## 1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF *I* 2 *MINA'BENTE OCHO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:*

WHEREAS, the first National Transportation Week was observed in March
 1953 to draw public attention to the importance and benefits of transportation; and
 WHEREAS, in 1957, the third Friday in May was proclaimed as National
 Defense Transportation Day in response to a request by the U. S. Congress; and

WHEREAS, in 1962, the President responded to a Congressional Joint
Resolution's request to proclaim the week in which that Friday falls as National
Transportation Week; and

WHEREAS, our transportation system was vital to the development of our country. During the Revolutionary War, the merchant marines carried cargo to help defend our national interests. In the 1800's, new roads and canals facilitated the migration to the west and unified our country. The invention of the horseless carriage and airplane had far-reaching consequences to our island and our country's defense and economy; and
