SISTER MARY JOSEPH QUICHOCHO ON THE OCCASION OF  
HER GOLDEN JUBILEE CELEBRATION.

**Whereas**, Sister Mary Joseph Quichocho is the daughter of the  
late Manuel Indalecio and Maria Camacho Quichocho, residents of  
Yona; and

**Whereas**, Sister Mary Joseph, as she is more commonly called,  
is the eldest of thirteen children; and

**Whereas**, Sister Mary Joseph attended public school in Yona  
from 1941 through 1945 until Japanese forces invaded and occupied  
Guam during World War II; and

**Whereas**, in 1949 Sister Mary Joseph transferred to the newly  
established Saint Francis Catholic school in Yona staffed by the  
School Sisters of Notre Dame; and

**Whereas**, Sister Mary Joseph graduated among the first class  
of Saint Francis School eighth graders in 1950; and

**Whereas**, Sister Mary Joseph entered into the Aspiranture to  
begin her training into religious life sponsored by the School Sisters  
of Notre Dame; and

**Whereas**, Sister Mary Joseph was among six young women chosen to travel from Guam to the School Sisters of Notre Dame Motherhouse in Milwaukee, Wisconsin to continue her preparation for life as a nun; and

**Whereas**, in 1955, Sister Mary Joseph was professed a Sister of the School Sisters of Notre Dame, receiving the black veil symbolizing the three vows of poverty, obedience and celibacy; and

**Whereas**, Sister Mary Joseph has unselfishly spent her entire life as a Sister of Notre Dame teaching in various schools in Guam and Micronesia; and now therefore, be it

**RESOLVED**, that the Executive Committee of I Mina'Bente Ocho Na Liheslaturan Guåhan, does hereby on behalf of the people of Guam, commend and congratulate and celebrate with Sister Mary Joseph on the occasion of her Fiftieth Jubilee; and be it further

**RESOLVED**, that the Speaker certify, and the Secretary of the Legislature attest to, the adoption hereof and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to Sister Mary Joseph Quichocho; to Sister Joseph Ann Quinene, SSND Regional Leader; to Most Reverend Anthony S.
