- WHEREAS, April 2005 is the local and national recognized month to celebrate Autism Awareness; and
- 5 WHEREAS, autism is a severely incapacitating, lifelong disability,
- 6 resulting in significant impairment of an individual's ability to learn, develop
- 7 appropriate social skills, understand verbal, nonverbal, and reciprocal
- 8 communication; and
- 9 WHEREAS, autism is a spectrum disorder that affects each person
- 10 differently and to varying degrees of severity; and
- WHEREAS, autism is four times more prevalent in boys than girls and
- 12 knows no racial, ethnic, or social boundaries; and

WHEREAS, family income, lifestyle, and educational levels do not 1 2 affect the chance of autism's occurence; and WHEREAS, today, autism spectrum disorders is even more common 3 than Downs Syndrome, Diabetes, Muscular Dystrophy, Cystic Fibrosis, and 4 many forms of Childhood Cancer; and 5 WHEREAS, there are more than 1,500,000 people with Autism in the 6 7 United States and approximately 110 individuals with autism on the island of 8 Guam; and 9 WHEREAS, the recently released Center for Disease Control and Prevention report found that Autism Spectrum Disorder occurred in one (1) in 10 11 every 166 children; and 12 WHEREAS, accurate, early diagnosis before three years of age, and the resulting appropriate education and intervention are vital to the future 13 14 growth and development of individuals with autism; and 15 WHEREAS, through accountable training, knowledge, materials, 16 programs, increased awareness, and support groups, we will be empowered 17 and ready to meet the challenges of what will be needed to serve the growing 18 population of individuals with Autism Spectrum Disorders; and 19 WHEREAS, through the increased awareness and services available to individuals with autism, the lives of our friends with autism can be made 20 21 easier, while those without autism can expand their understanding of the

needs and challenges that individuals with autism are experiencing; and

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WHEREAS, parents, support groups, researchers, and professionals 1 have dedicated years of service in their ongoing efforts to advocate for the 2 rights, humane treatment, and appropriate education of all persons with 3 4 autism; and WHEREAS, these groups remain committed to their cause setting new 5 6 standards, researching causes and effects, and educating families, other professionals, and the general public to better understand this lifelong 7 8 disability; and WHEREAS, here on Guam, family support groups like AUTISM 9 COMMUNITY TOGETHER (ACT) and the AUTISM SOCIETY OF GUAM, are 10 dedicated to the ongoing efforts to advocate for the rights and appropriate 11 12 interventions of all persons with autism; and 13 WHEREAS, the AUTISM COMMUNITY TOGETHER (ACT), formed in 14 January 2004, is spearheading an awareness effort in order to educate parents, 15 professionals and the general public about autism and its effects; and 16

WHEREAS, various activities are being coordinated throughout the month of April 2005 to commemorate this auspicious event, including a Christian Mass at St. Jude's Church in Sinajana, a display at the Agana Shopping Center and the 2nd Annual ACT Walk/Get-Together at the Ricardo J. Bordallo Governor's Complex in Adelup; and now, therefore, be it
