored in monetary economics at the London School
11 of Economics and Political Science at the University of London, earning a
12 BSC in 1976, later attending the Sloan School of Business at Stanford
13 University where he earned his Masters of Business Management in 1985;
14 and

15 **WHEREAS**, Tony began his banking career at the Bank of America in
16 San Francisco and began working at the bank his father helped to found,
17 the Bank of Guam, in 1974, holding a number of positions including
18 Commercial Loan Officer and Senior Vice President; and

19 **WHEREAS**, in 1992, Tony was named Vice Chairman of the Board of
20 Directors as well as President and Chief Executive Officer for the Bank of
21 Guam, positions he held until being appointed Chairman of the Board in
22 2002 upon the passing of his father; and

23 **WHEREAS**, in addition to his banking career, Tony was a strong
24 advocate for the promotion of culture and the humanities in Guam, serving

1 on the Boards of the Guam Humanities Council and Pacific Islanders in
2 Communications; and

3 **WHEREAS**, Tony was also a member of a number of civic, charitable,
4 commercial and community organizations including the American Cancer
5 Society (Guam Chapter), Guam Chamber of Commerce, Guam Banker's
6 Association, Micronesia Regional Tourism Council, Guam Political Status
7 Commission, Pacific Islands Development Bank, Young President's
8 Organization, Catholic Education Board of Trustees, Hagåtña Restoration
9 and Redevelopment Corporation, and the Congressional Hispanic Caucus
10 Institute; and


11 **WHEREAS**, Tony also made significant contributions to economic
12 initiatives within the region as Chairman of the Board of the Guam
13 Economic Development Authority, and he also served the people of our
14 island as a Regent on the Board of the University of Guam; now, therefore,
15 be it

16 **RESOLVED**, that the Executive Committee of *I Mina'Bente Ocho Na*
17 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the
18 people of Guam, express the great sadness and offer their most heartfelt
19 condolences on the untimely passing of this noted businessman,
20 community leader, and son of Guam, to the family of Mr. Anthony Aflague
21 "Tony" Leon Guerrero, and be it further


22 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker and the Chairman of the Executive
