Gumataotao, Civilian employee for the United States Air Force, for her extremely successful tours of duty on Andersen Airforce Base, Guam and particularly for her efforts to promote a better relationship between the United States Air Force and the people of Guam.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF I

- 2 MINA'BENTE OCHO NA LIHESLATURAN GUAHAN:
- 3 WHEREAS; Mrs. Gumataotao was born and raised in Guam. She is married
- 4 to Tomas C. Gumataotao, is also a Team Andersen employee with Del Jin Inc.;
- 5 has four children with 6 wonderful grandchildren of her own along with 6
- 6 step children and 20 wonderful step-grandchildren. She graduated out of
- John F. Kennedy High School in Tumon, Guam, and started working for the
- 8 Government of Guam right out of high school in 1969. She held a job with the
- 9 Office of Employment Opportunity (OEO) until 1973 when she applied for a

- position with the Civilian Personnel Office at Andersen and was hired by
- 2 February as a Clerk for the 8th Air Force, Logistics Plans with an effective date
- 3 of 3 March 1973; and
- WHEREAS, Ms. Barbara M. Gumataotao served as the director of the
- 5 Andersen AFB Real Estate Office in Resources Flight with the 36th Civil
- 6 Engineer Squadron, Andersen Air Force Base, Guam. She leads a staff of
- 7 three realty specialists in the management of all Air Force assets on Guam,
- 8 Singapore and in Sydney/Exmouth/Learmonth, Australia; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Ms. Gumataotao epitomized the definition of all on and off
- base community servant. Her actions have made numerous significant
- contributions to the United States and the people of Guam; and
- WHEREAS, Ms. Gumataotao served her 33 years of service on Andersen
- 13 AFB from 3 March 1973 to 3 March 2006. She was extremely involved in a
- number of military and community projects, which have made significant
- impact on the quality of life of the people of Andersen and Guam. Her efforts
- have definitely improved the natural beauty of our island paradise. She has
- maintained a calm and level head in the midst of all contingencies while still
- making time to give back to the community with her unselfish dedication and

endless energy. She is most deserving of this prestigious and honorable award; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Gumataotao, is responsible for all Real Estate in the 13th
Air Force now led by the 36th Air Expeditionary Wing, she manages 19,025
acres and over 2,300 facilities, coordinating real estate transactions, reviewing
and approving facility use and identifying and correcting facility misuse after
decades of the Navy trying to excess 3,200 acres of land under PL 103-339;
and

WHEREAS, Ms. Gumataotao, took over as Real Estate agent in the mid-90's and led the Air Force's efforts to finalize the process and complete the transfer of eight parcels of land (2,136 acres) to the Government of Guam culminating a five year effort to properly identify, characterize and remediate the land after 50 years of military use. She worked closely with local government and community officials throughout the transfer process to allow interim access to the parcels through license agreements. She successfully identified, justified, and spearheaded the procurement of over \$500,000 in architectural survey services required to retrace and locate boundary markers

in preparation to turn back acres of excess land to the Government of Guam in

one of the largest returns of military land in the history of Guam; and

3 WHEREAS, Ms. Gumataotao administers the largest real property

4 support program of any Air Force base in the Pacific Air Forces including 9

easements, 21 permits, 17 licenses, 8 leases, and 38 Inter-service Support

6 Agreements with organizations from the Air Force, Department of Defense,

7 Federal Government, the Government of Guam, and private industry. These

8 agreements support many activities on Guam including critical utility support

9 to the Department of Public Works, Guam Power Authority, Guam

10 Waterworks Authority and the Guam Telephone Authority; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Gumataotao supported the Air Force's efforts to bury

the 17 mile fuels pipeline through exceptional coordination with community

leaders, notifications to all effected land owners, and conducting town

meetings to address concerns. Her staff routinely monitors use of all facilities

and real property on Guam to ensure proper compliance with all Air Force

and federal requirements; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Gumataotao worked very closely with the Andersen

leadership to accommodate all real estate requirements from facilities like the

- Officers' Spouse Gift Shop to supporting unique aircraft bed down facility
- 2 requirements. She coordinates and manages the Andersen Real Estate
- 3 Working Group satisfying all facility moves and requests for new and
- 4 additional facility space; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Ms. Gumataotao played a critical role in many facility use
- 6 initiatives including the implementation of Department of Defense Schools on
- Andersen, procuring the Piti Warehouse for Air Fore use, identification and
- 8 reporting of 360 excess housing units for submission to the Congressionally
- 9 mandated McKinney Homeless Act Report, and all crucial military training
- operations conducted at Andersen AFB; and
- WHEREAS, Ms. Gumataotao is truly a community leader who strongly
- supports Air Force initiatives to maintain a friendly and positive partnership
- with the Government of Guam. She works tirelessly to communicate Air
- 14 Force Real Estate requirements and policies to members of the local
- 15 community and government; and
- WHEREAS, Mrs. Gumataotao personally works with the land-locked
- residents at Ritidian Point, Jinapsan Beach and in the vicinity of Andersen
- South to ensure they have proper access to their properties and comprehend

- Air Force security requirements. She negotiated with the Bureau of Land
- 2 Management and the Government of Guam to complete a Memorandum of
- 3 Understanding to allow the Government of Guam the use of the Harmon
- 4 Cliffline properties for the Guam Liberation Carnival. She worked tirelessly
- 5 to complete all legal documentation and obtain necessary approvals to allow
- 6 the Government of Guam to use the Andersen South facilities to support the
- 7 South Pacific Games; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Ms. Gumataotao successfully supported the Mayor of
- 9 Barrigada's efforts to utilize 20 acres of Air Force land at the Barrigada Radar
- Facility for a community ball field for youth activities and was Nominated for
- the civilian of the first quarter in the year 2000; and
- WHEREAS, Ms. Gumataotao consistently produces results that benefit
- both the Air Force and the local community. After graduating from John F.
- 14 Kennedy High School in Upper Tumon, she has obtained her expertise in Real
- 15 Estate management from years of hard work and dedication. She attended
- three professional development courses in 2003 including Supervisory
- 17 Refresher Training, the PACAF Real Estate Training Seminar, and the Air
- Force Automated Civil Engineering Computer System training course; and

WHEREAS, Ms.Gumataotao mentors and trains the employees who
work for her in the Real Estate Office. Two Real Estate Specialists have been
promoted several grades above their staring level.

WHEREAS, Ms.Gumataotao was a key player for her squadron's receipt of the 2000 Major General Robert C. Thompson Award for an Outstanding Civil Engineer, Resources Flight as well as the 2001 Air Force Award; and WHEREAS, Mrs. Gumataotao forges positive communication with the downtown community, base customers and her co-workers. She played a vital role in building a great community/base relations by assisting private landowners in gaining access to, using and enjoying their property at Jinapsan and Urunao Beach; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Gumataotao first started working at Team Andersen 8th Air Force Logistics Plans then on to the 27th Communications Squadron in 1973, the last year of Arc Light and the start of Operation Linebacker II. Her tour at Andersen also included assignments at the Audit Office, 43rd Supply Squadron, and the 36th Civil Engineering Squadron, where she has been working in the Resources Flight, Real Property Section for the last 20 years; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Guamataotao's education, training, has given her

- 2 numerous awards; and has been instrumental in her job as a civilian in the
- 3 United States Air Force; and
- 4 WHEREAS; Mrs. Barbara M. Gumataotao, a local civilian, who came to
- 5 Andersen AFB, in March 1973, and has since given unselfishly in promoting
- 6 friendship between the United States Air Force and the people of Guam, who
- 7 has an outstanding dedicated hours on Andersen where her presence will
- surly be missed by friends in the civilian capacity as well as the military
- 9 community; and; now, therefore be it
- RESOLVED, that that the Executive Committee of I Mina'bente Ocho na
- Liheslaturan Guåhan and the people of Guam, commend and congratulate Mrs.
- Barbara M. Gumataotao on her outstanding contributions as a civilian for the
- United States Air Force and the people of Guam, and be it further
