1        **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF I**  
2 ***MINA'BENTE OCHO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:***

3        **WHEREAS, Mr. and Mrs. Roman L.G. and Maria "Mae" Cruz Quinata**  
4 **were married on October 22, 1955; and**

5        **WHEREAS, Mr. and Mrs. Roman L.G. and Maria "Mae" Cruz Quinata**  
6 **have been blessed with four (4) children all of whom have also celebrated the**

1   Sacrament of Matrimony: *Roman, Jr.* and *Annie Pereda Quinata, Josephine*  
2   *"Terry" Quinata* and *Michael Doyle, Francis "Frank" and Pamela Sgambelluri*  
3   *Quinata, and Senator John "JQ" and Donna Muna Quinata;* and are also the  
4   proud grandparents of eleven (11) grandchildren and seven (7) great  
5   grandchildren; and

6           **WHEREAS,** as a married couple and active members of our community,  
7   Mr. and Mrs. Roman L.G. and Maria "Mae" Cruz Quinata have and continue  
8   to contribute towards the prosperous growth of our Island; and

9           **WHEREAS,** Mr. Roman L.G. Quinata's service to our island community  
10   began when he served as an Advisor to the Local Chapter of the Boy Scouts of  
11   America and later joined the Guam Militia following World War II; and

12           **WHEREAS,** after serving two (2) years in the United States Army  
13   during the Korean War and after working as a Power Plant Electrician with  
14   the U.S. Naval Public Works Center in Guam, Mr. Quinata was elected by the  
15   residents of the Municipality of Talofofo to serve as their Commissioner for  
16   three (3) consecutive terms beginning in 1968; and

17           **WHEREAS,** as the Commissioner of Talofofo, Mr. Quinata was selected  
18   by other island Commissioners to serve as President of the District  
19   Government Council, and was instrumental in the implementation of one of  
20   Guam's first postal mail delivery systems and in organizing a variety of  
21   activities for the youth of Talofofo, many of which included sports such as  
22   basketball, football, and little-league baseball; and

23           **WHEREAS,** Mr. Quinata then worked for the Public Utilities Agency of  
24   Guam (PUAG) in different capacities, including Community Project  
25   Coordinator, Public Information Officer, and as Assistant Manager for the

1 Water Distribution Division, and would retire after more than thirty-three (33)  
2 years of combined service in different government of Guam entities, and later  
3 served as a member of the new Guam Waterworks Authority's Board of  
4 Directors; and

5 **WHEREAS**, Mr. Quinata's loving wife and lifelong partner, Mrs. Maria  
6 "Mae" Cruz Quinata, began her career as an Accountant with the Pacific  
7 Construction Company (PCC), and left the private sector as an Office  
8 Manager for the company; and

9 **WHEREAS**, Mrs. Maria "Mae" Cruz Quinata entered government  
10 service as an Accountant with the Department of Corrections, and shortly  
11 after, was employed at the Department of Public Health and Social Services as  
12 the agency's Comptroller; and

13 **WHEREAS**, Mrs. Quinata then worked for the Department of Labor,  
14 and retired after more than twenty-five (25) years of combined service in  
15 different government of Guam entities, and served as a member of the Guam  
16 Environmental Protection Agency's Board of Directors from 1994 thru 2001;  
17 and

18 **WHEREAS**, throughout her marriage, Mrs. Quinata has and continues  
19 to be active in a variety of charitable and religious organizations, serving as  
20 the Chief Financial Officer for Notre Dame High School; member of the  
21 Christian Mothers' Associations in the Municipalities of Inarajan and Talofofo;  
22 member of the Guam Memorial Hospital Volunteers Association since 1995  
23 (currently serving as President); member of the Island Board of Christian  
24 Mothers; and as Regent of the Catholic Daughters of the Americas, Court  
25 2047, Our Lady of Camarin, for two (2) terms; and


1           **WHEREAS**, throughout their fifty (50) years of marriage and in both
