Relative to recognizing and commending Alee Family Violence Shelter—Catholic Social Service on their 25th year of tireless service to the women and children of Guam.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY *I LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN*:

WHEREAS, Father David I.A. Quitugua, together with the Sisters of Good
Shepherd played an important role in the establishment of Catholic Social Service and
the first of many ministries; and

WHEREAS, following Public Law 15-117, that called for an abuse shelter on
Guam, Catholic Social Service responded to this need and established the Alee Spouse
Abuse Shelter on March 19, 1981, dedicated as a refuge and safe haven for women
and children of domestic abuse and neglect designated for operation by the Sisters of
Good Shepherd; and

WHEREAS, the name "Alee" nautical term meaning "shelter from the storm,"
was thought of by the late Ricardo Castro of Sinajana, a former accountant with
Catholic Social Service; and

WHEREAS, Alee offers round the clock operations including a confidential
 telephone hotline, crisis counseling, referral service, respite care, childcare service and
 transportation; and

WHEREAS, Alee is committed to ensuring the highest regard for privacy and
 confidentiality for the safety of every woman, child and staff member; and

18 WHEREAS, Catholic Social Service and the Sisters of Good Shepherd, as 19 requested by the Department of Public Health and Social Services expanded the 20 services of Alee Shelters to include a separate shelter for children, known as Alee -1 21 2:31

WHEREAS, Alee Children's Shelter is also an emergency receiving home whose primary objectives are to promote healing in children from the effects of abuse and neglect; to prevent unnecessary separation of siblings when removed from home, and to allow ample time for Child Protective Services (CPS)-Bureau of Social Service Administration (BOSSA) to assemble foster home matches; and

WHEREAS, the Alee Family Violence Shelter has since its founding served
three thousand four hundred fifty five (3,455) women and their children, and Alee
Children's Shelter has served eight hundred eleven (811) children, providing them with
emergency food, clothing, and safety with the means to seek self-sufficiency; and

WHEREAS, women who seek refuge with Alee Shelter are offered opportunities to improve their general health and general status, and that of their children, by attending training courses in parenting, general health and nutrition, housekeeping, interpersonal relations and building of self esteem or self-worth; and

WHEREAS, Alee Children's Shelter provides an interruption of the cycle of the
child's learning pattern of violence and to promote healthy personality development,
positive interaction and build on developmental potential; and

WHEREAS, the Sisters of Good Shepherd had developed a network with other
agencies and organizations to meet the growing needs of abused women and children,
not only in Guam, but also other countries throughout the world; and

WHEREAS, in the twenty-five years of service to the people of Guam, Alee
Family Violence Shelter had eight program directors, Sr. Anita Kristofco, RGS; Sr.
Ursula Fritz, RGS; Sr. Joanne Getz, RGS; Sr. Teresa Floyd, RGS; Sr. Eileen Mearns,
RGS; Sr. Marie Maurer, RGS; Sr. Nora Pat O'Flannigan, RGS and since July 22, 2003
to the present, Sr. Brigid Perez, RSM (Religious Sister of Mercy); and

WHEREAS, Sr. Brigid Perez, RSM, newly appointed program director, will
continue the work of the Sisters of Good Shepherd and Catholic Social Service under
the direction and guidance of Ms. Cerila M. Rapadas, Executive Director; Sr. Mary
Callista Camacho, RSM, Deputy Director; and Archbishop Anthony S. Apuron, OFM
Cap. DD; and

1 WHEREAS, Sr. Brigid Perez, RSM, is impelled to commit her life and 2 resources to act in solidarity with the economically poor of the world, especially women 3 and children; women seeking fullness of life and equality in church and society; and in 4 solidarity with one another as she embraces the multicultural and international reality as 5 animated by the Gospel and foundress, Catherine McAuley's passion for the poor; and

WHEREAS, as a member of the Family Violence Sexual Assault Task Force
(FVSATF), Sr. Brigid Perez, will work harmoniously with other members to seek
solutions and remedies to address the island's family violence and child abuse issues
utilizing sources available to them; and

WHEREAS, that each and every person arriving at Alee Shelters will be
 received with compassion and care, fulfilling the mission of Catholic Social Service, to
 respect the dignity of the human person; and

WHEREAS, to recognize the enormous contribution received from the diverse branches of the Armed Forces, the military personnel and their families, religious communities and organizations, that have been unending since the beginning of Alee; and now therefore be it
