TO COMMENDING AND RELATIVE CONGRATULATING THE UNITED STATES ARMY ON 230<sup>TH</sup> ITS **BIRTHDAY**, TO PRAISING IT FOR CONTRIBUTING OVER TWO **CENTURIES** OF OUTSTANDING SERVICE TO THE NATION AND THE WORLD, AND TO WISHING IT AND ITS DEDICATED MEMBERS WELL IN ALL THEIR FUTURE ENDEAVORS.

## 1 BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'BENTE OCHO NA LIHESLATURAN 2 GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, the Continental Army of what become the United States Army, was established on June 17, 1775, just as the Revolutionary War got underway, and was commanded by General George Washington, the Father of our Country who, after winning the War, became the First President of the United States, the Army, itself born amidst the gathering storm clouds of the American Revolution, having grown form the small band of Minutemen on Lexington Green to the finest fighting force in the world today; and

10 WHEREAS, from its birth on the Lexington Green to the present, the 11 Army has forged a proud history in defending the Nation with honor and 12 distinction in all its many wars and armed conflict, most notably in the Civil 13 War, World I and II, Korean Conflict, Vietnam Conflict, Panama, Grenada, 14 Persian Gulf War, and currently in our peace mission in East Timor in

Indonesia, Bosnia, Africa, Kosovo and the Araqi War ("Iraqi Freedom"); 1 including "Global War on Terrorism, and 2

WHEREAS, the Army's 77<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division played a major role in 3 liberating Guam from enemy occupation in World War II, making the people 4 of Guam forever grateful to the Army for its part in the island's liberation 5 fifty-eight years ago, and since the end of World War II, thousands of Guam's 6 young men and women have joined the United States Army, distinguishing 7 8 themselves for their valor and dedication, all too many of whom died in the post-war conflicts in Panama, Grenada, Persian Gulf War, Kosovo, Bosnia, 9 East Timor in Indonesia, Africa, Korea, Vietnam and the recent attack on 10 American soil at the Pentagon and in New York City causing thousand of 11 12 Guam's young men and women to volunteer for duty in the war zone. Resulting in many winning awards for gallantry in action, four of whom 13 earning Distinguished Service Cross, the Nation's Second highest reward for 14 heroism in combat; and 15

WHEREAS, the American Army, first and always, is of the people, with 16 17 a broad foundation of national support symbolized by the endless rows of vellow ribbons and the American flags which bedeck the country from coast 18 to coast on Independence Day, as the Nation and the Army continues to shape 19 into the 21<sup>st</sup> Century, to meet the changes in store, all Americans seeking to 20 21 maintain the continuity of capabilities and commitment that has made the Army what it is today-the final bastion of defense of the American people 22 and the American way of life; now, therefore, be it 23

1 **RESOLVED**, that the Twenty-Eighth Guam Legislature commemorate 2 June 14, 2005 as the 230<sup>th</sup> Birthday of the United States Army, does herby call 3 on the people of Guam to memorialize and celebrate the contributions that 4 member of the United States Army—Active, National Guard, Reserve and 5 Retirees—have made to the Nation and to Guam and does further salute the 6 men and women in the Active Army, the Guam National Guard, and the 7 Army Reserve who continue to serve; and be it further
